LEADING OFF: Happy Easter!! Angels play on Easter Sunday for 29th time in Club history (12-16 all-time)... Halos are 2-1 after three games for second straight season (started 2-1 and 2-2 in Oakland in 2017)...**Club seeks first 3-1 start since 100-win season in 2008...Today's game will air at 5 am local time in Japan on NHK...2018 represents the Angels' 58th MLB season and 53rd campaign in Anaheim...LAA holds an all-time record of 11 games over .500 at 4,559-4,548-3...Today marks the 9,111th regular season game in team history...Following this series, Angels open the home slate vs. Cleveland (April 2-4) and Oakland (April 6-8).**

OHTANI = BASEBALL RARITY: The last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last to do it as a non-pitcher on Opening Day followed by a pitching start in the first 10 games was **Babe Ruth** (Red Sox) in 1919...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).

HALOS FROM JAPAN: With today's start, will join **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.

TRADE MADE: Last night, the Angels traded **C Carlos Perez** to Atlanta in exchange for **INF Ryan Schimpf**...Schimpf was optioned to Salt Lake.

SKIPPIN' UP: With yesterday's win, **Mike Scioscia** (1,572 wins) passed **Dick Williams** (1,571 wins) for sole possession of 21st on all-time managerial wins list.

ELIAS SAYS: Yesterday **Mike Trout** went 3-for-5 with two RBI and **Albert Pujols** went 2-for-5 with two RBI in the Angels' 8-3 win. **Angels are now 17-2 when both Trout and Pujols each produce at least two hits and RBI.**

FOR OPENERS:

- **Shohei Ohtani** joins **Hideki Matsui**, **Kaz Matsui**, **Tsuyoshi Shinjo** and **Kosuke Fukudome** as Japanese-born players with a hit on Opening Day in their first MLB at-bat.
- LAA had three players (**Calhoun**, **Cozart** & **Maldonado**) post three hits apiece on Opening Day for first time in Club history...Angels also matched a team record with 3 HRs on Opening Day (**Pujols**, **Cozart**, **Calhoun**) – 6th time.
- **Albert Pujols** hit his 5th career Opening Day HR to tie **lan Kinsler** & **Bryce Harper** for MLB lead among actives.
- LAA has now played extra innings on Opening Day five times: 2018 at OAK (L, 5-6), 2013 at CIN (W, 3-1), 1986 at SEA (L, 4-8), 1982 at OAK (L, 2-3) & 1966 at CWS (L, 2-3).
- **Kole Calhoun** joins **Dave Parker** (1991) as only Angels with a triple and a home run on Opening Day.
- **Zack Cozart** is first Angel to homer in his Halo debut on Opening Day since **Hideki Matsui** in 2010.

MARCH ON: 2018 marks the sixth time the Halos open a campaign in the month of March...Angels are 1-5 all-time in March season openers, last coming in 2014 (March 31; 10-3 loss at Seattle)...**March 29th marked the earliest Opening Day date in Club history...Saturday marked the first time the Angels will have played three regular season games in March (are now 3-5 all-time in the month).**

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .538 (1,572-1,347) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history...**Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter).**

VS. OAKLAND: Thursday marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)...**Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7 (5-5 on road) and have won seven of last nine meetings...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .325 (111/342) with 24 HR & 58 RBI in 89 games vs. Oakland.**

ONLY ONE: There have been 19,183 people to play Major League Baseball (entering 2018). Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is **Mike Trout**.

3000/600: **Albert Pujols** is 28 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining **Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** and **Alex Rodriguez**.

MORE ALBERT: **Pujols** is vying to become the 32nd player all time with 3,000 hits, the sixth foreign born player to accomplish the feat and the second player to do so in an Angels' uniform (**Rod Carew** in 1985).

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster features seven players new to the organization: **Luke Bard**, **Jim Johnson**, **Shohei Ohtani**, **Rene Rivera**, **Zack Cozart**, **lan Kinsler** and **Chris Young**.

HOT SPRINGS: Several Halos posted strong numbers during Spring Training including **Zack Cozart** (.353, 4 HR, 9 RBI), **Kole Calhoun** (.353, 1 HR, 9 RBI), **Mike Trout** (.308, 3 HR, 8 RBI), **Justin Upton** (3 HR, 11 RBI), **Jose Alvarez** (1-0, 2.38), **Garrett Richards** (1-0, 2.84) and **Nick Tropeano** (2-0, 3.12)

NOW YOU KNOW: **Shohei Ohtani** is the fourth Japanese player to appear for the Halos:

- Shigetoshi Hasegawa** 1997-01
- Hideki Matsui** 2010
- Hisanori Takahashi** 2011-12

INDIANS ON DECK: Angels will open at home vs. the Tribe for the fifth time in club annals (1965, 1980, 1999 and 2002)...In last such meeting, Halos were shutout 6-0 by **Bartolo Colon**...**Halos have dropped 11 straight and 15 of last 16 games to the Tribe...A loss to the Indians in next meeting would match longest losing streak in Club history vs. one team (also to Baltimore from 1979-80 and Kansas City in 1975)...LAA has dropped last 10 games in Cleveland (9-20 last 29 there)...Halos are 6-6 in last 12 at the Big A.**

First Major League start as a pitcher

- **WELCOME TO THE SHO:** Making first start as a pitcher...Made Major League debut with Angels on Opening Day as the starting designated hitter and went 1-for-5 with a single in his first career plate appearance...Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017 and had contract selected by Angels on March 27.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** In two Cactus League appearances, went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA (2.2 IP – 8 ER) and five strikeouts...Also pitched in intrasquad and minor league games for Angels this Spring.
- **THE BABE AND I:** With today's start, will become first player to *start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher* within his team's first 10 games since Babe Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).
- **TWO WAY COMPANYY:** The last time any player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher at any point within the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as outfielders and pitchers...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).
- **TOPPING THE RANKINGS:** Enters 2018 ranked by *MLB.com* as the #1 prospect in all of baseball...Is rated as top Angels prospect by *Baseball America* and #2 overall in baseball.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** Today marks first career appearance as a pitcher vs. Oakland.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Today marks first career appearance as a pitcher at the Coliseum.
- **HALOS FROM JAPAN:** With today's start, will join **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.
- **AT THE PLATE:** For additional batting notes, please see Ohtani's section in the Angels hitters section of the game notes.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made five starts as a pitcher in 2017 for Nippon-Ham Fighters of Japanese Pacific League, and went 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (25.1 IP - 9 ER) with 29 strikeouts...Was limited to five games pitching last season, due to an ankle injury...In his 65 games as a batter, hit .332 with 16 doubles, eight home runs and 31 RBI.

CAREER NOTES:

- In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
- Earned a "Best Nine Award" as a pitcher for the Fighters in 2015 & 2016 after leading the Pacific League in ERA each season (2.24 in 2015 & 1.86 in 2016)...
- In 2016, was named Pacific League MVP...In 21 games (20 starts) as a pitcher, went 10-4 with a 1.86 ERA (140 IP - 29 ER) with 174 strikeouts...Also appeared in 104 games as a hitter and batted .322 with 18 doubles, 22 HR and 67 RBI.
- Native of Ōshū, Japan...Made Pacific League debut with Fighters at age 18.

Making first start of the season...Opens regular season in a starting rotation for first time in career...In four Spring Training starts, went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (13.1 IP – 8 ER) and 13 strikeouts...In 27 games (24 starts) for Angels last season, went 11-10 with a 4.15 ERA (147.1 IP – 68 ER) and 105 strikeouts...Set career-highs in wins, innings and strikeouts...In five career games (one start) vs. Cleveland, is 0-1 with a 3.75 ERA (12 IP – 5 ER) and seven strikeouts.

AGE: 24

- Pitched in 64 games for Angels last season, going 6-1 with three saves and a 3.86 ERA (58.1 IP – 25 ER) while striking out 63 and walking 18 in his rookie campaign.

AGE: 32

AGE: 29

- Hit first home run of the season Thursday...Was the first Halo right fielder to homer on Opening Day since Torii Hunter in 2011...Joined Dave Parker (1991) as the only Angels all time to homer and triple on Opening Day.
- Made fifth Opening Day Roster and fifth Opening Day start in right field...Is the first Angel right fielder to make five consecutive Opening Day starts since Vladimir Guerrero (2004-08)...The last Angel to make more consecutive Opening Day starts in right field was Tim Salmon (1993-03)...In 2014, became the club's first home grown Opening Day right fielder since Tim Salmon in 2003.
- **Posted a .353 (18/51) average with a home run and nine RBI in 20 spring games.**
- Hit .303 (24/79) with three doubles, two triples and eight RBI against Oakland in 2017...Made Major League debut in Oakland May 22, 2012.
- In 2017, appeared in 155 games for the third consecutive year...Drew a career-high 71 walks while 19 home runs marked second most of career.

#7 ZACK COZART (INF)

AGE: 32

- Five hits in 15 at-bats (.333) this season with three runs scored, two doubles, a triple, home run and two RBI...On Thursday, became the 28th Angel all time to homer in first game with the Club and first since Carlos Perez in 2015.
- In eighth big league season (seventh full) and first as an Angel...Spent first seven big league seasons with the Cincinnati Reds...Signed as a free agent Dec. 15, 2017.
