WINS AND LOSSES: Texas posted its 2nd win of the season last night to snap a 3-G losing streak...Rangers have won the 2nd game of each of club's 1st 2 series...currently T4th place in the A.L. West (w/ OAK), 3.0 games back of division-leading Houston...Rangers' 4 losses are tied with 7 other teams for most in MLB, joining BAL, DET, TB (all 1-4), and OAK (2-4) as A.L. clubs with 4 defeats...club has opened with a 2-4 record for a 2nd straight year, this after having 3+ wins after 6 games in every season from 2008-16...Rangers did not win its season-opening series for a 4th straight season after going 1-3 vs. HOU (2-2 at OAK in 2015, 1-2 vs. SEA in 2016, 0-3 vs. CLE in 2017)...club had won its 1st series in 4 consecutive campaigns from 2011-14...thru 7 G, Rangers had a 2-5 record in 2017, which was fewest wins thru 7 G since 2006 (also 2-5)...Texas had a 3-4 mark after 7 G in 3 straight years from 2014-16...going back to '17, TEX has is 4-12 in last 16 G, with 3 of those 4 wins against the A's.

VS. OAKLAND: This 4-game set marks 1st of 6 series between the Rangers and A's in 2018...overall, Rangers have lost 2 of 3, 9 of 12, 11 of 17, and 15 of last 26 vs. A's, but have a 19-17 advantage beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Texas leads all-time series 362-353, while A's have 187-171 edge at the Coliseum.

• Last night's win snapped the Rangers' 9-game losing streak here at the Coliseum, 1st win in this facility since 4/17/17... the 9-G slide was the Rangers' longest ever at the Coliseum, and T3rd-longest in any single road venue in Rangers history...the only longer streaks were a pair of 0-11 droughts, one across the Bay at AT&T Park from 6/27/98-6/21/09 and the other at Comerica Park vs. Detroit from 9/11/07-5/21/09...the losing skid against the Giants does not include the postseason, as Rangers lost 2010 World Series Games 1 and 2 at that venue for an 0-13 drought before finally landing a win there with Matt Harrison's CG SHO on 6/8/12.

ON THE ROAD: Texas has split its 1st 2 road games this season...last night's win snapped an overall 4-game road losing skid dating to last season, each of those 4 losses here at the Coliseum...going back to 2017, Rangers have lost 4 of 5, but are 5-4 in last 9, 7-7 in last 14, 11-8 in last 19, and 18-15 in away games going back to 7/21/17...Rangers finished 37-44 (.457) on the road in 2017, club's 2nd-lowest away win pct. in the last 10 years beginning 2008 (34-47, .420 in 2014).

RECORD-SETTING EFFORT FOR HAMELS: Cole Hamels recorded 11 strikeouts in 5.0 innings last night to earn the win, recording his 1st 8 outs via strikeout...some notes on his effort:

- The 11 K's mark the most by any pitcher in an outing of 5.0 innings-or-less in Washington/Texas franchise history (since 1961).
- · According to Elias Sports Bureau, Hamels became the 1st pitcher in Rangers history to record the 1st 8+ outs of a game via strikeout...Elias says it happened once before in franchise history, when Senators' Jim Duckworth did it for Washington (1st 8) on 9/4/65 at DET in Tiger Stadium...last MLB pitcher to do it was ARI's Taijuan Walker on 9/1/17 at COL...also marked 1st time Hamels had ever recorded 1st 8 outs of a start on K's.
- Marked Hamels' most strikeouts in a game since 7/28/16 vs. KC (12).
- Was 1st game of Hamels' career with 10+ K's in 5.0-or-fewer innings, his 35th career game with 10+ strikeouts, 6th w/ TEX, 1st since 8/19/16 at TB (10).
- According to baseball-reference.com, Hamels' 16 swinging strikes (swing and miss) last night matched his most in the last 2 seasons (also 16 on 9/11/17 vs. SEA)...Hamels had reached that figure (16-or-more) in 8 starts for Texas in 2016.

MLB NETWORK TONIGHT: Tonight's Rangers/A's game will be seen in some U.S. markets on MLB Network, but fans in Rangers/A's markets will see COL at SD on MLBN.

BELTRÉ TIES CAREW: Adrián Beltré's hit last night was career no. 3053, tying Rod Carew for 25th place on the all-time list...it also tied Carew, who was born in Panama, for most hits all-time by a native of Latin America... Beltré was already the all-time hits leader among players born in the Dominican Republic...with 3 more hits in this series, Beltré could also pass OAK great Rickey Henderson (3055) on all-time list.

· Beltré has 2820 career games, T21st place all-time with Reggie Jackson.

GALLO REACHES 50: Joey Gallo hit career HR no. 50 last night his his 204th major league game...only 10 players in ML history have reached 50 HR in fewest games, according to baseball-reference.com...the HR also made Gallo the fastest Ranger to reach 50 career long balls, as previous fastest in Washington/Texas franchise history had been Mark Teixeira (229 games) and Pete Incaviglia (247 games).

Gallo leads the team with 2 HR and 4 RBI in '18.

THE KING: Elvis Andrus saw his season-opening hit streak end at 5 games last night...he still has an MLB-best 25 plate appearances this season without a strikeout, one more PA than WAS' Bryce Harper (24 PA's, no SO)...also, Andrus' 4.32 pitches per PA is highest figure among the 9 MLB batters with 10+ PA's and no K's in 2018.

KEEP BATS WARM: The Texas offense matched a season high with 10 hits last night, going 2-for-5 with RISP...with 4 runs last night, Rangers are now 2-0 when scoring 4+ runs and 0-4 when plating 3-or-fewer.

TIMELY HITTING: Rougned Odor recorded each of the Rangers' 2 hits with RISP last night, posting the 1st multi-RBI game by a Texas batter in 2018...it was the 5th time in Odor's career that he has had multiple hits with RISP in the same game, 1st instance since 9/12/16 at HOU...Odor now has 2 of the team's 6 hits with RISP on the season.

SOLO MISSION: Each of the Rangers' 1st 5 HR this season have been solo shots, as Texas is one of 6 ML clubs without a HR with men on (also DET/MIN/NYM/PHI/TB)...Rangers have the most games of any team on that list, and only $\ensuremath{\mathsf{MIN}}$ (8) has more HR than Texas.

SHORTS: Happy birthday to Martin Pérez (27), who is slated to be activated from the DL for his season debut tomorrow (see page 2)...Doug Fister's 2.61 career ERA at the Coliseum is 3rd-lowest among active pitchers with 7+ starts here... Alex Claudio induced 7 groundballs in 2.0 IP last night (according to STATS), tied for highest total in any outing that short in 2018 (also MIA's Brad Ziegler on 3/31 vs. CHC)... Keone Kela's save last night was Rangers' 1st of the season and 1st by a Texas pitcher at the Coliseum since 9/23/16 (Sam Dyson), which was the night that Texas clinched the A.L. West...the top four Texas minor league affiliates begin their seasons on Thursday.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#38 Doug Fister, RHP (1-0, 1.80)

TONIGHT: The 34-year-old right-hander will be making his 2nd start of the season tonight in the 3rd of 4 games vs. the Athletics in the Bay Area this week...will be working on regular 4-days' rest after earning his 1st win of the season, and his first in a Rangers uniform, in a 5-1 second game victory against the Astros...went 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (8 ER/12.1 IP) over 4 starts in 'A' games this spring...owns 5 seasons of 10-or-more wins, including career-high 16 victories with WAS in 2014, finishing 8th in N.L. Cy Young Award voting...has made 9 career postseason starts with 3 different teams that included World Series outing with DET in 2012... the 9-year ML veteran spent the final 3 months of 2017 with BOS, making 15 regular season starts for the A.L. East Division champs... Fister signed a one-year contract with an option for 2019 on 11/28/17.

LAST START: Earned the victory in the Rangers' 2nd game of the season on Friday vs. HOU, a 5-1 Texas win (5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR, 77 pitches/48 strikes)...lone run allowed came via an RBI double by Max Stassi (5th inning)...his 77 pitches were 2nd-fewest in his career in first start of the season... faced just 2 batters the 3rd time through the Houston lineup...of 4 hits allowed, 2 went for doubles...is still the only starting pitcher to record a win against the Astros this season

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Has gone 8-8 with a 3.28 ERA (39 ER/107.0 IP) over 18 career starts vs. the Athletics, including 0-1, 13.50 ERA (6 ER/4.0 IP) in a single start last season as a member of the Red Sox...surrendered a 2-run home run to Matt Olson in the 1st inning...permitted a double and triple by Jed Lowrie.

AT THE COLISEUM: Is 4-4, 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP) over 9 career starts at the Oakland Coliseum...has the 3rd-lowest ERA at the Coliseum among active pitchers with at least 7 starts (Ervin Santana-2.08 ERA in 15 G/13 GS and Justin Verlander-2.38 ERA in 10 GS)...making his first appearance at the Oakland Coliseum in nearly 2 years since 7/20/16 with HOU (7.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR)...currently has a two game winning streak against the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum (13.2 IP, 11 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 0 HR).

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 38-42 with a 3.98 ERA (278 ER/629.1 IP) on the road in his career...making first road start in 2018...last road start was on 9/24/17 with BOS at CIN (5.1 IP, 9 H, 3 R-ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 0 HR)...has gone 22-24 with a 4.00 ERA (158 ER/355.1 IP) over 59 starts against. A.L. West opponents.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Has issued just 2.08 walks per 9.0 innings in his big league career, 6th best among active pitchers with at least 1,000.0 innings... among pitchers with at least 1250.0 innings since 2009, also ranks among MLB leaders in fewest home runs allowed per 9.0 IP (9th, 0.86), ERA (16th, 3.68) and WHIP (19th, 1.250).

SPRING TRAINING: Went 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (8 ER/12.1 IP) over 4 starts... opened the spring with an 8.0-inning scoreless streak, permitting just 5 hits over that span...7 of 8 runs allowed in 'A' games this spring came in start on 3/20 vs. the White Sox in Glendale...allowed 0 HR over 4 starts...totaled 8 K's and 2 BB.

<u>A HEIGHT ADVANTAGE:</u> At 6'8", would tie for the 2nd tallest pitcher in Rangers' history: 6'10—Chris Young (2004-05); 6'8"—Mike Smithson (1982-83), Kameron Loe (2004-08), Dustin Nippert (2008-10)...2018 free agent signee Chris Martin is also listed at 6'8".

2017: Signed a major league contract with LAA on 5/20 and was optioned to Salt Lake (AAA)...made 3 starts for the Bees (1-0, 4.02), issuing one run in each of 1st 2 outings before allowing 5 R in 5.0 IP on 6/16 vs. Reno...was claimed on release waivers by BOS on 6/23 and added to big league club the following day... was 5-7, 4.71 (44 ER/84.0 IP) in 15 starts and 0-2, 7.11 (5 ER/6.1 IP) in 3 relief appearances for the Red Sox the rest of the season...ranked 4th on the staff in wins, starts, and innings (90.1) beginning 6/24...opponents batted .254, including career low .208 vs. RHB.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — LHP MARTIN PÉREZ (1st start)

The lefty, who turns 27 today, is scheduled to be activated from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow to make his season debut with a start in Thursday's series finale...underwent arthroscopic surgery on 12/18/17 to repair a broken right radial head in his right (non-throwing) elbow and has spent the last 2 months of the offseason on a rehab and throwing program...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Diliberti in Dallas, as he removed the fragmented pieces and replaced the radial head...sustained the injury in an accident at his ranch in his native Venezuela on 12/11/17...made 2 'A' starts for Texas this spring, going 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP), lasting 5.0 IP in each outing... had 2 BB/5 SO...last 'A' start was 3/23 at SD (ND, 5.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR)...Pérez last pitched in a simulated game on Friday at Round Rock: 6.0 IP, 2 BB, 10 SO, 87 pitches...has career 7-7 record with 5.24 ERA (51 ER/87.2 IP) in 16 G/GS against the A's...has more starts, wins, and losses vs. A's than any other club...went 2-2, 5.49 (12 ER/19.2 IP) in 4 G/GS against Oakland in 2017, although he went 0-2, 9.72 (9 ER/8.1 IP) in 2 GS here at the Coliseum, allowing 4+ R while lasting less than 5.0 IP in both outings...in career, has gone 3-4, 5.05 (26 ER/46.1 IP) in 8 G/GS at the Coliseum, most losses in any visiting park and tied for most starts in any road venue (also 8 GS at Safeco)... in 2017, led Texas staff in wins (career-high 13), starts (32), and innings (185.0)...also established a career high in strikeouts (115), 2nd on club (Darvish-148)... had team highs in losses (12) and hits allowed (221), both the highest figures of his career...opponents batted .301/.359/.453/.812, 2nd-highest BA and 5th-highest in Oab among A.L. starters...his 1.535 WHIP was 7th-highest in A.L., also 9th-highest in club history by a qualifier.
