WINS AND LOSSES: Texas has lost 4 of last 5 G after losing last night at OAK, 6-2...club enters series finale needing a win to split the 4-game set for 2nd time in as many series to begin the year...Rangers' only 2 wins have come in 2nd game of each series...team's 5 losses are tied for most in majors with BAL, LAD, SD, and TB...club has opened with a 2-5 record for a 2nd straight year, this after having 3+ wins after 7 games in every season from 2007-16...thru 8 G, Rangers had a 3-5 record in 2017, tied with 2009 and 2015 for slowest start since 2006 (2-6)...Texas has not been above .500 thru 8 G since 2013 (6-2)...going back to '17, TEX has is 4-13 in last 17 G, with 3 of those 4 wins against the A's.

- Team is currently in 5th place in the A.L. West, 4.0 games back of division-leading Houston...team's 4.0 GB is tied for largest division deficit in MLB with BAL, TB, and SD.

THE FINALE: Texas wraps its 1st road trip and 2nd series of the season today at the Coliseum...Rangers are trying to earn a 2-2 split in this series and avoid taking losses in the 1st 2 series of a season for the 1st time since 2006 (dropped 1st 3 series)...Rangers did not win its season-opening series for a 4th straight season after going 1-3 vs. HOU (2-2 at OAK in 2015, 1-2 vs. SEA in 2016, 0-3 vs. CLE in 2017)...club had won its 1st series in 4 consecutive campaigns from 2011-14.

VS. OAKLAND: After today, next 3 series vs. A's will take place in Arlington, as Rangers do not return to the Coliseum until 8/20-22...overall, Rangers have lost 3 of 4, 10 of 13, 12 of 18, and 16 of last 27 vs. A's, but have a 19-18 advantage beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Texas leads all-time series 362-354, while A's have 188-171 edge at the Coliseum.

- Rangers lost 9 straight games at the Coliseum before Tuesday's win, as the team's previous win in this facility had been on 4/17/17...it was T3rd-longest drought in any single road city in Rangers history, as club had 0-11 runs at San Francisco and Comerica Park.

ON THE ROAD: Texas is 1-2 to begin its road schedule in 2018, losing 5 of last 6 away contests dating to last season...each of those 5 defeats have come here at the Coliseum...going back to 2017, Rangers are 5-5 in last 10, 7-8 in last 15, 11-9 in last 20, and 18-16 in away games beg. 7/21/17...Rangers finished 37-44 (.457) on the road in 2017, club's 2nd-lowest away win pct. in the last 10 years beginning 2008 (34-47, .420 in 2014).

HARD SUN: Texas has gone 0-3 in day games this season, losing all 3 day tilts in the HOU series to begin the year...offense has batted .161 (15-93) with 6 R and 34 SO in those 3 games, going 1-for-12 w/ RISP...pitching staff has allowed 21 R-ER in 27.0 IP...in daytime, Rangers have lost 6 straight, 8 of 9, 13 of 16, and 18 of 23 beginning 7/2/17...current 6-G slide is longest in daytime since 7 in a row, 6/30/16-7/16/16...

HEADED HOME: Rangers are scheduled to fly back to the DFW Metroplex after today's game and begin a 6-game, 6-day homestand against the Blue Jays on Friday night...Texas was 3-4 vs. TOR in 2017, losing season series for a 5th consecutive season, as Rangers are 11-22 vs. Jays since start of 2013...Rangers also went 2-6 vs. Jays in the 2015 and 2016 ALDS, losing last 6 in a row...clubs meet in Toronto from 4/27-29, as season series with Jays is slated to be over by the end of the month.

AFFILIATES BEGIN PLAY TONIGHT: The top four Texas minor league affiliates begin play tonight...the affiliates and their scheduled starting pitcher (all times CT): Triple-A Round Rock (LHP David Hurlbut) vs. Memphis at 7:05 pm, Double-A Frisco (RHP Collin Wiles) vs. Tulsa at 7:05 pm, High-A Down East (RHP Emerson Martinez) at Lynchburg at 5:30 pm, and Low-A Hickory (RHP Tyler Phillips) at Greensboro at 6:00 pm.

MAZ THE MACHINE: Nomar Mazara has gone 5-for-7 with a BB in his last 8 plate appearances in this series...he has a team-high 5 hits in this series, scoring 3 of the Rangers' 7 runs...Mazara leads all Rangers in '18 with 5 runs scored, and his 8 hits and 2nd-most on the club.

ODOR'S STREAK ENDS: Rougned Odor had played in 168 consecutive games for Texas before he did not appear last night...it marked the 1st time Odor had not appeared in a reg. season game for Texas since the 2016 season finale, 10/2/16 vs. TB, which was also a Profar start at 2B.

PÉREZ RETURNS: Martin Pérez is slated to be activated today and make his season debut...is seeing a delayed start to the season after offseason surgery on his right (non-throwing) elbow...Pérez turned 27 years old yesterday, and will be the youngest Ranger to make a start this season...only pitcher under 30 to have started for Texas prior to today was Matt Moore (28.286 on 3/31 vs. HOU).

BELTRÉ TIED WITH CAREW: Adrián Beltré's lone hit in this series on Tuesday was career no. 3053, tying Rod Carew for 25th place on the all-time list...it also tied Carew, who was born in Panama, for most hits all-time by a native of Latin America...Beltré was already the all-time hits leader among players born in the Dominican Republic...with 3 hits in today's series finale, Beltré could also pass OAK great Rickey Henderson (3055) on all-time list.

THE KING: Elvis Andrus had just one hit last night, but he still has an MLB-best 29 plate appearances this season without a strikeout, 11 more than the next-closest batter (KC's Whit Merrifield-18)...Andrus has missed on just 7 of 52 (13.5%) swings in 2018, the 11th-lowest figure among A.L. qualifiers this season.

COME PICK ME UP: Jesse Chavez (2.1 IP) and Jose Leclerc (2.0 IP) combined for more innings last night than starter Doug Fister (3.2), 2nd game for Texas to have that happen in 2018 (also Sat. vs. HOU)...Rangers' 27.0 relief innings this season are just 7.0 less than the rotation (34.0), and the figure ranks as 5th-most in MLB (35.1-MIA, 30.1-LAA, 28.0-ATL, 27.1-MIL)...the 25 relief appearances for the Texas bullpen ranks T5th-most in majors: 31-LAA, 27-ATL, 26-MIA/PHI, 25-TEX/TOR.

RARE ERROR: Last night's error on Robinson Chirinos on a play at the plate led to the Rangers' 1st unearned runs of the season...would you believe that the Rangers' .987 (3 E/237 TC) fielding pct. ranks as 5th-best in the A.L.?...the club's only other errors this season came in the 2nd game on Sat. vs. HOU, when Andrus and Odor both committed miscues.

THE WHIFF: Texas pitching posted 10 more strikeouts last night, 4th time in 7 games with 10+ K's in 2018...it took the staff 13 games to reach that total last season...pitchers rank 3rd in MLB with 69 K's (72-HOU, 70-LAA), and staff's 10.18 SO/9 ranks 5th.

SHORTS: Last night's season-low 2:23 time of game was shortest for Rangers since 9/23/16 at OAK (2:19), club's division-clincher...Rangers' 18 runs scored are 3rd-fewest in WSH/TEX franchise history thru 7 G, ahead of only 1988 (12) and 1977 (17)...TEX and PHI are only MLB teams that have yet to score 6+ runs in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Martin Pérez, LHP
(0-0, —)

TODAY: The 27-year-old left-hander is scheduled to be activated from the 10-day disabled list and start today's game in his 2018 debut...his 27th birthday was yesterday...pitched in 2 spring training 'A' games, but opened the season the DL while still recovering from offseason surgery on his right (non-throwing) elbow...will be the 6th different starter used by Texas in the 1st 8 team games...last pitched in a simulated game on Friday at Round Rock in preparation for today's outing...has more starts (16), wins (7), and losses (7) against the A's than any other opponent...posted a career-high 13 wins in 2017...one of just 12 American League pitchers with 30+ starts in each of the last two seasons, Perez already ranks 17th in club history in starts (113)...he is the first Ranger with consecutive 30-start campaigns since Matt Harrison in 2011-12...saw two seasons cut short in 2014-15 following 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow on 5/19/14...the Venezuela native signed a four-year contract through 2017 with club options for 2018, 2019, and 2020 on 11/7/13...made his major league debut in 2012 at the age of 21, and was rated as one of the Rangers' top five prospects by Baseball America in five straight seasons from 2009-13.

SURGERY: Underwent arthroscopic surgery on 12/18/17 to repair a broken right radial head in his right (non-throwing) elbow and has spent the last 2 months of the offseason on a rehab and throwing program...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Diliberti in Dallas, as he removed the fragmented pieces and replaced the radial head...sustained the injury in an accident at his ranch in his native Venezuela on 12/11/17.

SPRING TRAINING: Made 2 'A' starts for Texas this spring, going 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP), lasting 5.0 IP in each outing...had 2 BB/5 SO...last 'A' start was 3/23 at SD (ND, 5.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR)...Pérez last pitched in a simulated game on Friday at Round Rock: 6.0 IP, 2 BB, 10 SO, 87 pitches...pitched for High-A Down East Wood Ducks (Rangers Hi-A affiliate) in Surprise on 3/12, facing Dodgers High-A affiliate Rancho Cucamonga on Field 5...threw live batting practice on 3/7 in Surprise as he prepped for his 1st game.

VS. OAKLAND: Will be making his 3rd consecutive start against the Athletics dating back to 2017...took loss in next-to-last start of '17 on 9/24 here at the Coliseum (4.2 IP, 6 H, 5 R-ER) and then won his final outing on 9/29 in Arlington (6.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER)...has career 7-7 record with 5.24 ERA (51 ER/87.2 IP) in 16 G/GS against the A's...has more starts, wins, and losses vs. A's than any other club...went 2-2, 5.49 (12 ER/19.2 IP) in 4 G/GS against Oakland in 2017, although he went 0-2, 9.72 (9 ER/8.1 IP) in 2 GS here at the Coliseum, allowing 4+ R while lasting less than 5.0 IP in both outings...in career, has a record of 3-4, 5.05 (26 ER/46.1 IP) in 8 G/GS at the Coliseum, most losses in any visiting park and tied for most starts in any road venue (also 8 GS at Safeco).

GROUNDED: Induced 32 GDP's in 2017, 2nd-most in A.L. and T2nd-most in MLB to only TOR's Marcus Stroman (34)...it was also the 2nd-highest single-season total in club history to only Perez's 2016 total (36)...he is 1st pitcher with back-to-back seasons of 32+ GDP's induced since NYY's Chien-Ming Wang in 2006-07.

I'LL BE THERE: Perez leads all Texas pitchers in starts (65) and innings (383.2) over the past 2 seasons, when he became the 1st Ranger with consecutive 30-start campaigns since Matt Harrison in 2011-12...no Texas pitcher has done it in 3 straight seasons since Rick Helling (4, 1998-2001)...he was one of just 12 A.L. pitchers with at least 30 starts in both 2016 and 2017, joining Chris Sale and Wade Miley as the only left-handers on that list.

2017: Led staff in wins (career-high 13), starts (32), and innings (185.0)...also established a career high in strikeouts (115), 2nd on club (Darvish-148)...had team highs in losses (12) and hits allowed (221), both the highest figures of his career...on the 10-day DL 6/23-7/2 with a fracture/laceration at the tip of his right thumb...did not require a rehab assignment...sustained injury when he caught his thumb in the hinge section of a hotel room door on evening of 6/22 in New York...over final 11 starts beginning 8/9, went 8-2 with a 3.71 ERA (28 ER/68.0 IP) in 11 G/GS to drop final ERA from 5.46 to 4.82...won a career-best 7 consecutive starts (zero no decisions) from 8/9-9/8, T2nd-longest streak by a Texas starter in team history and longest since Kenny Rogers in 2005 (club-record 8)...the 7-G win streak (including no-decisions) ranked T4th in the A.L. in 2017 and T7th in MLB...pitched for Team Venezuela in the 2017 World Baseball Classic (0-1, 7.50, 5 ER/6.0 IP) won by the United States.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER - LHP MATT MOORE (0-1, 9.00 in one game/start)

The 28-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 2nd start of the season when the club returns home and hosts the Toronto Blue Jays on Friday night...will be working on extended 5-days' rest due to the addition of Martin Perez into the Texas rotation...suffered the loss in his Texas debut, a 9-3 Rangers defeat on Saturday vs. HOU in Arlington (4.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 85 pitches/53 strikes)...allowed 3 of the 4 runs in the 2nd inning with 2 runs via a Jake Marisnick 2-run homer...allowed multiple baserunners in each of the 1st 3 innings, but retired the side in order in the 4th inning...has gone 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA (19 ER/52.1 IP) over 10 career starts vs. the Blue Jays, his 3rd-most starts vs. any opponent...is slated for his 3rd career regular season start at Globe Life Park...also tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in Tampa Bay's 9-0 win over the Rangers in Game 1 of the 2011 ALDS...was acquired in a 3-player trade with SF on 12/15/17...returns to the American League where he went 39-28 with 3.88 ERA from 2011-16 with TB...was traded to the Giants on 8/1/16, going 6-5 the rest of that season...tied for the N.L. lead with 15 losses in 2017 while receiving the 3rd lowest run support of any Major League qualifying pitcher...posted 10+ victories 3 times with the Rays, going 17-4 and earning A.L. All-Star honors in 2013...had Tommy John surgery in 2014 when he made just 2 starts...was selected by TB in 8th round of 2007 MLB Draft and made ML debut in September 2011.
