LEADING OFF: Angels play the fourth game (2-1) of their initial home stand of 2018 vs. Cleveland (April 2-4; 2-1) and Oakland (April 6-8)...Marked first series win over Indians since Aug. 3-5, 2015...Halos have won five of last six games...Three of five wins on season have been in comeback fashion...Angels are 5-2 after seven games for a second straight season and look for a 6-2 start thru eight affairs for a second straight campaign...Following this homestand, LAA sets out on its second trip of 2018 to Texas (April 9-11) and Kansas City (April 12-15).

FAST FACTS: Prior to tonight's game, OF Justin Upton will be honored in a pregame ceremony and presented with his third career Silver Slugger Award...Angels are 13-3 in last 16 home games vs. Oakland...Club has averaged six runs per game in the 16 matchups (95 total runs)...Last season, Angels were 17-3 in Parker Bridwell's starts, marking best team record in a rookie's starts since Ted Wilks for the 1944 St. Louis Cardinals (18-3) (STATS LLC)...In March/April-May across last two seasons, Zack Cozart is batting .335 (67/200)... Angels relievers lead the A.L. with a 1.48 ERA (30.1 IP – 5 ER)...LAA has committed just two errors thru seven games.

<u>SHOEMAKER UPDATE:</u> Matt Shoemaker underwent an MRI Wednesday...Findings did not show acute trauma to the right elbow. He will undergo an EMG & nerve conduction on Monday in LA. More updates to follow.

FROM THE FARM: Local product & #8 prospect RHP Griffin Canning (Santa Margarita, UCLA) impressed in his professional debut for Inland Empire last night (4 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).

LAST GAME RECAP: On Wednesday, the Halos defeated the Indians 3-2 in 13 innings on a walk-off HR by Zack Cozart - his first career walk-off hit...First walk-off HR by Angels since Albert Pujols (August 3, 2016 vs. Oakland in 9th inning)...First extra-inning walk off HR for LAA since Pujols on August 9, 2014 vs. Boston (19th inning)...Angels' bullpen pitched 8.1 scoreless innings (2 H, 9 SO by 8 relievers)... Noé Ramirez notched his first career win... Andrelton Simmons (1 for 5) has hits in each of first seven games to open the year for the second straight season (matches longest career streak to open a season; 2017)...Longest hitting streak in Majors this season... Shohei Ohtani (2-5, 1 HR, 1 R, 2 RBI) tied the game at 2-2 in the fifth with a 2-run shot off C. Kluber, his second straight home game with a HR - first Angel to homer in first two career MLB home games...12 total bases through first three career games with a plate appearance ties **Bobby Clark** (1979) for franchise record...Five RBI through first three career games with a plate appearance ties franchise record (Bobby Clark in 1979).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Shohei Ohtani is the first player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since Babe Ruth on June 13-14, 1921...First rookie with 3+ hits and 1+ wins in his team's first 6 games of a season since Dutch Stryker for 1924 Boston Braves (STATS LLC)...First player with 4+ hits, a home run, and a win in his team's first six games since Wes Ferrell in 1937 for Red Sox (STATS LLC)...With last Sunday's start, Ohtani became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Babe Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Shohei Ohtani is the first Angels pitcher with at least six strikeouts in MLB pitching debut since Kevin Gregg in 2003...Ohtani is the second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' Masato Yoshii (4/5/98 vs. PIT).

OHTANI = BASEBALL RARITY: Prior to Ohtani, the last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both Bullet Joe Bush (Red Sox) and Clarence Mitchell (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders (STATS LLC).

NOW YOU KNOW: Shohei Ohtani is the fourth Japanese player to appear for the Halos:

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19<sup>th</sup> season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .539 (1,575-1,348) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history... Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter).

<u>ONLY ONE:</u> Entering 2018, 19,183 people had played Major League Baseball. Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is **Mike Trout.** 

<u>ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE:</u> Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).

<u>3000/600</u>: Albert Pujols is 25 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez.

MORE ALBERT: Pujols is vying to become the 32nd player all time with 3,000 hits, the sixth foreign born player to accomplish the feat and the second player to do so in an Angels' uniform (Rod Carew in 1985).

<u>NEW HALOS:</u> Angels Opening Day active roster features seven players new to the organization: Luke Bard, Jim Johnson, Shohei Ohtani, Rene Rivera, Zack Cozart, Ian Kinsler and Chris Young.

<u>Vs. ATHLETICS:</u> Halos lead 2018 series 3-1...Last Thursday marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)...Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7 (5-5 on road) and have won eight of last 10 meetings...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, **Mike Trout** is batting .326 (113/347) with 24 HR & 59 RBI in 90 games vs. Oakland.

(2008) Torii Hunter connects for a walk-off grand slam in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning vs. Cleveland – it was the 7<sup>th</sup> walk-off slam in club history; (1978) After throwing a complete game shutout on Opening Day of 1977, Tanana accomplished the same feat the following season with a 1-0 defeat of the Oakland A's in Anaheim; (1970) Andy Messersmith threw the first opening Day in Angels' history in a 12-0 blanking of the Milwaukee Brewers.

- VS. OAKLAND: In two career starts vs. A's (both last year), went 0-0 with a 19.50 ERA (6 IP 13 ER)...His two starts vs. Oakland were his only games of 2017 allowing six-or-more runs...Oakland accounted for 13 of his 49 earned runs allowed (27%) last season.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 12 career games (11 starts) at Angel Stadium, is 5-3 with a 3.89 ERA (69.1 IP 30 ER)...Has registered a quality start in seven of his 11 home starts.
- ROAD WARRIOR: In nine starts on the road last season, was 5-0 with a 3.31 ERA (51.2 IP 19 ER)...Angels were victorious in all nine contests, which is a franchise record to begin a career (previously belonging to Matt Palmer Angels won his first six road starts)...Streak of nine straight road wins to start his career is longest since Brooklyn's Clem Labine (9) in 1951-53...Only Major League pitcher with longer road streak to start a career is Yankees' Whitey Ford (13, from 1950-53).
