LEADING OFF: Angels play the fifth game (3-1) of their initial home stand of 2018 vs. **Cleveland** (April 2-4; 2-1) and **Oakland** (April 6-8; 1-0)...**Halos have won six of last seven games**...Four of six wins on season have been in comeback fashion (**LAA trailed 6-0 after 1 1/2 innings last night**)...Second straight April where Angels overcome 6-run deficit to win (also April 9, 2017 vs. **Seattle**)...**Angels are 6-2 after eight games for a second straight season...With a win tonight, Halos would move to 7-2 thru nine affairs to set a Club record (current best is 6-2-1 set in 1974)**...Following this home stand, LAA sets out on its second trip of 2018 to **Texas** (April 9-11) and **Kansas City** (April 12-15).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Fifth time in Angels history to win a game despite giving up five home runs (Last was May 31, 2016 vs. Detroit)...**Shohei Ohtani** (1-4, 1 R, 2 RBI, 1 HR, 1 BB, 1 SO) sets Angels records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, **Chris Davis**, **Tom Murphy** and **Matt Kemp**)...First Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games...**First A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since Babe Ruth (Five times; 1918-1921, 1930) (STATS LLC)**...Second Angels player to hit a home run in each of his first three home games of a season (**Bobby Bonds** in 1977)...Since RBI became official, he is first A.L. with a home run and 2+ RBI in each of first 3 career home games (STATS LLC)...**Andrelton Simmons** (3-5, 2 R, 2 RBI, 1 2B) is tied for MLB lead with **Matt Chapman** for longest active hitting streak (8; new career high to start a season)...Fourth multi-hit game of season (tied for second in A.L. with five others)...Tied for MLB lead with **Chapman** for hits (14)...Second Angel with 14+ hits and one or fewer strikeouts in first eight games of the season (**Garret Anderson**, 1997) (STATS LLC)...**Justin Upton** (3-5, 2 R, 3 RBI, 1 HR, 1 2B, 2 SO) logs third multi-hit game of the season...First three-hit game of the season and provides game-winning 3-run HR in 7th frame.

FAST FACTS: **LAA leads A.L. with 51 runs scored. .273 clip and 144 total bases**...In March/April-May across last two seasons, **Zack Cozart** is batting .328 (67/204)...**Angels relievers lead the A.L. with a 1.91 ERA (37.2 IP – 8 ER)**...LAA has committed just two errors thru eight games.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Shohei Ohtani is the first player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since Babe Ruth on June 13-14, 1921**...First rookie with 3+ hits and 1+ wins in his team's first 6 games of a season since **Dutch Stryker** for 1924 Boston Braves (STATS LLC)...First player with 4+ hits, a home run, and a win in his team's first six games since **Wes Ferrell** in 1937 for Red Sox (STATS LLC)...With last Sunday's start, **Ohtani** became the first player to **start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher** within his team's first 10 games since **Babe Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Shohei Ohtani is the first Angels pitcher with at least six strikeouts in MLB pitching debut since **Kevin Gregg** in 2003...Ohtani is the second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' **Masato Yoshii** (4/5/98 vs. PIT)...**Ironically, Yoshii was Ohtani's pitching coach the last two seasons with the Nippon-Ham Fighters**.

OHTANI = BASEBALL RARITY: Prior to Ohtani, the last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders (STATS LLC).

NOW YOU KNOW: Shohei Ohtani is the fourth Japanese player to appear for the Halos:

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .539 (1,576-1,348) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history... **Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter)**.

ONLY ONE: Entering 2018, 19,183 people had played Major League Baseball. Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is **Mike Trout**.

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 23 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining **Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** and **Alex Rodriguez**.

MORE ALBERT: Pujols is vying to become the 32nd player all time with 3,000 hits, the sixth foreign born player to accomplish the feat and the second player to do so in an Angels' uniform (**Rod Carew** in 1985).

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster features seven players new to the organization: **Luke Bard**, **Jim Johnson**, **Shohei Ohtani**, **Rene Rivera**, **Zack Cozart**, **Ian Kinsler** and **Chris Young**.

Vs. ATHLETICS: Angels are 14-3 in last 17 home games vs. Oakland...Club has averaged 6.4 runs per game in the 17 matchups (108 total runs)...**Halos lead 2018 series 4-1**...March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)...**Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7 (5-5 on road) and have won nine of last 11 meetings**...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, **Mike Trout** is batting .322 (113/351) with 24 HR & 59 RBI in 91 games vs. Oakland.

RANGERS ON DECK: First of three stops in Arlington in 2018 (**also Aug. 16-19) and Sept. 3-5**)...Texas claimed the 2017 season series 11-8 (Angels were 4-5 on road) and also won the 2016 season series 10-9...Halos are 7-11 in last two seasons in Arlington.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

April 7

(2008) **Torii Hunter** connects for a walk-off grand slam in the 9th inning vs. Cleveland – it was the 7th walk-off slam in club history; (1978) After throwing a complete game shutout on Opening Day of 1977, **Tanana** accomplished the same feat the following season with a 1-0 defeat of the Oakland A's in Anaheim; (1970) **Andy Messersmith** threw the first complete game shutout on Opening Day in Angels' history in a 12-0 blanking of the Milwaukee Brewers.

April 8

(1986) **Wally Joyner** makes his MLB debut going 1-for-5 (2B) at Seattle...He would finish second to **Jose Canseco** for Rookie of the Year honors in 1986, batting .290 with 22 HRs and 100 RBI; (1989) **Jim Abbott** made his major league debut vs. Seattle in Anaheim, becoming the 16th player in history to make his debut without a day in the minor leagues.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JC RAMIREZ

Tossed seven scoreless innings in last start vs. A's on April 25, 2017

- Making second start of the season for Angels...Is in fifth Major League season (third with Angels)...Begins a season in starting rotation for first time in MLB career.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** In four Cactus League starts for Angels, went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (13.1 IP – 8 ER) and 13 SO.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in season debut on Monday vs. Cleveland in Angels home opener after allowing five runs (four earned) on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts...Three home runs allowed match career-high
- **GOING DEEP:** Completed at least 7 IP six times last season (most by any Angels pitcher in 2017).
- **FIRST FRAME:** Last season, had a 5.63 ERA (24 IP – 15 ER) in the first, compared with a 3.80 ERA (118.1 IP – 50 ER) after the first inning as a starter.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 10 career games (one start) against Oakland, is 2-1 with a 2.95 ERA (18.1 IP – 6 ER)...In three games vs. A's last season (one start), went 1-0 with a 0.84 ERA (10.2 IP – 1 ER)...In only start (April 25 at Angel Stadium), worked seven scoreless innings, allowing two hits and two walks with seven strikeouts.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 37 career games (13 starts) at The Big A, is 5-8 with a 4.40 ERA (104.1 IP – 51 ER) with 75 strikeouts and 33 walks...As a starter, is 2-7 with a 4.83 ERA (78.1 IP – 42 ER) at The Big A...Has earned wins in two of last four home starts after going winless through first nine starts at The Big A.
- **2017 RECAP:** Appeared in 27 games (24 starts) for Angels last season and established career-highs in wins (11), strikeouts (105) and innings pitched (147.1)...His 11 victories led the Halos pitching staff...Set career-high with nine strikeouts on Apr. 19 at HOU and matched that total on Apr. 30 at TEX.
- **ROAD SUCCESS:** Was the winning pitcher in seven of last 10 road starts last season and has pitched to a 2.93 ERA (58.1 IP – 19 ER) in those contests...**Ranked fifth in the A.L. in road ERA from April 30-end of 2017 season...**With five game road win streak from April 30 – June 24, became first Angels pitcher to win five straight road starts since **Jered Weaver** won six straight from June 27 – Aug. 22, 2012.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Owns a 15-18 career record with a 4.66 ERA (278.1 IP – 144 ER) and 199 strikeouts in 136 career games (25 starts)...Made Major League debut with Philadelphia on June 23, 2013 vs. NYM...Did not pitch in Majors in 2014...Split 2015 season between Arizona and Seattle...Claimed off waivers by Angels from Reds on June 26, 2016.

Making second start as a pitcher of the season (both vs. Oakland)...Earned the win in pitching debut on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum after working six innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts; all three runs allowed came on three-run HR by Matt Chapman in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced.

- Connected for first career walk off hit Wednesday with a 13th inning solo home run...Was the first walk off home run by an Angel since Albert Pujols Aug. 3, 2016 vs. Oakland.
