LEADING OFF: Angels play the finale of their initial home stand of 2018 (3-2) vs. Cleveland (2-1) and Oakland (1-1)...Halos have won six of last eight games...LAA is 6-3 thru 9 G for a second straight season...Club looks for first 7-3 start thru 10 G since 1987...Tomorrow, LAA opens its second trip of 2018 to Texas (April 9-11) and Kansas City (April 12-15).

BACK TO COMING BACK: Four of six wins on season have been in comeback fashion (Halos led MLB with 47 comeback wins in 2017)...LAA erased a 6-0 deficit to win 13-9 Friday - second straight April Angels overcame 6-run deficit to win (also April 9, 2017 vs. Seattle).

SPEED AND POWER: From Sports Info Solutions, players in last 10 seasons to throw multiple pitches at 100 mph and homer: Syndergaard, Stephen Strasburg, Gerrit Cole Noah Harvey, Andrew Cashner, Michael Lorenzen Matt José Fernández and Shohei Ohtani (The Athletic).

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Shohei Ohtani has set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, Chris Davis, Tom Murphy and Matt Kemp)...Since RBI became official, he is first A.L. player with a home run and 2+ RBI in each of first three career home games (STATS LLC).

FAST FACTS: 10 walks last night by Angels' pitchers are most in a nine inning game since April 21, 2006 at Oakland (LAA leads A.L. with 43 free passes)...LAA leads A.L. with 54 runs scored, 90 hits, 15 HR and 158 total bases...Halo relievers lead the A.L. with a 2.42 ERA (44.2 IP - 12 ER) and .190 BAA...LAA has committed just two errors thru nine games.

PLAYER POINTS: In March/April-May across last two seasons, Zack Cozart is batting .329 (68/207)...Andrelton Simmons is second in A.L. with 14 hits (Matt Chapman leads with 15) ... Justin Upton's 23 total bases are third-most in A.L...Shohei Ohtani is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (Bobby Bonds in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since Babe Ruth (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - STATS LLC)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since Babe Ruth on June 13-14, 1921...First rookie with 3+ hits and 1+ wins in his team's first 6 games of a season since Dutch Stryker for 1924 Boston Braves (STATS LLC)...First player with 4+ hits, a home run, and a win in his team's first six games since Wes Ferrell in 1937 for Red Sox (STATS LLC)... Ohtani became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

BASEBALL RARITY: Prior to Ohtani, the last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both Bullet Joe Bush (Red Sox) and Clarence Mitchell (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders (STATS LLC).

TODAY FOR SHOHEI: With a winning decision today, Shohei Ohtani would become the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since Jim Shaw for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched). (STATS LLC)

ROSTER MOVES: Today the Angels recalled RHP Eduardo Paredes and RHP Felix Peña from Triple-A Salt Lake...RHP JC Ramirez (right elbow strain) was placed on the 10-day disabled list and RHP Akeel Morris has been optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake

NOW YOU KNOW: Shohei Ohtani is the fourth Japanese player to appear for the Halos

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .539 (1,576-1,349) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history... Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter)

> ALL-TIME MANAGER WINS 1,599 20. Tommy Lasorda 21. Mike Scioscia 1,576 22. Dick Williams 1,571

ONLY ONE: Entering 2018, 19,183 people had played Major League Baseball. Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is Mike Trout.

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 22 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez.

2000 RBI: Pujols enters today with 1,921 RBI – only four players have ever reached 2,000 in an MLB career: Hank Aaron (2,297), Babe Ruth (2,214), Alex Rodriguez (2,086) and Cap Anson (2,075) BASEBALL REFERENCE

ATHLETICS: Angels are 14-4 in last 18 home games vs. Oakland...Club has averaged 6.2 runs per game in the 18 matchups (111 total runs)...Halos lead 2018 series 4-2...March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)... Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7 and have won nine of last 12 meetings...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .318 (113/355) with 24 HR & 59 RBI in 92 games vs. Oakland.

Vs. GRAVEMAN: Albert Pujols is 14-for-33 (.424, 4 HR) and Mike Trout is 10-for-30 (.333. 2 HR).

RANGERS ON DECK: First of three stops in Arlington in 2018 (also Aug. 16-19) and Sept. 3-5) ... Texas claimed the 2017 season series 11-8 (Angels were 4-5 on road) and also won the 2016 season series 10-9...Halos are 7-11 in last two seasons in Arlington.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY April 8 (1986) Wally Joyner makes his MLB debut going 1-for-5 (2B) at Seattle... He would finish second to **Jose** second to Jose Canseco for Rookie of the Year honors in 1986, batting .290 with 22 HRs and 100 RBI; (1989) Jim Abbott made his major league debut vs. Seattle in Anaheim, becoming the 16th player in history to make his

debut without a day in the minors. April 9 (2009) Angels' pitcher Nick Adenhart (22) and friends Courtney Stewart (20) and Henry Pearson (25) were tragically killed by a drunk driver in a hit-and-run car accident in the early morning hours of April 9th in Fullerton, CA...A fourth passenger, **Jon** Wilhite (24), sustains critical injuries. (1966) The Angels played their first xhibition game at Anaheim Stadium, a 9-3 loss to San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

1-0, 4.50 ERA First start as a pitcher at Angel Stadium

- <u>WELCOME TO THE SHO:</u> Making second start as a pitcher and first at home...Made Major League debut with Angels on Opening Day as the starting designated hitter...Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017 and had contract selected by Angels on March 27.
- LAST TIME ON THE MOUND: Earned the win in first career start on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum after working six innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts; all three runs allowed came on three-run HR by Matt Chapman in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced...Became second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' Masato Yoshii (4/5/98 vs. PIT)...Yoshii was Ohtani's pitching coach the last two seasons with the Nippon-Ham Fighters.
- <u>2018 SPRING TRAINING</u>: In two Cactus League appearances, went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA (2.2 IP 8 ER) and five strikeouts...Also pitched in intrasquad and minor league games for Angels this Spring.
- THE BABE AND I: With his start on April 1 in Oakland, become first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Babe Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).
- <u>TWO WAY COMPANY:</u> The last time any player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher at any point within the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).
- <u>TOPPING THE RANKINGS</u>: Enters 2018 ranked by *MLB.com* as the #1 prospect in all of baseball...Is rated as top Angels prospect by *Baseball America* and #2 overall in baseball.
- VS. OAKLAND: In one career start vs. A's, is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 IP 3 ER) and six strikeouts.
- <u>AT ANGEL STADIUM</u>: Today marks first career appearance as a pitcher at Angel Stadium...With his starts at DH on this homestand, became first A.L. player to homer in 3 straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Babe Ruth**, who did it in five seasons (1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1930). (STATS LLC)
- <u>HALOS FROM JAPAN</u>: This season, joins **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.
- <u>AT THE PLATE:</u> For additional batting notes, please see Ohtani's section in the Angels hitters section of the game notes.
 <u>2017 RECAP:</u> Made five starts as a pitcher in 2017 for Nippon-Ham Fighters of Japanese Pacific League, and went 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (25.1 IP 9 ER) with 29 strikeouts...Was limited to five games pitching last season, due to an ankle injury...In his 65 games as a batter, hit .332 with 16 doubles, eight home runs and 31 RBI.
- CAREER NOTES: In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
- Earned a "Best Nine Award" as a pitcher for the Fighters in 2015 & 2016 after leading the Pacific League in ERA each season (2.24 in 2015 & 1.86 in 2016)...
- In 2016, was named Pacific League MVP...In 21 games (20 starts) as a pitcher, went 10-4 with a 1.86 ERA (140 IP 29 ER) with 174 strikeouts...Also appeared in 104 games as a hitter and batted .322 with 18 doubles, 22 HR and 67 RBI.
 Native of Ōshū, Japan...Made Pacific League debut with Fighters at age 18.
