Oakland Athletics (4-7) vs. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (3-6)

HOME SWEET HOME: Following their first road trip of the season, where they went 1-4 against the Diamondbacks (0-3) and the Giants (1-1), the Dodgers return home to open a five-game homestand with the first of two games against the Oakland Athletics for their first Interleague matchup of the year. Los Angeles has gone 3-6 to start the new season, which is the worst start for the club since 1996, when the club also dropped six of its first nine games. After the two-game set against the A's, the Boys in Blue will have an off-day Thursday before taking on the Diamondbacks for three games this weekend.

- Los Angeles, which played its second consecutive extra-inning game on Sunday afternoon, snapped its four-game losing streak with a 2-1 victory in the 10th inning against the Giants as they split the two-game series. Dodger catcher/infielder **Kyle Farmer** stroked the go-ahead RBI double in the 10th, as he recorded his second career game-winning hit, with both coming against San Francisco.
- Prior to tonight's contest, Dodger All-Star shortstop Corey Seager will be presented with the 2017 Silver Slugger Award, the second time he has earned the award in as many years. Also, the first 40,000 fans in attendance will receive the first installment of the 60th Anniversary Collector's Card Set presented by 76.

SEEING GREEN: Los Angeles is facing the A's for the first time since 2015, when they dropped three of four games against Oakland. The Dodgers split the series, 1-1, at Dodger Stadium three years ago and are 8-5 at the Ravine overall against the A's. The clubs will meet again for a two-game series in Oakland on August 7-8 and though they don't play often, there are many connections between the two teams:

- Prior to joining the Dodgers, General Manager Farhan Zaidi spent 10 seasons in the Athletics organization.
- Dodger bench coach Bob Geren spent 13 seasons in the Oakland organization (1999-2011), including serving as the manager from 2007 until June 9, 2011, posting a 334-376 record. Geren also spent three seasons as the bullpen coach for the A's from 2003-05 and spent one season as the bench coach in 2006.
- Dodger pitching coach Rick Honeycutt played for Oakland Series with the A's in 1989.
- Prior to being acquired by the Dodgers at the 2016 trade deadline, Rich Hill made 14 starts for the Athletics that year and went 9-3 with a 2.25 ERA (19 ER/76.0 IP).
- Former Los Angeles outfielder and current Dodger broadcaster Rick Monday was made the first ever player selected in the Major League First-Year Player Draft in 1965 by the Kansas City Athletics. Monday played six seasons for the Athletics (1966-71) and was named an All-Star in 1968.

RIDING WITH RYU: Dodger left-hander Hyun-Jin Ryu will make his second start of the season tonight and looks to record his first win of the year. Ryu made his first start of 2018 on April 2 at Arizona, allowing three runs on five hits in 3.2 innings with two strikeouts, as he did not factor in the decision. The southpaw also made his first career pinch-hit appearance on Saturday against the Giants, as he struck out with the bases loaded in the 12th inning.

- Last season, Ryu went 5-9 with one save and posted a 3.77 ERA in 25 games (24 starts). He struck out 116 batters against 45 walks in 126.2 innings and held opposing hitters to a .263 average, including a .240 mark against righties.
- Ryu, who will make his first career start against the Athletics tonight, has gone 3-3 with a 4.12 ERA (29 ER/63.1 IP) in 11 career Interleague starts. He has struck out 58 batters against just 17 walks, while holding hitters to a .258 average in Interleague matchups.
- On six or more days of rest since his last start throughout his career, Ryu has gone 9-6 with a 2.97 ERA (44 ER/133.1 IP) in 23 starts, while also holding hitters to a .250 average.

Dodger infielder/outfielder Chris Taylor has been dominant throughout his career when facing the opposing league, posting a career .306/.355/.450 slashline with 10 doubles, two homers and 13 RBI in 34 career Interleague contests. Taylor has also reached base safely in his last nine Interleague games, going 19-for-36 (.528) with six runs, six doubles, one homer, eight RBI and two stolen bases along with a 1.353 OPS.

IN A PINCH: The Dodger bench has proven to be very resourceful for Dodger manager Dave Roberts as the club currently leads the Majors with seven hits by a pinch-hitter and ranks among the league leaders in pinch-hit average (.389, 2nd), RBI (3, T-3rd) and OPS (.865, 9th).

Dodger second baseman Chase Utley has been clutch off the bench for Los Angeles, as he has gone 3-for-4 (.750) in pinchhit situations. Utley is currently tied with Atlanta's Lane Adams and Chicago-NL's Tommy La Stella for the league lead in hits as a pinch-hitter.

KINGS OF THE HILL: The Dodger pitching staff has started the season off on the right foot as Los Angeles leads the National League in from 1987-93 and once again in 1995. Honeycutt won a World ERA by starting pitchers, trailing just the Red Sox and Astros in the bigs:

Dodger starters have also held hitters to a .232 average, a 1.14 WHIP and has struck out 52 batters against just 14 walks in 51.2 innings.

CATCHING HEAT: The Dodger offense has been quiet to start the season with the exception of the catching duo of Yasmani Grandal and **Austin Barnes**, who have gotten off to solid starts:

Grandal, who has been a bright spot for the Dodger offense to start the year, has posted a .321 (9-for-28)/.406/.464 slashline with four runs, one double, one home run and three RBI in eight games. According to STATS, LLC., Grandal is one of only nine players in the league to lead his team in batting average, on-base percentage, hits and home runs in 2018.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, DODGER STADIUM: On this date in 1962, 52,564 Southern California baseball fans were in attendance to watch the Dodgers face the Cincinnati Reds in the first game at Dodger Stadium. Four-time World Series champion, Johnny Podres took the mound for Los Angeles, and took the loss in the Dodgers 6-3 defeat to the Reds.

- Became the fourth South Korean-born Dodger and first native Korean pitcher to start a postseason game on Oct. 6, 2013 against the Braves in NLDS Game 3, allowing four runs in 3.0 innings in a no-decision
- Selected as a seven-time KBO All-Star after going 98-52 with a 2.80 ERA in 190 career games (181 starts) with Hanwha Eagles from 2006-12...tossed 27 complete games and eight shutouts in Korea...won two KBO Gold Glove Awards (2006, 2010)
- Has had success pitching internationally for Korea in the 2008 Olympics and 2009 World Baseball Classic...won a Gold Medal as a member of the South Korean team at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, going 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA in Olympic play...went 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 ER/7.0 IP) in five games (two starts) in the 2009 World Baseball Classic, helping Team Korea to a silver medal
- Signed by Los Angeles on Dec. 12, 2012 after his posting by the Hanwha Eagles of the Korea Baseball Organization
