Oakland Athletics (4-8) vs. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (4-6)

LET'S MAKE IT THREE: Following the 4-0 shutout victory over the Athletics to open their five-game homestand last night, the Dodgers look to win their third consecutive game for the first time this season and win their first series of the year tonight. After blanking Oakland in yesterday's contest, Los Angeles is currently tied with the Kansas City Royals for the most shutout wins in the Majors with three. Following tomorrow's off-day, the Boys in Blue will take on their division rivals, the Diamondbacks, for a three-game weekend set.

Prior to tonight's contest, the Dodger organization will be awarded the 2017 Wilson Defensive Team of the Year Award, while right fielder Yasiel Puig will receive the 2017 Wilson Defensive Player of the Year as baseball's best defender in right field. Also, the first 40,000 fans in attendance will receive a Dodgers Hooded Sweatshirt presented by Security Benefit.

SEEING GREEN: Los Angeles, who is facing the A's for the first time since 2015, snapped its two-game skid against Oakland last night. Despite the Dodgers trailing in the overall series against the Athletics, 11-19, the Boys in Blue are 9-5 overall against Oakland at Dodger Stadium. The clubs will meet again for a two-game series in Oakland on August 7-8 and though they don't play often, there are many connections between the two teams:

- Prior to joining the Dodgers, General Manager Farhan Zaidi spent 10 seasons in the Athletics organization.
- Dodger bench coach Bob Geren spent 13 seasons in the Oakland organization (1999-2011), including serving as the manager from 2007 until June 9, 2011, posting a 334-376 record. Geren also spent three seasons as the bullpen coach for the A's from 2003-05 and spent one season as the bench coach
- Dodger pitching coach Rick Honeycutt played for Oakland from 1987-93 and once again in 1995. Honeycutt won a World Series with the A's in 1989.
- Prior to being acquired by the Dodgers at the 2016 trade deadline, Rich Hill made 14 starts for the Athletics that year and went 9-3 with a 2.25 ERA (19 ER/76.0 IP).
- Former Los Angeles outfielder and current Dodger broadcaster Rick Monday was made the first ever player selected in the Major League First-Year Player Draft in 1965 by the Kansas City Athletics. Monday played six seasons for the Athletics (1966-71) and was named an All-Star in 1968.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT: Dodger southpaw Alex Wood will take the mound tonight for his third start of the season and looks to record his first win of the year. In his last start on April 4 at Arizona, Wood allowed three runs on six hits in 6.0 innings with five strikeouts as he recorded the loss. Despite starting the season 0-1, Wood has been stellar on the mound as he has allowed just three runs in 14.0 innings (1.93 ERA), has held hitters to a .146 average and has posted a 0.50 WHIP, which is currently tied for the third lowest in the Majors (min. 10.0 IP). Wood has also struck out 10 batters without issuing a walk to start the season.

In two career starts against the Athletics, Wood has gone 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (5 ER/11.2 IP) and has limited the opposition to a .231 average. He last faced the A's on Aug. 19, 2015 in Oakland, allowing three runs on five hits in 5.2 innings and recorded the loss.

KINGS OF THE HILL: The Dodger pitching staff has started the season off on the right foot as Los Angeles leads the National League in ERA with a 2.47 mark (27 ER/98.1 IP) and trail just the Astros (2.02 ERA) for the big league lead.

- The Dodger pitching staff has been lights out, as they have allowed just one or fewer runs in six games this season, which is currently the most in the Majors.
- Dodger starters currently lead the senior circuit with a 2.03 ERA (13 ER/57.2 IP) and trail just the Boston Red Sox (1.68 ERA) and the Houston Astros (1.93 ERA) for the top spot in the Majors. They are also holding hitters to a .216 average (4th, ML) and are posting a 1.06 WHIP (2nd, ML).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Earlier today, Baseball Commissioner Robert D. Manfred, Jr. announced at a press conference at Dodger Stadium that Major League Baseball has awarded the 2020 All-Star Game Presented by Mastercard and accompanying All-Star Week festivities to the Los Angeles Dodgers. The 2020 Midsummer Classic, which will be the 91st edition in the event's history, will make its return to Los Angeles for the first time since 1980. This will mark the fourth time in franchise history that the Dodgers will hold the Midsummer Classic, including the third time in Los Angeles and the second at Dodger Stadium. Prior to the 1980 All-Star Game, the Dodgers played host to the Midsummer Classic in 1959 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum and in 1949 at Ebbets Field.

Alongside the Commissioner of Baseball, Dodger President and CEO Stan Kasten, Los Angeles City Councilmember Gilbert Cedillo, Dodger Manager Dave Roberts and Dodger All-Stars Kenley Jansen and Justin Turner were present on stage during the press conference this afternoon. Dodger Hall of Famers Tommy Lasorda and Jaime Jarrín, along with Dodger legends and former Dodger All-Stars Don Newcombe, Ron Cey, Reggie Smith, Bill Russell and Manny Mota were also in attendance.

INTERLEAGUE STRONG: With yesterday's win over the Athletics, the Dodgers have won 14 of their last 15 Interleague games and have been victorious in its last 10 consecutive home Interleague matchups. Los Angeles posted a 16-4 (.800) record in Interleague play last season, which tied for the best winning percentage in the Majors with Boston.

- Dodger infielder/outfielder Chris Taylor continued his dominance in Interleague play, as he led last night's game off for the Dodgers with a solo shot for his first homer of the season and his fourth career leadoff home run. Throughout his career when facing the opposing league, Taylor has posted a career .304/.352/.470 slashline with 10 doubles, three homers and 14 RBI in 35 career Interleague contests. Taylor has also reached base safely in his last 10 Interleague games, going 20for-40 (.500) with seven runs, six doubles, two homers, nine RBI and two stolen bases along with a 1.345 OPS.
- Dodger All-Star shortstop Corev Seager followed Taylor's home run with a longball of his own for his first home run of the season and the Dodgers first back-to-back homers of the year. Seager has also seen success against the opposing league, as he has hit safely in 13 consecutive Interleague games dating back to July 7, 2017. During that span, he has gone 17-for-54 (.315) with three runs, two doubles, two homers and 10 RBI.

お誕生日おめでとうございます!: The Dodgers would like to wish a very happy birthday to right-handed pitcher Kenta Maeda, who turns 30years-old today. Maeda, who is slated to make his second start of the season on Friday against the Diamondbacks, has gone 1-0 in two games (one start) and has yet to allow a run in 6.0 scoreless innings, while striking out 12 against just one walk. The native of Japan is in his third big league season, as he has gone 30-17 with a 3.73 ERA and has collected one save in 63 games (58 starts) with the Dodgers. Happy birthday Kenta!

The Dodgers would also like to wish a very happy birthday to hitting coach Turner Ward, who is turning 54 years-old. Ward, who is in his third season as the Dodgers' hitting coach, guided the Dodgers to establish franchise records in extra-base hits (553), doubles (312), home runs (221) and slugging percentage (.437) in 2017.

2017 REVIEW:

- In 27 games (25 starts), he collected a career-high 16 wins and posted a career-low 2.72 ERA (46 ER/152.1 IP) in his third season with the Dodgers...struck out 151 batters against 38 walks, while posting a 1.06 WHIP
- Held hitters to a .217 average, including a .213 mark against right-handed hitters…limited the opposition to a .186 average with runners on-base and a .167 mark with runners in scoring position
- Made 25 starts (15 quality starts) and went 15-3 with a 2.82 ERA (46 ER/147.0 IP) and held hitters to a .224 average...despite beginning the season in the bullpen, he ranked among big league starters (min. 125.0 IP) in wins (T-12th), ERA (6th), WHIP (1.09, 8th), opponents' OPS (.639, 9th), opponents' OBP (.281, 9th), home runs allowed per nine innings (0.92, 12th) and opponents' batting average (17th)
- Started the season 11-0 (April 15-July 15), becoming just the 19th pitcher since 1913 to start a season 11-0 or better and the first since Stephen Strasburg in 2016 (13-0)...his 11-game winning streak was also the second longest streak in the big leagues this season, trailing teammate Clayton Kershaw's 12-game streak
- Made 14 consecutive starts without a loss from April 10-July 15, which was the longest by a Dodger since Rick Rhoden, who went 19 straight starts without a loss in 1976...during that stretch, he went 10-0 with a 1.66 ERA (15 ER/81.1 IP) and limited hitters to a .183 average, while striking out 97 batters against 22 walks
- Selected to his first All-Star game in his fifth big league season and also finished ninth in the NL Cy Young voting
- Made two stints on the disabled list with a SC joint inflammation (May 29-June 10 & Aug. 22-Sept. 3), missing a total of 24 games
- Appeared in three games (two starts) in the postseason, going 0-1 with a 2.92 ERA (4 ER/12.1 IP) and limited batters to a .122 average...struck out 13 against just two walks in 12.1 innings...had a no-hit bid through 5.2 innings against the Astros in Game 4 of the World Series, which marked the longest no-hit bid in WS history by a Dodger pitcher

CAREER NOTES:

- The All-Star southpaw enters his fourth season with the Dodgers after having a breakout 2017 season, collecting a career-high 16 wins and posting a career-low 2.72 ERA in 27 games (25 starts)
- In five big league seasons, has gone 43-33 with a 3.20 ERA in 139 games (102 starts) with Atlanta (2013-15) and Los Angeles (2015-17)
- Has limited batters to a .248 average during the course of his career, including holding left-handed hitters to a .241/.290/.327 slash line...has held the opposition to a career .217 average with runners in scoring position
- Has gone 39-31 with a 3.26 ERA in 102 starts, while going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 37 career relief appearances
- Since his Major League debut in 2013, he ranks among National League leaders (min. 500.0 IP) in opponents grounded into double play per nine innings (0.91, 10th), home runs allowed per nine innings (0.75, 7th) and pickoffs (18, 4th)
- Has a career 3.19 strikeout-to-walk ratio, striking out 603 against 189 walks in 651.2 innings
- Selected to his first All-Star game in his fifth big league season in 2017...also finished ninth in the NL Cy Young voting last season
- Made his Major League debut on May 30, 2013 for the Braves, after having his contract purchased that day, allowing just one hit in 1.0 scoreless inning of relief against the Toronto Blue Jays
- Made his first career Major League start on June 18, 2013 against the New York Mets, allowing one run on two hits in 3.0 innings, recording the loss in the Braves' 3-4 defeat...struck out five and issued three walks on 73 pitches
- Picked up his first big league win on July 30, 2013, allowing three runs on six hits in 7.0 innings in the Braves' 11-3 victory against the Rockies
- Originally selected by the Atlanta Braves in the second round (85th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft from the University of Georgia
