TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin their second homestand of the season with a 7-day, 7-game homestand that features American League West opponents the Oakland Athletics (3 G) and the Houston Astros (4 G)...the Mariners are coming off a 10-day, 7-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1), Minnesota (1-1) and Kansas City (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS... Seattle has won 2 straight games...team is 4-3 during the day and 2-1 at night... Seattle is 2-1 at Safeco Field and 4-3 on the road.

- Seeing Double Robinson Canó is tied for 2nd with Rogers Hornsby for most home runs by a second baseman in Major League history, trailing only Jeff Kent's 377 career home runs.

 Left vs. Right - the Mariners are 3-0 when facing a left-handed starter and 3-4 vs. right-handed starters.

 Four Square - Seattle is 5-1 when scoring 4 runs-or-more, but 1-3 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

 Series Record - Seattle has won or tied each of its first 4 series (2-0-2) to begin the season for the 2nd time

- in club history, trailing only the 2001 team which began the season with 9 consecutive series without a loss.

GREEN AND GOLD...since 2015, the Mariners are 37-20 (.649) in 57 games vs. the Athletics, including winning 8 of the last 9 games vs. Oakland (7/9/17-c)...Seattle's .649 winning percentage vs. the Athletics is tied for the best record by an American League team against a division oppnent during this span: Seattle vs. Oakland (37-20/.649), Houston vs. Seattle (37-20/.649), Cleveland vs. Detroit (38-21/.644), New York-AL vs. Tampa Bay (37-22/.627) and Los Angeles-AL vs. Oakland (40-24/.625).

TRISKAIDEKAPHOBIA...today is Friday the 13th, marking the first of two times the Mariners will play on a Friday the 13th this season (also 7/13 vs. LAA)...the Mariners are 10-27 all-time on Friday the 13th (including postseason, 9-26 regular season)...the Mariners last game on Friday the 13th was a 6-7 loss at the Los Angeles Angels on May 13, 2016...the Mariners have scored 13 runs on Friday the 13th on one occasion, a 13-7 win at Minnesota on Sept. 13, 1996.

BE LIKE MIKEsince being acquired by the Mariners on Aug. 30, 2017, Mike Leake leads the club in wins (5), ERA (2.66) and innings pitched (44.0 IP) while ranking 2nd in strikeouts (31)...Leake is one of 10 AL pitchers with at least 5 wins, 40.0 innings pitched and an ERA below 2.70 during that span (8/30/17-c)...he is joined by Trevor Bauer-CLE, Carlos Carrasco-CLE, Mike Clevinger-CLE, Corey Kluber-CLE, J.A. Happ-TOR, Charlie Morton-HOU, Jake Odorizzi-TB/MIN, Luis Severino-NYY and Justin Verlander-DET/HOU.

DON'T YOU KNOW...Robinson Canó has reached base safely in all 10 games this season, including 9 games with at least 1 hit...overall he is batting .406 (13x32) with 10 runs scored, 4 doubles, 4 RBI, 2 HBP and 7 walks...**Canó** is the fifth Mariners player with at least 10 runs scored, 10 hits and 5 walks in the team's first 10 games of the season, joining **Mitch Haniger** in 2017 (10 R, 10 H, 7 BB), **Ichiro Suzuki** in 2006 (10 R, 10 H, 5 BB), Ken Griffey Jr. in 1997 (14 R, 14 H, 5 BB) and **Edgar Martinez** in 1995 (10 R, 12 H, 7 BB).

ENJOY THE OFF DAY ... yesterday was the Mariners fifth off day in the first 15 days of the season (4 scheduled off days & 1 postponed game)... Seattle has played 10 games this season, which is the fewest in the Majors...Colorado, Los Angeles-AL, San Diego and Texas leads the Majors Leagues with 14 games played...beginning on today, the Mariners will play 17 consecutive games (April 13-29) before their next scheduled off day on April 30...the Mariners also are entering a stretch where they play 23 games in 24 days and 36 games over 38 games (April 13-May 20)...Seattle's only two off days during this stretch are Monday, April 30 and Monday, May 7.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING...Dee Gordon has hit safely in the first 10 games of the season, batting 333 (14x42) with 7 runs scored, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 2 walks and 5 stolen bases...his 10-game hitting streak is currently T3rd-longest active streak in the Majors League, trailing 11-game hitting streaks by Brian Dozier-MIN and Marcell Ozuna-STL...Gordon is the 7th Mariners player to start the season with a hitting streak of at least 10 games and the first since Endy Chavez (10 G) in 2009...only Joey Cora (16 G in 1998) and Bruce Bochte (14 G in 1979) have had longer hitting streaks to open a season as a Mariner than Gordon.

STREAKING...dating back to Sept. 26, 2017, Dee Gordon has hit safely in 16 consecutive games, batting .353 (24x68) with 14 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 2 walks and 9 stolen bases...his 16-game hitting streak combined over the last 2 seasons is the 2nd-longest in his career, trailing only a career-high 17-game hitting streak, Aug. 27-Sept. 14, 2017...also dating back to Aug. 27, 2017, Gordon has hit safely in 39 of 43 games, including 21 multi-hit contests, batting .360 (67x186) with 33 runs scored, 3 doubles, 4 triples, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 1 HBP, 4 walks and 19 stolen bases...during this stretch Dee ranks 3rd in the Majors with a .360 average (min. 75 PA), trailing only Josh Reddick-HOU (.364/39x107) and Buster Posey-SF (.364/47x129).

MILESTONE TRACKER...Kyle Seager is in his 8th season with Seattle, since making his debut in 2011 and is quickly moving up the Mariners all-time offensive rankings:

- Seager (215) trails Raúl Ibañez (216) by 1 double for 5th-most in franchise history. Seager (155) trails Raúl Ibañez (156) by 1 home runs for 6th-most in club history. Seager (534) trails Bret Boone (535) by 1 RBI for 8th-most in franchise history.

- Seager (363) trails Raúl Ibañez (367) by 4 walks for 8th-most in club history.

AS YOU KNOW...Robinson Canó (.406), Dee Gordon (.333) and Jean Segura (.333) are each batting .333 or better through the first 10 games of the season... BUT DID YOU KNOW?... Cano, Gordon and Segura are the fifth trio of Mariners to have hit a .333 or better batting average through the team's first 10 games of the season and first since 2001?...they join Edgar Martinez (.424), Bret Boone .382) and Ichiro Suzuki (.341) in 2001, Glenallen Hill (.394), David Segui (.390), Russ Davis (.375) and Joey Cora (.341) in 1998, Ken Griffey Jr. (.424), Edgar Martinez (.368) and Alex Rodriguez (.333) in 1997, Alvin Davis (.371), Jeffrey Leonard (.353) and Harold Reynolds (.350) in 1989 and Bruce Bochte (.417), Leon Roberts (.417) and Ruppert Jones (.353) in 1979).

 Michael Raymond Leake.

 30-year-old right-hander is making his 3rd start of the season, 8th Mariners start, 236th career start, 241st career appearance and 4th career start vs. the Athletics tonight.

 Anative of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School. Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12. Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Play-
- er Draft...did not sign.
 Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
 Is 14-11 with a 3.89 ERA (110 ER, 254.2 IP) in 40 career GS in April.

LAST OUTING...earned his second win of the season in a 5-4 Mariners win at Minnesota on April 7, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and 4...was lifted with no outs in the 6th inning after allowing consecutive doubles...prior to that, had allowed just 1 hit, retiring 14 of the first 19 batters he faced.

HELLO, SEATTLE ... since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 5-1 with a 2.66 ERA (13 ER, 44.0 IP) in 7 starts (5 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in ERA, wins, innings pitched (44.0) and strikeouts (31).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 6 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (14 ER, 23.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 1 walk...threw 6.0 innings in his final spring start on 3/21 vs. MIL, allowing 4 runs on 10 hits while walking 1 and striking out 4.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

NO APRIL FOOLS ... Leake went 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (5 ER, 33.1 IP) in 5 April starts in 2017...his 1.35 ERA in April was the 4th-lowest in the Majors in 2017, ranking just ahead of Mariners starter James Paxton (1.39)...overall he is 13-11 with a 3.89 ERA (108 ER, 249.2 IP) in 39 career starts in the month of April.

FOUR SCORE...is 8-1 with a 3.11 ERA (29 ER, 84.0 IP) in his last 13 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to April 23, 2017...his clubs are a combined 10-3 in those 13 games (7-3 w/STL, 3-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 64-4 with a 3.40 ERA (232 ER, 615.0 IP) in 95 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 76-19 in those 95 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 235 starts, 16th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 16th in innings pitched (1458.1).

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in the Majors made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber-CLE, 8, Chris Sale-BOS, 4, Carlos Martinez-STL, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom-NYM,

4 and Carlos Carrasco-CLE, 4).

QUICK RISE...became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11,

minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on Āpril 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 85-77 with a 3.98 ERA (644 ER, 1458.1 IP) with 989 strikeouts and 349 walks in 240 career games (235 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
