BOSTON RED SOX (16-2) at OAKLAND A'S (9-10)

EASTERN STANDARD: The Red Sox entered today with a 4.0-game lead in the AL East, the largest lead for any of the six current 1st-place teams...The Sox' largest lead of the 2017 season was 5.5 games.

THE BIG PICTURE: The Red Sox rank 1st in the majors in win % (.889, 16-2), run differential (+66), and runs per game (6.44), as well as 2nd in ERA (2.63) and fielding % (.992).

☛ The Sox are 6-0-0 in series, having earned sweeps at MIA (2-0), vs. TB (3-0), vs. BAL (3-0), and at LAA (3-0).

FOR THE RECORD: At 16-2, the Red Sox are off to the best start through 18 games in the franchise's 118-year history...The club's 2nd-best start was in 1946 (15-3).

☛ BOS is the 7th team since 1900 to win at least 16 of its first 18 games, joining the 1987 Brewers (17-1), 1984 Tigers (16-2), 1981 A's (17-1), 1955 Dodgers (16-2), 1918 Giants (17-1), and 1911 Tigers (16-2).

WINNING WAYS: The Red Sox lost to the Rays on Opening Day, 6-4, but they have since gone 16-1...It is the first time BOS has gone 16-1 over any 17-game stretch since 2004 (16-1 from 8/16-9/3)...They last went 17-1 over an 18-game stretch in 1988 (19-1 over 20 games from 7/15-8/3).

☛ The Sox own MLB's longest active win streak (7 games)...They also won 9 straight from 3/30-4/10.

MANAGING EXPECTATIONS: According to Elias, the Red Sox are the only MLB team since 1900 to win at least 16 of its first 18 games with a manager in his 1st season with the club.

☛ The only other Red Sox manager to win 16+ of his first 18 games with the club was Joe Morgan, who took over at the 1988 All-Star break and went 19-1 in his first 20 games in his managerial debut.

KEEPING SCORE: According to Elias, the Sox' +66 run differential is the 2nd-best for any team through 18 games in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), trailing only the 1993 Tigers (+67).

☛ The Sox have scored 116 runs, tied for their 4th-most through the first 18 games of a season (123 in 1950, 118 in 2003, 117 in 1924, 116 in 1995)...In their last 11 games, the Sox have scored 92 runs (8.4 per game).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.291), well ahead of the 2nd-highest mark (ATL-.271)...BOS also leads the majors in OBP (.362), SLG (.496), OPS (.859), doubles (55), and XBH (82)...The Sox own MLB's lowest strikeout percentage (16.3%; 120 SO in 735 PA).

☛ The Sox' 55 doubles are the most for any ML team through 18 games since at least 1908...Their 82 XBH are the most for any Sox team through 18 games since at least 1908.

☛ The Sox have recorded 10+ hits in each of their last 6 games...Since 6/20/17, they are 44-1 (.978) in such games...They have recorded 14+ hits in each of the last 3.

EARLY AND OFTEN: The Red Sox have scored 18 runs in the 1st inning, most in the AL and 3rd-most in MLB (WSH-23, ATL-19)...The Sox have scored in the 1st inning in 5 of their last 6 games, including each of their last 3.

☛ The Sox have scored 4+ runs in a single inning 10 times, tied with PHI for the most such innings this season.

POWER SURGE: The Red Sox hit 11 HR at LAA, their 3rd-most ever in a 3-game series (16 HR vs. NYY in June 1977, 14 HR vs. STL in June 1950).

☛ The Sox rank 6th in the majors in HR (24), only 3 behind the MLB leaders (COL and LAA, 27)...In 2017, the Sox hit their 24th HR on 5/7, their 31st game.

☛ The Sox lead MLB with 4 grand slams, after hitting none in 2017...According to Elias, this is the 1st time the Sox have ever hit 4 grand slams before May 1.

WEEK IN REVIEW: The Red Sox out-scored the Angels by a 27-3 margin in a 3-game sweep from Tuesday-Thursday...The +24 run differential was the Sox' highest in a 3-game series since May 2016 vs. OAK (+25).

☛ The Angels entered the series with the majors' highest run differential (+48) and 2nd-best record (13-3, .813)...According to Elias, the Sox are the 1st team since the 1957 Yankees to sweep a series of 3+ games on the road against an opponent that entered the series with an .800+ win % (min. 10 games into season).

PITCHING IN: The Red Sox rank 2nd in the majors with a 2.63 ERA (HOU-2.45)...It is the club's 4th-lowest ERA through 18 games in the Live Ball Era, trailing only 2001 (2.10), 1988 (2.50), and 1992 (2.61).

☛ The Sox own the majors' lowest opponent AVG (.207), opponent OPS (.578), and HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.54; 10 HR).

☛ The Sox have allowed 3 runs or fewer in a ML-best 15 of their 18 games, including each of their last 7.

START ME UP: Red Sox starters are 12-1 with a 1.98 ERA (22 ER/100.0 IP)...According to Elias, it is the club's 2nd-lowest starter ERA through 18 games since earned runs became an official stat in the AL in 1913 (1.50 in 1917).

☛ Sox starters lead the majors in ERA...Elias notes that the last MLB team with a sub-2.00 starter ERA through the first 18 games of a season was ATL in 2014 (1.54).

WHAT A RELIEF: Red Sox relief pitchers have allowed 0 runs in their last 14.0 IP, and 1 run in their last 20.0 IP...BOS relievers gave up 6 ER on Opening Day, but since then they have a 2.86 ERA and a .193 opponent AVG (66.0 IP, 45 H, 21 ER).

☛ Opponents are 3 for their last 48 (.063) against Sox relievers, including 1 for their last 28 (.036).

BEST OF THE BETTS: Mookie Betts leads MLB in runs (22), AVG (.391), SLG (.797), and OPS (1.277)...He also leads the AL in doubles (8), HR (tied, 6), and XBH (14).

☛ According to Elias, Betts' 22 runs are the most in club history through the first 18 games of a season.

☛ Betts hit his 13th career leadoff HR last night, extending his own franchise record...He has 63 HR as a leadoff hitter, 2nd-most in club history behind Dom DiMaggio (69).

DIALED IN: J.D. Martinez began the season 0-for-8, but he is since 23-for-60 (.383)...He is 13 for his last 22 (.591) and has homered in 4 of his last 11 games.

☛ Andrew Benintendi began the season 0-for-13, but has since gone 16-for-47 with 10 BB (.340 AVG, .456 OBP).

☛ Brock Holt is 7 for his last 15 (.467) with 3 XBH, after starting the season 1-for-18 (.056).

☛ In his last 8 games, Jackie Bradley Jr. is 9-for-27 (.333).

☛ Rafael Devers has hit safely in each of his last 13 road games since 9/18/17, MLB's longest active streak...In his last 6 games overall, he is 11-for-27 (.407).

THIS LAND IS MORELAND: Mitch Moreland has homered in each of his last 3 games at Oakland Coliseum...He has 14 HR in only 45 career games at OAK, tied with Mike Trout for the most by a visitor at the venue since the start of 2010.

☛ Moreland began the season 0-for-12...He is since 12-for-23 (.522) with 6 XBH.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Is making his 2018 season debut after being activated from the DL earlier today.
- Made 2 starts during his rehab assignment: 4/8 with Triple-A Pawtucket, 4/13 with Double-A Portland...Combined to go 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (4 ER/9.2 IP).
- Completed his 1st full season with the Red Sox in 2017...Went 17-6 with a 3.32 ERA (64 ER/173.2 IP), a .252 opponent AVG (166-for-659), a 1.35 WHIP, 174 SO, and 69 BB in 32 starts.
- The Red Sox were 22-10 in his starts last year, including 14-4 in his final 18.
- Allowed 2 runs or fewer in a ML-leading 23 starts during the 2017 season, joining Babe Ruth (28 in 1916) and Roger Clemens (23 in 1990) as the only Red Sox since at least 1908 with 23+ such outings in a single season.
- Ranked among AL leaders last season in wins (T-4th, 17), win % (4th, .739), ERA (7th, 3.32), starts (T-9th, 32), SO (12th, 174), and opponent AVG (12th, .252).
- Was also among league leaders in opponent SLG (9th, .388), opponent OPS (12th, .712), SO/9.0 IP ratio (9th, 9.02), and SO/BB ratio (17th, 2.52).

Pomeranz's .645 winning percentage (20-11) since making his Red Sox debut on 7/20/16 is tied for the 6th-highest mark in the AL during that time (min. 25 decisions).

Holds a 3.68 ERA (99 ER/242.1 IP) in 46 appearances (45 starts) with the Red Sox since being acquired from SD via trade on 7/14/16.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

Made 73 appearances (19 starts) for the Athletics from 2014-15...Was 10-10 with a 3.08 ERA (53 ER/155.0 IP).

Is 7-2 with a 3.08 ERA (25 ER/73.0 IP) 36 career appearances (10 starts) at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...In those 10 starts, is 5-1 with a 3.70 ERA (20 ER/48.2 IP).

Made each of his 2 career starts vs. OAK in 2017, going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (2 ER/10.0 IP).

Allowed 2 runs (1 ER) over 4.0 IP in his lone road start vs. the club (ND, 5 H, 2 BB, 6 SO).

ON THE ROAD:

Over 31 road starts in 2016-17, went 14-10 with a 2.96 ERA (59 ER/179.2 IP)...Ranked among ML pitchers on the road in that time (min. 150.0 IP) in ERA (11th), opponent AVG (11th, .226), and opponent OPS (11th, .666).

Went 7-3 in 15 road starts during 2017...His 3.19 ERA (30 ER/84.2 IP) in those outings was the 6th-lowest in the AL.

Won a career-long 7 consecutive road decisions from 5/31-8/28/17...Was tied for the 2nd-longest road winning streak in the AL last season (T-5th in MLB), and marked the longest by a Red Sox since Clay Buchholz in 2009-10 (9).

2018 SPRING TRAINING:

Made 1 Grapefruit League start on 3/2 at STL...Did not allow a baserunner in the 1st inning prior to exiting the game with left forearm tightness.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Went 17-6 with a 3.32 ERA (64 ER/173.2 IP), a .252 opponent AVG (166-for-659), a 1.35 WHIP, 174 SO, and 69 BB in 32 starts during his 1st full season with BOS.
- Pitched 5.0+ innings and allowed 2 ER or fewer in 20 of his starts, throwing 6.0+ innings in 15 of those.
- Made 10 starts against teams that qualified for the postseason, going 6-1 with a 2.62 ERA (16 ER/55.0 IP)...BOS went 9-1 in those.
- Posted a 5.29 ERA through his first 7 starts, but went 14-2 with a 2.84 ERA (44 ER/139.2 IP) in 25 starts from 5/20 through the end of the season...Among AL pitchers, only Corey Kluber (1.62) and Luis Severino (2.77) had lower ERAs in that time.
- Lost only 1 of his 19 starts from 5/20-8/28 (11-1).
- Posted the longest winning streak by a Red Sox pitcher in 2017 (8-0 in 12 starts from 6/27-8/28)...Was 1 of only 6 ML pitchers with a winning streak of 8+ games.
- Held opponents to a .211 AVG with RISP (30-for-142), the 5th-lowest mark in the AL and 9th-lowest in MLB.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- In 59 ML relief appearances, has a 2.10 ERA (15 ER/64.1 IP) and a .189/.261/.282/.543 opponent batting line...Has a 3.84 career ERA (244 ER/571.2 IP) as a starter, including a 3.38 mark (165 ER/440.0 IP) in 81 starts from 2014-17.
- Named an NL All-Star in 2016, representing the host Padres on 7/12 in San Diego...Traded to the Red Sox 2 days later.
- Selected to the 2011 All-Star Futures Game while with Single-A Kinston...Was the No. 5 overall pick in the 2010 June Draft (CLE).

- Sale's 1.23 ERA marks his 2nd-lowest through the first 4 starts of a season (0.91 in 2017).
- Is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER/11.0 IP) in 2 road starts this season...Limited opponents to a .162 AVG (6-for-37) in those outings while posting a 0.82 WHIP.
- Is 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (14 ER/58.0 IP) in 8 career starts vs. OAK...Recorded 62 SO and 9 BB in those, posting a .192 opponent AVG (40-for-208) and 0.84 WHIP.

- In his last 3 games, is 7-for-13 (.538) with a 2B, 4 HR, 6 runs, 4 RBI, a .600 OBP, 1.538 SLG, and 2.138 OPS.
- Is tied for the AL lead with 6 HR...Has 22 runs through 18 team games, the most by a Red Sox hitter through 18 team games since at least 1908...The last AL hitter to reach that mark through 18 team games was Alex Rodriguez in his 2007 MVP season (24).
- Leads MLB in AVG (.391), SLG (.797), OPS (1.277), runs scored (22), and total bases (51, tied)...Ranks among AL leaders in hits (4th, 25), 2B (1st, 8), HR (T-1st, 6), RBI (T-8th, 14), OBP (3rd, .481), and XBH (1st, 14).
- Has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games, and reached base in 25 of his last 26 and 52 of his last 56.
