BOSTON RED SOX (17-2) at OAKLAND A'S (9-11)

THE BIG PICTURE: The Red Sox rank 1st in the majors in win % (.895, 17-2), run differential (+70), runs per game (6.47), and fielding % (.993), as well as 2nd in ERA (2.64).

• The Sox are 6-0-0 in series, having earned sweeps at MIA (2-0), vs. TB (3-0), vs. BAL (3-0), and at LAA (3-0).

FOR THE RECORD: At 17-2, the Red Sox are off to the best start through 19 games in the franchise's 118-year history.

• BOS is the 7th team since 1900 to win at least 17 of its first 19 games, joining the 1987 Brewers (17-2), 1984 Tigers (17-2), 1981 A's (17-2), 1955 Dodgers (17-2), 1918 Giants (18-1), and 1911 Tigers (17-2).

WINNING WAYS: The Red Sox lost to the Rays on Opening Day, 6-4, but they have since gone 17-1...It is the first time BOS has gone 17-1 over *any* 18-game stretch since 1988 (19-1 over 20 games from 7/15-8/3).

SOX STREAKS: The Red Sox own MLB's longest active winning streak (8 games)...They also won 9 straight games from 3/30-4/10...This is the 1st time since 1978 the Sox have recorded multiple win streaks of 8+ games in a single season...They last had multiple win streaks of 9+ games in a single season in 1948.

APRIL SHOWERS: The Sox are 15-1 (.938) in April, with 9 games remaining in the month...BOS has never won more than 18 games in April, doing so in 1998, 2003, and 2013...The Sox' highest win % in any April is .846 (11-2 in 1918).

MANAGING EXPECTATIONS: According to Elias, the Red Sox are the only MLB team since 1900 to win at least 17 of its first 19 games with a manager in his 1st season with the club.

• The only other Red Sox manager to win 17+ of his first 19 games with the club was Joe Morgan, who took over at the 1988 All-Star break and went 19-1 in his first 20 games in his managerial debut.

KEEPING SCORE: According to Elias, the Sox' +70 run differential is the 2nd-best for any team through 19 games in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), trailing only NYY in 2003 (+74).

• The Sox have scored 123 runs, their 5th-most through the first 19 games of a season (most since 2003, 124 R)...In their last 12 games, the Sox have scored 99 runs.
 • The Sox have scored 18 runs in the 1st inning, most in the AL...They have scored 4+ runs in a single inning 11 times, the most such innings in MLB this season.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.293), well ahead of the 2nd-highest mark (OAK-.270)...BOS also leads the majors in OBP (.361), SLG (.497), OPS (.858), doubles (56), and XBH (85)...The Sox own MLB's lowest strikeout percentage (16.3%; 126 SO in 771 PA).

• The Sox' 56 doubles are the most for any ML team through 19 games since BOS in 2003 (also 56).
 • The Sox' 85 XBH are the 2nd-most for any Sox team through 19 games since at least 1908 (86 in 2003).
 • The Sox have recorded 10+ hits in each of their last 7 games...They last had a *longer* streak in 2008 (11 games from 5/2-12)...Since 6/20/17, they are 45-1 (.978) when recording 10+ hits.

POWER SURGE: The Red Sox have hit 13 HR in their last 4 games, after hitting 13 in their first 15 games.

• The Sox rank T-4th in the majors in HR (26), only 2 behind the MLB leaders (COL and LAA, 28)...In 2017, the Sox ranked 27th in MLB with 168 HR (last in the AL).

GRAND OLD TIME: The Red Sox lead MLB with 5 grand slams...According to Elias, BOS is only the 2nd team ever to hit 5+ grand slams before May 1 (1996 Expos, 6)...Prior to 2018, the Sox had never hit 4+ grand slams before May 1.

• All 5 of the Sox' grand slams have come in their last 12 games, after they hit none in their previous 176 games.
 • 5 different Red Sox have hit a grand slam this season: Xander Bogaerts (4/7 vs. TB), Mookie Betts (4/10 vs. NYY), J.D. Martinez (4/11 vs. NYY), Rafael Devers (4/18 at LAA), and Mitch Moreland (4/20 at OAK).

THIS LAND IS MORELAND: Mitch Moreland has homered in each of his last 4 games at Oakland Coliseum...He is 1 of 6 players in the ballpark's history (1966-2018) to homer in 4+ straight games here as a visitor...The only players to homer in 5 consecutive games here as a visitor are Mike Trout (2013-14) and Danny Tartabull (1990-91).

• Moreland has 15 HR in only 46 career games at OAK, the most by a visitor here since the start of 2010.
 • Moreland has an active 8-game hitting streak and has 9 RBI in his last 3 games...He began the season 0-for-12, but he is since 13-for-27 (.481) with 7 XBH.

BAY AREA VS. BAY STATE: The Red Sox are 17-33 (.340) in their last 50 games at Oakland Coliseum, but they have won each of their last 2 games here, and 7 of their last 12.

• In 2017, the Sox lost 3 straight games at OAK from 5/18-20, dropping to 21-21 on the year...Since then, the Sox are 89-50 (.640), just a half-game behind CLE (89-49, .645) for the majors' best record in that time.

PITCHING IN: The Red Sox rank 2nd in the majors with a 2.64 ERA (HOU-2.34)...It is the club's 4th-lowest ERA through 19 games in the Live Ball Era, trailing only 2001 (2.19), 1920 (2.55), and 1988 (2.62).

• The Sox own the majors' lowest opponent OPS (.583).
 • The Sox have allowed 3 runs or fewer in a ML-best 16 of their 19 games, including each of their last 8...They are the 1st team since the 1982 Angels to allow 3 runs or fewer in 16+ of a season's first 19 games.
 • The last time the Sox allowed 3 runs or fewer in 9+ straight games was 2013 (11 straight, 8/19-31).

START ME UP: Red Sox starters are 12-1 with a 2.17 ERA (25 ER/103.2 IP)...It is the club's lowest starter ERA through 19 games in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...BOS starters have allowed 1 or 0 runs in 13 of the club's 19 games.

• Sox starters rank 2nd in the majors in ERA (HOU-2.15).

WHAT A RELIEF: Red Sox relief pitchers have allowed 0 runs in their last 19.1 IP, and 1 run in their last 25.1 IP...The longest scoreless streak by Sox relievers in 2017 was 26.0 IP (6/11-17).

• BOS relievers gave up 6 ER on Opening Day, but since then they have a 2.65 ERA and a .198 opponent AVG (71.1 IP, 50 H, 21 ER)...Opponents are 8 for their last 68 (.118) against Sox relievers.

THIS AND THAT: Mookie Betts leads MLB in runs scored (23), AVG (.382), SLG (.765), and OPS (1.234)...He also leads the AL in doubles (8) and XBH (14).

• In his last 9 games, Jackie Bradley Jr. is 10-for-30 (.333) with 2 HR and a 1.029 OPS.
 • Rafael Devers has hit safely in each of his last 14 road games since 9/18/17, MLB's longest active streak.
 • J.D. Martinez began the season 0-for-8, but he is since 23-for-60 (.383)...He is 13 for his last 22 (.591) and has homered in 4 of his last 11 games.

TONIGHT'S START:

Allowed 1 or 0 runs in each of his first 4 starts this season, tying a career-long streak at any point during a season (5x)...Had not strung together back-to-back starts with 1 or 0 runs to begin a season prior to 2018.

Sale is 1 of 4 Red Sox to allow 1 or 0 runs in each of his first 4 starts of season as a member of the Opening Day rotation (since 1908)...The other Red Sox with such a streak are Cy Young (4, 1908), Dutch Leonard (6, 1914), and Roger Clemens (4, 1991).

Sale's 1.23 ERA marks his 2nd-lowest through the first 4 starts of a season (0.91 in 2017).

Ranks among AL leaders in ERA (4th, 1.23), SO (T-8th, 31), opponent OPS (9th, .510), SO/9.0 IP ratio (T-3rd, 12.68), and WHIP (11th, 0.95).

Also ranks 4th in the AL with a 6.20 SO/BB ratio...Owns the highest SO/BB ratio in March/April (4.73, 232 SO/49 BB) over the last 100 seasons (min. 200.0 IP).

His 4 starts with 1 or 0 runs allowed lead the majors in 2018...Sale's 18 such starts since the beginning of 2017 are tied with Luis Severino for the most in the majors over that time.

Leads the majors in scoreless starts since the beginning of 2017 (11).

Enters today limiting RHH to a .179 AVG (12-for-67) this season...Has not allowed a hit to 7 batters faced with RISP in 2018.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

Allowed 2 runs over 7.0 IP on 5/19/17 at OAK, his last start vs. the club (ND, 7 H, 10 SO).

Is 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (14 ER/58.0 IP) in 8 career starts vs. OAK...Struck out 62 and issued 9 BB in those outings, posting a .192 opponent AVG (40-for-208) and 0.84 WHIP.

Allowed 3 runs or fewer in each of his 4 career starts at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...Tossed 7.0+ innings in 3 of those contests.

Was 3-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 ER/27.1 IP), 36 SO, and 4 BB in 4 starts vs. the AL West in 2017.

ON THE ROAD:

Is 0-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER/11.0 IP) in 2 road starts this season...Has limited opponents to a .162 AVG (6-for-37) in those outings while posting a 0.82 WHIP.

Allowed 1 or 0 runs in each of his last 3 road starts (beginning 9/20/17)...Strung together a career-long 4 consecutive such starts twice: 4/15-5/13/16 with CWS; 7/21-8/13/17 with BOS.

Both his 191 SO and 13 double-digit SO efforts on the road in 2017 are the highest single-season totals in the majors in the last 100 years.

Over 21 road starts with BOS, is 10-5 with a 2.56 ERA (39 ER/137.0 IP)...Allowed 2 runs or fewer in 13 of those outings.

Leads the majors with 206 SO on the road since the start of 2017, trailing only Ivan Nova (137.2) for the most IP (137.0)...Leads ML pitchers with 75.0+ IP on the road during that span with a 13.53 SO/9.0 IP ratio, and paces the AL in opponent AVG (.200), opponent OPS (.568), and SO/BB ratio (7.36).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

Made his 4th career Opening Day start on 3/29 at TB (also 2013-14, '16 with CWS).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Holds the highest SO/BB ratio (5.14) in the Live Ball Era (min. 1,000.0 IP)...Also ranks 2nd among that group with 10.58 SO/9.0 IP (Randy Johnson-10.61).

According to Elias, reached 1,500 career SO in fewer IP than any pitcher in ML history (1,290.0 IP), breaking Kerry Wood's previous record (1,303.0 IP).

Has recorded 12+ SO 28 times since the start of 2012, 11 more than any other pitcher in that span (Kershaw-17)...His 53 games with 10+ SO since 2012 trail only Max Scherzer's 61 for the most in MLB during that time, and are the 15th-highest career total since at least 1908.

His 12.93 SO/9.0 IP ratio in 2017 is the 3rd-highest single-season mark in ML history behind Randy Johnson (13.41 in 2001) and Pedro Martinez (13.20 in 1999).

Had 10+ SO in 8 consecutive starts from 4/10-5/19/17, tying Pedro Martinez (1999) and his own streak in 2015 for MLB's longest single-season streak since 1900 (source: Elias)...Elias also notes that Sale and Martinez are the only 2 pitchers since 1893 with multiple streaks of 7+ consecutive starts with 10+ SO.

In 2017, recorded the 35th 300-SO season since 1900 (source: Elias)...Elias also notes that in only 2 of the previous 34 300-SO seasons since 1900 did a pitcher have fewer walks than Sale did (41) at the time of his 300th SO: Curt Schilling in 2002 with ARI (31) and Pedro Martinez in 1999 with BOS (37).

- Has reached base in 13 of his last 14 games with a PA, posting a .420 OBP over that time...Has reached multiple times in 10 of those contests.
- Drove in a run in 4 straight games from 4/14-19 (8 RBI), tying a career-long streak (5th time, last 8/11-14/17)...Has reached base in 27 of his last 60 PA.
- Is tied for the AL lead with 5 multi-BB games, which tied for the most by a BOS hitter in the team's first 10 games since 1908 (5th time, last Mark Bellhorn, 2004).
- Is 12 for his last 31 (.387) with 7 XBH against RHP...Has hit .289 (171-for-591) in his career against righties.
- Is a .351 career hitter (61-for-174) with RISP...Since his 2016 debut season, ranks 3rd in the majors with a .381 AVG (32-for-84) with RISP and 2 outs.

- Led off Thursday's game with a HR for the 2nd time in 3 nights (also Tuesday)...It marked his 13th career leadoff HR, extending his franchise record...Has reached base to begin 8 of 17 games (.471 OBP)...Has reached to lead off 7 of his last 11 games, coming around to score each time.
- In his last 3 games, is 8-for-17 (.471) with a 2B, 4 HR, 7 runs, 4 RBI, a .526 OBP, 1.235 SLG, and 1.762 OPS.
- Has 23 runs through 19 team games, the most by a Red Sox hitter through 19 team games since Ted Williams in 1942 (24)...The last ML hitter to reach that mark through 19 team games was Alex Rodriguez in his 2007 MVP season (26).
- Leads MLB in AVG (.382), SLG (.765), OPS (1.234), and runs scored (23)...Ranks among AL leaders in hits (4th, 26), 2B (1st, 8), HR (T-2nd, 6), RBI (T-11th, 14), OBP (2nd, .469), XBH (1st, 14), and TB (T-2nd, 52).
- Has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games, and reached base in 26 of his last 27 and 53 of his last 57.
- In 15 April games, leads the majors with 23 runs, a .421 AVG (24-for-57), and a 1.360 OPS...Since 1913, the only other Red Sox hitter to score as many as 23 runs through the entire month of April is Johnny Damon in 2002 (24 in 21 G).
