BOSTON RED SOX (17-3) at OAKLAND A'S (10-11)

TIP YOUR CAP: Sean Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox last night, becoming the 1st pitcher to accomplish the feat vs. BOS since SEA's Chris Bosio did so 25 years ago on 4/22/93 at the Kingdome.

- Prior to last night, the Sox had played 3,987 consecutive games without being no-hit, the 2nd-longest active streak in the majors (OAK-4,242).
- Between being no-hit in 1993 and last night, the Red Sox threw 4 no-hitters: Hideo Nomo (2001), Derek Lowe (2002), Clay Buchholz (2007), and Jon Lester (2008).
- Entering last night, the Sox had recorded 10+ hits in each of their last 7 games.

SOX STREAKS: Last night's result snapped the Sox' 8-game win streak...They also won 9 straight games from 3/30-4/10...This is the 1st time since 1978 the Sox have recorded multiple win streaks of 8+ games in a single season.

THE BIG PICTURE: The Red Sox rank 1st in the majors in win % (.850, 17-3), run differential (+67), runs per game (6.15), and fielding % (.993), as well as 3rd in ERA (2.68).

FOR THE RECORD: At 17-3, the Red Sox have matched the franchise's best start through 20 games...The 1946 club also won 17 of its first 20 games en route to a 21-3 start.

- Prior to the Sox, the last teams to win 17+ of their first 20 games were the 2003 Yankees (17-3) and 1987 Brewers (18-2).

WINNING WAYS: The Red Sox lost to the Rays on Opening Day, 6-4, but they have since gone 17-2...It is the first time BOS has gone 17-2 over *any* 19-game stretch since 2004 (20-2 from 8/16-9/8 after starting 17-2).

PITCHING IN: The Red Sox rank 3rd in the majors with a 2.68 ERA...It is the club's 5th-lowest mark through 20 games in the Live Ball Era, its lowest since 2001 (2.28).

- The Sox have allowed 3 runs or fewer in a ML-best 17 of their 20 games, including each of their last 9...They are the 1st team since the 1981 A's to allow 3 runs or fewer in 17+ of a season's first 20 games.
- This is the 1st time the Sox have allowed 3 runs or fewer in 9+ straight games since 2013 (11, 8/19-31).
- The Sox own the majors' lowest opponent OPS (.593).

START ME UP: Red Sox starters are 12-2 with a 2.28 ERA (28 ER/110.2 IP)...It is the club's lowest starter ERA through 20 games in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...BOS starters have allowed 1 or 0 runs in 13 of the club's 20 games.

- Sox starters rank 2nd in the majors in ERA (HOU-2.12).

WHAT A RELIEF: Red Sox relief pitchers have allowed 0 runs in their last 20.1 IP, and 1 run in their last 26.1 IP...The longest scoreless streak by Sox relievers in 2017 was 26.0 IP (6/11-17).

- BOS relievers gave up 6 ER on Opening Day, but since then they have a 2.61 ERA and a .198 opponent AVG (72.1 IP, 51 H, 21 ER)...Opponents are 9 for their last 72 (.125) against Sox relievers.

CLOSING TIME: Craig Kimbrel has converted his last 15 save opportunities (since 8/5/17), MLB's longest active streak.

- Kimbrel is 4 saves shy of 300 for his career, having converted 296 of 325 opportunities (91.1%)...Of the 28 pitchers with 300+ saves, Mariano Rivera and Joe Nathan own the highest save percentage (both 89.1).

APRIL SHOWERS: The Sox are 15-2 (.882) in April, with 8 games remaining in the month...BOS has never won more than 18 games in April, doing so in 1998, 2003, and 2013...The Sox' highest win % in any April is .846 (11-2 in 1918).

BAY AREA VS. BAY STATE: The Red Sox and A's conclude a 3-game series today...These teams will play a 3-game set at Fenway Park from 5/14-16.

- The Sox are 6-0-0 in series, having earned sweeps at MIA (2-0), vs. TB (3-0), vs. BAL (3-0), and at LAA (3-0).
- The Sox are 15-34 (.306) in their last 49 games at OAK.
- In the last 16 seasons (2003-18), the Red Sox are 92-115 (.444) in the Pacific Time Zone, which includes games at LAA, OAK, SEA, LAD, SD, and SF...Against those teams at Fenway Park in that same time, the Sox are 129-70 (.648).

THIS LAND IS MORELAND: Mitch Moreland has homered in each of his last 4 games at Oakland Coliseum...He is 1 of 6 players in the ballpark's history (1966-2018) to homer in 4+ straight games here as a visitor...The only players to homer in 5 consecutive games here as a visitor are Mike Trout (2013-14) and Danny Tartabull (1990-91).

- Moreland has 15 HR in only 46 career games at OAK, the most by a visitor here since the start of 2010.
- Moreland has an active 8-game hitting streak and has 9 RBI in his last 3 games...He began the season 0-for-12, but he is since 13-for-27 (.481) with 7 XBH.

KEEPING SCORE: The Sox own the majors' highest run differential (+67)...According to Elias, the last 2 teams with a run differential as high through the first 20 games of a season were the 2016 Cubs (+69) and 2003 Yankees (+79), both of whom played in the World Series.

- The Sox have scored 123 runs, their most through the first 20 games of a season since 2003 (129).
- The Sox have scored 18 runs in the 1st inning, most in the AL...They have scored 4+ runs in a single inning 11 times, the most such innings in MLB this season.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.282), OBP (.350), SLG (.478), OPS (.828), doubles (56), and XBH (85)...The Sox also own MLB's lowest strikeout percentage (17.0%; 136 SO in 801 PA).

- The Sox rank 8th in the majors in HR (26), only 5 behind the MLB leader (LAA-31)...In 2017, the Sox ranked 27th in MLB with 168 HR (fewest in the AL).
- The Red Sox have hit 13 HR in their last 5 games, after hitting 13 in their first 15 games.

GRAND OLD TIME: The Red Sox lead MLB with 5 grand slams...According to Elias, BOS is only the 2nd team ever to hit 5+ grand slams before May 1 (1996 Expos, 6)...Prior to 2018, the Sox had never hit 4+ grand slams before May 1.

- All 5 of the Sox' grand slams have come in their last 13 games, after they hit none in their previous 176 games.

LEADING OFF: Mookie Betts leads MLB in runs scored (23), SLG (.732), and OPS (1.191)...He also ranks among AL leaders in doubles (1st, 8), XBH (1st, 14), AVG (2nd, .366), OBP (2nd, .459), and HR (T-2nd, 6).

- Betts has hit 4 HR on this road trip...He has 63 HR as a leadoff hitter, 2nd-most in club history behind Dom DiMaggio (69)...On Tuesday, he tied Ted Williams for the most 3-HR games in Sox history (3).

- 🔥 Earned the win in his last start on 4/17 at LAA...Allowed 1 run over 5.0 IP (3 H, 4 BB, 6 SO).
- 🔥 Surrendered 1 or 0 runs over 5.0+ IP in 3 of his 4 starts this season.
- 🔥 Has held opponents to a .183 AVG in 2018 (13-for-71), including limiting RHH to just 9 hits in 54 AB (.167).
- 🔥 Allowed 4 hits or fewer in each of his 4 starts this season, tying a career-long streak...Price also did so in 2010 with the Rays (9/1-18).
- 🔥 Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in each of his first 2 starts this season...Tied a career-long streak of consecutive starts with 7.0+ scoreless IP (last 9/28/14-5/6/15 with DET).
- 🔥 Trails only Felix Hernandez (39) and Justin Verlander (31) for the most scoreless starts of 7.0+ IP in the AL (28) since 2008.
- 🔥 Posted a 6.75 ERA (31 ER/41.1 IP) in his first 7 starts as a Red Sox...In 48 appearances (43 starts) since, is 21-12 with a 3.30 ERA (104 ER/283.1 IP) and 268 SO.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- 🔥 Holds a 3-2 record and 3.03 ERA (16 ER/47.2 IP) over 7 career starts at OAK.
- 🔥 Last pitched against the club on 9/2/16 at OAK...Earned the win after allowing 2 runs on 4 hits over 7.0 innings.
- 🔥 Is 21-17 with a 3.46 ERA (136 ER/353.2 IP) in 55 career appearances (53 starts) vs. the AL West...Over 31 career starts in AL West ballparks, is 16-9 with a 3.88 ERA (85 ER/197.1 IP).

ON THE ROAD:

- 🔥 Is 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) in 2 road starts this season, including 7.0 scoreless frames on 3/30 at TB.
- 🔥 Has allowed 1 or 0 runs in a career-long 3 consecutive road starts twice, last doing so as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays in 2013 (7/24-8/9).
- 🔥 Tossed 7.0+ innings in 68 road starts since debuting in 2008...Trails only Felix Hernandez (86) and Justin Verlander (79) for the most road starts of 7.0+ IP during that time.
- 🔥 Is 73-32 (.695) over 140 career road appearances (134 starts)...Trails only Vic Raschi (.700, 63-27) for the highest road winning percentage over the last 100 seasons (min. 75 decisions).
- 🔥 Price's 73 career road wins trail only Justin Verlander (75) for the most in the AL since 2008, and mark the 3rd-most in the majors (Jon Lester-76).
- 🔥 Is 14-8 with a 3.72 ERA (71 ER/171.2 IP) in 29 road appearances (27 starts) with the Red Sox.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

- 🔥 Held a 29.1-inning scoreless streak from 9/14/17 to 4/11/18, including the postseason.
- 🔥 Was the 1st Red Sox member of the Opening Day rotation with scoreless outings in each of his first 2 starts of a season since Bret Saberhagen (2, April 1999).
- 🔥 Prior to Price, the last Red Sox to begin a campaign with consecutive scoreless starts of 7.0+ IP as a member of the Opening Day rotation was Mel Parnell in 1949 (2).
- 🔥 Price became the 1st ML pitcher in the last 100 seasons to begin a campaign with consecutive scoreless outings of 7.0+ IP while throwing 95 or fewer pitches in each (76 on 3/30 at TB, 91 on 4/5 vs. TB)...KC's Jakob Junis then joined Price, doing so in 2 consecutive starts from 4/3-9 this year.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- 🔥 The 5-time All-Star (2010-12, 2014-15) won the 2012 AL Cy Young Award (runner-up in 2010, '15)...Is the only No. 1 overall Draft Pick (2007 by TB) to win a Cy Young Award.
- 🔥 Led the AL in ERA in 2012 (2.56) and 2015 (2.45)...His career ERA of 3.21 ranks 6th among active ML pitchers (min. 1,000.0 IP).
- 🔥 Paced MLB with 271 SO in 2014...Has recorded 200+ SO 5 times in the last 7 years (2011-17)...Is 1 of 6 ML pitchers to do so in 5+ seasons during that time, and joins teammate Chris Sale (5) and Justin Verlander (5) as the only AL pitchers with as many 200+ SO seasons during that time.
- 🔥 His 14 CG since 2012 rank 3rd in the AL (Corey Kluber-16, Chris Sale-15) and T-5th in MLB (Clayton Kershaw-19, Madison Bumgarner-15, Adam Wainwright-14).
- 🔥 Owns a career .652 winning percentage (129-69), the 4th-highest among AL pitchers in the DH era (1973-present; min. 150 decisions)...Trails only Pedro Martinez (.760, 117-37), Roy Halladay (.661, 148-76), and Roger Clemens (.656, 316-166).

- Has reached base in 14 of his last 15 games with a PA, posting a .411 OBP over that time...Has reached multiple times in 10 of those contests.
- Drove in a run in 4 straight games from 4/14-19 (8 RBI), tying a career-long streak (5th time, last 8/11-14/17)...Has reached base in 28 of his last 64 PA.
- Is tied for the AL lead with 5 multi-BB games, which tied for the most by a BOS hitter in the team's first 10 games since 1908 (5th time, last Mark Bellhorn, 2004).
- Is 12 for his last 31 (.387) with 7 XBH against RHP...Has hit .289 (171-for-591) in his career against righties.
- Is a .351 career hitter (61-for-174) with RISP...Since his 2016 debut season, ranks 3rd in the majors with a .381 AVG (32-for-84) with RISP and 2 outs.

- Led off Thursday's game with a HR for the 2nd time in 3 nights (also Tuesday)...It marked his 13th career leadoff HR, extending his franchise record...Has reached base to begin 9 of 18 games (.500 OBP)...Has reached to lead off 8 of his last 12 games, coming around to score 7 times.
- In his last 5 games, is 8-for-20 (.400) with a 2B, 4 HR, 7 runs, 4 RBI, .478 OBP, 1.050 SLG, and 1.528 OPS.
- Had 23 runs through 19 team games, the most by a Red Sox hitter through 19 team games since Ted Williams in 1942 (24)...The last ML hitter to reach that mark through 19 team games was Alex Rodriguez in his 2007 MVP season (26).
- Leads MLB in SLG (.732), OPS (1.191), and runs scored (23)...Ranks among AL leaders in AVG (2nd, .366), hits (T-4th, 26), 2B (1st, 8), HR (T-2nd, 6), RBI (T-15th, 14), OBP (2nd, .459), XBH (1st, 14), and TB (4th, 52).
