WINS AND LOSSES: Texas salvaged the finale of the Seattle series with a 7-4 win on Sunday, and are 1-2 to begin this 6-game, 6-day homestand against SEA (1-2) and OAK (3 G)...Rangers are seeking to win consecutive games for the 2nd time in 2018 (also 4/14-15 at HOU)...Texas has lost 2 of 3, 4 of 6, and 9 of club's last 13 games...team was a season-low 8-under .500 following loss on Saturday...team has gone 7-11 since a 1-4 start...club had season-long 5-G losing streak from 4/8-13...longest win streak is 2 G and team is 2-9 in last 11 9-inning games (2-0 in extras in that span).

• At 8-15 (.348), the Rangers have the 4th-lowest winning percentage in the A.L. and T6th-lowest in MLB...Rangers' 15 losses are tied for 2nd-most in the A.L. (15-KC; 16-BAL) and T4th-most in MLB (18-CIN; 16-MIA; 15-SD)...the 8 wins are T3rd-fewest through 23 games in Rangers history, as club opened 7-16 in both 1982 and 2008...seeking to avoid slowest 24-game start since 2015 (8-16) with a win tonight... team was 11-13 after 24 games in 2017.

• Team has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 14 days...club has gained ground in the division twice since Tuesday, but current 8.0-G deficit matches largest of 2018 (5th time)...Texas has been in either 4th or 5th place for 24 of the 25 days this season (T2nd following win on 3/30)... Rangers have gained ground in the division standings on just 5 days in 2018.

SERIES STUFF: Texas enters tonight with an 0-7 record in series openers, only MLB team that has yet to win an opener...club is 5-2 in 2nd game of series...Texas is 1-5-1 in series this season after a series loss vs. the M's this weekend, and team is now 0-4-0 in 4 series in Arlington...matches most consecutive home series losses to begin a season in Texas history, something that also happened in 1982 and 2015 (series of 2+ G).

AT HOME: The Rangers snapped a 6-G losing streak in Arlington with Sunday's win, and have gone 3-10 at Globe Life Park this season...club has lost 9 of last 11 in Arlington...club's .231 home win pct. is lowest among teams with 10+ home games, and 4th-lowest overall in MLB to CIN/KC (1-7, .125) and CWS (1-8, .111)...tied for slowest start after 13 home games in Rangers history (also 1982, 1984, and 1985)...club has had 4-or-fewer wins through 14 1st 14 home games once since 1985 (4-10 in 2015).

• While the Texas offense has produced on a similar level both at home and on the road, the pitching staff's home ERA (A.L.-high 5.92) is nearly 3 runs higher than the away figure (3.10)...pitchers have allowed 7+ runs in 8 of last 11 at home.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 2-2 vs. the Athletics in 2018 after splitting a 4-game series in the Bay Area, 4/2-5... Texas won 2 of the final 3 games in Oakland, but have still lost 3 of 5, 10 of 14, 12 of 19, and 16 of last 28 vs. A's... Rangers have 20-18 advantage beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Rangers went 7-3 vs. the A's at home last season, and have won 11 of last 16 meetings in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 363-354, and holds leads of 191-166 in Arlington and 103-99 at Globe Life Park.

FAMILIAR FOES: Including this week's series with Oakland, the Rangers are scheduled to face the A.L. West in 20 of their 1st 26 games...club has gone 6-11 vs. division rivals, including a 2-8 mark in Arlington...since 9/12/17, Rangers have gone 12-24 in intradivision contests, including 4-16 vs. West in Arlington since that date.

MARTIN PÉREZ logged his 1st quality start of the season yesterday afternoon...Pérez is the 4th Texas starter to allowed 2 R-or-less over the club's last 6 games...Texas starters have also issued one-or-zero walks in 4 straight, longest since a 5-G streak, 9/8-12/17.

GALLO...GONE: Joey Gallo hit his team-leading 7th home run of the season yesterday, T3rd in the A.L. (LAA's Mike Trout-9; BAL's Manny Machado-8)...all 7 of Gallo's long ball's have come in the month of April, most since Josh Hamilton (9) and Mike Napoli (7) in 2012...the club record for home runs in April is 9 and shared by Ivan Rodriguez (2000), Alex Rodriguez (2002), Carl Everett (2003), Ian Kinsler (2007), and Josh Hamilton (2012).

• Gallo's home run yesterday came on a 3-0 pitch, as he now owns both 3-0 HR by a Texas batter since the start of 2016 (also 4/21/17 vs. KC off Nate Karns).

TWO MORE FOR BELTRÉ: With 2 doubles on Sunday, Adrián Beltré now has 1120 career extra-base hits, passing George Brett (1119) for sole possession of 17th place on the all-time list...the 2 hits also raised his career hit total to 3072, 9 shy of matching Adrian "Cap" Anson for 22nd place on the all-time hit list.

• Beltré has batted .295/.328/.519/.847 (130-441) with 26 HR and 83 RBI in 112 games vs. the A's since joining the Rangers in 2011... his 83 RBI are 9 more than any other OAK opponent over that span and he ranks 2nd in home runs to Mike Trout (27).

• Beltré is batting .367 (11-30) with 4 2B, 2 HR, and 5 RBI in his career vs. tonight's OAK starter Trevor Cahill, 4th-highest among active players.

KEONE KELA has converted all 3 save chances this season, including Sunday's win over the Mariners...yesterday was Kela's 1st career save at Globe Life Park, as each of his 1st 5 career saves came on the road...Kela is one of just 3 ML relievers with multiple wins and saves this season, along with TB's Alex Colome (2 W, 4 SV) and SF's Hunter Strickland (2 W, 3 SV).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Since 4/14, Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Ronald Guzmán have accounted for nearly a third of the club's RBI in the last 8 games (11 of 38)...with a 2-run single in the 8th yesterday, Kiner-Falefa extended his hit streak to 5 games, T2nd-longest hit streak by an A.L. rookie this season (NYY's Miguel Andujar currently has a 6-G hit streak)... Kiner-Falefa also ranks among the A.L. rookie leaders in hits (5th, 11) and total bases (T6th, 15).

THE OFFENSE: The Texas offense has matched its season high with 7 runs in each of the last 2 games...since reaching 7 runs for the 1st time on Tues. at TB, the Rangers have totaled 7 runs in 3 of their last 5 games...Texas batters recorded 10 doubles in the 3-game series with the Mariners, most in a series of that length since 9/8-10/17 vs. NYY (also 10)... it was the most doubles in a 3-game series vs. the Mariners since 4/6-8/01 in Arlington.

LOW STRIKEOUTS: The Rangers matched their 2nd-lowest strikeout total of the season yesterday vs. the Mariners, whiffing just 4 times in the contest...each of the club's other 3 games with 4-or-fewer strikeouts came in the 4-game series at OAK, 4/2-5...the Rangers have averaged 5.25 strikeouts per game vs. OAK and 9.84 strikeouts per game vs. all other clubs.

MOMENT OF SILENCE: The Rangers will observe a moment of silence for Texas All-Star second baseman Davey Nelson...he spent four seasons with the Rangers from 1972-75 and was named to the All-Star team in 1973...Nelson passed away today at the age of 73.

SHORTS: Ricardo Rodriguez will throw one inning in an extended spring game on Monday, his first game appearance... Shin-Soo Choo has hit safely in 6 straight, matching the longer hit streak by a Texas batter in 2018...Rangers have won 5 straight games started by Juan Centeno...Texas is 0-3 on Mondays.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

**#55 Matt Moore, LHP
(1-3, 5.59)**

TONIGHT: The 28-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 5th start of the season in tonight's series opener with the A's...earned 1st of the season in his last start on Tues. at TB, his 1st quality start with Texas, and he will start on 5 days' rest...Tues. was 1st time in his career to face the Rays, his former club...is 1-1, 2.25 (3 ER/12.0 IP) in his last 2 starts after going 0-2, 11.05 in 1st 2 GS w/ TEX... was the 1st Ranger to go 0-3 in 3 starts to begin Rangers career since Jason Jennings in 2008...opponents are batting .304/.385/.418/.802 in his 4 starts... was acquired in a 3-player trade with SF on 12/15/17...returns to the American League where he went 39-28 with 3.88 ERA from 2011-16 with TB...was traded to the Giants on 8/1/16, going 6-5 the rest of that season...tied for the N.L. lead with 15 losses in 2017 while receiving the 3rd lowest run support of any Major League qualifying pitcher...posted 10+ victories 3 times with the Rays, going 17-4 and earning A.L. All-Star honors in 2013...had Tommy John surgery in 2014 when he made just 2 starts...was selected by TB in 8th round of 2007 MLB Draft and made ML debut in September 2011.

LAST START: Is coming off his 1st win with Rangers on Tues. at TB, a 7-2 Texas victory in which he posted the 2nd-longest outing from the team's rotation in 2018 (7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-0 ER, 2 BB, 6 SO, 93 pitches/63 strikes)...had a 69 game score while facing Rays for 1st time in his career after spending 6 seasons with TB... lone run allowed came after a leadoff walk in the 3rd, but it was unearned after an error in that frame by SS Isiah Kiner-Falefa...threw 13-or-fewer pitches in 5 of 7 innings (19 pitches in 1st and 3rd), and Rays went 0-for-final-12 vs. Moore... marked team's lone win at The Trop in that 3-G series.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-2, 7.07 (22 ER/28.0 IP) in 5 G/GS in his career against OAK...took loss in lone start last year w/ Giants at AT&T (5.0 IP, 5 H, 4 R-ER)... lone win vs. A's came 7/21/16 at the Coliseum (7.0 IP, 3 R-ER)...has held A's Khris Davis to 0-for-6 in his career.

AT GLOBE LIFE PARK: Has gone 0-3, 8.76 in 3 G/GS in Arlington this season with a 2.108 WHIP...including his start in Game 1 of the 2011 ALDS for the Rays against the Rangers, began career with 13.1 scoreless innings in Arlington...prior to this season had made just one regular season start at this facility, a 2-0 Rays win on 4/10/13 (5.1 IP, 1 H, 0 R-ER, 6 BB, 5 SO)...outdueled Derek Holland (8.0 IP, 2 R) in that contest...only hit allowed was a single by Craig Gentry...also tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in Tampa Bay's 9-0 win over the Rangers in Game 1 of the 2011 ALDS...had made just 3 career starts in the regular season before that postseason start...was the Rays' only win of the series as Texas went on to win the next 3 games and the series.

0-AND-3: Lost each of his 1st 3 starts before his win on Tues. at TB, and his 3 losses are T3rd-most in the A.L...1st pitcher to lose each of 1st 3 starts to begin his Rangers career since Jason Jennings in April 2008...last longer streak was Ed Figueroa, who lost his 1st 4 starts in August 1980.

2018: Rangers are 3-1 in his starts...Juan Centeno caught both his 1st start and his last outing at TB (1-1, 3.27), and Robinson Chirinos has caught the other 2 starts (0-2, 8.64)...opponents after 1-0 count: .379 (11-29)...after 0-1 count: .238 (10-42)...leadoff batter has reached in just 3 of 20 innings with only one leadoff walk...opponents hitting just .167 (4-24) with no outs in inning, .364 (20-55) with one or 2 outs in a frame...batters have a .333 (8-24) BA with RISP...has not allowed a run in the 1st inning (.250 opp. avg), but has permitted 5 runs in both 2nd and 3rd frames...opponent avg by PA in game: 1st - .364 (12-33), 2nd - .344 (11-32), 3rd - .071 (1-14)...suffered the loss in his Texas debut, a 9-3 Rangers defeat on 3/31 vs. HOU in Arlington (4.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 85 pitches/53 strikes)...was the 2nd starter in Texas history with 6+ SO and zero walks in a start of 4.0 innings-or-less, joining Colby Lewis on 6/23/12 vs. COL (4.0 IP, 0 BB, 6 SO).

2017: Ranked 2nd on the Giants staff in starts (31), innings (174.1), strikeouts (148), and quality starts (14) in his only full season with SF...his 5.52 ERA was the highest among the 58 ML qualifying pitchers (min. 162.0 IP) and was the 2nd highest in Giants franchise history (Terry Mulholland, 5.80 in 1995)...led the N.L. in runs (116) and earned runs (107) allowed and tied 3 others (Tyler Chatwood, COL; Clayton Richard, SD; Jeff Samardzja, SF) for the league lead in losses (15)...opp. batted .283, 3rd highest among N.L. qualifiers...had just 3.67 runs of support per 9.0 IP, 3rd lowest among all ML qualifiers and received one or no runs 14 times.
