WINS AND LOSSES: Texas lost to Oakland last night, 9-4, and club is 1-3 on this 6-game, 6-day homestand against SEA (1-2) and OAK (0-1)...team has lost 3 of 4, 5 of 7, and 10 of club's last 14 games...Texas has matched season low at 8-under .500 (also after loss on Sat.)...team has gone 7-12 since a 1-4 start...club had season-long 5-G losing streak from 4/8-13...longest win streak is 2 G (4/14-15 at HOU) and team is 2-10 in last 12 9-inning games (2-0 in extras in that span).

• At 8-16 (.333), the Rangers have the 4th-lowest winning percentage in the A.L. and 6th-lowest in MLB...Rangers' 16 losses are 2nd-most in the A.L. (17-BAL) and 4th-most in MLB (18-CIN; 17-BAL/MIA)...the 8 wins are T2nd-fewest through 24 games in Rangers history (also 1985, 2008, 2015), as club opened 7-17 in 1982...slowest 2 starts after 25 G came in 1982 (7-18) and 2008 (8-17)...team was 11-14 after 25 games in 2017.

• Team has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 15 days...club has gained ground in the division twice since last Tuesday, but current 8.0-G deficit matches largest of 2018 (6th time)...Texas has been in either 4th or 5th place for 25 of the 26 days this season (T2nd following win on 3/30)...Rangers have gained ground in the division standings on just 5 days in 2018.

SERIES STUFF: Texas would need to post back-to-back wins for a 2nd time in 2018 to win this series...club dropped to 0-8 in series openers last night, only winless team in MLB in such games...club is 5-2 in 2nd game of series...Texas is 1-5-1 in series this season, including 0-4-0 in 4 series in Arlington...matches most consecutive home series losses to begin a season in Texas history, something that also happened in 1982 and 2015 (series of 2+ G).

AT HOME: The Rangers are 3-11 in Arlington this season, losing 7 of 8 and 10 of last 12...lost 6 straight at home before win on Sun. vs. SEA...club's .214 home win pct. is 3rd-lowest in MLB, ahead of only KC (1-7, .125) and CWS (2-8, .200)...the 3-11 mark matches slowest 14-G start at home in club history (also 3-11 in 1982, 1985), and previous low for wins after 15 G in Arlington were 4-11 records in 1982, 1984, 1985.

• While the Texas offense has produced on a similar level both at home and on the road, the pitching staff's home ERA (A.L.-high 6.07) is nearly 3 runs higher than the away figure (3.10)...pitchers have allowed 7+ runs in 9 of last 12 at home.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 2-3 vs. the Athletics in 2018, splitting a 4-game series in the Bay Area, 4/2-5, ahead of last night's defeat...Texas has lost 4 of 6, 11 of 15, 13 of 20, and 17 of last 29 vs. A's...Rangers have 20-19 advantage beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Rangers went 7-3 vs. the A's at home last season, and have won 11 of last 17 meetings in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 363-355, and holds leads of 191-167 in Arlington and 103-100 at Globe Life Park.

FAMILIAR FOES: Concluding with this week's series with Oakland, the Rangers are scheduled to face the A.L. West in 20 of their 1st 26 games...club has gone 6-12 vs. division rivals, including a 2-9 mark in Arlington...since 9/12/17, Rangers have gone 12-25 in intradivision contests, including 4-17 vs. West in Arlington since that date.

WALK THIS WAY: Joey Gallo has a HR, 2B, and 3 RBI in the last 2 games, and he has also walked in 6 consecutive games with a plate appearance...the 6 straight games is a team-high in '18, and marks 2nd-longest such streak of Gallo's career (9 G, 8/14-30/17)...the 6-G streak is T3rd-longest in the A.L. this season, and best span in MLB in '18 is 8 G by WAS' Bryce Harper (4/1-9).

• Gallo has a team-best 7 hits with RISP, going 7-for-21, including 6-for-his-last-16 (.375).

ROTATION DELIVERS: Texas starters have pitched at least 5.0 innings in a season-best 6 consecutive games, compiling a 3.57 ERA (14 ER/35.1 IP) in 6 G beginning Tues. at TB to lower season ERA from 5.72 to 5.11...the 3.57 ERA ranks 5th in the A.L. since Tuesday...starters have permitted just one HR last 6 G and 35.1 IP.

EL CAPITAN: Adrián Beltré hit his 8th double last night, tied with 5 others for most in the A.L...with 621 career doubles, 13th all-time, he is just 3 shy of matching Hank Aaron and Albert Pujols (T11th, 624) on the all-time list...his 1121 extra-base hits rank 17th all time, one shy of matching Manny Ramirez (1122) for 16th in baseball history in that category.

LECLERC IS LE-SCORELESS: Despite 2 walks last night, Jose Leclerc posted 1.2 scoreless innings and now has 6.2 shutout frames spanning his 1st 5 outings with Texas this season...it is the 2nd-longest scoreless span by any Texas pitcher in 2018, as Bartolo Colon had 9.0 straight frames without allowing a run over a relief outing and start from 4/10-15...Leclerc has 10.2 consecutive scoreless inn. dating to 2017...among pitchers with 15.0+ March/April innings in 2017-18, Leclerc's 0.54 ERA (1 ER/16.2 IP) is 4th-best in MLB to Andrew Miller (0.00), Carl Edwards Jr. (0.44), and Cody Allen (0.45).

HANG LOOSE: Isiah Kiner-Falefa extended his hit streak to 6 games last night, matching the longest by a Ranger this season (4th time) and the 2nd-longest by any A.L. rookie in 2018 (NYY's Miguel Andujar has current 7-G hit streak)...it is the longest hit streak by a Texas rookie since Drew Robinson's 7-G run from 8/19-27/17.

ANOTHER CLUTCH HR FOR CHIRINOS: Robinson Chirinos' 2-R HR in the 4th yesterday tied the game at 3-3...each of his 3 HR this season have either tied the game or given Texas a lead, as he owns 3 of the Rangers' 7 GT or GA HR in 2018...Chirinos leads all Rangers with 3 GA RBI this year.

STOLEN CAR: Texas had a season-high 3 stolen bases last night after entering the game with 5 SB on the year...in 14 G with 3+ SB since the start of 2016, last night was just the 3rd time to score as little as 4 runs in such a game (others 4/23/16 at CWS and 4/30/17 at LAA).

THAT'S A RECORD: After the 2 triples by Oakland in the 9th inning last night, it's worth noting that the Rangers are one of 3 MLB clubs without a 3-base hit in 2018 (also CLE and STL)...in fact, the Rangers have gone a club-record 46 games since the last Texas triple by Rougned Odor on 9/8/17 vs. NYY...previous team mark had been 36 G from 5/26-7/4/13, which stands as the Rangers' single-season record...Rangers' 46-G triples drought is the longest active ML streak, although there have been several longer spans in recent years, including BAL's MLB-record 67-game run without a triple from 5/31-8/13/16.

SCORING CHANGE: There has been a scoring change from Sun. vs. SEA, as official scorer Steve Weller has changed a Jean Segura infield single (leading off 7th) to an E6 (throwing error on Profar)...the change takes an ER away from Matt Bush...the change is reflected in today's Rangers game notes, but will not show up in the MLB official stats until tomorrow.

SHORTS: RHP's Tony Barnette and Tim Lincecum, both currently on the DL, were scheduled to throw live batting practice this afternoon...Rangers are only ML club without a game of 4+ hits w/ RISP...bullpen has allowed a 4+ run inning in 7th-or-later in 3 of this homestand's 1st 4 games...team has used at least 4 relievers in 4 straight to open the homestand, and team's 84 relief app. are T2nd-most in MLB (96-LAA, 84-TEX/COL)...HR by TEX right-handed batters in '18: 3-Chirinos, 2-Andrus, 1-Beltré, Kiner-Falefa, Rua.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

**#35 Cole Hamels, LHP
(1-3, 4.76)**

TONIGHT: The 34-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 6th start of the season tonight in the middle contest of this 3-game series with the Athletics...has never finished the month of April with 4 losses in his 13 professional seasons (1-3 in 2013 and 3-3 in 2008)...will be working on extended 5-days' rest after taking the loss in a 4-2 Texas setback on Wednesday afternoon at Tampa Bay...is averaging 10.80 SO/9 through 5 starts, nearly 4 strikeouts higher than his 2017 figure (6.39)...opponents have swung and missed on 30.2% of pitches, an increase of close to 9 points over 2017 (21.6%)...has allowed 7 HR in 28.0 IP, 3 by HOU's George Springer, as well as 3 leadoff home runs...is 3-8 with a 5.58 ERA (44 ER/71.0 IP) over his last 13 starts dating back to 8/26/17...despite being slowed by a lengthy disabled list stint in 2017, still posted his 9th career double-digit win total...earned the wins in each of the Rangers' division-clinching games in 2015 and 2016...joined the Rangers in a 7/31/15 trade after 9 1/2 seasons with the Phillies, ranking in the team's top 6 all-time in wins, starts, innings, and strikeouts...signed a six-year contract extension on 7/25/12, taking him through 2018, with a club/vesting option for 2019...team is 1-4 in his 5 starts.

LAST START: Took the loss in a 4-2 Texas setback on Wednesday afternoon at Tampa Bay (6.1 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 0 BB, 4 SO, 0 HR, 86 pitches/59 strikes)...set down 15 of the 1st 17 batters he faced, permitting just a pair of doubles over the 1st 5 innings...carried a 2-hit shutout into the 6th inning, but TB scored 3 runs in the frame...he Rays 6th inning rally began with a single by TB no. 9 hitter Johnny Field on an 0-2 pitch...Field would score the tying run two batters later on a Daniel Robertson double...returned for the 7th inning at just 75 pitches, but exited allowed another run on a Denard Span RBI double.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-3 with a 4.11 ERA (21 ER/46.0 IP) over 8 career starts vs. the Athletics...snapped a 2-game losing streak vs. the Swinging A's in a 4-1 Texas victory on 4/3 at the Coliseum (5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 1 HR, 3 BB, 11 SO, 94 pitches/52 strikes)...marked Hamels' most strikeouts in a game since 7/28/16 vs. KC (12) and his 16 swinging strikes (baseball-reference.com) matched most against Hamels in the last 2 seasons (also 16 on 9/11/17 vs. SEA)...is 3-2, 4.50 (19 ER/38.0 IP) in 7 starts vs. OAK in a Texas uniform...Oakland batters have posted a .299/.370/.544/.914 slash line in those outings.

GLOBE LIFE PARK: Is winless in a pair of home starts this season, allowing 10 R-8 ER over 11.0 IP...has lost 4 straight at Globe Life Park since the end of an 8-game home win streak on 9/26/17...is 4-4, 5.94 (35 ER/53.0 IP) in 10 home starts since the 2017 All-Star break...opponents have batted .302/.380/.628/1.008 in the 2 home starts this season compared to .246/.303/.449/.752 away from Arlington.

2018: Opponents have swung and missed on 30.2% of pitches, nearly 9 points higher than 2017 (21.6)...has whiffed 27.0% of BF...his 10.80 SO/9 rate is 9th in the A.L....has allowed a HR in 4 of 5 GS, including 3 starts allowing 2 HRs...tied for A.L. lead in HR allowed w/OAK's Kendall Graveman and BAL's Kevin Gausman...allowed only 18 HRs in 2017...opposition hitting .167/.306/.300/.606 with 2 outs...opponents are 6-for-21 with 4 BB w/RISP...opponent avg. by time through order - 1st time: .279 (12-43), 2nd time: .243 (9-37), 3rd time: .258 (8-31), 4th time: 1-for-1...Robinson Chirinos has caught all 5 starts...had 11 strikeouts on 4/3 at OAK, most by any pitcher in an outing of 5.0 innings-or-less in Washington/Texas franchise history (since 1961)...recorded his 1st 8 outs via strikeout, 1st Rangers pitcher to ever do that and 2nd in franchise history to Senators' Jim Duckworth did it for Washington (1st 8) on 9/4/65 at DET in Tiger Stadium (credit Elias Sports Bureau).

OPENING ACT: Was tabbed as the starting pitcher for Opening Day on March 16 in Surprise...was Hamels' 4th career Opening Day start, his 2nd with Texas...became the 10th different pitcher to start multiple openers for Texas.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Has gone 34-15 (.694) over 73 starts since the 7/31/15 trade to the Rangers, tied w/ David Price for best win pct. in A.L. and T7th-best in MLB (min. 25 decisions) to only Clayton Kershaw (39-12, .765), Stephen Strasburg (38-12, .760), Zack Greinke (42-16, .724), Jake Arrieta (45-18, .714), and Jon Lester (39-17, .696)...according to STATS LLC, he was one of just 5 pitchers since 1913 to win at least 19 of his 1st 22 decisions with a single club, joining Vida Blue as only pitchers to do it for an A.L. club...won a career-high 12 consecutive decisions from 8/23/15-5/22/16 before loss on 5/27/16 vs. PIT...it matched the longest win streak by a starter in Rangers history (Bobby Witt - 12 G in 1990) and was the longest by a left-hander.

• After his win on 8/21 at LAA, had a 31-7 (.816) record in his 1st 60 career starts w/ TEX, 2nd pitcher in MLB history with .800+ win pct. in 1st 60 starts with a team (credit Elias)...the other: Jim McCormick, 47-10 (.825) with the Cubs in 1885-1886 (credit Elias).

ALL I NEED IS THREE: Since Hamels took a 4-3 loss on 8/7/15 at SEA in his 2nd start as a Ranger, he has gone 32-2 over his last 52 starts when receiving 3+ runs of support...of his 366 career starts has received 3 runs of support or more in 210 of them, going 133-18 (.881) in those games.

2017: Despite missing nearly 2 months on the disabled list, still ranked among team leaders in wins (T2nd, 11), starts (3rd, 24), innings (3rd, 148.0), and strikeouts (3rd, 105)...while he didn't qualify, posted 2nd-highest ERA (4.20) of his career (4.32 in 2009)...was on the DL, 4/30-6/25, with a right oblique strain suffered while warming up prior to a scheduled start on 5/2 at HOU...was the longest DL stint of his career, as he had never missed more than 29 days (3/26-4/23/14)...was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (1 ER/8.2 IP) in a pair of rehab starts with Double-A Frisco: 6/16 vs. San Antonio and 6/21 vs. Midland.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — RHP DOUG FISTER (1-2, 3.59 ERA in 3 games/starts)
