Jean Segura has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games (4/19-c), batting .319 (15x47) with 10 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 14 RBI and 4 stolen bases...he has recorded an RBI in 9 of those 11 games.

In his last 11 starts vs. Oakland (5/10/15-c), Félix Hernández is 6-3 with a 2.50 ERA (19 ER, 68.1 IP) with 61 strikeouts and 12 walks.

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 4th (2-1) of 19 games this season...the Mariners are 10-2 in their last 12 games vs. the Athletics (7/9/17-c):

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open a 6-day, 6-game homestand with the first of three games against the Oakland Athletics...will also host the Los Angeles Angels for three games over the weekend...went 7-3 on a recently-concluded 10-game, 10-day, 3-city road trip to Texas (2-1), Chicago-AL (2-1) and Cleveland (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle is 7-3 in its last 10 games, 12-7 in its last 19 games and 13-8 in its last 21 games...Seattle is 8-6 during the day and 8-5 at night...Seattle is 5-5 at Safeco Field and 11-6 on the road.

- **Leaders** - three Mariners lead outright or are tied for the American League lead in major statistical categories: **Edwin Díaz** leads the AL with 11 saves...**Dee Gordon** leads the AL with 10 stolen bases...**Mitch Haniger** is tied for the AL lead with 10 home runs (also: Didi Gregorius-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA).
- **Off to the Races** - the Mariners are one of three teams in the American League with a pair of players with at least 5 stolen bases each...they are joined by Chicago-AL (Tim Anderson, 8 SB, and Leury Garcia, 5 SB) and Cleveland (Rajai Davis, 5 SB, and Francisco Lindor, 5 SB)...**Dee Gordon** leads the American League with 10 stolen bases while **Jean Segura** ranks T3rd with 5 steals.
- **What a Relief** - the Mariners bullpen has combined for a 2.38 ERA (6 ER, 22.2 IP) over its last 7 games (4/23-c)...Mariners relievers have struck out 33 while walking only 4 and holding opponents to a .171 (14x82) average against during that span.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied eight of their first nine series, posting a series record of 6-1-2.
- **The Juan Nicasio File** - **Juan Nicasio** leads the Major Leagues with 10 holds...over his last 7 games (4/7-c), he has retired 31 of 37 batters faced, while posting a 1.69 ERA (2 ER, 10.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts and 1 walk.

FAST START...the Mariners went 16-11 (.593) in March/April...it equaled their 4th-most wins prior to May 1 in club history (also: 1996, 16-10, and 1997, 16-11); trailing only the Mariners clubs from 2001 (20-5), 2002 (18-8) and 2003 (17-10)...Seattle's .593 winning percentage ties the 1997 Mariners squad for 5th-best in March/April in club history (min. 5 G), trailing the clubs from 2001 (.800/20-5), 2002 (.692/18-8), 2003 (.630/17-10) and 1996 (.615/16-10).

LATE AND GREAT...in the 7th inning and later, **Mitch Haniger** is batting .406 (13x32) with 12 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 14 RBI, 4 walks, a .472 on-base percentage and a 1.250 slugging mark (1.722 OPS)...among all players in the 7th and later, Haniger ranks 1st in runs, home runs, slugging, OPS and extra-base hits, T1st in RBI, 8th in batting and T8th in hits...the Mariners lead the Majors in home runs (17) and slugging (.498) in the 7th inning and later, while also ranking 4th in batting (.264/79x299) and T10th in runs (45).

YES IN DEE, DEE...**Dee Gordon** has appeared in each of the Mariners 27 games this season, making 26 starts...the Mariners are 15-5 when Gordon records at least 1 hit, compared to a record of 1-6 when he goes hitless...in Mariners wins, Gordon is batting .371 (26x70) with 14 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 8 RBI, 3 HBP, 1 walk, 8 stolen bases and a .405 on-base percentage...in Mariners losses, he is batting .200 (8x40) with 3 runs, 1 walk, 2 stolen bases and a .220 on-base percentage.

IN THE SWING OF THINGS...three Mariners are batting at least .300: **Robinson Canó** (.313/30x96), **Dee Gordon** (.309/34x110) and **Mitch Haniger** (.309/30x97)...Seattle is one of two American League teams with a trio of players batting at least .300, joining Boston (Mookie Betts, .344, J.D. Martinez, .337 and Hanley Ramirez, .330)...Canó ranks 13th in the AL, while Haniger ranks 16th and Gordon is tied for 17th.

MITCH HANIGER IS GOOD...**Mitch Haniger** has not only gotten off to a hot start in 2018, he ended his 2017 campaign on a high note...since Aug. 30, 2017, Haniger is batting .341 (75x220) with 36 runs, 16 doubles, 2 triples, 18 home runs, 44 RBI, 2 HBP, 15 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .385 on-base percentage and a .677 slugging mark (1.062 OPS) in 56 games...among Major League leaders during that span, Haniger ranks 2nd in total bases (149), 3rd in batting, home runs and extra-base hits, T3rd in hits, 4th in slugging and OPS and 6th in RBI.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH, EDWIN...in 14 appearances in March/April, **Edwin Díaz** converted 11-of-11 save opportunities while posting a 0.63 ERA (1 ER, 14.1 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 7 walks...Díaz is one of nine pitchers (done 10x) in Major League history to record at least 11 saves and 27 strikeouts in any calendar month...he is the first to do so since Aroldis Chapman had 13 saves to go along with 31 strikeouts in July 2012 for Cincinnati...Díaz is the second Mariner to accomplish this feat, joining Norm Charlton, who had 11 saves and 29 strikeouts in September 1995.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH CANDIDATE...in 27 games in March/April, **Mitch Haniger** hit .309 (30x97) with 17 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 27 RBI, 12 walks, a .384 on-base percentage and a .701 slugging percentage (1.085 OPS)...among American League leaders for March/April, he ranked T1st in home runs, T2nd in RBI, 4th in slugging, 3rd in extra-base hits and total bases (68) and 5th in OPS...Haniger recorded 5 game-winning RBI in March/April, tied for the most in the AL with Alex Bregman-HOU and Jed Lowrie-OAK...he recorded an RBI every 3.59 at-bats (97 AB, 27 RBI), 3rd-best in the AL (Didi Gregorius-NYY, 3.27/98 AB, 30 RBI and Xander Bogaerts-BOS, 3.40/51 AB, 15 RBI)...Haniger averaged one home run every 9.70 at-bats (97 AB, 10 HR), 2nd-best in the AL (Matt Davidson-CWS, 9.67/87 AB, 9 HR)...he reached base safely via a hit or walk in 22 of 27 games, including 18 games with a hit...Haniger had 9 multi-RBI games in March/April, most in the Major Leagues, ahead of Khristian Davis-OAK (8) and Gary Sánchez-NYY (8).

TWO OUTS, SO WHAT...the Mariners are batting .262 (79x302) with two outs this season, 5th-best in the Majors and 3rd-best in the AL...trail only Atlanta (.290/97x334), Oakland (.290/97x334), Los Angeles-AL (.284/95x334) and Milwaukee (.273/94x344)...Seattle's 18 home runs with two outs are T2nd-most in MLB (also: New York-AL), behind the Athletics (19)...three Mariners rank among the American League's top-9 hitters with two outs: **Robinson Canó's** .406 (13x32) average is 3rd-best, while **Jean Segura** ranks 4th with a .405 (15x37) mark, and **Kyle Seager** is 9th with a .353 (12x34) average...Seager and **Mitch Haniger** have each hit 4 home runs with two outs, tied with 5 others for 3rd-most in MLB...Seager's 12 RBI with two outs are tied with 3 others for 3rd-most in the Majors.

DID YOU KNOW?...that the Mariners are 12-0 this season when their bullpen inherits a lead?...the Mariners are one of four teams in the Major Leagues to have their bullpen protect every lead it has inherited, joining Arizona (15-0), Chicago-NL (11-0) and Cleveland (11-0)...STATS.

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 382nd career start and his 48th career start vs. Oakland tonight.
- Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
- A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Is 23-25 with a 4.02 ERA (175 ER, 392.0 IP) in 61 career GS in May.

LAST OUTING...

...earned the win in his 6th start of the season, a 4-3 Mariners win at Chicago-AL on April 25...allowed 3 runs on 7 hits and 2 walks while striking out 6 across 6.0 innings pitched...allowed 2 runs in the 1st inning, including a leadoff home run to Yoan Moncada...did not allow a baserunner in his last 3.0 innings pitched.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY...

...of Félix's 47 career starts against the Athletics, 37 are quality starts, including his April 15 start at Safeco Field (6.1,5,2,2,0,7,HR-1)... since the Athletics moved to Oakland in 1968, no pitcher has recorded more quality starts vs. the Athletics than Hernández...he ranks ahead of Frank Tanana (34), Bert Blyleven (31), Tommy John (29), Ervin Santana (27) and Roger Clemens (27).

ATHLETICS TALENT...

...in his last 10 starts vs. Oakland (July 4, 2015-c), Félix is 5-3 with a 2.49 ERA (17ER, 61.1 IP)...in that same span, he is 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA (7 ER, 30.1 IP) in 5 starts (4 quality starts) against the Athletics at Safeco Field... his 2.61 career ERA vs. Oakland ranks second among qualifying active pitchers (Ervin Santana, 1.95 ERA/45 ER, 208.0 IP).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...

...in 2 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 ER, 5.0 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 1 walk...Félix exited his first spring start after 1.1 innings on 2/26 at CHC after being hit by a line drive on right forearm (1.1,1,1,1,0,2)...allowed 1 R over 3.0 innings in MiL game on 3/19 at SD-AAA (3.0,3,1,1,0,5)...threw 3.2 innings on 3/24 vs. CHC, allowing a leadoff home run before retiring 10 of the last 14 batters he faced (3.2,4,1,1,1,3).

IMPRESSIVE START...

...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest AL pitcher (all starts in AL) is Verlander with 49...during this stretch Félix has recorded 249 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (258).

HE'S OUR LEADER...

...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...

Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins (163), starts (381), innings pitched (2,535.0) and strikeouts (2,368).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

CAREER...

...spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner... is 163-116 with a 3.22 ERA (908 ER, 2535.0 IP) in 381 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins (163), starts (381), quality starts (249), innings pitched (2535.0) and strikeouts (2,368).

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 7th start of the season tomorrow against the Athletics...no decision in his last start, a 5-4 Mariners win in Cleveland on April 26 (6.0,5,2,2,3,10,HR-1)...no decision in a 9-7 come-from-behind win against TEX on April 21 (4.0,6,5,5,3,6)...W#1 in a 2-1 Mariners win on April 16 vs. HOU (6.0,3,1,1,3,7,HR-1); 10 strikeouts matched his career high (5th time, 2nd in '18)...L#2 in a 2-4 Mariners loss on April 5 at MIN (5.0,4,2,2,5,1,HR-1)...L#1 in his first start of the season, a 5-6 Mariners loss on March 31 vs. CLE (4.2,6,6,6,4,4, HR-2)...**SPRING TRAINING:** Went 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts...**2017:** Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...**CAREER:** 31-21 with a 3.41 ERA (172 ER, 453.2 IP) in 80 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...**vs. OAK:** Is making his 7th career start and his 1st start this season against Oakland...is 3-0 with a 3.96 ERA (16 ER, 36.1 IP) in 6 career starts against the Athletics.
