TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-day, 6-game homestand with the second of three games against the Oakland Athletics (1-0)...will also host the Los Angeles Angels for three games over the weekend...went 7-3 on a recently-concluded 10-game, 10-day, 3-city road trip to Texas (2-1), Chicago-AL (2-1) and Cleveland (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle is 8-3 in its last 11 games, 13-7 in its last 20 games and 14-8 in its last 22 games...Seattle is 8-6 during the day and 9-5 at night...Seattle is 6-5 at Safeco Field and 11-6 on the road.

- **Leaders** - three Mariners lead outright or are tied for the American League lead in major statistical categories: **Edwin Díaz** leads the AL with 12 saves...**Dee Gordon** leads the AL with 12 stolen bases...**Mitch Haniger** is tied for the AL lead with 10 home runs (also: Didi Gregorius-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA).
- **What a Relief** - the Mariners bullpen has combined for a 1.71 ERA (4 ER, 21.0 IP) over its last 7 games (4/24-c)...Mariners relievers have struck out 33 while walking 6 and holding opponents to a .125 (9x72) average against during that span.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied eight of their first nine series, posting a series record of 6-1-2.
- **The Juan Nicasio File** - **Juan Nicasio** leads the Major Leagues with 11 holds...over his last 7 games (4/16-c), he has retired 20 of 22 batters faced over 7.0 scoreless innings (2 H, 0 BB, 8 K).
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 14-4 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 3-7 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 6 games over .500 at 17-11...Seattle has not been 6 games over .500 since finishing the 2016 season 10 games over .500 at 86-76 (.531).

SOLVING SOUTHPAWS...the Mariners are 5-2 this season when facing a left-handed starter...over the last two seasons (2017-c), **Ichiro Suzuki** (.370/20x54, 3 2B, 5 RBI, 6 BB), **Jean Segura** (.316/48x152, 7 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 16 RBI, 15 BB), **Guillermo Heredia** (.308/45x146, 8 2B, 4 HR, 14 RBI, 10 BB) and **Ryon Healy** (.308/44x143, 8 2B, 7 HR, 23 RBI, 7 BB) each have hit over .300 vs. lefties...**Ichiro** is batting .364 (12x33) vs. tonight's A's starter Brett Anderson...his 12 hits are the most in the Majors off Anderson.

LEFT IS RIGHT...since 2012, **Kyle Seager** leads all active left-handed batters in home runs vs. left-handed pitchers with 53...during that span, he ranks ahead of Chris Davis (52), Jay Bruce (46), Anthony Rizzo (43), Joey Votto (41) and teammate **Robinson Canó** (40)...since 2012, **Nelson Cruz** leads all players in home runs off lefties with 61, ranking ahead of Giancarlo Stanton (59), Mark Trumbo (57), Josh Donaldson (56), Todd Frazier (55) and Seager (53)...Cruz (2) and Canó have each homered off tonight's Oakland A's starter Brett Anderson.

IN THE SWING OF THINGS...three Mariners are batting at least .300: **Dee Gordon** (.339/39x115), **Mitch Haniger** (.303/30x99) and **Robinson Canó** (.300/30x100), ...Seattle is one of two American League teams with a trio of players batting at least .300, joining Boston (Mookie Betts, .337, J.D. Martinez, .337 and Hanley Ramirez, .311)...Gordon ranks 3rd in the AL, while Haniger ranks 19th and Canó is tied for 20th.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH, EDWIN...closer **Edwin Díaz** has been named the Hartford Presents American League Reliever of the Month for April...it is the second such honor in his career (also: July 2017)...Díaz converted 11-of-11 save opportunities while posting a 0.63 ERA (1 ER, 14.1 IP) in 14 relief appearances in March/April...he struck out 27 and walked 7 while limiting opposing batters to a .043 (2x46) average against...also averaged 16.95 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings-pitched (27 K, 14.1 IP)...among American League relievers for March/April, Díaz ranked 1st in saves, strikeouts, K/9.0 IP and opponents' average against...the Mariners went 14-0 in his 14 outings in March/April...he is one of 9 pitchers in Major League history (done 10x) to record at least 11 saves and 27 strikeouts in any calendar month...Díaz is the first to do so since Aroldis Chapman-CIN (13 SV, 31 K) in July 2012 and the second Mariners pitcher to do so, joining Norm Charlton, who had 11 saves and 29 strikeouts in September 1995.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY...**Ichiro Suzuki** is batting .331 (558x1688) with 260 runs scored, 66 doubles, 21 triples, 15 home runs, 133 RBI and 129 walks in 452 career games in May...his .331 average is his highest monthly career average (min. 200 PA), ranking ahead of his .324 (536x1653) in June...among all active players Ichiro's .331 average is the 2nd-highest in the Majors (min. 300 PA), trailing only Xander Bogaerts (.338/148x438) and ranking ahead of Miguel Cabrera (.327/463x1446)...also among active May leaders, he leads the Majors in hits (558), while ranking 2nd in runs scored (260) and in triples (21).

O-TOWN BULLIES...**Mitch Haniger** (.357/25x70, 13 R, 6 2B, 3B, 6 HR, 16 RBI, 3 BB), **Ichiro Suzuki** (.327/320x979, 118 R, 30 2B, 8 3B, 5 HR, 68 RBI, 64 BB), **Dee Gordon** (.327/16x49, 7 R, 3 2B, 3B, 6 RBI) and **Jean Segura** (.316/25x79, 19 R, 6 2B, 3B, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 5 BB) are all batting above .315 in their careers vs. Oakland...among all active players, **Ichiro's** 320 career hits and 118 runs scored vs. the A's are the most in the Majors, while also ranking 4th in average (min. 150 PA).

STRAIGHT A'S...**Dee Gordon** has hit safely in 7 of 8 games vs. the Athletics, including 4 multi-hit contests...dating back to 2017, **Gordon** is batting .432 (16x37) with 7 runs scored, 3 doubles, 6 RBI and 5 stolen bases...during this stretch his .432 average vs. the A's is the 2nd-highest, while teammates **Mitch Haniger** (.357/25x70, 13 R, 6 2B, 3B, 6 HR, 16 RBI, 3 BB) and **Jean Segura** (.348/23x66, 17 R, 6 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBI, 5 BB) rank 10th and 12th respectively.

GREEN AND GOLD...since 2015, the Mariners are 40-21 (.656) in 61 games vs. the Athletics, including winning 11 of their last 13 games vs. Oakland (7/9/17-c)...Seattle's .656 winning percentage vs. the Athletics is tied for the best record by an American League team against a division opponent during this span: Seattle vs. Oakland (40-21/.656), Houston vs. Seattle (40-21/.656), Cleveland vs. Detroit (38-21/.644), New York-AL vs. Tampa Bay (37-22/.627) and Los Angeles-AL vs. Oakland (40-24/.625).

AS YOU KNOW?...**Dee Gordon** is 11-for-14 (.786) over his last 3 games with 5 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 RBI, 1 HBP and 3 stolen bases...**BUT, DID YOU KNOW?**...that Gordon's 11 hits are tied for the most hits during a 3-game span in Mariners club history?...Gordon joins Kendrys Morales (7/31-8/2/13), **Ichiro Suzuki** (3x: 6/6-8/06, 9/21-24/04 & 9/20-22/04) and Alex Rodriguez (4/18-20/98) as the only Mariners to record 11 hits over a 3-game span as a Mariner...Carlos Correa-HOU was the last Major League player with at least 11 hits in a 3-game span (11 H, 9/26-28/17).

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 7th start of 2018, his 81st career MLB start, and 7th career start vs. the Athletics tonight.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game...named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Is 4-1 with a 1.70 ERA (8 ER, 42.1 IP) in 7 career starts in the month of May.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 5-4 Mariners win, on April 26 at Cleveland...allowed 2 runs on 5 hits and 3 walks across 6.0 innings...tied his career high with 10 strikeouts...both runs came on a two-run homer by Yonder Alonso in the 6th inning.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 5 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks...threw 5.0 innings in his final spring start on 3/25 vs. SD, allowing 3 runs (2 earned runs) on 6 hits while walking 1 and striking out 6.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)... earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...placed on the 10-day DL on May 5 (retro to May 3) with a left forearm strain...activated on May 30 after making one rehab start (5/26 w/AA Arkansas)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL starting Aug. 11 with a strained left pectoral muscle...activated on Sept. 15.

2017 AWARDS...named the **2017 MARINERS PITCHER OF THE YEAR** by the Seattle BBWAA...earlier in the season, earned two American League awards in the span of three days...**AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH**...named American League Pitcher of the Month for July on Aug. 2...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July...**CO-AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK**...named co-American League Player of the Week on July 31...went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 13.0 IP) with 18 strikeouts and 0 walks in 2 starts vs. BOS (7/24) and New York-NL (7/30) for the week of July 24-30...marked his 2nd such honor of the season (also: April 10-16)...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season...shared the honors with Texas' Adrian Beltre.

THE STREAK...earned the win in 7 consecutive starts, July 2, 2017 -Aug. 4, 2017...equaled the club record for wins in consecutive starts (also: Jamie Moyer, 5/6-6/8/03, and Scott Bankhead, 6/18-7/20/89)...fell one win short of becoming the first Mariner in club history to earn the win in 8 consecutive starts.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH...in 6 starts in the month of July, went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 6 wins in a calendar month...his 1.37 ERA for July was the lowest in calendar month by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández posted a 1.22 ERA (6 ER, 44.1 IP) in June of 2014...Paxton's 1.37 ERA in July was 7th-lowest in club history by a Mariners left-hander in a calendar month and the lowest since Jamie Moyer posted a 1.01 ERA (4 ER, 35.2 IP) in June of 2002.

2017 NOTABLES...Paxton was the first Mariners left-hander with 12 wins in a season since Jason Vargas won 14 games in 2012...Paxton did not allow a home run in 7 consecutive starts (7/2-8/4), working at least 6.0 innings in each of those 7 outings...his streak of 7 straight starts (7/2/17-8/4/17) of 6.0+ IP without allowing a home run was T2nd longest in club history, tied with Doug Fister (6/14-7/21/11)...trailed only Félix Hernández's club record of 9 consecutive such starts, May 7 - June 18, 2014.

RING 'EM UP...recorded 11 outings last season with at least 8 strikeouts...ranked T6th-most such starts in the American League (also: Carlos Carrasco-CLE)...trailed only Chris Sale-BOS (26), Corey Kluber-CLE (22), Chris Archer-TB (18), Luis Severino-NYY (16) & Justin Verlander-DET/HOU (13).

INJURIES & REHAB...placed on the 10-day DL with a left forearm strain on May 5, 2017 (retro to May 3)...appeared in 1 game on a rehab assignment with AA Arkansas...started vs. Frisco on May 26, 2017, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits (1 home run) while striking out 5 in 4.0 innings...activated from the 10-day DL on May 31, 2017...was again placed on the 10-day DL on Aug. 11, 2017, with a left pectoral strain...activated on Sept. 15, 2017.

CAREER...Is 31-21 with a 3.41 ERA (172 ER, 453.2 IP) with 453 strikeouts in 80 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut with Seattle on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. Tampa Bay.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP WADE LeBLANC (0-0, 4.61 ERA)

33-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 1st start of the season...has recorded a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts and 3 walks in 5 relief appearances this season...signed with the Mariners on March 25 after being released by the Yankees at his request...**SPRING TRAINING:** Was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...**2017 SEASON:** Went 5-2-1 in 50 appearances (0 starts) with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP) with 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...**CAREER:** 10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...overall, is 30-35-3 with a 4.41 ERA (289 ER, 590.1 IP) in 181 career appearances/79 starts...in 79 career starts, is 22-31 with a 4.55 ERA (217 ER, 429.0 IP), 294 strikeouts and 147 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League, going 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...**vs. OAK:** Will make his 6th career appearance (4th start) against the Athletics...has gone 2-0 with a 4.98 ERA (12 ER, 21.2 IP) in 6 career appearances...has not faced Oakland since Aug. 14, 2016 (6.0,5,3,3,1,7,HR-2).
