TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-day, 6-game homestand with the final of three games against the Oakland Athletics (1-1)...will also host the Los Angeles Angels for three games over the weekend...went 7-3 on a recently-concluded 10-game, 10-day, 3-city road trip to Texas (2-1), Chicago-AL (2-1) and Cleveland (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle is 8-4 in its last 12 games, 13-8 in its last 21 games and 14-9 in its last 23 games...Seattle is 8-6 during the day and 9-6 at night...Seattle is 6-6 at Safeco Field and 11-6 on the road.

- Series Stuff the Mariners have won or tied eight of their first nine series, posting a series record of 6-1-2.
- Four Score Seattle is 14-4 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 3-7 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
   Swing Away Kyle Seager has hit 60 career home runs at Safeco Field, 3rd-most all-time as a Mariner,
- Swing Away Kyle Seager has hit 60 career home runs at Safeco Field, 3rd-most all-time as a Mariner, trailing only Raúl Ibañez (78) and Bret Boone (62)...Nelson Cruz is 4th on the list with 56 career home runs as a Mariner at Safeco Field, while his 66 career home runs at Safeco trail only Raúl Ibañez (83) all-time.

**ICHI**...the Mariners announced today that OF **Ichiro Suzuki** is transitioning to the role of Special Assistant to the Chairman, effective today...RHP **Erik Goeddel** has been selected from AAA Tacoma to fill Ichiro's spot on the Major League, 25-man, roster...Ichiro ranks 21st all-time in MLB history with 3,089 career hits, including 2,542 as a Mariner...after amassing 1,278 hits during a 9-year career (1992-2000) with the Orix Blue Wave of Japan's Pacific League, Ichiro has totaled 4,367 between MLB and Japan...on Aug. 7, 2016, he recorded his 3,000th career hit in the Major Leagues – a triple – becoming one of 31 players to reach that milestone...Ichiro is one of seven players to collect at least 3,000 hits and 500 stolen bases in the Major Leagues, joining Lou Brock, Ty Cobb, Eddie Collins, Rickey Henderson, Paul Molitor and Honus Wagner.

**RUBBER-GAME RECORDS**...the Mariners are 4-0 in rubber games this season (game to decide outcome of a 3-game series), winning the final game of the series vs. Cleveland (3/29-4/1), at Kansas City (4/9-11), vs. Oakland (4/13-15) and at Chicago-AL (4/23-25)...in the first 9 series this season the Mariners are 6-1-2... in 2017 the Mariners went 10-7 in rubber games.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT...James Paxton struck out a career-high 16 batters in 7.0 innings last night vs. the Oakland Athletics (previous: 10, 5x, last: 4/26/18 at CLE)...his 16 strikeouts are the most by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson tallied 19 strikeouts on Aug. 8, 1997 vs Chicago-AL.

- Paxton is the 5th pitcher in Live Era (since 1920) to strike out at least 16 batters in 7 or fewer innings, joining Randy, Johnson (3x). Jake Page (2x). Cliff Lea and Michael Pineda.
- ing Randy Johnson (3x), Jake Peavy (2x), Cliff Lee and Michael Pineda.

   Paxton is the 2nd Mariners pitcher (done 3x) to strike out 16 batters and allow 0 runs in Mariners club history, joining Randy Johnson (8/8/97 vs. CWS & 7/15/95 vs. TOR).
- Since 2000, Paxton is the 6th left-handed pitcher with at least 16 strikeouts in a game, joining Danny Duffy (8/1/16), Cliff Lee (5/6/11), Johan Santana (8/19/07), Randy Johnson (7x between 5/8/01-9/14/02) and Ron Villone (9/29/00).
- Paxton's 16 strikeouts are a single game high at Safeco Field (previous: 15, Pedro Martinez on 9/4/99).
- **Paxton**'s 16 are the most by a Canadian-born player (previous: 15, Erik Bedard on 7/7/07 at TEX w/BAL).

<u>SOLVING SOUTHPAWS</u>...the Mariners are 5-3 this season when facing a left-handed starter...**Ben Gamel** (2x5, 3B, BB), **Mitch Haniger** (.333/10x30, 3 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 3 BB), **Kyle Seager** (.324/12x37, 2B, 5 RBI, BB) and **Jean Segura** (.313/10x32, 2 2B, 3B, 6 RBI, BB) are each batting over .300 this season vs. left-handed pitchers...**Seager**'s 12 hits vs. lefties this season are currently T8th in the American League, while his .324 average vs. left-handed pitchers is the 5th-highest among left-handed batters.

**LEFT IS RIGHT**...since 2012, **Kyle Seager** leads all active left-handed batters in home runs vs. left-handed pitchers with 53...during that span, he ranks ahead of Chris Davis (52), Jay Bruce (46), Anthony Rizzo (44), Joey Votto (41) and teammate **Robinson Canó** (40)...since 2012, **Nelson Cruz** and Giancarlo Stanton are tied for the lead among all players in home runs off lefties with 61, ranking ahead of Mark Trumbo (57), Josh Donaldson (56), Todd Frazier (55) and Seager (53).

**STRAIGHT A'S...Dee Gordon** has hit safely in 8 of 9 games vs. the Athletics, including 5 multihit contests...dating back to 2017, **Gordon** is batting .429 (18x42) with 7 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 6 RBI and 5 stolen bases...during this stretch his .429 average vs. the A's is the 2nd-highest in the Majors, while teammates **Jean Segura** (.352/25x71, 17 R, 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, 5 BB) and **Mitch Haniger** (.351/26x74, 13 R, 6 2B, 3B, 6 HR, 16 RBI, 3 BB) rank 11th and 12th respectively...**Kyle Seager** has hit safely in all 5 games he has appeared in vs. the A's this season, batting .526 (10x19) with 4 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

**ON A ROLL**...dating back to April 20, the Mariners offense is batting .278 (119x428) with 68 runs scored, 31 doubles, 3 triples, 20 home runs, 68 RBI, 7 HBP, 32 walks and 8 stolen bases in their last 12 games...during this 12-game stretch, the Mariners lead the American League in slugging percentage (.505), while also ranking T1st in doubles (31); 2nd in batting average (.278/119x428), RBI (68), onbase percentage (.335) and OPS (.840); T2nd in runs scored (68); 3rd in home runs (20) and runs per game (5.67); and 4th in hits (119).

**GREEN AND GOLD**...since 2015, the Mariners are 40-22 (.645) in 62 games vs. the Athletics, including winning 11 of their last 14 games vs. Oakland (7/9/17-c)...Seattle's .645 winning percentage vs. the Athletics is the 2nd-best record by an American League team against a division opponent during this span: Houston vs. Seattle (40-21/.656), Seattle vs. Oakland (40-22/.645), Cleveland vs. Detroit (38-21/.644), New York-AL vs. Tampa Bay (37-22/.627) and Los Angeles-AL vs. Oakland (40-24/.625).

AS YOU KNOW...Dee Gordon is batting .342 (41x120) with 18 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 8 RBI, 3 HBP, 2 walks and 12 stolen bases in 29 games this season...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?...that Gordon's 41 hits are tied for the 4th-most in club history through the Mariners first 29 player games of the season?...Gordon trails only Jean Segura (46 hits, 4/3-5/17/17), Ichiro Suzuki (46 hits, 4/2-5/4/01) and Alex Rodriguez (42 hits, 4/1-5/3/97) while being tied with Ichiro (41 hits, 4/15-5/16/09), David Segui (41 hits, 3/31-5/6/98) and Ken Griffey Jr. (41 hits, 4/1-5/4/97).

FRESH START...has not started a game since earning the win against Milwaukee on Aug. 19, 2016 (5.1,6,3,3,0,4,HR-3), a span of 622 days and 65 appearances between starts.

.COME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-NL at his request.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

LAST TIME AROUND...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...was 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and 5 quality starts in 8 starts with the Mariners...held opponents scoreless in 2 of his 3 relief appearances...went 0-0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER. 5.1 IP) with 7 strikeouts in 3 relief appearances

SPRING TRAINING...was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) and 10 strikeouts and 1 walk in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...held opponents to 1 earned run or fewer in 5 of his 7 appearances, including 2 outings with 0 earned runs.

IN JAPAN ... spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League... went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...tossed his second career complete game on April 2, 2015 at Rakuten Golden Eagles, allowing 2 earned runs on 2 hits 9.0 innings (also: 4/25/14 at Reno w/Salt Lake).
