BALTIMORE ORIOLES (8-24) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-16)

RHP Kevin Gausman (2-2, 4.15) vs. RHP Trevor Cahill (1-1, 3.00)

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 26-of-32 of games played this season...Machado currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .437 on-base percentage ranks fourth in the AL and ranks sixth in the majors...His .650 slugging percentage ranks fourth in the AL and fifth in the majors...Machado was named the American League Co-Player of the Week, along with Oakland LHP Sean Manaea, for the week ending April 22...Machado posted a slash line of .500/.560/1.273 with seven runs scored, 11 hits, two doubles, five home runs, and eight RBI over six games played to earn his fourth career AL Player of the Week Award, last winning for the week ending August 20, 2017.

KEEPING UP WITH JONES: On Friday, OF Adam Jones played in his 1,500th game with the Orioles and went 3-for-4 at the plate with one home run...He became the eighth player in Orioles history (since 1954) to reach the 1,500 games played mark...Jones joined Cal Ripken, Jr. (3,001 games), Brooks Robinson (2,896), Mark Belanger (1,962), Eddie Murray (1,884), Boog Powell (1,763), Brady Anderson (1,759), and Paul Blair (1,700) as players to appear in at least 1,500 games with the Orioles...According to STATS, LLC., Jones became the seventh active player to reach 1,500 games with his current team (see chart at right)...Jones joined the Orioles on February 8, 2008 when he was acquired from the Seattle Mariners along with RHP Chris Tillman, LHP George Sherrill, RHP Kam Mickolio, and LHP Tony Butler in exchange for LHP Erik Bedard.

THE IGNITOR: OF Trey Mancini is hitting .286 (28-for-98) in 23 games when batting lead-off...Mancini ranks tied for fourth in the American League when batting in the lead-off spot...His .343 on-base percentage from the lead-off spot ranks sixth in the AL...He has hit safely in 17-of-23 games while batting lead-off.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Alex Cobb tossed the Orioles 12th Quality Start of the season on Tuesday...The Orioles 12 Quality Starts this season are tied for seventh in the American League...The Orioles fell to 5-7 in games in which their starter has recorded a Quality Start...RHP Dylan Bundy is tied for 12th in the AL with four Quality Starts this season...Orioles starters have received just 55 runs of support this season, which ranks fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received just 114 runs of support this season, which is fewest in the AL and second-fewest in the majors (Miami Marlins, 99).

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones hit his 252nd career home run as a center fielder on Friday...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 252 homers hit while playing center field rank 13th all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails Mickey Mantle (432), Ken Griffey, Jr. (382), Fred Lynn (266), and Bernie Williams (261)...Willie Mays is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

THE COMPANY YOU KEEP: SS Manny Machado hit two home runs on April 22 against the Indians for his third multi-home run game of the season and the 17th of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Machado is tied for sixth all-time in multi home run games by a right-handed batter 25-years-old and younger...He trails Jimmie Foxx (19), Bob Horner (19), Willie Mays (19), Alex Rodriguez (19), and Andruw Jones (18)...He is tied with Joe DiMaggio (17) and Ralph Kiner (17).

CATCH THIS: On April 21, C Chance Sisco threw out three Cleveland baserunners attempting to steal...He caught LF Michael Brantley attempting to steal second base in the sixth inning, SS Francisco Lindor at second base in the seventh inning, and PR Rajai Davis at third in the ninth inning...Sisco has caught 8-of-15 would-be base stealers this season...It marked the first time an Orioles catcher had three catcher-caught-stealing in a game since C Matt Wieters caught three baserunners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto.

MAKE MINE A DOUBLE: In the 12th inning on April 8 at New York-AL, the Orioles turned a 1-2-5 double play when a bases-loaded ground-er to RHP Brad Brach was thrown to C Caleb Joseph and was completed with a throw by Joseph to 3B Tim Beckham...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 1-2-5 double play was the first of its kind in the majors since September 7, 2012 when the Houston Astros (RHP Lucas Harrell, C Chris Snyder, 3B Matt Dominguez) did so against the Cincinnati Reds...Also, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Sunday's 12th-inning two-out play marked the first 1-2-5 double play in Orioles history.

SIX PACK: Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Orioles hitters lead the majors with 1,372 home runs hit and also lead the majors in fewest number of errors committed with 522...Several current hitters rank among Major League leaders in home runs since 2012...Chris Davis ranks second with 225, Adam Jones ranks seventh with 181, and Mark Trumbo is tied for 13th with 172 home runs.

VS. OAKLAND: The Orioles and Athletics play the second game of six matchups between the two clubs this season...The A's lead the season series, 1-0...The A's will visit Baltimore, September 11-13...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 4-3...Baltimore leads Oakland (since 1968) in the all-time series, 265-264, with the Orioles going 128-129 at home and 135-134 in Oakland...From 1954-67, the Orioles owned a 161-116 record against the Philadelphia/Kansas City Athletics.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1964, 19-year-old rookie RHP Wally Bunker made his first start of the season and second of his Major League career...Bunker tossed a one-hitter, defeating Washington 2-1...OF Chuck Hinton's fourth-inning single was the only hit allowed by Bunker...1B Norm Sieburn's two-run home run in the seventh inning helped give Bunker and the Orioles the win...Bunker went on to win his first six games, tossed another one-hitter, and won 19 games during the season to be named the AL Rookie Pitcher of the Year.

DISABLED LIST: Five Orioles are currently on the disabled list...OF Colby Rasmus (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), 2B Jonathan Schoop (right oblique strain, since 4/14), and INF Tim Beckham (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 10-day disabled list...LHP Zach Britton (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15) and RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26) are on the 60-day DL.

FEEL THE DRAFT: The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own four picks in the top 115 of the 2018 Draft: the No. 11, 37, 87, and 115 overall selections.

STEADY EDDIE: The Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) has selected five baseball legends to be inducted into its "Hall of Game" as part of their fifth induction class...This year's class includes Dick Allen, Kenny Lofton, Eddie Murray, James Timothy "Mudcat" Grant, and James Rodney "J.R." Richard...The five greats will be inducted into the NLBM Hall of Game during ceremonies at the Gem Theater in Kansas City on June 9...Murray played 21 seasons, predominantly for the Orioles...With the Orioles, Murray earned three Gold Gloves, two of his three Silver Slugger Awards, and seven of his eight total All-Star appearances...Helping the O's to a World Series victory in 1983, Murray had his number retired by the team in 1998 and was inducted into the Orioles Hall of Fame in 1999...Just the third player in history to reach 500 home runs and 3,000 hits following Hank Aaron and Willie Mays, Murray was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

COACHING STAFF: The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for Howie Clark (assistant hitting), Roger McDowell (pitching), and Alan Mills (bullpen); the fourth for Scott Coolbaugh (hitting); and sixth season for Bobby Dickerson (third base) and Einar Diaz (coach); while Wayne Kirby (first base) and John Russell (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (630-593, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,512 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 630 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Making his seventh start of the 2018 season...Prior to the 2018 season, he changed his number to No. 34 to honor the late Roy Halladay, his childhood hero and fellow Coloradan...Made a team-leading 34 starts last year, which was also a career-high, passing his previous high of 30 set in 2016...His 34 starts also tied Chris Archer for the most in MLB...Was ejected for the first time in his career on May 3 at Boston after hitting Xander Bogaerts.

LAST START: Gausman made his sixth start of the season on April 29 vs. Detroit...Earned the win after tossing 5.2 innings, allowing one run on five hits, one home run, with three walks, and four strikeouts...Fewest runs allowed this season, and the fewest since also allowing one in his last start of the 2017 season (10/1/17 at TB)...Has allowed a home run in all but one of his starts this season (4/6 at NYY)...Is a career 2-1 in eight starts against Detroit...Threw 106 pitches, 66 strikes.

CAREER VS. OAKLAND: Gausman will be making his fourth career start against Oakland, and his first since the 2016 season...He is 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (8 ER/17.0 IP), and two Quality Starts in his first three games against the Athletics...He has made two starts at Oakland Coliseum, going 0-2 with a 6.30 ERA (7 ER/10.0 IP)...His one home start against the A's came on June 7, 2014 when he tossed 7.0 innings, allowing one run on four hits, one home run, with one walk and six strikeouts.

VS. AL WEST: Will be making his first start against an AL West opponent this season, and the 22nd of his career (23rd appearance)...He is a career 7-11 against the division with a 4.02 ERA (59 ER/132.0 IP), 13 Quality Starts, and a 8.05 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings...Gausman's last win on the road against an AL West opponent came on August 14, 2017 at Seattle, his last road start against the division, when he tossed 7.0 innings, allowing two runs on six hits, one home run, with one walk, and six strikeouts; the Orioles won 11-3...In 14 career road starts against the AL West, he is 2-10 with a 4.27 ERA (41 ER/86.1 IP)...In seven career home starts (eight appearance), he is 5-1 with a 3.55 ERA (18 ER/45.2 IP).

FIRST INNING TROUBLE: Gausman has surrendered runs in the first inning of three of his six starts this season (four runs on 4/1 vs. MIN, one run on 4/6 vs. NYY, one run on 4/11 vs. TOR), bringing his career first inning ERA to 5.54 (69 ER/112.0 IP), his highest career ERA for any inning...Last season, Gausman posted a 6.35 ERA (24 ER/34.0 IP) in the first inning, the sixth-highest mark among AL pitchers (min. 20 starts).

GETTING THEM EARLY: Gausman has allowed a .133 (2-for-15) opponents batting average with a 0-2 count...With a 1-2 count, opponents are hitting .083 (2-for-24)...When the count is even with two strikes at 2-2, opponents are hitting .250 (6-for-24), and with a full count opponents are hitting .231 (3-for-13)...The first time through the lineup, opponents are hitting .292 (14-for-48), second time through, .212 (11-for-52), and the third time through, .306 (11-for-36).

ON THE ROAD: Gausman will be making his third road start of the 2018 season and the 59th road start of his career (74th career road appearance)...In his first two road starts of the season, he is 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP), one Quality Start, one walk, and seven strikeouts...He has gone 15-29 with a 4.75 ERA (180 ER/341.1 IP) on the road as opposed to being 21-16 with a 3.59 ERA (133 ER/333.0 IP) in 54 career starts (62 appearances) at home...In 2017, Gausman pitched to a record of 7-7 with a 4.75 ERA (48 ER/91.0 IP) in 17 road games, making eight Quality Starts.

IMMACULATE INNING: Gausman struck out the side in the seventh inning on nine pitches on 4/23 against Cleveland...The inning marked Gausman's first "immaculate inning" of his career...According to STATS LLC., he was the first Orioles pitcher to accomplish the feat since 1988 (since such records have been kept)...Since 1988, an "immaculate inning" has been recorded 52 times in the majors and Gausman's was the first since RHP Rick Porcello did so against Tampa Bay in the fifth inning on August 9, 2017.

QUICK ON THE DRAW: With his three strikeouts on April 6 at New York-AL, Gausman passed 600 strikeouts for his career for his career (now has 623)...According to STATS, LLC., Gausman's 131 career games to reach the 600-strikeout mark rank as the third-fewest in Orioles history (since 1954)...LHP Erik Bedard (110 games) and RHP Daniel Cabrera (129 games) rank first and second, respectively...Ranking fourth and fifth-fewest games to 600 are RHP Mike Mussina (133 games) and RHP Jim Palmer (138 games).
