TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 11, 2006: Hideki Matsui fractures his left wrist and is removed from the game in the top of the first inning vs. Boston. According to Rule 10.24 (c), his 1,768 consecutive-games-played streak as a professional (1,250 with the Yomiuri Giants and 518 with the Yankees) comes to an end. His streak as a Yankee is the longest since Lou Gehrig's (2,130).

May 11, 1903: In the fifth inning of the Highlanders' 8-2 victory at Detroit's Bennett Park, first baseman John Gangel hits the first home run in Yankees franchise history, an inside-the-park solo homer off Tigers pitcher George Mullin.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 12, 1996: Trailing 8-0 after two innings, the Yankees respond with nine unanswered runs to pull out a Mother's Day win at Chicago's Comiskey Park. Joe Girardi hits a bases-clearing double in the sixth to give the Yankees the lead.

May 12, 1953: Whitey Ford throws a one-hit complete game shutout against the Indians at Yankee Stadium, allowing his only hit to Cleveland pitcher Early Wynn (6th inning single) as the Yankees win 7-0.

May 12, 1925: Yogi Berra is born in St. Louis, Mo. A three-time American League MVP and 10-time World Series champion, Berra was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1972.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 5-1 on their nine-game homestand, having won 2-of-3 vs. Boston and sweeping a 3G series vs. Cleveland last weekend...finish with 3G vs. Oakland (tonight-Sun.)...following this homestand, depart on an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Had their eight-game winning streak snapped in Thursday's series finale vs. Boston...are 15G over .500, 1G shy of their season high (16G over at the close of play Wed.)
- ▶ At 26-11 (.703), **are tied with Boston for the Majors' best record...is the latest in a season they have had at least a share of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/28/12** (tied with Cincinnati and Washington at 60-40)...with a win tonight and a Boston loss, would have sole possession of the best record in MLB this late in a season for the first time since the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 9-9, the Yankees are 17-2).
- ▶ **At 26-11, have tied for the ninth-best 37G start in franchise history...matches the 2003 and 1994 seasons as their second-best 37G start over the last 60 seasons** since 1959 (went 28-9 to start 1998).
- ▶ Their +65 run differential is second in MLB (Houston, +82).
- ▶ **Are 11-9 vs. the AL East and 15-2 vs. all other divisions.**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees had their eight-game winning streak snapped, falling, 5-4, on Thursday vs. Boston...**Yankees batters** were held without an extra-base hit for the first time this season...scored all four runs in the seventh inning on a walk, single, force out and wild pitch, knotting the game at 4-4...**LHP CC Sabathia** (4.0IP, 9H, 4ER, 0BB, 5K, 1HR) started and took a no-decision, allowing a season high in runs and hits...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-2, 3BB) had a run-scoring single and reached base four times in five trips, drawing a season-high 3BB...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4) was the only Yankee to record a multi-hit game, extending his hitting streak to eight games...**RHP Jonathan Holder** (2.0IP, 2K) retired all six batters faced...**RHP Dellin Betances** (2.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 3K, 1HR) retired 6-of-7 batters but took the loss, allowing a tie-breaking solo HR to J.D. Martinez in the eighth.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO BEAT THE BEST: Each of the Yankees' wins over their 8G winning streak (5/1-5/9) that ended with their loss on Thursday vs. Boston came against teams in sole possession or tied for first place at the start of the game...according to *Elias*, it marked the **second-longest winning streak against solely first-place teams (sole possession or tied for first)** by any club in MLB history, trailing only Cincinnati, who won 10 such games in-a-row from 6/21-7/1/99.

IT AIN'T OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER: The Yankees are 4-9 this season when *trailing after eight innings*, marking the most such wins in MLB this year (no other team has more than two such wins)...were 5-65 in such games in 2017.

- ▶ Have 10 come-from-behind victories this season and six wins *having gone ahead in their last at-bat* (five of which have come in their last nine games (since 5/1).
- ▶ Have won four of their 11 games (36.4%) *when trailing after seven innings this season*, marking the best such winning percentage in the Majors and tying for the most such wins (Mets are 4-12 in those games)...went 8-59 (11.9%) in such games in 2017.
- ▶ Seven times over their last 14G played, the Yankees have won after being tied or trailing after seven innings.

NOTHING EXTRA: In Thursday's loss vs. Boston, the Yankees were held without an extra-base hit for the first time this season, leaving the Cubs as the only team to tally at least 1XBH in every team game this season...also snapped an 86G streak with *at least 1XBH in home games* (5/12/17-5/9/18), the longest such streak in franchise history according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*.

- ▶ Had their streak of hitting at least one double in 30 straight games (home or road) snapped (4/5-5/9)...marked the franchise's second-longest doubles streak since at least 1908 (34G, 5/12-6/19/1936).

18-AND-OVER: The Yankees had their run of 17 wins in 18G (4/21-5/9) snapped with Thursday's loss vs. Boston...**was their best 18G stretch since going 17-1 from 6/2-18/1953, which was part of a larger 21-1 stretch from 5/27-6/18/1953**...matched the best 18-game stretch in MLB this season (Boston went 17-1 from 3/30-4/20).

- ▶ Over the stretch, outscored opponents, 110-45, and out-homered opponents, 25-13.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** posted a 2.28 ERA (162.0IP, 120H, 45R/41ER, 45BB, 182K, 13HR) over the span.
- ▶ **Yankees starters** had a 2.19 ERA (106.2IP, 26ER) during the stretch...allowed three-or-more runs just four times while permitting 1R-or-fewer in 10-of-18 starts.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** averaged 6.11 R/G over the stretch, hitting .250/.331/.454 as a team with 110R, 42 doubles, 2 triples, 25HR and 74BB.

ZEROING IN: The Yankees are one of two teams in the Majors (also Texas) yet to be shut out this season...were shut out just three times in 2017, the second-lowest total in the Majors (Minnesota-2)...their total over the last two seasons (2017-18) is the lowest in the Majors over the stretch...were shut out 13 times in 2016, the tied for the *second-highest* total in the Majors with San Francisco (San Diego-15).

HOME COOKING: The Yankees' loss on Thursday vs. Boston, snapped their all-time current Yankee Stadium record of 11 consecutive home wins...broke the previous mark of nine straight, set from 5/30-6/15/10...outscored opponents, 78-33, during this streak...was their longest *single-season* home win streak since taking 12-straight at the original Stadium from 4/25-6/1/85...matched Cleveland (8/24-9/14/17) and Los Angeles-NL (6/7-25/17) for the Majors' longest single-season home streak since the Indians won 13 straight from 6/1-7/5/16.

- ▶ **Are 16-6 (.727) at home in 2018, the most home wins and third-best home winning percentage in the Majors (Philadelphia, 15-5, .750; and Boston, 11-4, .733).**
- ▶ Since 9/2/17, **are 29-9 in their last 38 regular season home games** (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 11-1-1 in their last 13 home series (since 8/31/17).
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (142), HRs (35), HR per game (1.59), XBHs (81) and OBP (.363)...are second in runs per game (6.45), SLG (.470) and OPS (.832)...have homered in 14 of their last 16G at home.
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in three of their last seven home games.

WALK THIS WAY: INF Neil Walker is 6-for-16 with 9R, 3 doubles, 2RBI, 7BB, 1HP and a .583 OBP in his last 7G since 5/3 (was 13-for-80 with 5BB in his first 21G as a Yankee)...over this stretch, has raised his season BA 35 points and his OBP 82 points.

KID CAN PLAY: 2B Gleyber Torres (age 21y-149d today) has an eight-game hitting streak (since 5/2), batting .407 (11-for-27) with 2HR and 9RBI over the stretch...**is the youngest Yankee since Mickey Mantle (10G, 6/24-7/3(G1)/52, ending at age 20y-257d) to tally a hitting streak of at least 8G.**

- ▶ The Yankees are a **Major League-best 16-2 since he was recalled on 4/22**, with Torres starting all 18 games.
- ▶ Is batting .344/.388/.492 (21-for-61) w/ 9R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 11RBI, 5BB and 1SB in 2018...has reached safely in 16-of-18 games.
- ▶ Is the second-youngest Yankee in franchise history to tally at least 21H in his first 18 career games, behind Mickey Mantle, who also tallied 21H in an equivalent span in 1951.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton is batting .290 (18-for-62) with 16R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 7BB in his last 17 games (since 4/23).

- ▶ Tuesday's 2HR game vs. Boston was his third multi-HR game this season (also 2HR on 5/2 at Houston and 3/29 at Toronto)...is tied for the MLB lead in multi-HR games with Mookie Betts, Matt Davidson and Manny Machado.
- ▶ His 31 career multi-HR games are **the second-most through 1,023 career games in MLB history**, behind Ralph Kiner (35).
- ▶ The Yankees' nine individual multi-HR games in 2018 *through Tuesday* tied for the second-most in MLB history through 35G of a season (S.F. 10G in 1958; Seattle, 9G in 1996).

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees and Athletics will play 6G in 2018: a 3G series in the Bronx this weekend and a 3G series in Oakland over Labor Day (9/3-5)...have lost the last 4G vs. the A's (a 4G series in Oakland last June)...are 11-20 in their last 31 games and 14-26 in their last 40 meetings...had gone 30-7 in the previous 37 matchups prior to that stretch...**IN 2017:** Went 2-5 against the A's, going 2-1 at Yankee Stadium and getting swept in a 4G series in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have won just one of the last five season series with the A's (4-3 in 2016)...are 5-4-1 vs. Oakland over the last 10 season series (since 2008)...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 6-10 vs. Oakland at the current Yankee Stadium since 9/23/12 and 20-14 since its opening in 2009...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** The Yankees went 0-4 at Oakland Coliseum in 2017...are 19-17 in their last 36 games in Oakland...in 2016, snapped a four-series losing streak at the Coliseum, their longest since dropping 12 series in a row from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are 127-136 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

RHP Sonny Gray will make his eighth start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Oakland...will face his former team for the first time since being traded last season...the 28-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's off day...earned his 50th career win on Saturday vs. Cleveland (6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 93-of-130 career starts... was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

LAST START: Earned the win on Saturday vs. Cleveland (6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...allowed a solo homer to Francisco Lindor in the fifth and surrendered a run on Edwin Encarnacion's ground out in the sixth... marked his most strikeouts in a game since his first start of the year (8K on 4/1 at Toronto)...allowed exactly 4H and 2ER for the second consecutive start (also 4/30 at Houston).

VS.
