### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 13, 1985:** Down 8-6 with two on and two out in the bottom of the 9th, Don Mattingly takes former Yankee and then Twin Ron Davis deep for the walk-off three-run homer giving the Bombers the 9-8 win. The Yankees had been down 8-1 going into the sixth.

**May 13, 1955:** Mickey Mantle goes 4-for-4 with 3HR (2LH, 1RH) and all 5RBI in a 5-2 victory vs. Detroit at the Stadium. It marks his only career three-homer game and his first of 10 career games with HRs from both sides of the plate.

**May 13, 1929:** The Yankees lose, 4-3 at Cleveland, marking the first Major League game between two clubs wearing numbered uniforms.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 14, 2009:** The Yankees begin an 18-game streak without committing an error, during which they will compile a 14-4 record.

**May 14, 1996:** Dwight Gooden throws the eighth no-hitter in franchise history, defeating the Seattle Mariners, 2-0, at Yankee Stadium. He tosses 134 pitches in the contest (74 for strikes), walking six and striking out five.

**May 14, 1967:** Mickey Mantle hits his 500th career home run in the seventh inning off Baltimore's Stu Miller, providing the margin of victory in a 6-5 win at Yankee Stadium.

### TUESDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 15, 1941:** Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak begins with a single off Eddie Smith in a 13-1 loss vs. Chicago at Yankee Stadium.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 6-2 on their nine-game homestand with the finale vs. Oakland today...have split the first two games of their current series vs. Oakland...won 2-of-3 vs. Boston after sweeping a 3G series vs. Cleveland...following a Monday off day, begin an 8G road trip on Tuesday: 2G at Washington (Tue.-Wed.), 3G at Kansas City (5/18-20) and 3G at Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ At 27-12 (.692), **are tied with Boston for the Majors' best record**...is the latest in a season they have had at least a share of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/28/12 (tied with Cincinnati and Washington at 60-40)...last had sole possession of the best record in MLB this late in a season at the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 10-10, the Yankees are 18-3).
- ▶ Are 15G over .500, 1G shy of their season high (16G over at the close of play Wednesday).
- ▶ At 27-12, have matched the 1994 season as their second-best 39G start over the last 60 seasons since 1959 (went 30-9 to start 1998).
- ▶ Their +61 run diff. is third in MLB (Houston, +86; Boston, +65).
- ▶ Are 11-9 vs. the AL East and 16-3 vs. all other divisions.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated Oakland, 7-6, in 11 innings on Saturday...trailed 6-2 before scoring 4R in the bottom of the fifth...**Yankees relievers** tossed 6.0 no-hit innings (5BB, 10K, 1WP)...**RHP Domingo Germán** (5.0IP, 6H, 6ER, 3BB, 1K, 1HR) started and took a no decision...allowed a single to Mark Canha with one out in the third, his first career hit allowed *as a starter* (had recorded 25 outs and 2BB to that point, including his previous 6.0-inning outing on 5/6 vs. Cleveland, which was his first career start)...allowed 5ER in the fourth that snapped a personal 15.0-inning scoreless stretch...**C Gary Sánchez** (2-for-4, 3R, 2BB) reached base safely four times and hit a solo HR in the second...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-5, 1BB) followed Sánchez with a HR in the second, marking the Yankees' first set of back-to-back HRs of the season...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-5) hit a two-run HR in the fifth...**1B Neil Walker** (2-for-5, 2RBI, 1BB) had an RBI-single in the fifth and a "walk-off" single in the 11th, his fourth career "walk-off" hit and first since 5/8/17 vs. San Francisco (w/ New York-NL)...**2B Gleyber Torres** (0-for-5) had his nine-game hitting streak snapped...**RHP A.J. Cole** tossed 2.0IP (2BB, 4K) to earn his first win as a Yankee.

**ALL RISE:** **RF Aaron Judge** has homered in two straight games and three of his last four...has 49HR in 123 career home games, including six postseason games.

- ▶ On Saturday vs. Oakland, hit his 67th career regular season HR in his 221st game, matching the most by a player through as many games in Baseball history (Rudy York).
- ▶ Has 13RBI during his six-game RBI streak, the second-longest RBI streak of his career (7G, 9/24-30/17)...with 34RBI this season, is tied fourth in the Majors with Chicago-NL's Javier Baez, trailing only Baltimore's Manny Machado (36RBI), and Oakland's Khris Davis (35RBI) and Jed Lowrie (35RBI).
- ▶ Is hitting .333/.474/.800 (10-for-30) with 6R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 15RBI and 8BB in 8G on the homestand.
- ▶ Leads the Majors with 10HR and 30RBI *at home*.
- ▶ Is third in the Majors with a .436 OBP, trailing only Mike Trout (.453) and Tommy Pham (.437).
- ▶ With 33BB this season, is third in the Majors, trailing Bryce Harper (41) and Mike Trout (34)...is the third Yankee since 1990 to draw at least 33BB through the team's first 39G, joining Kevin Maas (40BB in 1991), Jason Giambi (40BB in 2006) and Nick Johnson (33BB in 2003).

**WALK THIS WAY:** On Saturday, **INF Neil Walker** recorded his fourth career "walk-off" hit with an 11th-inning single in the Yankees' 7-6 win vs. Oakland...is batting .360 (9-for-25) with 9R, 3 doubles, 4RBI, 8BB, 1HP and a .529 OBP in his last 9G since 5/3 (was 13-for-80 with 5BB in his first 21G as a Yankee)...over this stretch, has raised his season BA 47 pts. and his OBP 91 pts.

**MOTHER'S DAY BREAST CANCER AWARENESS:** The Yankees will celebrate Mother's Day today by wearing pink-themed uniforms and equipment in support of MLB's breast cancer awareness initiative...proceeds from the sale of pink bats used in today's game will go to Susan G. Komen and Stand Up To Cancer...additionally, **Rosa Lapaix** and longtime **Staten Island Yankees General Manager Jane Rogers** will be honored prior to the game.

**IN MEMORY OF:** In a pregame ceremony today, the Yankees will make a \$10,000 donation to the ALS Therapy Development Institute in memory of Gretchen Piscotty (mother of A's outfielder Stephen Piscotty), who passed away last Sunday night due to ALS.

**BACK IN BUSINESS:** The Yankees are 18-3 since 4/21, 5.0G better than any other team in the Majors over the stretch (next best: Atlanta and Chicago-NL, 12-7).

- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 126-66, and out-homered opponents, 30-20.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.92 ERA (191.0IP, 150H, 66R/62ER, 59BB, 209K, 20HR) over the span.
- ▶ **Yankees starters** have a 3.06 ERA (120.2IP, 41ER) during the stretch...allowed three-or-more runs just seven times while permitting 1R-or-fewer in 10-of-21 starts.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** averaged 6.00 R/G over the stretch, hitting .244/.332/.439 as a team with 126R, 42 doubles, 2 triples, 30HR and 94BB.

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees are 12-2 in their last 14 home games...won a current Yankee Stadium-record 11 straight games from 4/21-5/9, marking their longest *single-season* home winning streak since taking 12 straight at the original Stadium from 4/25-6/1/85...matched Cleveland (8/24-9/14/17) and Los Angeles-NL (6/7-25/17) for the Majors' longest single-season home winning streak over the last two seasons (2017-18).

- ▶ Are 17-7 (.708) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the most home wins and the third-best home record in the Majors (Boston, 11-4, .733; and Philadelphia, 15-6, .714).
- ▶ Since 9/2/17, are 30-10 in their last 40 regular season home games (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 11-1-1 in their last 13 home series (since 8/31/17).
- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 154-104, at home in 2018.
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (154), HRs (40), HR per game (1.67) and XBHs (86)...are second in runs per game (6.42) and OBP (.362)...are third in OPS (.828)...have homered in 16 of their last 18G at home.
- ▶ Have played 24 home games in 2018, second-most in the Majors (San Diego-26)...following today, will play just six of the next 25 games at Yankee Stadium (5/15-6/10).
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in four of their last nine home games...their four "walk-off" hits are second-most in the Majors this season (St. Louis-5).

**BOUNCE WITH ME:** The Yankees have played just one rubber game so far this season, losing on 4/12 at Boston.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** With Tyler Austin (16RBI), Miguel Andújar (14RBI) and Gleyber Torres (12RBI), Yankees occupy three of the top-four spots on the AL rookie RBI leaderboard (Los Angeles-AL's Shohei Ohtani-16RBI).

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** **Yankees pitchers** have limited opponents to a .146 BA (22-for-151) with RISP over the last 20 games (since 4/21)...A's batters are just 5-for-27 (.185) this series...their .213 opp. BA with RISP leads all AL staffs and is second to Washington (.197).

**HOLD IT RIGHT THERE:** **RHP Jonathan Holder** has not allowed an earned run in eight appearances since being recalled from Triple-A Scranton/WB on 4/21, retiring 28-of-31 batters (9.2IP, 2H, 1R/0ER, 1BB/1IBB, 8K).

**HOT, HOT HEAT:** **LHP Aroldis Chapman** has struck out 35-of-73 batters (47.9%) this season, the second-best strikeout rate among MLB relievers to Milwaukee's Josh Hader (60.8%).

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 1-1 vs. the Athletics in 2018...will play 6G in 2018: their current 3G series in the Bronx this weekend and a 3G series in Oakland over Labor Day (9/3-5)...are 1-5 in the last 6G vs. the A's...are 12-21 in their last 33 games and 15-27 in their last 42 meetings...had gone 30-7 in the previous 37 matchups prior to that stretch...**IN 2017:** Went 2-5 against the A's, going 2-1 at Yankee Stadium and getting swept in a 4G series in Oakland...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have won just one of the last five season series with the A's (4-3 in 2016)...are 5-4-1 vs. Oakland over the last 10 season series (since 2008)...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 1-1 at Yankee Stadium this year...are 7-11 vs. Oakland at the current Yankee Stadium since 9/23/12 and 21-15 since its opening in 2009...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** The Yankees went 0-4 at Oakland Coliseum in 2017...are 19-17 in their last 36 games in Oakland...in 2016, snapped a four-series losing streak at the Coliseum, their longest since dropping 12 series in a row from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are 127-136 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (5-1, 2.21 ERA)

**RHP Luis Severino** will make his ninth start of the season in today's homestand finale vs. Oakland...the 24-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...is tied for the AL lead (tied for second in the Majors) with five wins...is sixth in the AL in ERA...also ranks sixth in the AL with a .181 opp. BA (34-for-188)...the Yankees are 7-1 in his starts...tossed his first career shutout on 5/2 at Houston (5H, 1BB, 10K), also his first career complete game...made his first career Opening Day start in a win on 3/29 at Toronto, yielding 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings...at 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

**LAST START:** Started and took a no-decision in the Yankees' 3-2 win vs. Boston on Tuesday (6.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 0BB, 11K, 1WP)...recorded a season-high 11K, the most by a Yankee in 2018...were the most since Masahiro Tanaka had 15K on 9/29/17 vs. Toronto...exited with a 2-1 lead but his runner scored against the bullpen in the seventh...his other run scored on a Betts RBI single in the fifth.

**SEVY SEASON:** Is undefeated in his last five starts, posting a 3-0 mark with a 1.54 ERA (35.0IP, 20H, 6ER, 5BB, 43K, 2HR).

- ✦ Has at least 10K in consecutive starts for just the second time in his career (also 4/13/17 vs. Tampa Bay-11K and 4/18/17 vs. Chicago-AL-10K)...only four Yankees all-time have recorded double-digit strikeouts in at least three consecutive starts: Al Downing (4GS from 7/2-21/63), Ron Guidry (4GS from 6/2-17/78), Bob Turley (3GS from 5/6-15/55) and David Cone (3GS from 9/2-13/98).

**VS. OAKLAND:** Is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (12.0IP, 6ER) in two career starts against Oakland, both Yankees losses...on 4/21/16 at Yankee Stadium, surrendered just 2ER in 6.0IP in a 7-3 Yankees loss...on 6/16/17 in Oakland, gave up 4ER in 6.0IP in a 7-6 loss.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Is 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (26.1IP, 15H, 5ER, 4BB, 32K, 1HR) in four starts at home this season...his 1.71 ERA is the seventh-lowest home ERA in the Majors (second-lowest in the AL).

- ✦ The Yankees have won his last eight regular season starts at Yankee Stadium (since 9/3/17)...is 6-0 with a 2.01 ERA (49.1IP, 11ER) in that span, permitting more than 2R just once and failing to go 6.0IP just once.
- ✦ Has not lost at home in his last 10 starts (eight regular season and two postseason), dating back to 9/3/17 vs. Boston (his last loss came on 8/28/17 vs. Cleveland)...is 7-0 with a 2.70 ERA (56.2IP, 17ER) in that span, issuing more than 1BB just once...the Yankees are 10-0 in those starts.

**2018:** Is tied for second in the Majors with five wins...is seventh in the Majors (fifth in the AL) with a 0.87 WHIP...his .181 opponents' BA (34-for-188) ranks sixth in the AL.

- ✦ Has gone at least 6.0IP in 6-of-8 starts this season.
- ✦ Opponents are hitting .146 (13-for-89) with 3BB, 40K and 1HR in at-bats ending in a slider this season (Brooks Baseball).
- ✦ Has at least 6K in 19 consecutive road starts (since the start of 2017), tied for the fourth-longest streak in Major League history...is more than double the length of the next-longest Yankees streak (eight by Roger Clemens and Melido Perez).
- ✦ Has allowed only 2HR in 53.0IP this season...his 0.34 HR/9.0IP ratio is fifth-best in the Majors and second-best in the AL...did not allow a HR to his first 112BF until Toronto's Teoscar Hernández homered on 4/22...gave up a solo HR to Los Angeles-AL's Shohei Ohtani on 4/27, which was the first longball hit by a left-handed batter since Cleveland's Carlos Santana on 8/28/17 (113BF).

**WHAT A RUN:** Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 20-of-39 starts since the start of 2017, tied with Max Scherzer for the most in the Majors in that span.

- ✦ The Yankees are 7-1 in his starts this season and 27-12 since the start of 2017.

**FILL IN THE BLANK:** On 5/2 at Houston, tossed his first career complete game and shutout (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 10K) in a 4-0 win...was the second CGSHO by a Yankees pitcher since the start of 2015 (also Masahiro Tanaka on 4/27/17 at Boston, 3H in a 3-0 win).

- ✦ Marked the most strikeouts by a Yankees pitcher in a shutout since Mike Mussina on 9/24/02 vs. Tampa Bay (12K, 2H).
- ✦ At 24 years, 71 days old, was the second-youngest Yankee in the last 47 seasons (since 1972) to toss a shutout, behind Sterling Hitchcock (24 years, 22 days) on 5/21/95 vs. Baltimore (4H)...was the youngest Yankee with at least 10K in a CGSHO since Stan Bahnsen (23 years, 230 days) on 8/1/68 at Boston (12K, 3H).
- ✦ Was the second Yankee since 2004 to throw a shutout against the defending World Series champion (also Iván Nova, 6H on 9/21/13 vs. San Francisco).

**SEVY GEMS:** Is tied for second in the Majors with three scoreless starts...on 3/29 at Toronto, made his first career Opening Day start, allowing just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings (3BB, 7K) to earn the win...was the first scoreless Opening Day start by a Yankee since Roger Clemens (6.0IP, 3H) on 3/31/03 at Toronto...the 1H marked the fewest by a Yankees Opening Day starter since at least 1908...on 4/16 vs. Miami (6.0IP, 1H, 0R, 1BB, 8K) became the first Yankee to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings with 1H-or-fewer since Michael Pineda (7.1IP, 1H) on 9/22/14 vs. Baltimore.

- ✦ Was the first Yankee to post two scoreless starts in the team's first 15 games of a season since David Cone in 1997.
- ✦ Was also the first Yankee to record at least 5.0IP and 1H-or-fewer in two starts in a season since CC Sabathia and Javier Vazquez both did so in 2010 (two starts each)...was the first Yankee since at least 1908 with multiple starts of at least 5.0IP and 1H-or-fewer in the team's first 15 games, and just the sixth MLB pitcher to accomplish the feat (also; Steve Barber-1967; Sam McDowell-1966; Bob Feller-1947; Jim Tobin-1944 and Lon Warneke-1934)...only Severino, McDowell, Feller and Tobin had two such scoreless starts.
