BOSTON RED SOX (28-12) vs. OAKLAND A'S (19-21)

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox are 11-10 in their last 21 games, after going 17-2 in their first 19...They have won 6 of their last 9 games, including 3 of their last 4.

• The Sox' 28-12 record is tied for the 3rd-best start through 40 games in franchise history...BOS started 31-9 in 1946, 29-11 in 2002, and 28-12 in 2 seasons prior to 2018 (2007, 1904).

EASTERN STANDARD: Today is the 47th day of the MLB season...On only 3 of them have the Red Sox *not* held at least a share of 1st place at the start of the day (3/30, 3/31, 5/10).

• The Red Sox are 17-8 vs. the AL East, having gone 7-3 vs. TB, 4-2 vs. TOR, 3-3 vs. NYY, and 3-0 vs. BAL.

END OF THE ROAD: The Red Sox went 6-4 on their 11-day, 10-game road trip that concluded with yesterday's 5-3 win at TOR...It is tied for the Sox' longest road trip of the season, with another 10-gamer scheduled for 6/11-21 at BAL (3 G), SEA (4 G), and MIN (3 G).

HOME, SWEET HOME: Beginning tonight, 19 of the Sox' next 26 games will be played at home from 5/14-6/10...The Sox have played only 15 home games, tied for the 2nd-fewest in the majors (MIN-14, ATL-15).

• BOS leads the majors in runs per game (6.80), AVG (.291), SLG (.485), and OPS (.840) at home.

NO TIME TO REST: The Red Sox are in the midst of a stretch of playing 52 games in 55 days from 4/24-6/17, including 13 straight days with a game from 5/8-20...In that 55-day span, their off days are scheduled for 5/7, 5/21, and 6/4 (all Mondays).

• This Thursday's game vs. BAL is a makeup of the game that was originally scheduled for 4/16 (Patriots' Day).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in SLG (.454), doubles (97), and XBH (156)...They also lead the AL in AVG (.267).

• The Sox rank 2nd in MLB in runs (218)...They have scored 5+ runs in 25 games, most in MLB...Since the start of 2016, BOS is 168-28 (.857) when scoring 5+ runs, including 111-13 (.895) since 8/22/16.

SLUGGING SOX: The Red Sox have homered in 12 of their last 13 games (24 HR total), including each of their last 5.

• The Sox have hit 50 HR since 4/7, 2nd-most in the majors in that time (CLE-52).

• Overall, the Sox rank T-5th in the majors in HR (54), after ranking last in the AL and 27th in MLB in 2017 (168)...Last season, they didn't hit their 54th HR until 6/6, their 57th game.

THE RIGHT STUFF: Right-handed starters are 1-17 with a 7.08 ERA (113 ER/143.2 IP) in 31 starts against the Red Sox in 2018, with BOS going 23-8 in those games...Only 5 of those 31 outings were quality starts.

• The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.277), SLG (.480), and OPS (.822) vs. RHP.

ON THE WAY: Dustin Pedroia, who began the season on the 10-day disabled list recovering from left knee surgery, will make his 1st rehab appearance tonight for Triple-A Pawtucket at 2nd base (vs. Buffalo, 6:15 p.m.).

• Tyler Thornburg, who missed the 2017 season and began 2018 on the 10-day DL recovering from right shoulder surgery, is expected to pitch for the PawSox tonight...He has made 5 rehab appearances between Pawtucket and Double-A Portland (4.1 IP, 4 H, 3 R/2 ER, 4 BB, 6 SO).

ROSTER MOVES: The Red Sox today added RHP Steven Wright to the active ML roster and placed RHP Hector Velázquez on the 10-day disabled list with a low back strain.

BAY AREA VS. BAY STATE: The Red Sox and A's resume their 6-game season series tonight...BOS is 7-6 in series openers in 2018, but 21-6 in all other games...The Sox are 12-1 in series finales, having won each of their last 6.

• In the last 16 seasons (2003-18), the Red Sox are 94-117 (.445) in the Pacific Time Zone, which includes games at LAA, OAK, SEA, LAD, SD, and SF...Against those teams at Fenway Park in that same time, the Sox are 126-68 (.649).

STRAIGHT A'S: The Red Sox' scheduled starting pitchers for this series are a combined 11-1 with a 3.00 ERA (49 ER/147.0 IP) and a .205 opponent AVG (111-for-541).

• Rick Porcello ranks among AL leaders in wins (T-3rd, 5), HR/9.0 IP (3rd, 0.35), opponent OPS (5th, .551), WHIP (8th, 0.95), SO/BB ratio (6th, 6.13), and ERA (10th, 2.79).

• The Sox are 7-0 in Eduardo Rodriguez's starts in 2018.

• Chris Sale ranks among AL leaders in SO/9.0 IP (2nd, 12.10), ERA (6th, 2.17), opponent AVG (7th, .195), SO/BB ratio (3rd, 7.09), and WHIP (5th, 0.90)...Friday at TOR, he recorded 15 SO and 0 BB in 9.0 IP.

THIS IS 40: J.D. Martinez has 51 hits and 10 HR...He is only the 7th Red Sox player to record at least 10 HR and 50 hits in the club's first 40 games, joining Manny Ramirez (2001), Mo Vaughn (1994, '96, '98), Dwight Evans (1981), Jim Rice (1978), Ted Williams (1948, '57), and Jimmie Foxx (1938, '40).

• The only other major leaguers this season with 10+ HR and 50+ hits are Francisco Lindor and Manny Machado.

J.D. POWER: J.D. Martinez has reached base in each of his last 18 games (since 4/25), batting .400 (28-for-70) with 6 HR and a 1.204 OPS in that time...It is tied for the 2nd-longest on-base streak of his career (19 straight games from 9/28/15-4/20/16).

• Martinez ranks 5th in the majors in AVG (.342), 6th in SLG (.624), 6th in OPS (1.018), and T-6th in RBI (33).

• In 104 games since the 2017 All-Star break, Martinez leads the majors in RBI (105) and ranks 2nd in HR (41) behind only Giancarlo Stanton (43).

LEADING OFF: Mookie Betts has scored at least 1 run in 26 of his last 33 games since 4/1...Betts leads the majors with 42 runs scored, the most by a Red Sox player through the club's first 40 games of a season since at least 1908 (Ted Williams ranks 2nd on that list with 41 runs scored in 1942).

• Betts also leads the majors in AVG (.360), HR (tied, 13), XBH (29), SLG (.772), and OPS (1.212)...He ranks 2nd in OBP (.440) behind Mike Trout (.450).

THIS AND THAT: Brock Holt has reached base in each of his last 22 starts dating back to 2017, batting .329 (25-for-76) over that career-long streak, the longest active such streak in the AL...He has hit safely in each of his last 11 starts since 4/14 (18-for-43, .419 AVG/1.070 OPS).

• Andrew Benintendi has a 6-game hitting streak.

• Eduardo Núñez has hit safely in a season-long-tying 6 straight games, and 12 of his last 14.

• Hanley Ramirez has homered in 3 of his last 4 games.

• Carson Smith has allowed 0 runs and issued 0 BB in his last 7 appearances (5.2 IP, 6 H, 10 SO).

WHAT A RELIEF: Joe Kelly, who threw only 4 pitches in a perfect 9th inning yesterday, has allowed 1 run in his last 17 appearances, posting a 0.47 ERA and a .384 opponent OPS in that time (19.0 IP, 10 H, 4 BB, 21 SO).

• Against Kelly this season, left-handed hitters are 2-for-33 (.061) with 0 XBH, including 1 for their last 30 (.033) since 4/3, and 0 for their last 12 since 5/4.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Allowed a season-high 5 R and 8 H over 5.1 IP in his last start on 5/9 at NYY (ND, 3 BB, 3 SO).
- The Red Sox' loss in his last outing snapped a streak of 26 consecutive team wins when providing Porcello with 3+ runs of support...Since joining the club in 2015, Porcello is 44-5 in 62 starts when he receives 3+ runs of support, with the Sox going 52-10 in those games.
- Logged 7.0+ IP with 3 ER or fewer 4 times this season, tied with Chris Sale for the team lead.
- Has won each of his last 7 decisions beginning 9/16/17...Marks his longest winning streak since a career-long 8-decision streak from 5/22-7/29/16.
- Is among AL leaders in HR/9.0 IP (3rd, 0.31), BB/9.0 IP (5th, 1.39), and SO/BB ratio (6th, 6.13).
- Also ranks among league leaders in wins (T-3rd, 5), ERA (10th, 2.79), opponent OPS (5th, .551), and WHIP (8th, 0.95).
- Leads the majors with 161 starts of 1 or 0 BB since the beginning of 2009.
- His 49 starts with 1 or 0 BB since the beginning of 2016 are tied with Bartolo Colon for the 2nd-most in the majors, trailing only Josh Tomlin's 50 during that time.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- Last faced OAK in 2016, going 2-0 with a 3.29 ERA (5 ER/13.2 IP) in 2 starts.
- Currently holds a 4-decision winning streak vs. OAK (5 starts, 2.70 ERA, 10 ER/33.1 IP)...Is tied for his 3rd-longest career winning streak vs. a single opponent, trailing only a 5-decision streak vs. TB (4/20-9/24/16) and CWS (9/9/10-7/21/12).
- Is 6-5 with a 3.76 ERA (34 ER/81.1 IP) in 14 career appearances (13 starts) against the club.
- Earned the win in each of his first 2 starts vs. AL West opponents this season...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings on 4/18 at LAA and allowed 1 run in 6.0 innings on 5/4 at TEX.

AT HOME:

- Is 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 ER/22.0 IP) in 3 starts at Fenway Park in 2018.
- Enters today with 0 BB allowed at home this season, joining STL's Miles Mikolas as the only ML pitchers with 20.0+ home IP to have not issued a BB.
- Leads the AL in home SO/BB ratio (19 SO, 0 BB) and ranks among AL leaders at home in WHIP (3rd, 0.68), opponent OPS (4th, .473), ERA (11th), and opponent AVG (11th, .188).
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer over 7.0+ IP in each of his first 3 home starts in 2018...Is tied for the 2nd-longest career streak of such starts at home (last career-long 4, 8/9-9/14/16).
- Porcello's 3 consecutive home starts with 7.0+ IP are also tied for his 2nd-longest career streak (last career-long 4, 8/9-9/14/16).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Logged the most IP (40.1) of any Red Sox pitcher with 4 BB or fewer prior to May in the last 100 seasons...Is 1 of 11 AL pitchers, and 19 ML pitchers, in that span with 40.0+ IP and 4 BB or fewer prior to May.
- Allowed his 1st HR of the season in his last start on 4/29 vs. TB...Porcello's 40.1 IP through the end of April are the 2nd-most by a Red Sox before May with 1 or 0 HR allowed since 1913, trailing only Babe Ruth in 1917 (45.0 IP, 0 HR).
- Earned the win in each of his first 4 starts (3/31-4/18) and 5 straight including his final start of 2017 (9/27)...Marked his longest streak of wins in consecutive starts since a 6-start stretch from 6/28-7/29/16...Was the 1st Red Sox to win his first 4+ starts of a season since winning his first 5 in 2016.
- Issued just 1 BB in his first 4 starts (25.2 IP)...After walking TB's Jesus Sucre in the 3rd inning on 3/31, went 22.2 IP before issuing his next BB (1st inning, 4/24 at TOR).
- Tossed 6.0+ innings with 0 BB in 3 consecutive starts from 4/7-18, the longest streak by a Red Sox since his own 3-start stretch from 5/1-12 in 2017.
- Hurled 6.0 scoreless IP on 4/18 at LAA and 7.0 scoreless IP on 4/12 vs. NYY, both with 0 BB...Was his 1st streak of scoreless starts with 6.0+ IP since 2016 (2, 4/25-30)...Became the 4th Red Sox since at least 1908 with consecutive scoreless starts of 6.0+ IP and 0 BB: Josh Beckett (2, 2009), Bill Monbouquette (2, 1964), Wes Ferrell (2, 1934).
