BOSTON RED SOX (28-13) vs. OAKLAND A'S (20-21)

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox are 11-11 in their last 22 games, after going 17-2 in their first 19...They have won 6 of their last 10 games, including 3 of their last 5.

🔥 This is the 7th time in the Red Sox' 118-year history they have won at least 28 of their first 41 games, most recently doing so in 2007 (29-12).

EASTERN STANDARD: Today is the 48th day of the MLB season, only the 4th in which the Red Sox did not own at least a share of 1st place in the AL East at the start of the day.

🔥 The Red Sox are 17-8 vs. the AL East, having gone 7-3 vs. TB, 4-2 vs. TOR, 3-3 vs. NYY, and 3-0 vs. BAL.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Last night began a stretch for the Red Sox in which 19 of their 26 games will be played at home (5/14-6/10)...The Sox have played only 16 home games, tied for the 3rd-fewest in the majors (MIN-15, ATL-15, SEA-16).

🔥 BOS leads the majors in runs per game (6.69), AVG (.288), and SLG (.483) at home.

NO TIME TO REST: The Red Sox are in the midst of a stretch of playing 52 games in 55 days from 4/24-6/17, including 13 straight days with a game from 5/8-20...In that 55-day span, their off days are scheduled for 5/7, 5/21, and 6/4 (all Mondays).

🔥 This Thursday's game vs. BAL is a makeup of the game that was originally scheduled for 4/16 (Patriots' Day).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in SLG (.454), doubles (98), and XBH (159)...They also lead the AL in AVG (.266).

🔥 The Red Sox have 6 players with 20+ RBI, more than any other team in the majors...The Sox also lead MLB with 5 players batting .300+ (min. 50 PA).

🔥 The Sox rank 2nd in MLB in runs (223)...They have scored 5+ runs in 26 games, most in MLB...Since the start of 2016, BOS is 168-29 (.853) when scoring 5+ runs, including 111-14 (.888) since 8/22/16.

SLUGGING SOX: The Red Sox have homered in 13 of their last 14 games (26 HR total), including each of their last 6.

🔥 The Sox have hit 52 HR since 4/7, 2nd-most in the majors in that time (CLE-53).

🔥 Overall, the Sox rank T-3rd in the majors in HR (56), after ranking last in the AL and 27th in MLB in 2017 (168)...Last season, they didn't hit their 56th HR until 6/6, their 57th game.

THE RIGHT STUFF: Right-handed starters are 1-17 with a 7.08 ERA (113 ER/143.2 IP) in 31 starts against the Red Sox in 2018, with BOS going 23-8 in those games...Only 5 of those 31 outings were quality starts.

🔥 The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.276), SLG (.479), and OPS (.819) vs. RHP.

HERE'S THE SITUATION: BOS is the only team batting .200+ with 2 strikes (.212)...The Sox also lead the majors in OBP, SLG, and OPS with 2 strikes (.284/.337/.620).

🔥 The Sox lead the majors with 6 grand slams...The club's single-season grand slam record is 11 (2005).

LONDON CALLING: MLB and the MLBPA have announced that the Red Sox and Yankees will play a 2-game series in London in 2019 (6/29-30)...The Sox will serve as the home team for both games, to be played at London Stadium...The London Series will mark MLB's 1st games played in Europe.

🔥 The Sox last played a game outside of the U.S. and Canada in 2008, when they opened the season with 2 games against the A's at Japan's Tokyo Dome.

BAY AREA VS. BAY STATE: The Red Sox lost to the A's last night, 6-5...BOS is 7-7 in series openers in 2018, but 21-6 in all other games...The Sox are 12-1 in series finales, having won each of their last 6.

🔥 In the last 16 seasons (2003-18), the Red Sox are 94-117 (.445) in the Pacific Time Zone, which includes games at LAA, OAK, SEA, LAD, SD, and SF...Against those teams at Fenway Park in that same time, the Sox are 126-69 (.646).

GOOD LUCK CHARM: The Red Sox are 7-0 in Eduardo Rodriguez's starts in 2018...BOS last won a pitcher's first 8 starts of a season in 2008 (Daisuke Matsuzaka, first 10).

🔥 In 3 career starts vs. OAK, Rodriguez is 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP) and a .108 opponent AVG (8-for-74)...He took a no-hitter into the 8th inning on 9/4/16 at OAK, and on 9/12/17 he allowed 1 hit in 6.0 IP at Fenway.

LEADING OFF: Mookie Betts has scored at least 1 run in 27 of his last 34 games since 4/1, including in 10 of his last 12, and in each of his last 5.

🔥 Betts leads the majors with 43 runs scored, the most by a Red Sox player through the club's first 41 games of a season since at least 1908 (Ted Williams ranks 2nd on that list with 42 runs scored in 1942).

🔥 Betts also leads the majors in AVG (.362), HR (tied, 13), XBH (30), SLG (.766), and OPS (1.205).

🔥 In his last 15 games (since 4/27), Betts has hit .411 (23-for-56) with 14 XBH and 18 runs scored.

J.D. POWER: J.D. Martinez has homered in 6 of his last 12 games, including each of his last 2...He has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games.

🔥 Martinez has reached base in each of his last 19 games (since 4/25), tied for the longest streak of his career (3rd time)...During the streak, he is batting .405 (30-for-74) with 7 HR and a 1.233 OPS.

🔥 Martinez ranks 4th in the majors in AVG (.346) and SLG (.641), as well as 5th in OPS (1.037).

🔥 In 105 games since the 2017 All-Star break, Martinez leads the majors in RBI (106) and ranks 2nd in HR (42) behind only Giancarlo Stanton (43).

THIS IS 40: J.D. Martinez has 53 hits and 11 HR...He became the 7th Red Sox player to record at least 10 HR and 50 hits in the club's first 40 games, joining Manny Ramirez (2001), Mo Vaughn (1994, '96, '98), Dwight Evans (1981), Jim Rice (1978), Ted Williams (1948, '57), and Jimmie Foxx (1938, '40).

🔥 Mookie Betts reached those totals last night, in the club's 41st game (51 hits, 13 HR)...The only other major leaguers this season with 10+ HR and 50+ hits are Francisco Lindor and Manny Machado.

BROCK STAR: Brock Holt has reached base in a career-best 22 consecutive starts dating back to 2017, the longest active streak in the AL...He has hit safely in each of his last 11 starts since 4/14 (18-for-43, .419 AVG/1.070 OPS).

WHAT A RELIEF: Joe Kelly has allowed 1 run in his last 17 appearances, posting a 0.47 ERA and a .384 opponent OPS in that time (19.0 IP, 10 H, 4 BB, 21 SO).

🔥 Against Kelly this season, left-handed hitters are 2-for-33 (.061) with 0 XBH, including 1 for their last 30 (.033) since 4/3, and 0 for their last 12 since 5/4.

ON THE WAY: Dustin Pedroia, who began the season on the 10-day disabled list recovering from left knee surgery, made his 1st rehab appearance last night for Triple-A Pawtucket...He played 5 innings at 2B and went 1-for-3 with a run scored.

🔥 Tyler Thornburg, who missed the 2017 season and began 2018 on the 10-day DL recovering from right shoulder surgery, has made 6 rehab appearances between Pawtucket and Double-A Portland (4.2 IP, 6 H, 5 R/4 ER, 5 BB, 6 SO).

- Allowed just 1 hit over 5.0 scoreless innings in his last start on 5/10 at NYY (ND, 3 BB, 8 SO).
- Did not allow a hit to his first 12 batters faced in his last outing (2 BB).
- Has won each of his 3 decisions this season...Marks his longest winning streak since a career-long 4-decision stretch from 4/23-5/26/17.
- The Red Sox have won each of his 7 starts during the 2018 campaign, a career-long streak of starts with a team win...Is tied for the longest streak in the majors this season (Max Scherzer).
- Recorded a season-high 10 SO over 6.0 IP on 5/5 at TEX (ND, 4 H, 5 R, 2 BB, 3 HR)...Was his 2nd career double-digit SO effort (also 9/25/16 at TB, 13 SO).
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer over 6.0+ IP in 3 consecutive starts from 4/13-25, tied for his 2nd-longest career streak of quality starts (7, 4/23-5/26/17).
- Surrendered 2 ER or fewer over 6.0 IP in back-to-back starts from 4/13-19...Marked the 6th time Rodriguez has strung together back-to-back starts with 6.0+ IP and 2 runs or fewer...Began his career with 3 consecutive such outings (5/28-6/9/15), the longest streak of his career.
- Has allowed 3 hits to 31 LHH faced this season (.111/3-for-27, 2 BB, 2 HBP), the 5th-lowest mark in the AL and 8th in the majors (min. 30 LHH faced).
- Is limiting LHH to a .161 AVG (9-for-56, 4 BB, 4 HBP) since 8/26/17 vs. BAL.
- Is 21-3 with a 2.20 ERA in 38 career starts of 6.0+ IP (60 ER/246.0 IP).
- Is 19-2 with a 3.29 ERA (67 ER/183.1 IP) when receiving 4+ runs of support (30 starts).

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- Won each of his 2 starts vs. OAK in 2017...Allowed 3 ER in 8.0 IP on 5/21 at OAK and 1 R in 6.0 IP on 9/12 at Fenway Park.
- Has made 3 career starts vs. OAK, going 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP).
- Rodriguez's 1.64 career ERA vs. OAK is tied for the 3rd-lowest among active pitchers with at least 20.0 career IP against the club (Kershaw-0.87, Musgrove-1.33, Miley-1.64).
- Posted a .108 opponent AVG (8-for-74) and 0.68 WHIP in his first 3 starts vs. the club.
- His .108 opponent AVG vs. OAK is the lowest among actives against the club (min. 50 BF).
- Is 5-3 with a 3.86 ERA (29 ER/67.2 IP) in 12 career starts against AL West opponents...Has limited opponents to a .200 AVG (50-for-250) in those games.

AT HOME:

- Has recorded 13.93 SO per 9.0 IP in 3 home starts this season (21 SO, 13.2 IP), compared to 9.89 SO/9.0 IP in 4 road outings.
- The Red Sox have won 11 of Rodriguez's 14 home starts since the beginning of 2017 (.786 winning percentage).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Set career highs in appearances (25), starts (24), IP (137.1), and SO (150)...Made 4 scoreless starts in 2017, trailing only Chris Sale (10) for the most by a Sox pitcher.
- Tossed 6.0+ innings in each of his 4 scoreless starts, the most such outings by a Red Sox 24 or younger since Jon Lester's 7 in 2008.
- Held RHH to a .230 AVG (97-for-421), the 4th-lowest mark among AL southpaws.
- Was 4-1 with a 2.77 ERA (17 ER/55.1 IP) and a .209 opponent AVG in his first 10 starts through 5/31...The Red Sox won 7 of those starts...Ranked among AL leaders during that time in ERA (8th, 2.77), opponent AVG (6th, .209), opponent OPS (12th, .652), and WHIP (10th, 1.12).
- Won a career-high 4 consecutive decisions from 4/23-5/26, tossing a quality start in all 7 outings during the streak...Was his longest career streak of quality starts...Posted a 2.25 ERA (11 ER/44.0 IP) and a .204 opponent AVG (32-for-157) in that stretch.

- Has a season-long 7-game hitting streak (.300/9-for-30)...Is tied for his 2nd-longest career hit streak, trailing only an 11-game streak from 8/5-18/17.
- In his last 17 games, is batting .296 (21-for-71) with 15 runs, 7 2B, 3B, HR, 8 RBI, and a .465 SLG.
- Is a career .303 hitter (10-for-33) with 5 2B and 6 RBI in 9 games vs. OAK...In 3 career home games vs. the club, is 6-for-12 (.500) with 4 2B and 5 RBI.
- Stole his 7th base Sunday, tied for 8th in the AL...Over his career, is 28-for-33 (84.8%) in SB attempts, having gone 9 for his last 9.
