BOSTON RED SOX (28-14) vs. OAKLAND A'S (21-21)

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox are 11-12 in their last 23 games, after going 17-2 in their first 19...They have lost each of their last 2 games, 1 shy of their longest losing streak of the season (3 straight from 4/21-24).

This is the 8th time in the Red Sox' 118-year history they have won at least 28 of their first 42 games, most recently doing so in 2007 (29-13).

SERIES BUSINESS: The Sox are 12-1 in series finales this season, having won each of their last 6...They are 7-7 in series openers, but 21-7 in all other games.

The Sox have not been swept in 2018...Last season, they earned 12 series sweeps and were swept only 3 times.

SPRING SALE EVENT: Chris Sale has allowed 3 runs or fewer in each of his 9 starts...The only other Red Sox pitcher since 1991 to allow 3 runs or fewer in each of his first 9 starts of a season is Pedro Martinez (1999-2001).

In his last start (5/11 at TOR), Sale matched his career high with 15 SO and issued 0 BB in 9.0 IP.

DEVERS' ENDEAVORS: Rafael Devers has played in 99 ML games, all at the age of 21 or younger (turns 22 on 10/24/18)...He would become the 15th player (14th position player) to appear in 100 games with BOS before turning 22.

- Among that group, Devers would rank 2nd in HR through 100 games (17) behind only Tony Conigliaro (23), as well as T-2nd in RBI (55) behind Ted Williams (95) (Carl Yastrzemski had 55 RBI through 100 games).
- Devers is the 5th-youngest player to appear in a ML game this season, behind ATL's Ronald Acuña, Ozzie Albies, and Mike Soroka, and NYY's Gleyber Torres.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in SLG (.454), doubles (102), and XBH (164)...They also lead the AL in AVG (.266) and rank 2nd in MLB in runs (226).

The Sox doubled 4 times last night, bringing their season total to 102 through 42 games...The last MLB teams to reach 100 doubles in 42 games or fewer were the 2016 Red Sox and 2012 Red Sox.

SLUGGING SOX: The Red Sox have homered in 14 of their last 15 games (27 HR total), including each of their last 7... Their longest HR streak of 2017 was 8 games (9/20-28).

- The Sox have hit 53 HR since 4/7, 2nd-most in the majors in that time (CLE-55)...The 3rd-highest total in that span is 46 (ATL).
- BOS ranks 4th in the majors in HR (57), after ranking last in the AL and 27th in MLB in 2017 (168)...Last season, they didn't hit their 57th HR until 6/9, their 60th game.

WHAT A RELIEF: Joe Kelly has allowed 1 run in his last 17 appearances, posting a 0.47 ERA and a .384 opponent OPS in that time (19.0 IP, 10 H, 4 BB, 21 SO).

Against Kelly this season, left-handed hitters are 2-for-33 (.061) with 0 XBH, including 1 for their last 30 (.033) since 4/3, and 0 for their last 12 since 5/4.

NO TIME TO REST: The Red Sox are in the midst of a stretch of playing 52 games in 55 days from 4/24-6/17, including 13 straight days with a game from 5/8-20...In that 55-day span, their off days are scheduled for 5/7, 5/21, and 6/4 (all Mondays).

Tomorrow's game vs. BAL is a makeup of the game that was originally scheduled for 4/16 (Patriots' Day). PICK YOUR POISON: Only 10 major leaguers with at least 100 PA have an OPS of 1.000 or higher, 3 of whom are Red Sox: Mookie Betts (1st, 1.166), Mitch Moreland (5th, 1.030), and J.D. Martinez (6th, 1.024).

LEADING OFF: Mookie Betts leads the majors in HR (tied, 13), runs (43), XBH (30), SLG (.740), and OPS (1.166).

- Betts has scored at least 1 run in 27 of his last 35 games since 4/1, including in 10 of his last 13 games, and in 5 of his last 6.
- Betts' 43 runs scored are the 2nd-most by a Red Sox player through the club's first 42 games of a season since 1908 (Ted Williams, 45 in 1942).

J.D. POWER: J.D. Martinez has homered in 6 of his last 13 games, including 2 of his last 3...He has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games.

- Martinez has reached base in each of his last 20 games (since 4/25), the longest streak of his career... During the streak, he is batting .397 (31-for-78) with 7 HR and a 1.197 OPS.
- Martinez ranks 4th in the majors in AVG (.344) and SLG (.631), as well as 5th in OPS (1.024).
- In 106 games since the 2017 All-Star break, Martinez leads the majors in RBI (106) and ranks 2nd in HR (42) behind only Giancarlo Stanton (43).

THIS LAND IS MORELAND: In his last 10 games, Mitch Moreland is 15-for-36 (.417) with 10 RBI, 4 HR, 4 2B, a .500 OBP, an .861 SLG, and a 1.361 OPS.

- Since starting the 2018 season 0-for-12, Moreland is 30-for-79 (.380) with a .451 OBP.
- Among players with at least 100 PA, Moreland ranks 7th in AVG (.330), 7th in SLG (.626), 5th in OPS (1.030), and 6th in at-bats per RBI (4.33).

HAVE WE BENINTRODUCED?: Andrew Benintendi went 3-for-5 with a HR and a double last night...He has hit safely in each of his last 8 games, the 2nd-longest streak of his career (11 straight from 8/5-18/17).

In his last 18 games since 4/26, Benintendi is batting .316 (24-for-76) with 11 XBH and an .880 OPS.

BROCK STAR: Brock Holt hit a pinch-hit double in the 9th inning of last night's game...Since starting the season 1-for-18 (.056), he is 19-for-43 (.442) with a .698 SLG and 3 SO.

Holt has reached base in a career-best 22 consecutive starts dating back to 9/16/17, tied for the longest active streak in the AL...He has hit safely in each of his last 11 starts, and doubled in 6 of his last 8.

EASTERN STANDARD: Today is the 49th day of the MLB season, only the 5th in which the Red Sox did not own at least a share of 1st place in the AL East at the start of the day.

The Red Sox are 17-8 vs. the AL East, having gone 7-3 vs. TB, 4-2 vs. TOR, 3-3 vs. NYY, and 3-0 vs. BAL.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Red Sox are in the midst of a stretch in which 19 of their 26 games from 5/14-6/10 will be played at home (0-2 thus far)...BOS leads the majors in runs per game (6.47) and AVG (.287) at home.

- Has allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of his 9 starts this season...Is Sale's longest streak of starts with 3 ER or fewer since a career-long 12 consecutive from 9/18/15-5/19/16.
- Recorded 10+ SO in each of his last 2 starts and 3 of his last 5.
- ♣ Has struck out 10+ batters in 21 of his 41 starts with BOS since the beginning of 2017...Is tied with Max Scherzer for the most double-digit SO efforts during that time.
- Ranks 2nd in the AL with 78 SO and 12.10 SO/9.0 IP, trailing only Gerrit Cole (93, 13.57).
- Ranks among AL leaders in ERA (5th, 2.17), WHIP (5th, 0.90), SO/BB ratio (3rd, 7.09), BB/9.0 IP ratio (7th, 1.71), opponent AVG (7th, .195), and opponent OPS (7th, .588).
- Sale's 6 starts with 1 or 0 ER allowed this season are tied for the 2nd-most in the majors (also Carlos Martínez, Jacob deGrom), trailing only Justin Verlander (7).
- Lenters today limiting RHH to a .185 AVG (33-for-178) this season...Is the 4th-lowest mark among AL lefties with at least 50 RHH faced (9th in majors).
- ♣ Has allowed just 3 hits to 37 batters faced with RISP (.094, 3-for-32)...Is the 4th-lowest mark in the AL and the 7th-lowest in the majors (min. 25 BF with RISP).
- **Last start:** Recorded a career-high-tying 15 SO with 0 BB over 9.0 IP on 5/11 at TOR (ND, 6 H, 3 ER)...Marked his 3rd career 15-SO effort (also 5/28/12 and 8/16/15 with CWS).
- ♦ Was his 10th career start with 0 BB over 9.0 IP (last 8/26/16 with CWS), trailing only Clayton Kershaw (11) for the most in the majors since 2012.
- Became the 1st Red Sox with 15+ SO and 0 BB in a start since Pedro Martinez in 2000.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- Received the loss on 4/21 at OAK, striking out 10 and allowing 3 ER over 7.0 IP (6 H, BB).
- Struck out 10 Athletics in each of his last 2 outings vs. OAK (20 SO, BB, 14.0 IP).
- Over 9 career starts against the club, is 4-3 with a 2.35 ERA (17 ER/65.0 IP), a .196 opponent AVG, and 0.86 WHIP...Logged 6.0+ IP in each and 7.0+ IP in 7.
- ♣ Is 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (4 ER/14.0 IP) over 2 starts vs. the AL West in 2018 (also 5/6 at TEX).
- Sale's 2.25 career ERA (73 ER/291.2 IP) vs. the AL West trails only Pedro Martinez's 1.92 mark for the lowest vs. the division since it formed in 1969 (min. 250.0 IP).
- Among all pitchers with 25 decisions against the division since it formed in 1969, his .788 winning percentage (26-7) is the 4th-highest ever.

AT HOME:

- Surrendered 1 ER in each of his 3 home starts this year (1-0, 1.50 ERA, 3 ER/18.0 IP)...Is his longest streak of home starts with 1 or 0 ER allowed with BOS.
- 🖊 Has made 16 starts at Fenway Park with BOS...Is 8-3 with a 2.88 ERA (34 ER/106.1 IP), with the Red Sox going 11-5...Has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 of those.

- 📤 Allowed 1 or 0 runs in each of his first 4 starts...Became the 4th Red Sox member of the Opening Day rotation with such a streak since at least 1908, joining Cy Young (4 in 1908), Dutch Leonard (6 in 1914), and Roger Clemens (4 in 1991).
- 📤 With his 3rd 10+ SO effort of 2018 on 5/11 at TOR, passed Jon Lester for the 3rd-most by a Red Sox (1908-pres.): Pedro Martinez (72), Roger Clemens (68).
- 🚣 Allowed 1 ER over 7.0 IP in each of his 2 starts from 5/1-6...Marked his 1st pair of consecutive starts with 1 or 0 ER over 7.0+ IP since 8/8-13 of 2017 (also 2 starts).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- 🦊 Holds the highest SO/BB ratio (5.14) in the Live Ball Era (min. 1,000.0 IP)...Also ranks 2nd among that group with 10.58 SO/9.0 IP (Randy Johnson-10.61).
- Las recorded 12+ SO 30 times since the start of 2012, 13 more than any other pitcher in that time (Kershaw-17)...His 56 games with 10+ SO since 2012 trail only Max Scherzer's 64 for the most in MLB during that time, and are the 14th-highest career total since at least 1908.


