THE LATEST:

- ◆Yesterday afternoon, the Blue Jays won their 1st ever road game against the Mets, taking the back half of their two-game series by a score of 12-1...Snapped a 12-game road losing streak there, the 3rd longest road skid vs. any opponent in team history (19 at BAL, 17 at NYY)...The 11-run victory was the club's largest margin of victory this season, coming one day after taking its largest loss of the year (12-2).
- The Jays have dropped four of their last six games...Have gone 5-9 over their last 14 contests and are 10-15 in their last 25, following a 12-3 stretch...Remain in 3rd place, now 7.0 games back the Red Sox and 7.5 games behind the Yankees for the division lead.

A HAPP-Y HITTER:

- J.A. Happ threw 7.0 innings of two-hit ball yesterday while recording 10 strikeouts without issuing a walk...In doing so he became the 1st pitcher in the Majors this season with three games of 9+SO and 0-BB...Has five 9+SO starts, tied for 3rd most in MLB...Ranks 7th in the AL with 66 strikeouts and is 5th with an 11.42 SO/9 ratio.
- *Happ also went 2-for-3 at the plate with a walk to become the 1st pitcher in team history to reach base safely three times in a game... Became the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to record a multi-hit game (Halladay, Hutchison) and just the 2nd to score two runs in a game (Halladay)...With his work on both sides of the ball, Happ became the first AL pitcher to match or out-hit his opponent with 7+ IP since Clyde Wright did so for the Angels on Sept. 14, 1972 against Texas (courtesy STATS).

HERNANDEZ HOMERS AGAIN:

◆Teoscar Hernandez hit his 7th home run yesterday, a two-run homer in the 4th inning...Marked his 15th HR since joining the Jays on Sept. 1 last season, tied with Josh Donaldson for the most on the team...His 38 RBI over that span leads the club, as does his .577 slugging percentage... Hernandez's SLG in that time is also 4th best in the Majors among players 25-or-less years old.

WHEN URENA HOME RUN MOOD:

Richard Urena homered in his only at-bat yesterday, a three-run shot in the 9th inning...Marked the 2nd HR of his career (also Sept. 8, 2017 vs. DET) and his 1st multi-RBI game.

ON THE HOME FRONT:

- *This evening marks the start of a seven-game, eight-day homestand...

 After this four-game set with Oakland, Toronto will take a day off on

 Monday before a three-game series with the Angels (25-18).
- ◆The Jays are currently 11-11 at home, but have lost eight of their last 11 here...Have out-scored their opposition, 111-96, in games at Rogers Centre despite getting out-hit, 189-178...Toronto's 1.36 HR/game is 4th highest in the AL...Have averaged 5.05 runs/game at home, 4th highest in the AL, while allowing 4.36 R/G (5th in the AL).

BLUE JAYS vs. THE ATHLETICS:

All-Time: 195-217...All-Time, at Rogers Centre: 64-67...2017: 5-2

- The Blue Jays won their 2017 season series with the Athletics, 5-2... Won each of their last five meetings, including a four-game sweep here at Rogers Centre from July 24-27...Have gone 12-1 at home vs. OAK since the start of 2014 for a .923 win% - tied for the best home record by any team vs. a team in their own league (CHC: 12-1 vs. NYM).
- Kendrys Morales leads all current Blue Jays with 22 career HR and 60 RBI vs. OAK...Homered three times over his last two games against them one on July 26 and two on July 27 last season.
- Justin Smoak went 8-for-25 (.320) against the Athletics last season, including four homers and seven RBI for a 1.233 OPS...Had a multi-HR game on June 7 at OAK with his 2nd blast coming in the 10th inning.

BEFORE AND AFTER:

Josh Donaldson has gone 23-for-71 (.324) in 19 games against the A's since they traded him to the Blue Jays...Has hit 7-2B, 4-HR and driven in 16 runs while drawing 15 walks (17K) for a .448 OBP (tied for his 2nd highest vs. any AL opponent) and a 1.040 OPS (3rd highest).

Justin Smoak hit a solo home run in the 1st inning to open the scoring yesterday...The blast came on an 0-2 count, his 2nd HR in an 0-2 count this season (also April 26 vs. BOS off Chris Sale)...Is one of seven MLB batters with two 0-2 homers.

FIVE FOR THE WIN:

◆Yesterday's victory marked the Jays' 18th when scoring five or more runs...Are now 18-0 in games when scoring 5+ runs (4-21 with four or fewer runs scored)...Are one of two remaining undefeated teams when plating at least five runs (ARI: 13-0)...Their 18 wins in such games are T-5th most in the Majors and 3rd most in the AL.

STARTING SOMETHING:

Happ's win yesterday was the 1st by a Blue Jays starter in the month of May...Up to that point, Toronto was the only team without a starter win this month...His 7.0 IP were the most since Marcus Stroman threw seven frames on May 2 at MIN.

DOUBLING DOWN:

Dwight Smith Jr. doubled in his only at-bat yesterday...Has had all three of his hits this season go for doubles...Each of his last four MLB hits have been doubles...Now holds a .394 AVG (13-for-33) in 16 MLB games.

THE AX EFFECT:

John Axford has recorded 17 strikeouts across 18 games this season and posted a 1.31 ERA, 6th best among AL relievers...Has not allowed a run in any of his last nine appearances while punching out nine batters with a pair of walks (.184 OBA)...His current 11.2 scoreless inning streak is 2nd longest among AL RPs (McHugh - 14.1).

TONIGHT'S START:

- Tonight marks his 9th start of the season...Received a no decision in his last start (5/11 vs. BOS), allowing 3 runs (2ER) on 5 hits with 4 strikeouts and 3 walks.
- Enters tonight with 25 walks, 3rd most in AL (Giolito-32, Lynn-29).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Tied for the Major League lead with 9 ground ball double plays (Mike Leake, Brandon McCarthy).
- Ranks 5th in the AL with a 55.2 GB%...Has a 71.4 GB% on his changeup, 2nd highest among all MLB starters.
- Has received two-or-fewer runs of support in 5 of his 8 starts and 3R-or-fewer in 7 starts.
- Struck out a season-high 8 batters on 4/25 vs. BOS while allowing 2 runs over 6.0 innings...Marked his 4th consecutive quality start... His 4 QS are tied with Happ for the team lead.
- Took a loss in his start at NYY on 4/19 despite tossing his 3rd consecutive quality start.
- Took a no-hitter into the 8th inning at BAL on 4/10...Struck out 4 batters and allowed 1 run on 3 hits over 8.0 innings...The 8.0 IP tied a career high and marked his longest outing since July 4, 2016 vs. KC (8.0 IP), when he also allowed 1 run on 3 hits...It was also the longest outing by a Blue Jay starter in 2018.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Tossed 6.0 innings in his second-last outing (7/14 at DET), allowing just an unearned run...Marked his only win of 2017 and just his 3rd start with 6+ innings...Threw 100+ pitches for the 2nd time all year.
- Made two starts after his 2nd DL stint before being sidelined again (0-0, 3 ER/36.0 IP)...Each of his stints on the DL stemmed from issues dealing with his middle finger.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Won the American League ERA title in 2016 with a 3.00 ERA, the 5th pitcher in franchise history to do so...The last pitcher to lead his league in ERA at a younger age (24 years and 93 days) was Clayton Kershaw (23.193) in 2011.
- Had a ground ball percentage of 54.4% in 2016, which was 3rd best in MLB...Against RHH that percentage hit 61.0%, the highest in all of baseball.
- Named to his first All-Star team in 2016 where he pitched one inning (2H, 1ER, 1BB)...Finished 7th in AL Cy Young voting.
