INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Since May 9, Jean Segura is batting .429 (21x49) with 9 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI and 6 stolen bases...he leads the Majors in hits during that span, while also ranking 2nd in batting and stolen bases

Ryon Healy's .513 slugging percentage <u>while playing 1st base</u> is tops in the American League...ranks ahead of Jose Abreu-CWS (.510) and Justin Smoak-TOR (.452).

Mitch Haniger (.298/11/36) is one of three American League outfielders (primary position) with a batting average of at least .290, 10 home runs and 30 RBI...he is joined by Boston's Mookie Betts (.365/15/32) and J.D. Martinez

The Mariners pitching staff has combined for a 3.49 ERA (88 ER, 227.0 IP) since April 24, the 3rd-lowest team ERA in the American League during that span...trails only Houston (2.65/63 ER, 213.2 IP) and New York-AL (3.21/76 ER, 213.0 IP)

VS. OAKLAND

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 7th (4-2) of 19 games this season. the Mariners are 12-3 in their last 15 games vs. the Athletics (7/9/17-c)... since 2015, the Mariners are 20-8 (.714) at the Oakland Coliseum:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a four-day, three-game road trip with the first of three games against the Oakland Athletics...went 4-2 on a recently-concluded 6-day, 6-game homestand vs. Texas (1-1) and Detroit (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS... Seattle is 13-8 in its last 21 games, 18-11 over its last 29 games and 23-15 in its last 38 games...Seattle is 9-9 during the day and 18-10 at night...Seattle is 12-10 at Safeco Field, 15-9 on the road.

- No Hits for You Edwin Díaz leads American League relievers with a .117 (9x77) opponents average
- against...his .208 opponents slugging percentage ranks 4th-best among AL relievers. **Call it a Comeback** Seattle's 12 comeback wins are 3rd-most in the American League, trailing only Boston (15) and Toronto (13).
- Series Stuff the Mariners have won or tied 13 of their first 16 series, posting a series record of 10-3-3. Four Score Seattle is 22-5 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 5-14 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES...since April 24, the Mariners are 16-9 (.640), the 2nd-best winning percentage in the American League during that span...trail only the Yankees (.826/19-4)...during that same span (4/24-c), Mariners starters are 9-4 with a 3.51 ERA (59 ER, 151.1 IP) with 141 strikeouts and 37 walks in 25 games...Seattle starters rank 4th in the AL in ERA during that span, trailing Houston (2.37/42 ER, 159.1 IP), Los Angeles-AL (2.80/43 ER, 138.1 IP) and New York-AL (3.44/52 ER, 136.0 IP)...the 151.1 innings pitched by Mariners starters are 4th-most in the AL since April 24, behind the Indians (162.2 IP), Astros (159.1 IP) and Red Sox (153.0 IP)...Mariners starters are averaging 6.1 innings pitched per start since April 24.

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 8 games over .500 at 27-19...Seattle has not been 8 games over .500 since finishing the 2016 season 10 games over .500 at 86-76 (.531).

WHAT A RELIEF...since May 10, Mariners relievers have combined for the 2nd-lowest bullpen ERA in the Major Leagues...during this span, Seattle's bullpen has posted a 2.20 ERA (8 ER, 32.2 IP), which ranks just behind Houston (1.29/3 ER, 21.0 IP)...since May 10, Mariners relievers are 4-3 with 2 saves and 4 holds... they have combined for 34 strikeouts and 10 walks while holding opponents to a .215 (26x121) average against...they also rank 7th in WHIP (10 BB, 26 H, 32.2 IP) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.40/34 K, 10 BB) and 9th in opponents average against since May 10.

HEART OF THE ORDER...Mitch Haniger has made 7 starts batting 3rd in the order...in those 7 games, he is batting .321 (9x28) with 2 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 2 walks, a .367 on-base percentage and a .536 slugging mark (.902 OPS)...among American League #3 hitters (min. 30 PA), Haniger ranks 6th in slugging and 7th in batting and OPS...the Mariners are 5-2 in Haniger's 7 starts from the #3 spot in the

GREEN AND GOLD ... since 2015, the Mariners are 41-22 (.651) in 63 games vs. the Athletics, including winning 12 of their last 15 games vs. Oakland (7/9/17-c)...Seattle's .651 winning percentage vs. the Athletics is the 2nd-best record by an American League team against a division opponent during this span...trails Houston vs. Seattle (40-21/.656)...ranks ahead of Houston vs. Oakland (.635/40-23), Cleveland vs. Detroit (.629/39-23) and New York-AL vs. Tampa Bay (.627/37-22).

AT HOME ON THE ROAD...the Mariners have posted a .625 (15-9) road winning percentage this season, the 9th-best road winning percentage in the Majors...trail only Los Angeles-AL (.778/14-4), Houston (.696/16-7), New York-AL (.684/13-6), Boston (.680/17-8), Atlanta (.654/17-9), Milwaukee (.643/18-10), Washington (.636/14-8) and Colorado (.633/19-11)...the Mariners are averaging 5.21 runs-per-game (125 R, 24 G) on the road, 4th-most in the Majors...trail the Angels (6.00/108 R, 18 G), Astros (5.43/125 R, 23 G) and Cubs (5.22/120 R. 23 G).

SEGURA: SWEET-SWINGING SHORTSTOP...Jean Segura ranks among the top-5 American League shortstops (primary position) in several major offensive categories...Segura is batting .318 (61x192) with 32 runs, 14 doubles, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 33 RBI, a .337 on-base percentage and a .458 slugging mark (.795 OPS) in 45 games this season...he leads all American League shortstops in hits and RBI, while also ranking 2nd in batting, T2nd in doubles, 3rd in runs, 5th in on-base percentage and extra-base hits (19).

BENNY BALLGAME...Ben Gamel has hit safely in 9 of his last 13 games with an at-bat (5/5-c)...overall since May 5, he is batting .343 (12x35) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 1 HBP, 4 walks and a .425 on-base percentage in 14 games...during this span, he raised both his batting average and his on-base percentage more than 100 points; his average is now .230 (17x74) after being .128 entering May 5 and his on-base percentage is .305 after checking in at .190 on May 5.

LATE AND GREAT...in the 7th inning or later this season, Mitch Haniger is batting .364 (20x55) with 14 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 17 RBI, 8 walks, a .444 on-base percentage and a .927 slugging percentage (1.372 OPS)...Haniger leads all American League players in home runs, extra-base hits (12), slugging percentage and OPS (1.372) in the 7th or later, while also ranking 2nd in RBI, T5th in hits, 6th in batting and 9th in on-base percentage.

CLUTCH...since April 19, Jean Segura is batting .447 (17x38) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 22 RBI and 1 walk with runners in scoring position...overall this season he is batting .400 (22x55) with 5 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 29 RBI and 2 walks with RISP...he leads the Majors with 22 hits and 29 RBI with RISP, while also ranking T3rd in extra-base hits (8), T7th in batting and T8th in doubles.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners are 20-8 (.714) at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of the 2015 season...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that Seattle's .714 winning percentage at Oakland is the highest road winning percentage vs. a divisional opponent of any team in the Majors during that span?...the Mariners rank ahead of Chicago-NL at Cincinnati (.697/23-10), Boston at Toronto (.676/23-11), Chicago-NL at Milwaukee (.667/22-11), St. Louis at Milwaukee (.667/20-10) and Washington at Philadelphia (.667/18-9) in road winning percentage vs. divisional opponents since 2015.

- ABOUT LEAKE...
 Michael Raymond Leake.
- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 10th start of the season, 15th Mariners start, 243rd career start, 248th career appearance and 5th career start vs. Oakland tonight.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft
- Is 16-14 with a 3.33 ERA (101 ER, 272.2 IP) in 46 career G (43 GS) in May.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 9-8 extra-innings win over the Rangers on May 15...allowed 6 runs (5 earned) on 9 hits while striking out 2 batters across 5.1 innings pitched...held the Rangers to 3 runs through 5.0 innings...with 1 out in the 6th inning, allowed 4 consecutive hits (home run, double, double, single) for 3 runs, tying the game at 6-6 before being relieved by Dan Altavilla.

GETTING LOOSE...through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .393 (22x56) with a .424 on-base percentage and a .625 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .267 average (40x150) with a .331 OBP and a .487 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE ... has exited 6 of his 9 starts with a lead (5 games) or a tie score (1 game)...in his other 2 of other 3 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 6-3 in his 9 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 7-4

with a 4.66 ERA (43 ER, 83.0 IP) in 14 starts (7 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in wins and innings pitched (83.0) and ranks 2nd in strikeouts with 61 (James Paxton, 97)...in 10 of his 14 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned

DAY AND NIGHT...is 3-0 with a 4.00 ERA (8 ER, 18.0 IP) in 3 day games this season, while going 1-3 with a 7.09 ERA (26 ER, 33.0 IP) in 6 night starts... opponents are batting just .212 (14x66) with a .293 on-base percentage against Leake when the sun is out, while batting .343 (48x140) with a .387 onbase percentage after dark.

FOUR SCORE...is 10-1 with a 3.52 ERA (40 ER, 102.1 IP) in his last 16 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to April 23, 2017...his clubs are a combined 13-3 in those 16 games (7-3 w/STL, 6-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 66-4 with a 3.45 ERA (243 ER, 633.1 IP) in 98 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 79-19 in those 98 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 242 starts, 14th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 16th in innings pitched (1497.1).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE... became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)... became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player ..appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 87-80 with a 4.05 ERA (674 ER, 1497.1 IP) with 1,019 strikeouts and 358 walks in 247 career games (242 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
