VS. OAKLAND

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 9th (6-2) of 19 games this season... the Mariners are 14-3 in their last 17 games vs. the Athletics (7/9/17-c)... since 2015, the Mariners are 22-8 (.733) at the Oakland Coliseum:

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a four-day, three-game road trip with the finale (2-0) of three games against the Oakland Athletics...following today's game, will return to Seattle to begin a 10-day, 10-game homestand vs. Minnesota (3 G), Texas (4 G) and Tampa Bay (3 G)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 5 in a row and 7 of their last 9 games...Seattle is 15-8 in its last 23 games, 20-11 over its last 31 games and 25-15 in its last 40 games...Seattle is 9-9 during the day and 20-10 at night...Seattle is 12-10 at Safeco Field, 17-9 on the road.

- **Shut it Down** - Marco Gonzales (7.0 IP), Juan Nicasio (1.0 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP) combined for the Mariners 4th shutout of the season last night...Seattle's 4 shutouts are 4th-most in the AL, trailing Houston (6), Cleveland (5) and Minnesota (5)...each of the Mariners 4 shutouts have taken place on the road (4/24 at CWS, 5/8 at TOR, 5/14 at MIN and 5/23 at OAK)...Gonzales has started 2 of the club's 4 shutouts, while James Paxton (no-hitter) and Wade LeBlanc have each started 1.
- **Climbing the Ranks** - Edwin Díaz's 69 career saves rank T4th-most in club history (also: David Aardsma)...once Díaz surpasses Aardsma with his next save, Mike Schooler is next on the Mariners all-time saves leaderboard with 98 career saves as a Mariner.
- **On a Roll** - the Mariners have won a season-high 5 straight games...in 2017, Seattle won 5 consecutive games twice (6/2-7 and 7/9-17) and won a season-best 6 consecutive games, June 18-23.
- **Jean, Jean the Hit Collector** - since May 9, Jean Segura is batting .379 (22x58) with 10 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI and 6 stolen bases in 13 games...during that span, he ranks T2nd in the Major Leagues in hits (also: Mookie Betts), while also ranking 2nd in stolen bases and 6th in batting.
- **Call it a Comeback** - Seattle's 13 comeback wins rank T2nd-most in the American League (also: Toronto, trailing only Boston (15).
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 14 of their first 16 series, posting a series record of 11-3-3.
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 22-5 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 7-14 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

PLAYING IT CLOSE...with last night's 1-0 victory over the Athletics, the Mariners improved to 13-7 (.650) in one-run games this season...Seattle's 13 one-run victories are the most in the Majors this season...the Mariners .650 winning percentage in one-run games is 4th-best in the American League, behind New York-AL (.727/8-3), Boston (.688/11-5) and Oakland (.667/8-4)...Edwin Díaz has saved 10 one-run decisions this season, the most one-run saves in the Majors, ahead of Craig Kimbrel (8) and four pitchers with 6.

ONE IS ALL IT TAKES...the Mariners have won three 1-0 games this season: April 24 at Chicago, May 14 at Minnesota and May 23 at Oakland...through 48 games, the 2018 Mariners are tied for the 3rd-most 1-0 wins in club history (also: 2010, 2002 and 1979)...only the Mariners clubs of 2012 (6) and 2009 (4) have won more games by a final score of 1-0...Seattle's three 1-0 wins are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major league-lead this season...Edwin Díaz has earned the save in each of the Mariners 1-0 victories this season...his 3 saves in 1-0 games are tied for most in a single season by a Mariner (also: Kazuhiro Sasaki, 2002).

SWEEPING SUCCESS...with a win today, Seattle would secure its 19th sweep of the Oakland Athletics in club history (min. 3-game series)...the last time the Mariners swept the Athletics was Sept. 1-3, 2017 at Safeco Field...Seattle has swept the A's in Oakland on 6 occasions, including 3 times since 2015...the last time the Mariners swept a series of at least 3 games at the Oakland Coliseum was Sept. 9-11, 2016.

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...in 24 career starts at the Oakland Coliseum, Félix Hernández is 13-3 with a 2.76 ERA (50 ER, 163.0 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 39 walks...18 of his 24 career starts at the Coliseum have been quality starts...his 13 wins in Oakland are the most of any visiting pitcher, ranking ahead of Tommy John (12) and Mike Flanagan (11)...Félix's 18 quality starts at the Oakland Coliseum are 2nd-most all-time by a visiting pitcher, behind Frank Tanana (20)...(stats do not include Félix's "road" start vs. Oakland in Tokyo, Japan in 2012).

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 10 games over .500 at 29-19...with a win today, Seattle would be 11 games over .500 for the first time since being 86-75 (.534) after game #161 of the 2016 season.

AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES...since April 24, the Mariners are 18-9 (.667), the 2nd-best winning percentage in the American League during that span...trail only the Yankees (.760/19-6)...during that same span (4/24-c), Mariners starters are 10-4 with a 3.27 ERA (60 ER, 165.0 IP) with 150 strikeouts and 39 walks in 27 games...Seattle starters rank 3rd in the AL in ERA during that span, trailing Houston (2.36/45 ER, 171.1 IP) and Los Angeles-AL (2.85/47 ER, 148.1 IP)...the 165.0 innings pitched by Mariners starters are 4th-most in the AL since April 24, behind the Indians (174.2 IP), Astros (171.1 IP) and Red Sox (166.2 IP).

DIABOLICAL DÍAZ...Edwin Díaz recorded his 4th save in the Mariners last 9 games (5/14-c) by striking out the side in the 9th inning last night...overall this season, Díaz is 17-for-19 (89.5%) in save opportunities while posting a 1.78 ERA (5 ER, 25.1 IP)...he has recorded 45 strikeouts and 9 walks while limiting opponents to a .108 (9x83) opponents average against...he leads the American League in saves, while he is tied with Colorado's Wade Davis for the Major League-lead...Díaz leads AL relievers in strikeouts, opponents average against and WHIP (0.71/9 H, 9 BB, 25.1 IP), while ranking 3rd in strikeouts-per-9.0-IP (15.99/45 K, 25.1 IP) and 10th in ERA.

WHAT A RELIEF...since May 10, Mariners relievers have combined for the 2nd-lowest bullpen ERA in the Major Leagues...during this span, Seattle's bullpen has posted a 1.89 ERA (8 ER, 38.0 IP), which ranks just behind Houston (1.00/3 ER, 27.0 IP).

AT HOME ON THE ROAD...the Mariners have posted a .654 (17-9) road winning percentage this season, 4th-best in the Majors...trail only Los Angeles-AL (.750/15-5), Boston (.704/19-8) and Houston (.696/16-7).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive one-run games for the second time this season (also: 4/24-26)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...**that the Mariners have only won 4 straight one-run games on two occasions in club history?... the Mariners accomplished this feat for the first time on Aug. 21-24, 1998 and then again June 8-11, 2007.

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 386th career start and his 49th career start vs. Oakland today.
• Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
• Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
• Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
• In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
• ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
• At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
• Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
• A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
• Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
• Is 25-26 with a 4.15 ERA (191 ER, 414.2 IP) in 65 career GS in May.

LAST OUTING...

...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 5-4 comeback win on May 18 vs. Detroit...allowed 4 runs (3 earned) on 6 hits and 3 walks while striking out 4 across 6.0 innings...after allowing 3 runs to score in the 1st inning, held the Tigers scoreless until the 5th inning when a Victor Martinez double scored Leonys Martin, who had reached on an error.

ATHLETICS TALENT...

...in his last 10 starts vs. Oakland (8/26/15-c), Félix is 6-2 with a 2.69 ERA (18 ER, 60.1 IP)...in that same span, he is 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA (8 ER, 24.0 IP) in 4 starts (3 quality starts) against the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum...his 2.64 career ERA vs. Oakland ranks second among qualifying active pitchers (Ervin Santana, 1.95 ERA/45 ER, 208.0 IP)...leads the Majors in wins (26) and strikeouts (302) since his debut in 2005.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY...

...of Félix's 48 career starts against the Athletics, 38 are quality starts, including his starts on April 15 (6.1,5,2,2,0,7,HR-1) and May 1 (6.0,3,3,3,4,7,HR-1) this season at Safeco Field...since the Athletics moved to Oakland in 1968, no pitcher has recorded more quality starts vs. the Athletics than Hernández...he ranks ahead of Frank Tanana (34), Bert Blyleven (31), Tommy John (29), Ervin Santana (27) and Roger Clemens (27).

BRIGHT AND EARLY...

...in his career, Félix is 56-39 with a 3.16 ERA (302 ER, 859.1 IP) with 794 strikeouts and 259 walks in 130 daytime starts...of those, 86 have been quality starts, including 2 of his 4 daytime starts in 2018...the Mariners are 71-59 in Félix's starts during the day...MLB defines a day game as any game that begins prior to 5:00 p.m. local time.

CLIMBING THE RANKS...

...has 2,391 career strikeouts, 46th-most in Major League history...with 5 more strikeouts, Félix will tie Hall of Famer Sandy Koufax for 45th-most strikeouts in MLB history with 2,396.

IMPRESSIVE START...

...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest pitcher is Verlander with 51...during this stretch Félix has recorded 251 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (262).

HE'S OUR LEADER...

...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...

...Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins (165), starts (385), innings pitched (2,557.2) and strikeouts (2,391).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

CAREER...

...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 165-117 with a 3.25 ERA (924 ER, 2557.2 IP) in 385 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins (165), starts (385), quality starts (251), innings pitched (2557.2) and strikeouts (2,391).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JAMES PAXTON (3-1, 3.30)

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season tomorrow against the Twins...W#3 in his last start, a 7-2 Mariners win, on 5/19 vs. DET (9.0,3,2,2,1,8,HR-1); second complete game of his career...pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history, needing just 99 pitches in W#2, a 5-0 Mariners win on 5/8 at TOR (9.0,0,0,0,3,7); first complete game and first shutout of his career...notched a career-high 16 strikeouts in the Mariners 2-3 loss to OAK on 5/2 (7.0,5,0,0,1,16)...over his last 4 games, has gone 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA (5 ER, 28.0 IP) with 37 strikeouts...is 2-0 with a 1.45 ERA (5 ER, 31.0 IP) with 35 strikeouts in his last 4 starts...
SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts...2017: Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...CAREER: 33-21 with a 3.29 ERA (177 ER, 484.2 IP) in 84 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...vs. MIN: Is making his 5th career start vs. Minnesota...is 2-1 with a 2.91 ERA (7 ER, 21.2 IP) in 4 career starts against the Twins...no decision in his start on 4/5 at Minnesota (5.0,4,2,2,1,7,HR-1).
