- ♦ Arizona is 2-1 this season in Interleague Play, taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D- backs are 15-15 all-time vs. A's.
- ♦ The D-backs lead the NL with a .991 fielding pct., ahead of the Rockies (.991), Nationals (.987) and Mets (.986).
- ♦ Ketel Marte has hit .337 (30-for-89) with 7 RBI in 23 career games vs. A's...Jarrod Dyson hits .311 (32-for-103) in 35 games.
- ♦ Patrick Corbin is 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (3 ER in 25.1 IP) in his last 5 games (3 starts) during Interleague Play.
