HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ Arizona is making its first trip to the Oakland Coliseum since July 1-3, 2011...the D-backs are 7-3 in their last 10 games @ A's since July 9, 2000.
- ♦ Arizona is 2-1 this season in Interleague Play, taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D-backs are 15-15 all-time vs. A's.
- ♦ The D-backs lead the NL with a .991 fielding pct., ahead of the Rockies (.991), Nationals (.987) and Mets (.986).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has hit .337 (30-for-89) with 7 RBI in 23 career games vs. A's...**Jarrold Dyson** hits .311 (32-for-103) in 35 games.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** is 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (3 ER in 25.1 IP) in his last 5 games (3 starts) during Interleague Play.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs were swept @ Brewers, losing 9-2.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** was 1-for-3 with a home run (6)...**John Ryan Murphy** also went 1-for-4 with a home run (5).
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (4-4) suffered the loss after allowing 8 runs (6 ER) in 3.1 innings...**Fernando Salas** (0.2 IP), **T.J. McFarland** (2.0) and **Brad Boxberger** (1.0) combined to toss 3.2 scoreless frames.

- ♦ The D-backs have been added to ESPN's Monday Night Baseball on June 4 @ Giants and June 18th @ Angels and Tuesday Night Baseball on June 19 @ Angels...the games can also be seen locally on FOX Sports Arizona.

HALL OF FAME CLASSIC

- ♦ Tomorrow, **Augie Ojeda** will represent the D-backs at the annual Hall of Fame Classic @ Doubleday Field in Cooperstown, New York...each Major League team sends a player representative to take part in a 7-inning exhibition game.

ABOVE .500

- ♦ Arizona has had a record of .500 or better for 211 consecutive games since Opening Day 2017, the third-longest streak in team history behind 333 games from April 19, 1999-April 26, 2001 and 305 games from April 21, 2001-Sept. 29, 2002.

PAT IN THE HAT

- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** ranks among the NL leaders in opp. average (2nd, .177), WHIP (2nd, 0.91), strikeouts (2nd, 81), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (5th, 11.70), strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 4.50) and ERA (8th, 2.60).
- ♦ Is 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (3 ER in 25.1 IP) in his last 5 games (3 starts) during Interleague Play.

IT'S YOSHI!

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** boasts an 8-game scoreless streak (7.0 IP) since May 6, allowing just 2 hits and 2 walks (1 intentional), a .091 (2-for-22) opponent average and 7 strikeouts.

MURPH-DAWG

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is batting .302 (13-for-43) with 2 doubles, 5 homers and 11 RBI in 11 starts this season...his 5 home runs are already a career high (previous: 3 in 2015), and match his career total entering this season (146 games).

ON THIS DAY: THE BIG UNIT

- ♦ On this day in 1999, Randy Johnson threw his first shutout as a member of the D-backs in a 4-0 victory over the Padres...he'd go on to throw 14 shutouts with Arizona, the most in franchise history ahead of Brandon Webb (8) and Curt Schilling (5).

D-BACKS ALL-TIME DH NOTES

- ♦ D-backs designated hitters have combined to bat .239 (159-for-666) with 26 home runs and 91 RBI...D-backs designated hitters were 6-for-39 (.231) with 3 homers and 8 RBI in 2017.

 - The last D-back DH to homer was **A.J. Pollock** on Sept. 30, 2017 @ Royals (off Jacob Junis).
 - The only D-back with a multi-homer game as a DH was **Jay Bell** on July 17, 1999 @ Rangers.

PAUL SOLO BOBBLEHEAD courtesy of COX COMMUNICATIONS: The D-backs will host Star Wars Day at Chase Field on June 2 vs. Marlins, and the first 20,000 fans will receive a Paul Solo (Paul Goldschmidt + Han Solo) bobblehead, courtesy of Cox Communications.

INTERLEAGUE INFORMATION

- ♦ Arizona is 2-1 this season in Interleague Play, taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D-backs went 12-8 (.600) in Interleague Play in 2017, their most wins in a season vs. AL teams (also: 2002, '03, '13, '15).

IT'S (SHELBY) MILLER TIME!

- ♦ **Shelby Miller** made his third rehab appearance in Extended Spring Training Wednesday, tossing 5.0 innings, allowing 1 run on 2 hits with 4 strikeouts (66 pitches, 45 strikes).

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- ♦ The D-backs rank second in the Major Leagues with a .991 fielding pct. behind the Astros (.992) and ahead of the Rockies (.991) and Royals (.990).
- ♦ Arizona also leads all of baseball with a 18.4 Defensive Runs Above Average, which measures a player's defensive value relative to league average:
 - **MLB DEF Leaders** [source: FanGraphs.com]: **18.4 – D-backs**; 17.2 – Brewers; 16.0 – Cubs; 15.5 – Angels; 14.7 – Indians.
- ♦ The D-backs, who have the fewest errors in the NL (16), have made 4 miscues in their last 15 games and 5 over their last 20.

FAMILIAR FACES

- ♦ Several members of the A's coaching staff have ties to the D-backs:
 - **BOB MELVIN (manger):** Was the D-backs Manager from 2005-09, winning the NL Manager of the Year in 2007...was Bob Brenly's bench coach in Arizona from 2000-01.
 - **SCOTT EMERSON (pitching coach):** Pitched in the D-backs organization in 1997...went to Shadow Mountain High School and Scottsdale Community College.
 - **AL PEDRIQUE (first base coach):** Was the D-backs' interim manager in 2004 and was the third base coach in 2003.
 - **MATT WILLIAMS (third base coach):** Played 6 seasons for the D-backs (1999-2003)...he was also Arizona's first base coach in 2010 and third base coach from 2011-13, '16.
 - **MIKE ALDRETE (asst. hitting coach):** Was the D-backs' hitting coach from 2005-06...was also a coach in Arizona's Minor League system from 2001-03.
 - **RYAN CHRISTENSON (bench coach):** Played for the D-backs for parts of the 2001 season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CLAY BUCHHOLZ (0-0, 1.80)

- ♦ Allowed 1 run on 2 hits in 5.0 innings in his D-backs debut on May 20 @ Mets, but did not factor into the decision.
- ♦ Since 2009, leads the Majors with a .692 winning pct. (45-20) on the road.
- ♦ Is 4-2 with a 6.85 ERA (33 ER in 43.1 IP) in 9 career starts vs. A's...is 1-2 with a 9.58 ERA (11 ER in 10.1 IP) in 3 starts @ Oakland.
- ♦ Signed by the D-backs as a Minor League free agent on May 4.

- ◆ Needs 1 win for 50 in his career.
- ◆ Is looking for his first victory since April 22.
