HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ Arizona is making its first trip to the Oakland Coliseum since July 1-3, 2011...the D-backs are 8-3 in their last 11 games @ A's since July 9, 2000.
- ♦ Arizona is 3-1 this season in Interleague Play, having also taken 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D-backs rank second in the Major Leagues with a .991 fielding pct. behind the Astros (.992) and ahead of the Rockies (.991) and Royals (.989).
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** leads the Majors with a .692 winning pct. (45-20) on the road since 2009.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won the the series opener @ A's, 7-1.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** (5-1) earned his 50th career win after striking out 7 and allowing 1 run in 7.0 innings...**Yoshihisa Hirano** (1.0 IP) and **Andrew Chafin** (1.0) each had scoreless outings.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** went 2-for-4 with a home run (7), 2 RBI and 2 runs scored...**Paul Goldschmidt** tripled and drove in 2 runs...**John Ryan Murphy** had a double and 2 RBI as the DH.

MEMORIAL DAY UNIFORMS

- ♦ Over the next 3 days, teams across Major League Baseball will wear a camouflage-designed cap, matching jersey and socks which will feature five stars to represent the 5 branches of the U.S military.
- ♦ Major League Baseball will donate 100 pct. of its royalties from the sales of Memorial Day weekend apparel to charities supporting children and families grieving the loss of a military loved one...the organizations – Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors and Folds of Honor Foundation – will receive a minimum \$500,000 collective donation.

HALL OF FAME CLASSIC

- ♦ Today, **Augie Ojeda** will represent the D-backs at the annual Hall of Fame Classic @ Doubleday Field in Cooperstown, New York...each Major League team sends a player representative to take part in a 7-inning exhibition game.

- ♦ The D-backs pitching staff has allowed 179 runs this season, the fewest in franchise history through the first 50 games of a season [source: STATS LLC]:

- ♦ Arizona is 1 of 3 teams this season to have not allowed 10+ runs in a single game this season, joining Houston and St. Louis.

ABOVE .500

- ♦ Arizona has had a record of .500 or better for 212 consecutive games since Opening Day 2017, the third-longest streak in team history behind 333 games from April 19, 1999-April 26, 2001 and 305 games from April 21, 2001-Sept. 29, 2002.

ROAD WARRIOR

- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** leads the Majors with a .692 winning pct. (45-20) on the road since 2009...owns a career .622 winning pct. (48-28) on the road, compared to .507 at home (35-34).
- ♦ Is 4-0 with a 2.72 ERA (15 ER in 49.2 IP) in his last 11 road games (8 starts).

IT'S YOSHI!

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** boasts an 9-game scoreless streak (8.0 IP) since May 6, allowing just 3 hits and 3 walks (1 intentional), a .115 (3-for-26) opponent average and 8 strikeouts.

MURPH-DAWG

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is batting .298 (14-for-47) with 3 doubles, 5 homers and 13 RBI in 12 starts this season...his 5 home runs are already a career high (previous: 3 in 2015), and his 13 RBI are 1 shy of his career high set in 2015.
- ♦ He hit third in the order yesterday @ A's, just the second time in his career he hit higher than fourth as a starter (hit second on Sept. 29, 2013 vs. Astros).

ON THIS DAY: NEAR PERFECTION & CONSECUTIVE SHUTOUTS

- ♦ On this day in 2001, Curt Schilling took a perfect game into the eighth inning @ Padres, but has it broken up by a bunt single by Ben Davis with 1 out.
- ♦ On this day in 2006, Brandon Webb throws his second consecutive shutout, blanking the Reds, 3-0...he is 1 of 2 pitchers in team history (3 times) to toss back-to-back shutouts, along with Curt Schilling from May 9-14, 2003 (Webb also did it in 3 straight games from Aug. 5-17, 2007).

INTERLEAGUE INFORMATION

- ♦ Arizona is 3-1 this season in Interleague Play, winning the series opener last night @ A's and taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D-backs went 12-8 (.600) in Interleague Play in 2017, their most wins in a season vs. AL teams (also: 2002, '03, '13, '15).

- ♦ D-backs designated hitters have combined to bat .239 (160-for-670) with 26 home runs and 93 RBI...D-backs designated hitters were 6-for-39 (.231) with 3 homers and 8 RBI in 2017.

- ♦ The D-backs rank second in the Major Leagues with a .991 fielding pct. behind the Astros (.992) and ahead of the Rockies (.991) and Royals (.989).
- ♦ The D-backs, who have the fewest errors in the NL (16), have made 4 miscues in their last 16 games and 5 over their last 21.

FAMILIAR FACES

- ♦ Several members of the A's staff have ties to the D-backs:
 - ☐ **BOB MELVIN (manger):** Was the D-backs Manager from 2005-09, winning the NL Manager of the Year in 2007...was Bob Brenly's bench coach in Arizona from 2000-01.
 - ☐ **AL PEDRIQUE (first base coach):** Was the D-backs' interim manager in 2004 and was the third base coach in 2003.
 - ☐ **MATT WILLIAMS (third base coach):** Played 6 seasons for the D-backs (1999-2003)...he was also Arizona's first base coach in 2010 and third base coach from 2011-13, '16.
 - ☐ **MIKE ALDRETE (asst. hitting coach):** Was the D-backs' hitting coach from 2005-06...was also a coach in Arizona's Minor League system from 2001-03.

BUCHHOLZ AT A GLANCE

- ◆ In his 12th Major League season...signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.
- ◆ Is a 2-time AL All-Star (2010, '13).
- ◆ Member of 2 Red Sox World Championship clubs (2007, '13).
- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Finished sixth in the 2010 AL Cy Young voting, going 17-7 with a 2.33 ERA.
- ◆ Selected by Boston in the supplemental first round (42nd overall) in 2005 as compensation for Pedro Martinez leaving as a free agent.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Will be making his second start with the D-backs...did not factor into his first outing on May 20 @ Mets (1 ER in 5.0 IP).
- ◆ Signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4...originally signed a Minor League contract with Kansas City on March 20 and was released on May 1.
- ◆ Prior May 20, his last Major League start was on April 11, 2017 vs. Mets (L, 6 ER in 2.1 IP).

VS. A's

- ◆ Is 4-2 with a 6.85 ERA (33 ER in 43.1 IP) in 9 career starts vs. A's...
- ◆ Is 1-2 with a 9.58 ERA (11 ER in 10.1 IP) in 3 starts @ Oakland Coliseum.

- ◆ Was 1-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 ER in 27.2 IP) in 5 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, Triple-A Omaha and Triple-A Reno.

- ◆ Was introduced to his wife by Donald Trump at a 2008 UFC event in Anaheim, Calif...they were married at Trump National Golf Club in Palos Verdes, Calif. in 2009.
- ◆ Is a distant relative of former Major League pitcher, Taylor Buchholz...he pitched for the Astros (2006), Rockies (2007-08, '10), Blue Jays (2010) and Mets (2011).

NO-HITTER NOTES

- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Then-GM Theo Epstein spoke by phone with Terry Francona during the no-hitter, concerned about Buchholz's pitch count, who had not exceeded 98 in a game all season...Epstein said Buchholz would have been pulled if he reached 120, no-hitter or not, and finished with 115.

POSTSEASON INFO

- ◆ Has made 6 postseason starts, going 0-1 with a 4.25 ERA (14 ER in 29.2 IP).
- ◆ Started Game 4 of the 2013 World Series @ Cardinals, allowing 1 unearned run over 4.0 innings.
