HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ Arizona is concluding its first trip to the Oakland Coliseum since July 1-3, 2011...the D-backs are 8-4 in their last 12 games @ A's since July 9, 2000.
- ♦ Arizona is 3-2 this season in Interleague Play, splitting the first 2 games of this series @ A's, and taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.
- ♦ The D-backs lead the Major Leagues with a .992 fielding pct. ahead of the Astros (.992), Rockies (.991) and Royals (.989).
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA (10 ER in 37.2 IP), 37 strikeouts and 5 walks in 6 starts this season following a D-backs loss.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs loss @ A's, 3-0.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** (0-1) suffered the loss despite allowing 1 run and 2 hits in 6.0 innings...**Jorge De La Rosa** (1.0 IP) and **Fernando Salas** (1.0) each allowed 1 run.
- ♦ **Sócrates Brito** went 1-for-3 and **David Peralta** was 1-for-4.

- ♦ Today, **Brad Boxberger** is celebrating his 30th birthday...he shares a birthday with the likes of rapper Andre 3000 (42), actor Jack McBrayer (44) and former Major League manager Terry Collins (68).

ON THIS DAY: COMEBACK CITY

- ♦ On this day in 2011, the D-backs set a franchise record with a 6-run comeback @ Astros...Arizona, who trailed 6-0 at the end of the fourth inning, came back to win, 7-6.

ABOVE .500

- ♦ Arizona has had a record of .500 or better for 213 consecutive games since Opening Day 2017, the third-longest streak in team history behind 333 games from April 19, 1999-April 26, 2001 and 305 games from April 21, 2001-Sept. 29, 2002.

THE STOPPER

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA (10 ER in 37.2 IP), 37 strikeouts and 5 walks in 6 starts this season following a D-backs loss...since the start of 2017, has gone 10-3 with a 2.54 ERA (31 ER in 110.0 IP), 123 strikeouts and 19 walks in 17 starts following an Arizona loss.

MORE STRIKEOUTS + LESS WALKS = GOOD PLAN

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has 67 strikeouts and 7 walks this season, the Major's best strikeout-to-walk ratio (9.57)...the only pitcher in team history with a higher SO/BB ratio through 10 starts was Curt Schilling, who posted a 13.38 (107 SO/8 BB) in his first 10 starts of the 2002 season [source: STATS LLC].

IT'S YOSHI!

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** boasts an 9-game scoreless streak (8.0 IP) since May 6, allowing just 3 hits and 3 walks (1 intentional), a .115 (3-for-26) opponent average and 8 strikeouts.

MURPH-DAWG

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is batting .298 (14-for-47) with 3 doubles, 5 homers and 13 RBI in 12 starts this season...his 5 home runs are already a career high (previous: 3 in 2015), and his 13 RBI are 1 shy of his career high set in 2015.

INTERLEAGUE INFORMATION

- ♦ Arizona is 3-2 this season in Interleague Play, splitting the first 2 games of this series @ A's, and taking 2 of 3 from the Astros from May 4-6 @ Chase Field.

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Major Leagues with a .992 fielding pct. ahead of the Astros (.992), Rockies (.991), Royals (.989) and Rays (.989).
- ♦ The D-backs, who have the fewest errors in the NL (16), have made 4 miscues in their last 17 games and 5 over their last 22.

- ♦ The D-backs have a day game each of the next 3 days, their first such stretch since also playing 3 consecutive day games from May 27-29, 2017 (idea courtesy of Martín Bater/Carl Payne).

FAMILIAR FACES

- ♦ Several members of the A's staff have ties to the D-backs:
 - ❑ **BOB MELVIN (manager):** Was the D-backs Manager from 2005-09, winning the NL Manager of the Year in 2007...was Bob Brenly's bench coach in Arizona from 2000-01.
 - ❑ **AL PEDRIQUE (first base coach):** Was the D-backs' interim manager in 2004 and was the third base coach in 2003.
 - ❑ **MATT WILLIAMS (third base coach):** Played 6 seasons for the D-backs (1999-2003)...he was also Arizona's first base coach in 2010 and third base coach from 2011-13, '16.
 - ❑ **MIKE ALDRETE (asst. hitting coach):** Was the D-backs' hitting coach from 2005-06...was also a coach in Arizona's Minor League system from 2001-03.

ON DECK: CINCINNATI REDS

- ♦ Arizona is 11-6 in its last 17 games vs. Reds since Aug. 9, 2015...went 3-3 vs. Cincinnati in 2017.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is a lifetime .396 (21-for-53)/.439 OBP/.623 SLG hitter in 15 games vs. Reds with 4 doubles, 1 triple 2 home runs and 9 RBI...**Paul Goldschmidt** has career home runs and 20 RBI in 37 career games.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** is 2-2 with a 3.06 ERA (16 ER in 47.0 IP) in 8 games (7 starts) vs. Reds...**Fernando Salas** has a 1.90 ERA (5 ER in 23.2 IP) in 24 career appearances.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

SNAKEBITES

- ◆ Last faced the A's on Sept. 4, 2012 in Oakland, recording a 6-1 win with 7.0 innings, 1 run, 4 hits, 2 walks and 4 strikeouts.
- ◆ In his last 5 starts, has a 2.64 ERA (9 ER in 30.2 IP), .193 opponent average (22-for-114) and 35 strikeouts (4 walks).
- ◆ Among NL starters in May (min. 3 GS), is third with an 8.33 strikeouts-to-walk ratio (25:3), fourth with a 0.85 WHIP and tied for 11th with a .196 opponent average.
- ◆ His 2,303 career strikeouts are tied with Juan Marichal for 51st with on the all-time strikeout list...next up on the list is Rube Waddell (2,316).
- ◆ In last 3 games, held righties to a .152 average (7-for-46) with 15 strikeouts (0 walks).

LAST START

- ◆ Worked 6.0 innings with 4 runs and 9 strikeouts and took the 4-2 loss @ Brewers on May 21.

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,303 career strikeouts are tied with Juan Marichal for 51st on the all-time strikeout list trailing Rube Waddell (50th, 2,316), Early Wynn (49th, 2,334), Robin Roberts (48th, 2,357), Charlie Hough (47th, 2,362), Felix Hernandez (46th, 2,393) and Sandy Koufax (45th, 2,396).
- ◆ His 2,303 career strikeouts are fifth among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,880), Justin Verlander (2,509), Bartolo Colon (2,494) and Felix Hernandez (2,393).

VS. A'S

- ◆ In 15 career games, has made 11 starts (8 quality)...overall, is 6-1 with a 3.12 ERA (26 ER in 75.0 IP), .257 opponent average and 64 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 6 career road starts, is 3-0 with a 2.97 ERA (12 ER in 36.1 IP), .254 opponent average (36-for-142) and 29 strikeouts.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

MAY NUMBERS

- ◆ In 14 May starts as a D-back, is 8-3 with a 3.28 (34 ER in 93.1 IP), .205 opponent average and 97 strikeouts (15 walks).
- ◆ Among D-backs starters all-time in May (min. 10 GS), ranks first in opponent average (.205), tied for first in WHIP (0.91), fourth in win pct. (.727) and seventh in strikeouts (97).

VS. AL WEST

- ◆ In his last 3 starts (2 quality) vs. AL West, is 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER in 19.1 IP).
- ◆ In his last 8 starts (7 quality) vs. AL West, is 4-2 with a 1.99 ERA (12 ER in 54.1 IP), .195 opponent average (39-for-200) and 56 strikeouts (5 walks).

FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM

- ◆ His 7 walks are tied for sixth fewest by a NL starter (min. 5 GS) [leader is Ross Stripling/LAD, 3].
- ◆ Since 2017, his 52 walks are fifth fewest by a starter (min. 35 GS), behind Bartolo Colon (42), Ivan Nova (46), Corey Kluber (46), Alex Wood (47).
- ◆ Has 9.57 strikeout-to-walk ratio (58 strikeouts:7 walks) lead the Majors, ahead of Corey Kluber (7.80, 78:10), Miles Mikolas/STL (7.67, 46:6) and Daniel Mengden/OAK (7.17, 43:6).

- ◆ Among NL pitchers with runners on base, is second with a .218 opponents on-base pct. and 10th with a .181 opponents average.
