MEMORIAL DAY-The Rays are 5-12 all-time on Memorial Day, their worst record on any national holiday...their only wins have come in 2004 at MIN (7-3), 2007 vs. DET (6-5), 2008 vs. TEX (7-3), 2013 vs. MIA (10-6) and 2017 at TEX (10-8)...last year at Globe Life Park in Arlington, José De León earned the victory in his Rays debut, going 2.2 IP out of the bullpen.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have won consecutive games and three of their last 4 games on the heels of a 3-game losing streak...they are 9-4 in their last 13 games and 21-13 (.618) in their last 34 games dating back to April 18, 5th-best record in the majors since then...the Rays are 1 game below .500, in 3rd place in the AL East and 6.5 GB of the AL's second Wild Card... they have held at least a share of 3rd place in the division since the end of play on May 18 after spending the previous 48 days in 4th or 5th place.

- With yesterday's 8-3 win vs. BAL, the Rays improved to 8-4 in their last 12 series after a 1-4 start to the season...they scored eight unanswered runs to come back from a 3-0, 1st-inning deficit.
- The Rays have pitched to a 2.56 ERA (116-IP, 33-ER) in their last 13 games and have allowed 3 runs or fewer in nine of these games.
- Today is the seventh game of a stretch of games on 13 straight days, and continues a stretch of 40 games in 41 days (May 11-June 20).

CROOKED NUMBERS—Yesterday vs. BAL, the Rays sent 12 to the plate in the 3rd inning, their most in a frame since Oct 4, 2015 vs. TOR (12 PA, 1st inning)...the 6 runs and 5 hits tied season highs for a single frame...the only other time they scored as many runs in an inning this season was Opening Day vs. BOS to turn a 4-0 deficit in the 8th into a 6-4 lead.

- + All 3 runs allowed by the Rays came in the 1st...in it, the Rays issued an intentional walk in the 1st inning of a game for the first time since June 16, 2007 at COL (Todd Helton)...they also allowed their second bases-loaded walk of the season (April 3 at NYY).
- Yesterday was the first time the Rays allowed at least 3 runs in the top of the 1st and came back to win since Aug 8, 2015 vs. NYM.

ROAD RAYGE—The Rays are 14-13 on the road but 14-8 (.634) following an 0-5 start this season...this is the last of four consecutive 3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in club history the Rays have ever $made \ four \ consecutive \ three-city \ trips... on \ this \ trip, \ the \ Rays \ will \ travel \ to$ Oakland, Seattle and Washington, D.C., the first time they visit the West Coast on back-to-back trips since July-August 2012 (BAL-LAA-OAK, then MIN-SEA-LAA) when they went 9-4 in those West Coast series.

- + The Rays went 7-4 on their last road trip to BAL/KC/LAA and 5-3 on the previous trip to BAL/BOS/DET, the first time they were better than .500 on back-to-back road trips since May-June 2015.
- The Rays have averaged 5.00 runs per game over last two road trips...so far this season, the Rays are averaging 4.63 runs per game on the road, batting .271/.337/.423...in comparison, at home the Rays have scored 3.92 runs per game and have hit .255/.337/.379.
- + Entering today's game at OAK, the Rays are 6-3 in series openers on the road and 6-1 in their last seven series openers on the road.

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—The Rays are 68-103 (.398) all-time against the A's (41-46 at home, 27-57 on the road), their 2nd-worst record against any AL opponent (58-93, .384 vs. Indians)...their .321 winning pct. at Oakland Coliseum is the worst of any AL team...they have been held to 3 runs or fewer in 12 of their last 16 games here...last season, the Rays went 5-2 against the A's, their best season series ever against them...they have won consecutive series over the A's for the first time since 2008 (3).

CONSIDER THIS—Only three times this season have the Rays held a .500 winning pct. of better: 1-0, 1-1 and, most recently, 22-22...today the Rays have a chance to return to .500 despite a wide range of obstacles:

- + They enter this 9-game road trip having already played 27 games on the road, tied for 4th-most in the AL...their 24 games at home are 3rd-fewest in the AL, ahead of the Orioles (23) and Twins (23).
- They opened the season 1-8, 3-12 and 4-13, with an 8-game losing streak on the heels of a comeback win on Opening Day...at 3-12, they held the worst record in the AL and 2nd-worst in the majors.
- Rays relievers lead the majors with 214.2 IP, while Rays starters have covered 238.2 IP, fewest in the majors...the Rays opened the season with three regular members of the starting rotation and used "bullpen days" as needed as the fourth and fifth starters...they

- have used 10 different starting pitchers, most in the majors.
- They placed two-time Gold Glove winner and 2015 AL Platinum Glove winner Kevin Kiermaier (torn ligament in right thumb) on the disabled list on April 16, the third straight season he has missed significant time...they have gone 22-14 (.611) since he was placed on the disabled list, compared to 29-32 in 2017 and 14-34 in 2016.
- They have played 13 games against the Red Sox (4-9), who hold the best record in the majors...the Rays and Red Sox have met more frequently than any other two teams in the majors this season.

REDEFINING RELIEF - So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 16 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Orioles (8), and their most for an entire season since 2005 (23)
- 7 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors...the other 29 teams have combined to make 16 apps of this type, but the Marlins (4) are the only other team with multiple relief apps of 70+ pitches
- 31 apps of at least 2 IP, 2nd-most in the AL (Orioles, 32)
- 16 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 9)
- 12 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (D-backs/Marlins, 3)
- Yesterday vs. BAL, the Rays got 15 pitches from starter Sergio Romo and 116 pitches from their two relievers, Vidal Nuño (53) and Austin Pruitt (63)...it was the first time they had multiple relievers throw at least 50 pitches since Aug 25, 2005 vs. CLE.

DO IT LIKE PRUITT-Yesterday vs. BAL, Austin Pruitt went 5.2 IP for the second save of his career, both of the 3 IP (or more) variety at home against the Orioles (also June 23, 2017, 3 IP in a 15-5 win)...it was the longest app ending with a save in franchise history...previous mark was 4 IP, 4x-last Matt Andriese on May 14, 2015 vs. NYY...since the save became an official statistic in 1969, this was only the fourth time a pitcher went at least 5.2 IP and recorded a save, following TEX Joaquin Benoit on Sep 3, 2002 at BAL (7 IP), TEX Horacio Pina on April 23, 1972 vs. CAL (6 IP) and OAK **Bob Locker** on Aug 12, 1970 vs. CLE (5.2 IP).

UNCHARTED TERRITORY-The Rays rank 2nd in the majors with a .26382 avg., pct. points behind the Red Sox (.26409)...for the record, the only times the Rays have led the majors in avg. was the end of play on April 29, 2018, April 7, 2012, April 14, 2005, April 3, 2000 and April 1 and April 4-9, 1998...the Rays rank 3rd in the majors with a .337 OBP behind the Cubs (.341) and Yankees (.339)...the Rays have increased their avg. by 19 points and on-base pct. by 20 points over last season, when they ranked 25th and 22nd in the majors, respectively, at .245 and .317.

ODDS & ENDS—The Rays are 12-0 when hitting at least 2 HR, the only unbeaten team in the majors when doing so...however, their 12 games with multiple homers are tied for 5th-fewest in the majors this season.

- The Rays are 21-1 (.954) when scoring at least 5 runs this year.
- The Rays haven't lost a game when scoring 8 runs or more since Sep 26, 2015 at TOR, going 52-0 when doing so since then.
- The Rays have played 11 straight games decided by 2 runs or more... before this stretch, 19 of their first 40 games were 1-run games

MUSICAL CHAIRS—On the West Coast portion of this road trip, Doug Waechter will fill in for Brian Anderson as color commentator, and FOX Sports Sun will feature a three-man booth today, Thursday and Sunday, as Dewayne Staats and Waechter are joined by Andy Freed, Neil Solondz and Dave Wills, respectively...Solondz will be in the radio booth today (with Wills) and on Sunday (with Freed).

COOP-BOUND—Last week the National Baseball Hall of Fame & Museum requested artifacts from pitchers Jonny Venters and Sergio Romo... Venters is sending the cap he wore in his Rays debut on April 25 at BAL, when he became the second pitcher in major league history (after Jason Isringhausen) to return to the majors after three Tommy John surgeries, according to FanGraphs...Romo is sending the scorecard from his first major league start on May 19 at LAA.

MEDICAL MATTERS-RH Yonny Chirinos (right forearm strain) will make a rehab start tomorrow for Triple-A Durham vs. Rochester (Twins)... this will be his second rehab start, after pitching for Class-A Charlotte on Thurs vs. Fort Myers (Twins): 2 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 2 SO.

LAST START—On Wed vs. BOS, faced former teammate and close friend **David Price** and both received no decision...made the 171st start of his career, passing Price for 2nd in franchise history...his only run allowed in 6 IP was on a bases-loaded, double play grounder in the 6th, snapping his scoreless streak at 12.2 IP...faced one over the minimum through 4 IP, yielded consecutive 2-out hits in the 5th but got a 8-6-2 out at the plate...went single, walk, walk, GIDP, groundout in the 6th, and was replaced the next inning...his line: ND, 6 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 3 BB, 6 SO, 95 pit, 57 str.

BETTER OF LATE—His 4.68 ERA for the year is its lowest of the season...since the beginning of May, is 1-2 with a 2.76 ERA (32.2-IP, 10-ER) in 5 starts, compared to 2-1 with a 6.61 ERA (32.2-IP, 24-ER) in his first 6 starts of the season...has yielded 1 run or fewer in consecutive starts for the first time since May 17–June 7, 2015 (5).

- + Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 4 starts this month and 1 run or fewer in 3 starts...six of his 10 runs allowed this month came in his start of 7 IP on May 12 at BAL (G1)...has yielded 2, 1 and 0 and 1 runs in his other 4 starts in May.
- + Hasn't allowed a homer in four of his 5 starts this month...his last 2 starts have been homerless after allowing 3 HR on May 12 at BAL (G1)...started the season by becoming the third Ray to allow at least 1 HR in each of his first 6 starts of the year, following **Steve Parris** (7) in 2003 and **Dennis Springer** (9) in 1998.
- + Has gone 6 IP or more in five consecutive starts after failing to do so in nine of his previous 12 starts dating back to the end of last season.

vs. OAKLAND—Is 1-0 with a 3.97 ERA (11.1-IP, 5-ER) in 2 starts in his career against the Athletics...will be pitching at the Oakland Coliseum for the first time in his career...last faced the A's last June 11 at home, yielding three straight baserunners in the 2nd inning, accounting for his first 2 runs allowed...yielded an RBI double to Vogt in the 4th and RBI single to Khris Davis in the 6th...got ND as the Rays erased 3-0 and 4-3 deficits...his line: ND, 6 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 3 BB, 8 SO, 114 pit, 75 str.

QDDS & ENDS—Has yielded 4 runs or more in 6 starts this season, tied for most in the majors...has yielded 4 runs or more in eight of his 16 starts since Sep 8, 2017, compared to 4 runs or more in eight of his previous 37 starts spanning 2016-17.

- + Is 1 win shy of tying Scott Kazmir (55) for 3rd in franchise history, while his 1,107 SO are 2nd in club history behind James Shields (1,250).
- + According to FanGraphs, 13.0 pct. of his total pitches are swings-and-misses, highest on the team (Blake Snell is 2nd, 12.6 pct.) and 8th in the AL.
- + Has thrown his changeup for 10.6 pct. of his total pitches, 2nd-highest rate of his career and up from 8.0 pct. last season.
- + Has made 27 starts in his career with double-digit strikeouts, most in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** (23)...has not allowed a walk in eight of those 27 starts, tying Price for most in club history and as many as Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** compiled in his 27-year career.

SEEKING .500—Makes today's start with the Rays attempting to improve to .500 on the season...the Rays have gone 1-5 this season when a win would have brought them back to .500, including 0-2 in starts by Archer: May 1 at DET (2-1 loss) and May 6 vs. TOR (2-1 loss).

MR. DURABLE—Since June 1, 2013—the date he was recalled to the majors for good—he leads the majors with 167 starts...DET/WAS Max Scherzer ranks 2nd with 163 starts...made 34 starts last season, tying BAL Kevin Gausman for the major league lead and tying the club record (Archer in 2015, David Price in 2011, Scott Kazmir in 2007)...has made at least 30 starts in each of the last four straight seasons, one of two Rays pitchers all-time to do that (also James Shields, six, 2007-12)...became the third Rays pitcher with three straight years of 200 IP, joining Shields (six, 2007-12) and Price (three, 2010-12)... is one of five pitchers to throw at least 200 IP in each of the last three seasons, along with Max Scherzer, Jeff Samardzija, Chris Sale and Corey Kluber.

K'S FOR KIDS—Every strikeout he records this season will benefit the local nonprofit Starting Right, Now...its mission is to combat youth homelessness through a variety of personal development programs...for every strikeout, Archer, the Rays Baseball Foundation—a 501(c)(3) organization—and Crown Automotive Group will each donate \$25...this is the fourth consecutive year Archer has conducted the strikeout campaign.

LAST START—On Thurs vs. BOS, made his second scoreless start of the season (also March 30 vs. BOS) and ninth scoreless start of his career...retired his first 7 BF and 12 of his first 13 BF...didn't allow a runner to reach scoring position until two outs in the 5th, following a walk and single... allowed 3 hits, his fewest since April 10 at CWS (1)...was his third start against the Red Sox this season, improving to 2-0 with a 0.95 ERA (19-IP, 2-ER)...his line: W, 6 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 8 SO, 101 pit, 63 str.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 9 starts this season, tied for 2nd in the majors behind HOU Justin Verlander (10)...was the first

Ray to ever do that nine times within the team's first 48 games of the season...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 6 starts this season, tied for 4th in the majors (and tied for 2nd in the AL) behind Verlander (8), NYM Jacob deGrom (7) and ATL Mike Foltynewicz (7).

vs. OAKLAND—Is 0-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10.2-IP, 5-ER) in 2 starts against the A's, both on the road...last faced them on July 18, 2017, pitching on 12 days' rest in his first start following the All-Star break, but lasted only 4 IP...allowed a 2-out, 2-run homer to Khris Davis in the 1st inning.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
