RAY MATTER—The Rays have won three consecutive games and four of their last 5 games on the heels of a 3-game losing streak...they are 10-4 in their last 14 games and 22-13 (.629) in their last 35 games since April 18, 5th-best record in the majors since then...the Rays currently hold the 8thbest record in the AL, and they are 6.5 GB of the second Wild Card but are 1.0 GB of the A's and 2.0 GB of the Angels...in comparison, at 4-13 (.235) to start the season, the Rays held the 3rd-worst record in the majors.

- + At 26-26, the Rays are .500 (or better) for only the fourth time this season (previously 1-0, 1-1 and 22-22)...this is the second consecutive season the Rays have been 26-26 through 52 games.
- The Rays have held at least a share of 3rd place in the division for the last 11 days...they spent the previous 48 days in 4th or 5th.
- Tonight is the eighth game of a stretch of games on 13 straight days. and continues a stretch of 40 games in 41 days (May 11-June 20).

EXTRA! EXTRA!—Yesterday at OAK, the Rays were held without a hit from the last out of the 6th inning until two outs in the 13th, then pieced together three consecutive singles and held on for a 1-0 win...every baserunner for the Rays the entire game came with two outs...they won a 1-0, extra-inning game for only the second time in club history (2-8), following Sep 13, 2010 vs. NYY (Reid Brignac walk-off homer, 11th inn.).

- Yesterday was the fourth time in franchise history the Rays played to a scoreless tie through at least 12 innings: also July 22, 2016 at OAK (1-0 loss in 13 innings), Sep 13, 2015 vs. BOS (2-0 loss in 13 innings) and July 17, 2011 vs. BOS (1-0 loss in 16 innings).
- + It was the Rays first 1-0 win since July 8, 2017 vs. BOS and their first 1-0 win on the road since Aug 20, 2015 at HOU.
- Yesterday was the first Rays game decided by 1 run since since May 15 at KC (6-5 win), going 11 games in between.

THROWING BLANKS—Yesterday's 1-0 win at OAK was the Rays first shutout since Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL, leaving the Blue Jays as the only team without one this season...this was the third time in franchise history the Rays failed to record a shutout through the first 51 games...in 2005, their first shutout came in the 90th game; in 2007, their first shutout came in the 116th game...the 51 games without a shutout was their longest streak since July 11-Sep 16, 2009 (59)...from 2011-17, the Rays led the AL and ranked 2nd in the majors with 96 shutouts (Dodgers, 117).

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays are on a scoreless streak of 21 IP, since allowing 3 runs in the 1st inning on Sun vs. BAL...they are 3 IP shy of tying for the 2nd-longest scoreless streak in franchise history (24 IP, 3xlast June 30-July 3, 2013), and 6 IP shy of tying the club record (27 IP, Sep 12-15, 2013)...the Rays have yielded 3 runs or fewer in seven consecutive games, their longest such streak since July 24-Aug 4, 2016 (10).

- + The Rays bullpen didn't allow a run in 7 IP yesterday and hasn't allowed a run in its last 17.2 IP overall, since Anthony Banda allowed a 7th-inning, RBI single to Chris Davis on Sat vs. BAL.
- Since May 19—the date of Sergio Romo's first career start—the Rays have pitched to a 2.14 ERA (84-IP, 20-ER) in 9 games and the bullpen has pitched to a 1.85 ERA (58.1-IP, 12-ER).

JOHNNY WHOLESTAFF—The Rays have used a major-league-most 10 different starting pitchers this season, already their most for an entire season since 2014 (11)...with Nathan Eovaldi's season debut tomorrow, the Rays will use 11 starters through the first 54 games for the first time in club history (10 in 2000, 2003)...21 different pitchers have already appeared in a game for the Rays, 2nd-most in the AL behind the Angels (22)... this includes position players Johnny Field and Daniel Robertson but not Wilmer Font or Jaime Schultz, who are active but have not pitched.

Rays relievers lead the majors with 221.2 IP, while Rays starters have covered 244.2 IP, fewest in the majors.

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 16 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Orioles (8), and their most for an entire season since 2005 (23)
- 7 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors...the other 29 teams have combined to make 16 apps of this type, but the Marlins (4) are the only other team with multiple relief apps of 70+ pitches
- 32 apps of at least 2 IP, tied for most in the AL (Orioles)
- 17 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 10)
- + 12 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (D-backs/Marlins, 3)

ROAD RAYGE-The Rays have played 28 games on the road, tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind the Orioles (30), they are 15-13 on the road but 15-8 (.652) following an 0-5 start to the season...since April 9, the 15-8 record is tied for 4th-best in the majors...this is the last of four consecutive 3-city road trips to start the season-the first time in franchise history the Rays have ever made four consecutive three-city trips... on this trip, the Rays visit Oakland, Seattle and Washington, D.C., the first time they visit the West Coast on back-to-back trips since July-August 2012 (BAL-LAA-OAK, then MIN-SEA-LAA) when they went 9-4 in those West Coast series.

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—The Rays are 69-103 (.401) all-time against the A's

(41-46 at home, 28-57 on the road), their 2nd-worst record against any AL opponent (58-93, .384 vs. Indians)...their .329 winning pct. at Oakland Coliseum is the worst of any AL team...they have won three of their last 4 games here, despite scoring 3, 4 and 1 run(s) in those wins, after going 4-9 in their previous 13 games...they have been held to 3 runs or fewer in 13 of their last 17 games here...last season, the Rays went 5-2 against the A's, their best season series ever against them...they have won consecutive series over the A's for the first time since 2008 (3).

TURN AROUND, BRIGHT RAYS-Since April 18, the Rays are 22-13 (.629), 5th-best winning pct. in the majors and 4th-best in the AL (see chart above)...prior to this, they were 4-13 to start the season.

WHAT A COMEBACK—With yesterday's game-ending strikeout of Matt Olson in the 13th inning, Jonny Venters recorded his first save since Aug 22, 2011 at CHC (with ATL), going 2,470 days in between...during that stretch between saves, 469 other pitchers earned a save in the majors, with BOS Craig Kimbrel leading the way over that span with 267 saves.

+ Also in yesterday's game, Ryne Stanek recorded his first career win, coming in the 29th app of his career.

STAY THIRSTY, MY FRIENDS—The Rays haven not thrown a complete game since Matt Andriese on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK, the longest drought in AL history and 3rd-longest in major league history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, behind the Marlins from June 4, 2014-June 2, 2017 (480) and Brewers from April 6, 2011-July 8, 2013 (407)...since then:

- + the Rays have played 342 games
- + the longest outing for a Rays starting pitcher is 8 IP (eight times)
- + a Rays starter has pitched into the 9th inning only once: Alex Cobb on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX (double, homer and was replaced)
- the Rays have had 9 CG thrown against them
- the Indians have recorded a majors-most 15 CG, while six pitchers have thrown at least 5 CG, led by CLE Corey Kluber (8)

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY - On May 29, 2017 at TEX, the Rays won, 10-8, and Erasmo Ramirez became the first pitcher to record a save (May 28, 2017 at MIN) and go on to start the team's next game since fellow Nicaraguan (and his childhood hero) MTL Dennis Martínez surrounding the 1993 All-Star break (July 11 vs. SD, July 15 at LAD), according to the Elias Sports Bureau...he became the first pitcher to do that on consecutive $\it days$ since CLE Steve Farr from June 9-10, 1984 vs. SEA.

LAST START—On Thurs vs. BOS, made his second scoreless start of the season (also March 30 vs. BOS) and ninth scoreless start of his career...retired his first 7 BF and 12 of his first 13 BF...didn't allow a runner to reach scoring position until two outs in the 5th, following a walk and single...allowed 3 hits, all singles, his fewest since April 10 at CWS (1)...was his third start against the Red Sox this season, improving to 2-0 with a 0.95 ERA (19-IP, 2-ER)...his line: W, 6 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 8 SO, 101 pit, 63 str.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 9 starts this season, tied for 2nd in the majors behind HOU Justin Verlander (11)...was the first Ray to ever do that nine times within the team's first 48 games of the season...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 6 starts this season, tied for 4th in the majors (and tied for 2nd in the AL) behind Verlander (9), NYM Jacob deGrom (8) and ATL Mike Foltynewicz (7)...three times this season he has allowed 2 runs or fewer and not gotten the win, and twice he has allowed 1 run or fewer without the win.

THE WIN COLUMN—Has won consecutive starts and his 6 wins are tied for 6th in the AL, one shy of the league leaders...his 6 wins in 11 starts are more than his total from 24 starts last season (5) and match his career high (from 19 starts in 2016)...a win tonight would make him the sixth Ray with 7 wins through the first 53 games of the season, following **Erasmo Ramirez** (2016), **Matt Moore** (2013), **David Price** (2012, 2010), **Scott Kazmir** (2006) and **Rolando Arrojo** (1998).

vs. OAKLAND—Is 0-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10.2-IP, 5-ER) in 2 starts against the A's, both on the road...last faced them on July 18, 2017, pitching on 12 days' rest in his first start following the All-Star break, but lasted only 4 IP...allowed a 2-out, 2-run homer to Khris Davis in the 1st inning and run-scoring wild pitch in the 4th inning.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF—In 21 starts since his Aug 8 recall last season, he is 11-4 with a 2.81 ERA (121.2-IP, 38-ER) and .196 opp avg. (85-for-434)...min. 100 IP, his ERA over this span ranks 8th in the AL...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 16 of these 21 starts, 1 run or fewer in 12 starts and hasn't allowed an *earned* run in 6 starts...he is 6-1 with a 1.46 ERA (67.2-IP, 11-ER) in 11 starts at home over this span, compared to 5-3 with a 4.50 ERA (54-IP, 27-ER) in 10 starts on the road.

ODDS & ENDS—Ranks among AL leaders in starts (11, tied for 4th), wins (6, tied for 6th), ERA (2.78, 8th), hits per 9 IP (6.26, 6th), opp avg. (.195, 6th), WHIP (1.02, 12th), and pct. of swings that miss (29.6, 7th)...is averaging a career-high 95.3 mph on his fastball, 9th in the majors and 2nd among major league left-handed starters behind SEA James Paxton (95.5)...12.6 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 3rd among AL lefties.

- + Is throwing a career-high 62.1 pct. of his pitches for strikes...has thrown first-pitch strikes to 67.4 pct. of batters faced over his last 2 starts, compared to 53.4 pct. through his first 9 starts...has lowered his walk rate from 5.16 BB/9 IP in 2016 to 4.11 BB/9 IP in 2017 and 2.92 BB/9 IP in 2018.
- + Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in 14 of his last 15 starts dating back to Sep 12, 2017, the only exception coming on May 13 at BAL (6)...his streak of 15 consecutive starts yielding 6 hits or fewer is tied for the longest in franchise history (fourth time, last **Scott Kazmir** spanning 2007-08).
- + Has gone at least 7 IP six times in his last 19 starts since Aug 20, 2017 vs. SEA, compared to once in 35 career starts prior to that.

HOME vs. ROAD—Is 3-2 with a 4.59 ERA (33.1-IP, 17-ER) on the road this season and 6-10 with a 4.56 ERA (136.1-IP, 69-ER) in 28 starts on the road in his career...in comparison, his 0.86 ERA (31.1-IP, 3-ER) at home ranks 3rd in the majors behind OAK Trevor Cahill (0.64) and PHI Jake Arrieta (0.84)...has allowed 1 run or fewer in eight consecutive starts at home since last Sep 12, longest such streak in franchise history, passing Scott Kazmir (6) from Sep 27, 2007–June 17, 2008...has only allowed 3 runs in his last 49.1 IP at Tropicana Field dating back to the end of last season.

NO BRUISES INFLICTED—Has never hit a batter in 54 career starts, the longest streak by any starter to begin his career (no relief apps over that stretch) since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...it is the longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in franchise history, passing **James Shields** (38) in 2009–10...it is also the longest active streak in the majors, ahead of LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (43).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH NATHAN EOVALDI (Season Debut)

WELCOME BACK—Will be making his first app/start in the majors since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS, 657 days in between...in that start, exited after 1 IP with right elbow discomfort, was placed on the 15-day DL on Aug 12 (retroactive to Aug 11) with a right elbow tendon injury and underwent a second Tommy John surgery and had his right flexor tendon repaired on Aug 19, performed by Dr. Christopher Ahmad at New York-Presbyterian Hospital...originally was tabbed by Manager Kevin Cash on March 15 to start the fourth game of this season, but was placed on the disabled list the day before Opening Day...on March 30, he underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove loose bodies in his right elbow...the surgery was per-

formed by Dr. Koco Eaton in St. Petersburg.

 Totaled four rehab starts between Class-A Charlotte and Triple-A Durham...yielded 8 R/ER in 4 IP on Wed at Gwinnett.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD Andy Green.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- Has recorded multiple hits in three of his 7 games...recalled from Triple-A Durham on May 16 after appearing in 17 games with the Bulls.
- On Sun vs. BAL, reached in all 4 PA, the second time this season he reached base at least four times, while he didn't have a game of this type in 34
- games (32 starts) with the Giants last season...his 2-run single in the 3rd marked his first multi-RBI game since May 20, 2017 at STL (with SF). On May 17-18 at LAA, became the first player to begin his Rays career with consecutive multi-hit games since Drew Sutton (3) in 2012...became the second player in club history age 22 or younger to begin his Rays career with consecutive multi-hit games, following Delmon Young (3) in 2006.
- Born in Tampa and went to Hernando HS, reaching the state semifinals in 2011...was acquired from the Giants in the Evan Longoria trade.

- Batting .146/.255/.195 (6-for-41) with 2 2B and 3 RBI in his last 10 games (all starts) since May 18 to lower his avg. from .293 to .263...his 10-game drought without a homer is a season long...in comparison, hit .326/.372/.591 (43-for-132) with 10 HR in his previous 32 games, April 10-May 17.
- Has 15 multi-hit games, tied with Matt Duffy for the team lead...last multi-hit game was Sat vs. BAL, including a 2-run double in the 2nd inning. His 11 HR are five more than any other Ray and five shy of a career high...last year, didn't reach 11 HR until Aug 29 vs. OAK (Angels 133rd game).
- Has appeared in 51 games and made 50 starts (28-DH, 22-1B)...his 28 starts at designated hitter are his most since 2015 with the Angels (46).

- Hitless in his last 9 AB and batting .226/.314/.258 (7-for-31) in his last 8 games (all starts) since May 19 to lower his avg. from .322 to .303. Since returning from the 10-day DL (right hamstring strain) on April 27, is batting .326/.370/.424 (30-for-92) with 6 2B, 1 HR and 8 RBI. Has 15 multi-hit games, tied with C.J. Cron for the team lead...min. 50 AB, his .349 avg. (37-for-106) vs. RHP ranks 5th in the majors.
- Batting .328/.380/.391 (21-for-64) in 18 games (all starts) at home, but both homers have come on the road (April 5 at BOS, May 12 (G1) at BAL)
