ROSTER MOVE—The Rays have optioned Jaime Schultz to Triple-A Durham and reinstated Nathan Eovaldi (arthroscopic surgery, right elbow) from the 60-day DL...to make room on the 40-man roster, Jake Faria (left oblique strain) was transferred from the 10-day DL to the 60-day DL $\,$

- + Schultz made his major league debut last night and struck out all 3 BF in the 7th...he was the second pitcher in Rays history to strike out every single batter faced in his major league debut, following 35-year-old rookie LH Jim Morris on Sep 18, 1999 at TEX (0.1 IP)...he was the first pitcher in the majors to go at least 1 IP and strike out every batter in his debut since PIT John Holdzkom on Sep 2, 2014 at STL (1 IP), and the first to do this as part of his team's winning effort since NYY Edwar Ramírez on July 3, 2007 vs. MIN.
- + Eovaldi will be making his Rays debut...it will be his first app/start in the majors since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), going 657 days in between...he will become the 35th player to pitch in the majors after two Tommy John surgeries, and only the 12th pitcher to start a major league game after doing so (see next page).

#VOTERAYS-MLB today announced the 2018 Camping World All-Star Balloting Program, and voting will launch on Friday at noon ET...for the fourth straight season, balloting will be conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at mlb.com, all 30 club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark apps...fans can cast votes for starters a total of 35 times including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in any 24-hour period...the Midsummer Classic will be held on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C., the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital.

+ Rays on this year's ballot include C Wilson Ramos, 1B Brad Miller, 2B Joey Wendle, 3B Matt Duffy, SS Daniel Robertson, OF Mallex Smith, OF Kevin Kiermaier and OF Carlos Gómez.

RAY MATTER-The Rays have won four consecutive games and five of their last 6 games to improve to 27-26 on the season, the first time they've been over .500 since their Opening Day win vs. BOS...they have achieved this despite 1-8, 3-12 and 4-13 starts to the season...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Rays are the first team to fall at least 9 games under .500 and get back over .500 before the end of May since the 2009 San Diego Padres...tonight the Rays have a chance to improve to 2 games over .500 for the first time since the end of play on Aug 10, 2017 (59-57).

- + The Rays are 11-4 (.733) in their last 15 games, tied with the Brewers and Mariners for the best record in the majors since May 14... they are 23-13 (.639) in their last 36 games, 3rd-best in the majors behind the Yankees (26-9) and Brewers (26-12) since April 18.
- The Rays hold the 7th-best record in the AL, with two teams separating them from the AL's second Wild Card position...they are 5.5 GB of the Mariners and 3.5 GB of the Angels...as recently as May 13, there were six teams ahead of the Rays for the second Wild Card.

POWER BALL—Last night the Rays hit 4 HR, tying their season high (also April 28 at BOS)...C.J. Cron, Joey Wendle and Wilson Ramos hit backto-back-to-back homers over a span of 10 pitches in the 3rd inning, and Daniel Robertson homered in the 9th...it was the first time the Rays hit at least 4 HR, all solo, to account for all the team's runs since Sep 21, 2016 vs. NYY (5 HR in the 11-5 loss)—which, coincidentally, was the last time the Rays went back-to-back-to-back (Evan Longoria, Brad Miller, Corey Dickerson)...overall, it was the fourth time in club history the Rays went back-to-back: Sep 21, 2016 vs. NYY (2 outs, 3rd inning), June 24, 2013 vs. TOR (1 out, 2nd inn.) and June 9, 2008 at LAA (0 out, 2nd inn.).

- + The Rays became the second team to hit back-to-back-to-back homers this season, following the Royals on May 8 at BAL
- All 4 HR came with two outs, the fourth time in club history the Rays hit four 2-out homers in the same game: April 24, 2016 at NYY, June 11, 2013 vs. BOS and Sep 18, 2008 vs. MIN...in fact, all 5 runs scored by the Rays in this series have come with two outs.
- + Prior to last night, the Rays hadn't even gone back-to-back since Evan Longoria and Logan Morrison last Aug 1 at HOU, their last of a club-record and major-league-most 12 occurrences last season.
- The Rays are 13-0 when hitting at least 2 HR, the only unbeaten team in the majors when doing so...however, their 13 games with multiple homers are the 6th-fewest in the majors this season.

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have yielded 3 runs or fewer in eight consecutive games, their longest streak since July 24-Aug 4, 2016 (10)... the unearned run allowed in the 3rd inning last night snapped the club's

scoreless streak at 23 IP, and the 2 runs allowed in the 9th snapped a club-record streak of 29 IP without an earned run...previous record was 27 IP from Sep 12-15, 2013...those runs also snapped the bullpen's scoreless streak at 20 IP...since May 19-the date of Sergio Romo's first career start-the Rays have pitched to a 2.13 ERA (93-IP, 22-ER) in 10 games and the bullpen has pitched to a 2.04 ERA (61.2-IP, 14-ER).

ROAD RAYGE-The Rays have played 29 games on the road, tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind the Orioles (30)...they are 16-13 on the road but 16-8 (.667) following an 0-5 start to the season...since April 9, the 16-8 record is 3rd-best in the majors behind the Nationals (15-6) and Angels (15-7)...this is the last of four straight

3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in club history the Rays have ever made four consecutive three-city trips...on this trip, the Rays visit Oakland, Seattle and Washington, D.C., the first time they visit the West Coast on back-to-back trips since July-August 2012 (BAL-LAA-OAK and MIN-SEA-LAA), and they went 9-4 in those West Coast series.

+ Tonight is the ninth game of a stretch of games on 13 straight days, and continues a stretch of 40 games in 41 days (May 11-June 20).

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—With a win tonight or tomorrow, the Rays would win a third consecutive series over the A's for the first time since Aug 23, 2007-Aug 14, 2008 (four straight)...the Rays are 7-2 over the last two seasons against the A's after going 2-5 in 2016...all-time, the Rays are 70-103 (.405) against the A's (41-46 at home, 29-57 on the road), tied for their 2nd-worst record against any AL opponent...their .337 winning pct. at the Oakland Coliseum is the worst of any AL team...however, they are 4-1 over their last 5 games here, scoring 3, 4, 1 and 4 runs in those wins, compared to 4-9 in their previous 13 games at the Oakland Coliseum.

THIS & THAT-Last night the Rays made a season-high 3 errors, their most since Sep 23, 2017 at BAL (3 errors, 9-6 win)...the Rays improved to 28-87 (.243) all-time when committing 3 errors or more.

- Despite allowing 2 runs in the 9th, Sergio Romo recorded his first save since Oct 1, 2016 vs. LAD (with SF), and in doing so joined ATL Luiz Gohara as the only pitchers in the majors this year with at least 1 start and 1 save...the Rays had an AL-most three players do this last year (Matt Andriese, Austin Pruitt, Erasmo Ramirez)...the games this series have been saved by Jonny Venters and Romo, who went 2,470 and 604 days in between saves, respectively.
- The Rays have played consecutive 1-run games after a stretch of 11 games decided by 2 runs or more...the Rays have won back-to-back games, both by 1 run, for the third time this season...for the record, they haven't played three straight 1-run games, all victories, since Aug 20-22, 2015 at HOU/OAK...the Rays have played 21 one-run games this season, 3rd-most in the majors, and they are 9-7 after an 0-5 start...while they haven't lost a 1-run game since May 8 vs. ATL, they rank 2nd in the majors with 12 one-run losses

JOHNNY WHOLESTAFF—The Rays have used a major-league-most 10 different starting pitchers this season, already their most for an entire season since 2014 (11)...with Nathan Eovaldi's season debut tonight, the Rays will use 11 starters through the first 54 games for the first time in club history (10 in 2000, 2003)...22 different pitchers have already appeared in a game for the Rays, tied with the Angels for most in the AL and one shy of the major league lead (23, Braves)...this includes position players Johnny Field and Daniel Robertson but not Eovaldi or Wilmer Font, who on the active roster but have not yet appeared in a game.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY-INF Christian Arroyo turned 23 today...for the record, the only Ray turning 23 or younger to homer on his birthday was Carl Crawford on Aug 5, 2004 vs. SEA, on his 23rd birthday.

REMEMBER WHEN—Tonight will be Nathan's first major league game since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), going 657 days in between...he exited that game due to right elbow discomfort after a clean 1st inning...among his Yankees teammates who played in that game were since-retired **Mark Teixeira**, **Alex Rodríguez** and current teammate **Rob Refsnyder**...the Rays have played 261 games since then...Nathan's most recent win came on July 24, 2016 vs. SF, a 5-2 win at Yankee Stadium.

SNYDER SAYS—Pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** said this about Eovaldi's return: "It's going to be a huge accomplishment for him, but it's going to be something felt throughout the clubhouse. He's probably one of the hardest workers I've ever seen from me being a player and a coach at this point."

THE COMEBACK—Eovaldi will become the 35th player to pitch in the majors after two Tommy John surgeries, and only the 12th pitcher to start a major league game after doing so (see chart)...of those previous 11 players to start a game, only six made more than 4 starts and only two made more than 20 starts...he is the fourth to pitch for the Rays after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following Lance Carter (two), Al Reyes (two) and Jonny Venters (three), and first to start a game for them...he is the fourth pitcher to return to the majors this season after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following Venters, WAS Tim Collins and CWS Jace Fry...Eovaldi underwent Tommy John surgeries on Aug 19, 2016 (Dr. Christopher Ahmad at New York-Presbyterian Hospital) and as a high school junior, May 27, 2007 (Dr. David Lintner).

+ Nathan signed with the Rays as a free agent in February 2017 due in part to the club's reputation in handling pitchers recovering from Tommy John surgery...he achieved his goal of being physically ready to return by the end of 20

gery...he achieved his goal of being physically ready to return by the end of 2017, pitching on rehab assignment in both the Southern League and International League Finals last September...the Rays exercised his 2018 club option.

THE SETBACK—Nathan was reinstated today from the 60-day DL (arthroscopic surgery, right elbow)...originally was tabbed by Manager Kevin Cash

THE SETBACK—Nathan was reinstated today from the 60-day DL (arthroscopic surgery, right elbow)...originally was tabbed by Manager **Kevin Cash** on March 15 to start the fourth game of this season, but was placed on the disabled list the day before Opening Day...on March 30, he underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove loose bodies in his right elbow, performed by **Dr. Koco Eaton** in St. Petersburg.

+ Totaled four rehab starts between Class-A Charlotte and Triple-A Durham...yielded 8 R/ER in 4 IP in his last start, May 23 at Gwinnett.

vs. OAKLAND—Is 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA (29-IP, 16-ER) in 5 starts against the Athletics, and 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2-IP, 6-ER) in 2 starts on the road...has yielded 3 runs or fewer in four of his 5 starts, including both at the Oakland Coliseum.

NASTY FACTOR—In 2016, averaged 97.1 mph on his fastball according to FanGraphs, the 2nd-hardest in the majors (min. 100 IP) behind NYM Noah Syndergaard (98.0)...PITCHf/x clocked him with 36 pitches of at least 100 mph that year, topping out at 101.4 mph...in 2015, he was clocked as high as 102.4 mph, a mark reached by only CIN Aroldis Chapman that season...he joins a pitching staff that has two others who have already reached triple digits this season in José Alvarado and Ryne Stanek.

HOMETOWN HERO—Grew up in Alvin, Texas, and the city's claim to fame is Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan**, whose name and likeness are ubiquitous... although the two attended the same high school, he had never met Ryan until 2016, when the Yankees visited the Astros...Ryan once sent him a signed baseball during spring training congratulating him on his achievements.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH RYNE STANEK (1-0, 3.24)

A_NEW_LOOK—Will be making the second start of his major league career, following Sat vs. BAL...he started 41 games in the minors, most recently on June 4, 2016 at Jacksonville (Marlins), with Double-A Montgomery...in that game, he totaled 6 IP, 5 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 100 pitches—just the second game of his career with double-digit strikeouts.

+ His season high (majors or minors) is 1.2 IP (last Mon at OAK) and 40 pitches (May 8 vs. ATL)...his career highs in the majors are 2 IP (2x-last Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL) and 47 pitches (Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL).

LAST APP—On Mon at OAK, recorded the first win of his career (29th app)...pitched around a 2-out double and intentional walk in the 12th inning, and was replaced by **Jonny Venters** with 1-on, 2-out in the 13th.

- + Has made 2 apps in his career against the A's, going 1-0 with a 7.36 ERA (3.2-IP, 3-ER)...also June 10, 2017 (G2) at home (2-IP, 3-ER).
- + His last 4 apps (1 start) spanning 4.2 IP have been scoreless after allowing a 2-run homer to **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA.

GIVE HIM THE HEATER, RICKY—Has averaged 98.3 mph on his fastball this season, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on Sat vs. BAL...only one other pitcher has reached 100.5 mph in a start this season: LAA **Shohei Ohtani** was clocked between 100.6–101.0 four times on April 24 at HOU...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball and made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more—the most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** did it 23 times in 2013.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- Yesterday at OAK, snapped a season-long 10-game drought without a homer, the front end of back-to-back homers in the 3rd inning. Batting .178/.275/.289 (8-for-45) with 2 2B, 1 HR and 4 RBI in his last 11 games (all starts) since May 18 to lower his avg. from .293 to .268.
- Has 16 multi-hit games, tied with Matt Duffy for the team lead...his 16 multi-hit games are one shy of last season's total in 100 games.
- His 12 HR are tied for 9th in the AL, are five more than any other Ray and four shy of tying a career high...last season, didn't reach 12 HR until Aug 29 vs. OAK in the Angels 133rd game...is on pace for 36 HR, which would shatter his previous career high (16 in 2015, 2016 and 2017).
- Has appeared in 52 games and made 51 starts (29-DH, 22-1B)...his 29 starts at designated hitter are his most since 2015 with the Angels (46).

(40-for-110) vs. RHP leads the majors, ahead of CLE Michael Brantley (.362), but is batting .196 (9-for-46) vs. LHP.
- Both of his homers and 11 of his 15 RBI have come on the road, but is hitting for a higher avg. at home (.328) than on the road (.304).
- + Has appeared in 39 games, all starts (38-3B, 1-DH)...has made 6 errors in 106 chances for a .943 fielding pct., 4th-lowest in the majors at third base.

- Is 1-for-his-last-21...on Mon at OAK, his 13th-inning single snapped an 0-for-17 skid, and he came around to score the only run of the game. Batting .130 (3-for-23) with RISP, but is 1-for-his-last-16 after a 2-for-7 start...batting .306 (11-for-36) vs. LHP, compared to .216 (11-for-51) vs. RHP.
- On May 23 vs. BOS, credited with the second outfield assist of his career (also May 1 at DET), throwing out Eduardo Núñez 8-6-2 in the 5th inning.
