RAY MATTER—The Rays have won five consecutive games and six of their last 7 games to improve to 28-26 on the season, the first time they've been 2 games over .500 since the end of play on Aug 10, 2017 (59-57)... they have achieved this despite 1-8, 3-12 and 4-13 starts to the season... this is the third time this season the Rays have gone on at least a 5-game winning streak, following an 8-game streak from April 18-28 and 6-game streak from May 14-19...the Rays and Astros are the only teams in the majors this season with three separate winning streaks of at least 5 games... in comparison, the Rays had one 5-game winning streak over the previous three seasons and it came in **Kevin Cash's** first month on the job.

- + The Rays are 12-4 (.750) in their last 16 games, best record in the AL and tied with the Brewers for the best record in the majors since May 14...they are 24-13 (.649) in their last 37 games, 3rd in the majors behind the Yankees (27-9) and Brewers (27-12) since April 18.
- + The Rays are 4.5 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card position, with a 3-game series at Safeco Field this weekend...only the Mariners and Angels are ahead of the Rays for the second Wild Card...as recently as May 13, six teams were ahead of them.

SEEKING SWEEP—With last night's win, the Rays improved to 9-4 in their last 13 series, compared to 1-4 in their first five...this is the second consecutive road series the Rays will have an opportunity to complete a 4-game sweep...they lost the series finale, 5-2, on May 20 at LAA...today they are attempting to finish their fourth sweep this season (April 20-22 vs. MIN, April 25-26 at BAL, May 14-16 at KC)...their three sweeps already match their total from last year...if the Rays complete the sweep:

- + It would be their first 4-game sweep since Sep 20-23, 2013 vs. BAL and first 4-game sweep on the road since Aug 16-19, 2012 at LAA.
- + It would be the fifth time in club history they record four sweeps before the end of May (five in 2013, four in 2012, six in 2010, four in 2008) and the third time in club history they record three sweeps on the road before the end of May (three in 2011, four in 2010).
- + Four other times previously the Rays have had a chance to sweep and failed to do so: April 11 at CWS (2-1 loss), April 29 at BOS (4-3 loss), May 6 vs. TOR (2-1 loss) and May 20 at LAA (5-2 loss).

THROWING BLANKS—The Rays have twice shut out the Athletics this series, after coming in to it on a stretch of 51 games without one, their longest streak since July 11-Sep 16, 2009 (59)...this is the first time the Rays have had multiple shutouts in the same series since Sep 29-Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL (2) and first time on the road since Sep 24-26, 2013 at NYY (2)...never in club history have they recorded three shutouts in the same series.

- + Last night, the Rays carried a no-hitter through 6.1 IP, and their only hit allowed was a **Jed Lowrie** 1-out single in the 7th inning...it was the 12th shutout in club history yielding 1 hit or fewer (fifth on the road), first since April 19, 2016 at BOS.

PITCHING PROPERLY—Rays pitchers have pitched to a 0.58 ERA (31-IP, 13-H, 3-R/2-ER) so far this series...the club record for fewest runs and earned runs allowed in a 4-game series came from June 4-7, 2015 at SEA (4-R/3-ER), while the fewest hits the Rays have ever allowed in a 4-game series is 18 (twice: June 19-22, 2014 vs. HOU and July 1-4, 2013 at HOU).

- + The Rays have only allowed 3 R/2 ER over their last 40 IP, since the 2nd inning on Sun vs. BAL, including a club-record streak of 29 IP without an earned run (snapped Tues at OAK)...they have allowed 4 ER/3 R over their last 52 IP, since the 7th inning on Fri vs. BAL.
- + Since May 19—the date of **Sergio Romo's** first career start—the Rays have pitched to a 1.94 ERA (102-IP, 22-ER) in 11 games...Rays starters have a 1.93 ERA (37.1-IP, 8-ER) over this stretch, while the bullpen has pitched to a 1.95 ERA (64.2-IP, 14-ER)...the Rays currently rank 3rd in the AL with a 3.25 ERA (244-IP, 27-ER) in May.

JOHNNY WHOLESTAFF—The Rays have used a major-league-most 11 different starting pitchers this season—no other team has used more than nine...the Rays used only eight starters all of last season, and have used 11 different starters in a season only once previously in the Rays era (2008-current): 11 in 2014...24 different pitchers have already appeared in a game for the Rays, most in the majors ahead of the Braves (23).

- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 228 IP, 6.1 IP more than any other team (Reds, 221.2 IP) while Rays starters have covered 256.1 IP, fewest in the majors by 20.1 IP (White Sox, 276.2 IP).

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—Today the Rays have a chance to sweep the A's for the fifth time in franchise history and first time on the road...their last sweep was April 19-21, 2013 (3-0), while the only 4-game sweep was July 24-27, 1998...with last night's win, the Rays have won three consecutive series over the A's for the first time since Aug 23, 2007–Aug 14, 2008 (four straight)...the Rays are 8-2 over the last two seasons against the A's after going 2-5 in 2016...all-time, the Rays are 71-103 (.408) against the A's (41-46 at home, 30-57 on the road), their 3rd-worst record against any AL opponent...their .345 winning pct. at the Oakland Coliseum is the worst of any AL team...however, they are 5-1 over their last 6 games here, compared to 4-9 in their previous 13 games at the Oakland Coliseum.

ROADRAYGE—The Rays have played 30 games on the road, tied with the Astros and Orioles for most in the AL...they are 17-13 on the road but 17-8 (.680) following an 0-5 start to the season...since April 9, the 17-8 record is best in the AL and 2nd in the majors to the Nationals (16-6)...this is the last of four straight 3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in club history the Rays have ever made four consecutive three-city trips.

- + This is the Rays second consecutive West Coast trip (BAL-KC-LAA, then OAK-SEA-WAS), and they have gone 6-1 in the West Coast games thus far...it is the first time they have visited the West Coast on back-to-back trips since July–August 2012 (BAL-LAA-OAK and MIN-SEA-LAA), when they went 9-4 in those West Coast games.
- + Today is the 10th game of a stretch of games on 13 straight days, and continues a stretch of 40 games in 41 days (May 11–June 20).

UP NEXT: SEATTLE—Tomorrow's game will be the first of seven in 10 days against the Mariners (June 1-3 at Safeco Field, June 7-10 at Tropicana Field)...the Rays were swept in a 3-game series in Seattle last June 2-4, and were outscored, 28-7, and out-hit, 38-19, in that series...they lost the season series, 5-1, and were outscored, 42-17...all-time, the Rays are 74-93 (.443) against the Mariners (36-44 at home, 38-49 on the road)...they have lost the last four season series, going 9-17 (.346) since 2014.

- + Since **Jerry Dipoto** was named Seattle's General Manager in late-September, 2015, the Rays and Mariners have made nine trades, most recently last Friday when the Rays sent RH **Alex Colomé** and OF **Denard Span** to Seattle...five of the 25 players on the Rays active roster were once in the Mariners organization.

WELCOME BACK—Last night, **Nathan Eovaldi** appeared in his first major league game since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), going 6.57 days in between...he did not allow a hit in 6 IP, matching the longest no-hit bid of his career (April 25, 2016 at TEX)...only one other time has a Rays pitcher finished an outing having gone at least 6 IP without allowing a hit: **Matt Garza's** no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET (9 IP)...it was the sixth time in the majors this season that a pitcher was removed with a no-hitter in tact through at least 6 IP (last NYY **Domingo German** on May 6 vs. CLE).

ODDS & ENDS—The Rays have hit 6 HR over the last 2 games, more than their total from the previous 9 games (5)...the Rays are 14-0 when hitting at least 2 HR, the only unbeaten team in the majors when doing so.

- + The Rays have played 21 one-run games this season, 3rd-most in the majors, and they are 9-7 after an 0-5 start...they haven't lost a 1-run game since May 8 vs. ATL (4-0 in 1-run games since).

MUSICAL CHAIRS—On the West Coast portion of this road trip, **Doug Waechter** will fill in for **Brian Anderson** as color commentator, and FOX Sports Sun will feature a three-man booth today and Sunday, as **Dewayne Staats** and Waechter are joined by **Neil Solondz** and **Dave Wills**, respectively...Solondz will be in the radio booth with **Andy Freed** on Sunday.

A NEW LOOK—Will be making the second start of his major league career, following Sat vs. BAL...he started 41 games in the minors, most recently on June 4, 2016 at Jacksonville (Marlins), with Double-A Montgomery...in that game, he totaled 6 IP, 5 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 100 pitches—just the second game of his career with double-digit strikeouts...in his first start, Sat vs. BAL, retired all 5 BF, including strikeouts of **Adam Jones** (1st inning), **Manny Machado** (1st) and **Jonathan Schoop** (2nd).

- + His season high (majors or minors) is 1.2 IP (last Mon at OAK) and 40 pitches (May 8 vs. ATL)...his career highs in the majors are 2 IP (2x-last Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL) and 47 pitches (Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL).

LAST APP—On Mon at OAK, went 1.2 IP, tying a season high, and recorded the first win of his career (29th app)...pitched around a 2-out double and intentional walk in the 12th inning, and was replaced by **Jonny Venters** with 1-on, 2-out in the 13th.

- + Has made 2 apps in his career against the Athletics, going 1-0 with a 7.36 ERA (3.2-IP, 3-ER)...the other app was June 10, 2017 (G2) at home (2-IP, 3-ER).
- + His last 4 apps (1 start) spanning 4.2 IP have been scoreless after allowing a 2-run homer to **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA.

STAR POWER—Stanek has yielded 2 HR this season, a grand slam to **Manny Machado** on May 11 at BAL and a 2-run shot to **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA...has yielded 8 HR in 29 apps (1 start) spanning 28.1 IP in his career, but 5 HR came over a stretch of 5 apps and 6 IP, over multiple stints in the majors from June 8–Sep 2, 2017.

MAKING THE LEAP—Recalled on May 19 for his second stint this season (also May 5-12)...opened the season with Triple-A Durham and compiled a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) and 17 SO in 10 apps for the Bulls...over the last two minor league seasons, has recorded a 1.33 ERA (54.1-IP, 8-ER) with 77 SO and 22 BB, good for a 12.75 SO/9 IP ratio and a .210 opp avg. ...in the majors during this time, he has a 5.08 ERA (28.1-IP, 16-ER) with 40 SO, 17 BB and a .277 opp avg. (31-for-112).

MIX & MATCH—Stanek is one of 11 starting pitchers already used by the Rays this season, most in the majors—no other team has used more than nine...the Rays used only eight starters all of last season, and have used 11 different starters in a season only once previously in the Rays era (2008–current): 11 in 2014.

GIVE HIM THE HEATER, RICKY—Has averaged 98.3 mph on his fastball this season, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on Sat vs. BAL...only one other pitcher has reached 100.5 mph in a start this season: LAA **Shohei Ohtani** was clocked between 100.6–101.0 four times on April 24 at HOU...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** (23) in 2013...on Sep 2 at CWS, he allowed a solo homer to **Avisail Garcia** on a 100.7 mph pitch, according to StatCast—the fastest pitch thrown by a Ray since data is available (2008) that was hit over the fence...ranked by *Baseball America* as having the Best Fastball in the organization each of the past two seasons.

ELITE COMPANY—Was named after Hall of Fame 2B **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became just the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

WOO PIG SOOIE—As a junior at the University of Arkansas, he was 10-2 with a 1.39 ERA (98.1-IP, 15-ER) in 16 starts...over his collegiate career, went 22-8 with a 2.55 ERA in 48 apps (45 starts).

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
