WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the Athletics, 7-4, on Monday night to open this 6-game, 6-day homestand vs. Oakland (1-0) and Houston (4 G)...club finished with a 3-4 record on the 7-G road trip to Seattle (2-2) and Anaheim (1-2) prior to this homestand...club has lost 3 of 5 and 5 of last 9, but is still 5-5 in last 10 G, winning 8 of last 14 contests...team's 8-6 (.571) record since 5/22 ties LAA for 2nd-best in A.L. West in that span (SEA is 11-3)...have gone 10-13 since 5/12.

- At 26-37 (.413), the Rangers have the 4th-lowest winning percentage in the A.L. and 6th-lowest in MLB (ahead of BAL, CWS, MIA, CIN, KC)...the 26 wins are the team's fewest through 63 games since 2007 (23-40/23-41), T7th fewest ever, and T2nd-fewest through 63 games in last 17 seasons (beginning 2003).

- Texas has been under the .500 mark since a season best 1-1 on 3/30...club was season-high 13-under .500 mark on 5/21 (18-31)...longest win streak of 2018 is 3 games, 4/25-28...team had a season-long 5-G losing streak, 4/8-13.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers have been 13.5 GB of division-leading SEA for 3 straight days, matching largest deficit in 2018 (7 days total)...have gained ground in the division on 3 of last 8 and 4 of last 11 days, and have been between 11.5 and 13.5 GB for 16 straight days...current deficit of 13.5 GB is 5th largest in the majors (BAL: -23.0 GB; CIN: -16.0 GB; TOR -15.5 GB; MIA -14.5 GB)...club has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 58 days and in either 4th or 5th place for 68 of the 69 days this season (T2nd following win on 3/30).

SERIES STUFF: Texas is seeking a series sweep of this abbreviated 2-game set with a win tonight...club has not swept a series of 2 G vs. OAK since 9/23-24/97 at the Coliseum...at home, team has gone 2-6-1 in 9 series this season, including 2-0-1 in last 3 after dropping each of 1st 6...Rangers are 0-4-2 in last 6 series vs. A.L. West clubs since taking 2 of 3 from 4/13-15 at HOU.

AT HOME: The Rangers have gone 12-19 (.387) in Arlington this season, 4th-lowest win pct. in A.L. and 6th-lowest in MLB...team has won 5 of 7, 6 of 9, and 7 of last 11 at home, but have dropped 18 of last 29 at home...have gone 7-4 in last 11 G in Arlington after opening year at 5-15...the 12-19 mark matches 2nd-slowest 31-G start at home in club history (11-20 in 2001/12-19 in 1982 and 1990)...slowest 32-G start in team history is 12-20 in 2001.

- Over 15 home games since the start of May, the Rangers are averaging 1.87 HR/G (4th in MLB) and 5.40 R/G (T3rd in MLB), this after ranking in the bottom 6 in those categories at home through the end of April (0.69 HR/G; 3.56 R/G).

THE SWINGIN' A'S: The Rangers are 4-4 vs. the Athletics in 2018...Texas has lost 5 of 9, 12 of 18, 14 of 23, and 18 of last 32 vs. A's...Rangers have gone 22-20 vs. OAK beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Rangers went 7-3 vs. the A's at home last season, and have won 13 of last 20 meetings in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 365-356, and holds leads of 193-168 in Arlington and 105-101 at Globe Life Park...teams are playing 3 straight series in Arlington, the next from 7/23-26 (4 G).

ANOTHER CHANCE AT HISTORY: Bartolo Colon will be making a 4th attempt at a historic win in tonight's start as his 242 career wins rank 2nd all-time for a native of the Dominican Republic, one shy of matching Hall of Famer Juan Marichal (243)...the only Latin American native with more career victories is Nicaragua's Dennis Martinez (245)...Colon also enters tonight just 2 SO shy of reaching 2500 in his career...he currently ranks 34th all-time w/ 2498 SO, 4 behind Christy Mathewson (2502 SO according to MLB official statistician Elias Sports Bureau).

THE COMEBACKS: Each of the Rangers' last 7 wins have been come-from-behind victories over team's past 13 G beginning 5/23...it is longest span for each win to be a comeback W since 9 straight, 6/9-26/13...the Rangers had just 4 comeback victories in 1st 19 wins/50 games of the 2018 season...Texas has gone 10-3 in games decided in the 7th-or-later since 5/1, this after opening the season with a 2-7 record in those contests.

POWER SURGE: The Rangers belted a season-high 5 home runs last night, the club's most in a game since also hitting 5 long balls on 5/2/17 at HOU...the team had not gone deep 5 times in a home game since 8/31/16 vs. SEA (5)...entering play last night, Texas had totaled 9 home runs in their previous 6 games.

A LITTLE SMALL BALL TOO: Outside of the 5 home runs hit by the Rangers last night, none of the club's other 3 hits left the infield...Delino DeShields and Rougned Odor each reached via bunt hits to raise the clubs season total 10, T2nd-most in the majors this season (CIN-12; SF-10)...DeShields (T1st, 4) and Odor (T5th, 3) both rank among the A.L.'s bunt hit leaders this season.

ADRIÁN BELTRÉ provided the decisive long ball last night with a go-ahead, solo shot in the 8th...it was Beltré's 4th go-ahead HR in the 8th or later as a Ranger, tied with Rougned Odor for most among current Rangers...it was also the 23rd such home run of his career, 2nd-most among active players (Pujols-30)...since his ML debut in 1998, the only players with more are Pujols, David Ortiz (30), and Adam Dunn (29)...he has hit 4 of those home runs vs. Oakland, tied with Cleveland for most vs. any single opponent.

- The home run was Beltré's 1122nd career extra-base hit, tying Manny Ramirez for 16th place all-time...it also gave him 5170 total bases, passing Cal Ripken Jr. (5168) for 17th place on the all-time list.

BULLISH ON THE PEN: Texas relievers have earned the last 5 and 6 of the last 7 Rangers wins...5 straight wins by relievers match the club's longest streak since the start of 2017 (5 in a row, 5/10-14/17)...the last longer streak by the Texas pen was 7 in a row, 9/9-20/16...the Rangers are only MLB team with as many relief wins as rotation wins (13 each), and club's 10 relief wins since the start of May lead the majors.

- Jose Leclerc stranded a pair of inherited runners last night and has allowed just 1 of 22 (4.8%) IR to score the season, 2nd-best rate in the majors (SD's Brad Hand: 0-of-15).

- Keone Kela has started the season 14-for-14 in save chances this season, the 3rd-longest season-opening save streak in team history (19: Francisco Cordero, 4/7-6/10/04; 16: Joe Nathan, 4/5-5/25/13).

ALL ABOARD: Shin-Soo Choo has a 21-game on-base streak, the longest active streak in the majors and T6th-longest in the A.L. this season (DET's Jeimer Candelario had a league-best 28 G streak, 4/21-6/3)...since the start of his on-base streak on 5/13, Choo has batted .321/.459/.564/1.023 (25-78) and ranks among the ML leaders over that span in walks (1st, 20), OBP (2nd), and OPS (12th)...Choo also owns a 12-game hit streak, which is tied with COL's Charlie Blackmon for the longest active streak in the majors...it is the longest hit streak by a Texas batter since Robinson Chirinos hit safely in 14 straight, 8/14-9/1/17.

SHORTS: Texas pitchers have issued 3-or-fewer walks in 16 straight games, longest streak in the majors this season and longest by a Texas staff since an 18-game streak, 6/18-7/7/11...Texas starters have a quality starts in a season-high 4 straight...Chris Martin recorded his 1st ML win last night in career appearance no. 62...last night was 1st time for Texas batters to have 5+ walks and 5-or-fewer strikeouts in the same games since 9/30/17 vs. OAK.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#40 Bartolo Colon, RHP
(2-3, 4.21)

TONIGHT: The 45-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and 11th start of the season tonight in the finale of this brief 2-game set with the Athletics...will be making a 4th attempt at a historic win...Colon has 242 career wins, one shy of matching HoFer Juan Marichal (243) for most wins in MLB history by a native of the Dominican Republic...only Latin American native with more career victories than Marichal: Nicaragua's Dennis Martinez (245)...is 2 strikeouts shy of reaching 2500 for his career...will be working on regular 4-days' rest despite Monday's off day as he last started and took the loss in a 6-0 Texas setback on Friday in Anaheim...has gone 2-3 with a 5.29 ERA (28 ER/47.2 IP) over his last 8 starts to rise from 1.45 to season-high 4.21...ranked among A.L. leaders in BB/9 rate (3rd, 1.09), pitches per inning (2nd, 14.7), SO/BB rate (5th, 5.05), WHIP (10th, 1.03), and ground ball pct. (12th, 47.2)...was selected Rangers March/April Player of the Month by broadcasters and writers that cover the team on a regular basis...has won games with 11 different teams, tied for most all-time (also LaTroy Hawkins, Mike Morgan, Ron Villone)...was originally signed by Texas to a minor league contract on 2/4, going 0-1, 3.00 ERA (6 ER/18.0 IP) in 5 G/GS for the Rangers this spring w/ 2 BB/10 SO before he was released on 3/23...was re-signed to minors contract on 3/26...joins teammate Adrián Beltré (21 seasons) as only active MLB players to have appeared in 20+ seasons...Colon (age 45.008 today) is oldest MLB player since Omar Vizquel's final game on 10/3/12 (age 45.162), and 2nd-oldest in Rangers history (Nolan Ryan, 46.234 for final start 9/22/93 at SEA)...Rangers are 5-5 in his 10 starts.

ONE FROM THE DOMINICAN DANDY: His 242 wins rank 2nd all-time for a native of the Dominican Republic, one shy of matching Hall of Famer Juan Marichal (243)...the only Latin American native with more career victories is Nicaragua's Dennis Martinez (245)...leads all actives with 242 wins and 3378.2 IP, and his 2494 strikeouts are 3rd among actives (2884-Sabathia, 2514-Verlander).

NEARING MILESTONE STRIKEOUT: Enters tonight just 2 SO shy of reaching 2500 in career...currently ranks 34th all-time w/ 2498 SO, 4 behind Christy Mathewson (2502 SO according to MLB official statistician Elias Sports Bureau)...has had more than 4 SO once in '18, season-high 7 K's on 4/15 at HOU.

LAST START: Started and took the loss in a 6-0 Texas setback on Friday in Anaheim (3.0 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 68 pitches/43 strikes)...matched season highs in hits and runs allowed...failed to complete 5.0 innings for the 1st time in 10 starts...allowed 2 runs in each of the 1st 3 frames...surrendered 2-run homers to Ian Kinsler in the 2nd and Albert Pujols in the 3rd.

VS. OAKLAND: Former Athletic has gone 9-6 with a 3.33 ERA (51 ER/138.0 IP) in 22 games/21 starts vs. Oakland in his career...took a no decision in his Texas debut, a 3-1 loss on 4/2 at the Coliseum (6.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 89 pitches/62 strikes)...bullpen allowed 2 late runs as Colon took a no-decision...became 1st pitcher to open their Rangers career with a start of 6.0+ innings while allowing one-or-zero runs since Jerome Williams on 7/25/14 vs. OAK...in 3 GS vs. the A's since his final season w/OAK in 2013: 1-0, 2.21 ERA (5 ER/20.1 IP), 3 BB, 13 SO.

GLOBE LIFE PARK: Is winless in 7 G/5 GS at Globe Life Park this season, going 0-2 with a 5.14 ERA (20 ER/35.0 IP)...has surrendered 10 HR over 30.0 IP in the 5 starts...opponents have a .809 OPS in Arlington compared to .650 on the road...has not recorded a win at this facility since a 1-0 Oakland win on 9/14/13...is 9-5 with a 4.28 ERA (65 ER/136.2 IP) over 22 G/20 GS in his career at Globe Life Park.

2018: Opponents are batting .238/.263/.472/.735 this season...after the 1st out of an inning, opponents have a .153 (23-150) BA...opposition is 10-for-47 (.213) with RISP...opponent avg. by PA in game (as a starter): 1st PA - .202 (18-89); 2nd PA - .259 (22-85); 3rd PA - .279 (17-61)...Robinson Chirinos has caught 9 G/6 GS (4.06 ERA, 20 ER/44.1 IP), while Carlos Pérez has 4 G/GS (4.50, 11 ER/22.0 IP)...Pérez started on 5/16 in SEA, but Chirinos caught his BF in the 8th...matched career high w/ 4 HR allowed on 5/4 vs. BOS, 2nd time in Rangers history for pitcher to post qualifying start, allowing 4+ R all on solo HR (also Fergie Jenkins, 7/1/75 vs. KC)...took ND in Rangers' 5-4 10-inning walk-off win on 5/9 vs. DET...matched season high w/ 4 HR allowed, 5/21 vs. NYY.

A BIRD OF MANY COLORS: Colon has earned a victory with each of the 11 clubs for which he has pitched in his career, tying a trio of other pitchers for the ML record of winning games with the most different teams (also LaTroy Hawkins, Mike Morgan, and Ron Villone (11 each).

ALMOST PERFECT: Flirted with a perfect game on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball on 4/15 at HOU, retiring the 1st 21 Astros he faced before issuing a leadoff walk to Carlos Correa in the 8th inning...Josh Reddick followed w/ double to break up the no-hit bid...threw a first pitch strike to 20-of-25 batters faced...became the oldest pitcher in ML history to ever work at least 7.2 IP and allow one or fewer hits (previous TEX's Nolan Ryan at 44.090 for 7th no-hitter on 5/1/91 vs. TOR).

IN RELIEF: Has made 2 relief appearances, allowing 1 R-ER in 5.0 IP...opponents batting .188 (3-16) in relief w/ 0 BB/6 SO...whiffed 4 of 7 BF in 1st relief outing on 4/8 vs. TOR.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — LHP COLE HAMELS (3-5, 3.63 ERA in 12 games/starts)

The 34-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season in Thursday night's series opener against the Astros...leads all Texas starters in ERA (3.63), starts (12), innings (72.0), and strikeouts (74)...has gone 2-2 with a 2.89 ERA (14 ER/43.2 IP) in last 7 starts to lower ERA from 4.76 to 3.62, with opponents batting .199/.306/.385/.692 during that span...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after taking no decision in the Rangers' 3-2 win in 10 innings on Saturday at LAA (7.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 8 SO, 2 HR, 99 pitches/65 strikes)...exited in the 8th trailing 2-1 with 2 on and no outs before José Leclerc retired the next 3 to end the threat...Adrián Beltré's sac fly tied the game 2-2 in the 9th and Ronald Guzmán gave Texas a 3-2 lead with an RBI single in the 10th...marked the 1st time for Hamels to pitch into the 8th inning this season, and he joins Bartolo Colon (2x) as the only Texas starters to do so this season...recorded 2300th career strikeout by whiffing Michael Hermosillo in the 5th, joining Sabathia, Verlander, Colon, Hernández, and Greinke as active pitchers to reach the mark...has gone 8-5 with a 3.95 ERA (53 ER/120.2 IP) in 19 career starts vs. HOU, including 1-1, 2.55 (5 ER/17.2 IP) in 3 starts this season...outdueled Justin Verlander in most recent outing on 5/11 at HOU (6.0 SHO IP, 1 H, 3 BB, 5 SO), a 1-0 Rangers win...took ND despite quality start in 3-2 Texas loss on 4/13 at HOU (6.0 IP, 2 R-ER), a matchup against Gerrit Cole (7.0 IP, 2 R-ER, 14 SO)...saddled with the loss in Opening Day start in Arlington on 3/29 vs. HOU (5.2 IP, 3 R-ER)...is 1-4, 4.66 (19 ER/36.2 IP) in 6 starts in Arlington this season, home ERA more than 2 runs higher than road figure (2.55)...has allowed 10 of 15 home runs at home...has allowed 2 ER or less in 6 of last 7 starts, including streak of 5 straight from 4/24-5/22, longest by a Ranger in 2018...Hamels has been supported with one-or-zero runs in 8 of his 12 starts, as his 2.88 RSA ranks 2nd-lowest in the A.L. (BAL's Andrew Cashner-2.58)...suffered 5th loss of the year on 5/27 vs. KC, this after 10 total losses in his 1st 2+ seasons with the club from 7/31/15 through 2017...Hamels' 2.23 ERA (12 ER/48.1 IP) in night games ranks 6th in the A.L.... is averaging 9.25 SO/9 through 12 starts, nearly 3 K's higher than his 2017 figure (6.39)...opponents have swung and missed on 27.7% of pitches, an increase of more than 6 pct. points from 2017 (21.6%), 14th-highest rate in A.L....earned the wins in each of the Rangers' division-clinching games in 2015 and 2016...made 4th career Opening Day start this season, 2nd with Texas, as he became the 10th different pitcher to start multiple openers for Texas...Rangers are 4-8 in his starts, all games decided by 3 runs or less.
