Oakland clinched the season series against Kansas City with last night's victory...the A's have won four of the first five meetings this season...the Royals trail in all-time work by a 264-321 deficit, including a 117-174 record at the Coliseum.

EARLY HOME RUNS EXTEND SLIDE--Kansas City surrendered three solo home runs in the first four frames and dropped its sixth straight, 7-2, here last night...starter Jakob Junis dropped his third-straight decision, dropping his season mark below .500 for the first time at 5-6...he was charged with six runs on a career-high 10 hits with a walk and five strikeouts in 5.1 innings of work...he allowed all three home runs, marking the third time this year that he's given up three or more in a game...the Royals didn't get on the board until the eighth inning when Mike Moustakas cracked his 13th home run of the season over the right field scoreboard...Alex Gordon chipped in three of KC's seven hits, however the club was held to three runs or fewer for the fourth-straight night and the fifth time in its last six games.

DAY BALL--Kansas City hopes to change its luck on this road trip with its first of back-to-back matinees this afternoon...the Royals are 9-19 overall in day games, however they have won three of their last five, dating back to 5-2 triumph in 10 innings at Busch Stadium on May 23...KC's lone win against the A's this year was also an afternoon affair, last Saturday at 'The K'.

MOOSE KEEPS RBI PACE--Third baseman Mike Moustakas provided KC's only offense last night, blasting a two-run shot in the eighth inning - his 13th roundtripper of the season...it also represented his 10th contest of the season with multiple RBI, which leads the club...his 42 RBI for the season rank tied for ninth in the American League and are two ahead of his total through the club's first 64 games last year, when he finished with a career-high 85 driven in...his home run pace is slightly behind last year's record-setting season, when he connected for 38 roundtrippers, as Moose had 18 homers at this point in 2017.

BREAKS AHEAD IN SCHEDULE--This extended weekend in Oakland will close out a stretch in which KC will have played 23 games in 24 days...the Royals will take Monday off before opening a two-game Interleague set against the Cincinnati Reds, then get another day off on Thursday, which will also be the night of the annual Diamond of Dreams charity event on the Kauffman Stadium field, featuring songstress Rachel Platten...the Royals have four scheduled off days this month, playing 14 times in 18 days...KC actually had five days off on the original schedule, but have to make up the April 15 snowout with the Angels on Monday, June 25, when the Royals are traveling between Houston and Milwaukee making that a four-city, nine-game tour, which includes the makeup game.

GORDO BACK ON TRACK--After a rough start to the week, Alex Gordon found his stroke last night, collecting three of Kansas City's seven hits on the night for his second multi-hit game in the last three contests...last night marked his fifth game of the season with three hits or more, while it was his 13th multi-hit contest overall, after he collected 16 all of last season...his season average of .269 is nearly 100 points higher than it was on this date last year, when he was batting .172.

HOMESTAND STARTS TUESDAY--Kansas City will open an eight-game homestand next Tuesday night with the first of two against the Cincinnati Reds, both 7:15 starts...the stay will also feature three-game visits from the defending World Series Champion Houston Astros next Friday thru Sunday and then the other Texas club will visit for three as the Rangers hit town on June 18-20...KC last faced Cincy in 2015, winning all four games and is 13-8 all-time vs. the Reds.

DIVISIONAL WORK--Kansas City dropped its sixth-straight to AL West competition, falling to 4-14 against the division this year...the Royals will close out a stretch of 10-straight games against the West tomorrow, however KC will host both Houston and Texas during its next homestand...the club is 12-14 within the AL Central, including an 8-4 record in its last 12 intradivision contests...Kansas City has gone just 3-12 vs. the East...KC's work against the National League is 2-3, with the NL Central the focus this season.

DANNY DUFFY makes his team-leading 14th start of the season and 144th of this career (172nd appearance)...it's his eighth career outing (seventh start) vs. Oakland and first this season...the 29-year-old lefty signed a five-year extension in 2017, which runs through 2021...he was originally selected in the third round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft out of Cabrillo High School in Lompac, Calif.

FLY BALL FRENZY IN NO DECISION--Danny took a no-decision despite leaving with the lead in the Royals' 9-6 loss to begin this seven-game trip Monday in Anaheim...he was charged with four runs on seven hits and three walks in 5.0 innings, with no strikeouts...it was his first start without one since July 10, 2015 vs. Toronto, snapping a streak of 74 consecutive starts with a strikeout, matching Jason Vargas (April 2, 2014-Oct. 1, 2017) for the longest such streak by a Royals left hander...Duffy recorded all 15 outs via fly balls on Monday, becoming the first Royal to do that and the first in the Majors since at least 1974, when *STATS Inc.* data is available...he departed with a 5-4 lead, allowing single tallies in the first, second and fifth, while he surrendered a solo shot to Jeffry Marte to begin the sixth, departing with a 5-4 lead...the bullpen allowed two more in the sixth and three in the eighth, resulting in the 9-6 loss.

VS. LEFTIES--Danny has not faced a left-handed batter in four of 13 starts, including Monday vs. the Angels...when opposing managers do insert lefties into their lineup, they're batting just .231 (12-for-52) vs. Duffy...since returning from an oblique injury last July 4, he has held lefty batters to a .159 average (17-for-107), fifth best in the Majors (min. 100 lefties faced) behind Blake Snell (.124), David Robertson (.125), Wade Davis (.148) and Edwin Diaz (.155)...since the start of 2012, he's allowed only four HR to left-handed batters in 591 plate appearances, second fewest in the Majors (min. 500 lefties faced), behind Trevor Rosenthal (3).

GETTING PICKY--Duffy picked off Eduardo Nunez at first base on May 2 in Boston, his first pickoff of the season and 26th of his career, second most in the AL since the start of 2011, behind James Shields (27)...since pickoffs were first recorded in 1974, Duffy's 26 are tied with Bruce Chen for most by a Royal.

VS. OAKLAND--Danny is 3-0 with a 3.44 ERA (14 ER in 36.2 IP) and a .175 opponents' average (22-for-126) in seven career outings (6 starts) vs. Oakland, but hasn't figured into the decision in his last four appearances (3 starts) since winning his first three...he earned his first career win in his sixth career start here at the Coliseum on June 14, 2011, allowing just two runs over 6.0 innings...his .175 average vs. the Athletics is the third lowest all-time (min. 6 starts), trailing only Hideo Nomo (.164) and Chuck Estrada (.167)...he's one of five active pitchers with at least three wins and no losses in at least six starts vs. Oakland.

ON THE ROAD--Both of Duffy's wins this season have come on the road, where he's 2-4 with a 5.89 ERA (29 ER in 44.1 IP) in eight starts...after starting 0-3 through four road outings, he earned the win with 5.1 innings of one-run ball on May 8 at Baltimore and earned another win two weeks later on May 24 in Texas, with 7.2 innings of one-run ball.

Pitching Notes

Tomorrow's Starter – Brad Keller

- Brad will make his third start of the season in the series finale in Oakland tomorrow afternoon...he's 1-2 with a 2.12 ERA (7 ER in 29.2 IP).
- Keller took the loss in a 1-0 defeat to the Angels on Tuesday...in his second start since transitioning to the rotation, he allowed one run on five hits over a career-high 4.1 innings, throwing 75 pitches...his lone blemish came when the Angels executed a double steal in the fifth after he had left the game.
- He made 26 starts for Jackson (AA) in 2017, going 10-9 with a 4.68 ERA...100 of 106 minor-league outings were starts, including his last 50.
- He ranks fourth among American League rookie pitchers in appearances with 23 and 11th in opponent batting average at .225 (min. 50 batters faced).
- Keller will be facing Oakland for the first time in his career...he's 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (3 ER in 9 IP) in four outings (one start) against the AL West.
- He has a 2.16 ERA (4 ER in 16.2 IP) in 12 appearances on the road, including allowing one run in 4.2 innings in his first career road start Tuesday in Anaheim.

- Jason allowed an inherited runner to score from third last night on a fielder's choice but recovered to strike out Jonathan Lucroy and induce a ground out by Nick Martini...he has not allowed a run in five of his last six appearances after giving up runs in consecutive outings for the first time in his career May 20 and 21.
- He was originally selected by the Royals in the fifth round of the 2010 Draft out of Blue Valley Northwest HS (Overland Park, Kan.), but was traded to Minnesota in 2014 for Josh Willingham...did not pitch in 2015 or '16 due to injury and re-signed with Kansas City last August 18 after a brief stint in the Padres' organization.
- Adam is the 18th known player to play for the Royals after attending a Kansas City-area high school, and he's the sixth different Royals pitcher to make his Major League debut this season—second most in the Majors behind San Diego—joining: Scott Barlow, Tim Hill, Brad Keller, Trevor Oaks and Eric Stout.

- Scott took his first loss Wednesday, allowing a two-run homer to Ian Kinsler and a solo shot to Justin Upton...he's worked at least 3.0 innings in three straight relief outings...the last Royals pitcher to have a longer streak of relief appearances of at least 3.0 innings in the same season was Shawn Camp (5) in 2005.
- On May 29, he became the first KC reliever to toss 4.0 hitless innings since Jose Santiago (also, 4.0) on May 21, 2000 at Anaheim...he's the third Royals reliever to collect five strikeouts and work 4.0 hitless frames, joining Jeff Montgomery (May 7, 1990 at Cleveland) and Mark Littell (June 2, 1976 at Oakland).

- Brian appeared for the first time in a week last night, allowing an unearned run on one hit with a strikeout in 2.0 innings...it marked his 10th relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings, tied for second most in the AL behind Tampa Bay's Matt Andriese (11) and three behind Pittsburgh's Tyler Glasnow for most in the Majors.
- Despite allowing four earned runs to Oakland on June 1, Flynn still has a 2.92 ERA (4 ER in 12.1 IP) in five outings against AL West foes this season.

Kelvin Herrera

- Kelvin tossed a scoreless eighth inning Thursday, erasing a one-out single with a double play...he's tied for seventh in the AL with 13 saves, while his 92.9 save percentage (13-for-14) is fourth in the AL...retired 16-of-the-last-19 batters he's faced over his last six outings...pitched in 17 of KC's 21 victories this season.
- Herrera has not yielded a walk in any of his 25 appearances (23.2 IP), surpassing Dan Quisenberry (19 outings, 37.2 IP in 1982) for the most consecutive games without a walk to begin a season in Royals history...Kenley Jansen (2017) and Mark Eichhorn (1991) hold the Major League record at 30 appearances, the only two streaks longer than Herrera's current run...has faced 119 batters since his last walk, trailing only Corey Kluber (139) for longest active streak in the Majors.
- Herrera's 0.76 ERA (2 ER in 23.2 IP) leads AL relievers and ranks second in the Majors behind only Milwaukee's Jeremy Jeffress (0.59).
- Recorded his 56th career save on June 2, moving him to within two of tying Doug Bird (58) for fifth in club history...he has not had a save chance since.

- Tim bounced back from taking the loss Monday to pitch a perfect seventh inning Thursday, striking out Jed Lowrie and retiring Dustin Fowler and Khris Davis on ground outs...his ground ball rate of 60.4 is third among AL relievers, while his 3.20 ground ball to fly ball rate is tied for fifth.
- Hill became the third Royal to collect his first big league win this year on June 2, joining Brad Keller (May 11) and Scott Barlow (May 29)...he's third among AL rookies in appearances (25), while his WHIP (1.32) is fifth and his ERA (4.12) is ninth among first-year AL relievers with a minimum of 19 innings pitched.
- He has held opponents hitless in 15 of 25 outings, including each of the first seven (6.2 IP) to begin his career, which was one game shy of matching Jonathan Sanchez (2006) and Garry Roggenburk (1963) for the most hitless appearances to begin a career in Major League history, according to *Elias Sports Bureau*.

- Kevin recorded a pair of outs in the fifth Tuesday, retiring Ian Kinsler on a fly ball with the go-ahead run on third before the Angels executed a double steal to score the game's lone run...he has a 5.79 ERA (9 ER in 14 IP) in 11 road outings this season as opposed to being unscored upon in 11 games (12.1 IP) at home.
- Earned his fourth win May 30, tying him for the AL lead among relievers and for third in the Majors behind Jeremy Jeffress and Robert Gsellman (5).
- His 59.7 ground ball rate is sixth among AL relievers...he worked 3.0 scoreless innings in Kansas City's 7-6 win in 13 innings on May 1 in Boston, retiring nine batters on 24 pitches, becoming the second player since 2014 to record 3.0 relief innings on 24 pitches or fewer, joining Ryan Webb (22) on Aug. 11, 2015.

- He had nine starts with Omaha (AAA) this season, going 3-3 with a 2.50 ERA (15 ER in 54.0 IP), which ranks second in the Pacific Coast League...his 1.22 WHIP is tied for fifth in the PCL among qualifying hurlers...acquired from the Dodgers' organization in a three-team trade on Jan. 4, 2018.

This & That

L.C. FILLS IN AGAIN--For the second time this season, Royals' Minor League Pitching Coordinator, Larry Carter, is filling in on the Major League staff as he will serve as the pitching coach for the remainder of the series with Cal Eldred attending to his daughter Emily's high school graduation festivities...Carter is in his 21st season in the Royals' organization and fourth in his current role...the 2014 Dick Howser Award winner – which recognizes outstanding contributions to the organization in player development – previously served as a pitching coach with Omaha (AAA) in 2013 and 2014, helping the Storm Chasers win consecutive National Titles.

DUPER STILL SUPER--Kansas City replay review expert Bill Duplissea nailed another one on Wednesday night in Anaheim as he determined Mike Moustakas was indeed safe sliding into third base in the eighth inning and after New York agreed and overturned the call...Alex Gordon stepped up and drove home a pair of runs with a two-out single to cut the deficit to 4-3...the overturn upped Dupe's current 2018 mark to 15-for-17 for an 88.2% success rate, the tops in the Majors...it's actually not even close, as yesterday's updated numbers indicate that San Francisco is second at 68.8% (11-for-16)...Dupe has made good on 68% of his challenges in his career (114-for-168), which ranks among the best, including a Major League best 72.8% success rate over the last three seasons (67-for-92).

HERRERA OFF TO FAST START--Newly acquired outfielder, Rosell Herrera, is off and running since joining the Royals' organization, having gone 7-for-14 (.500) in his first four games with Omaha (AAA) this week...Herrera, 25, collected a triple, drew a pair of walks and scored three runs in the Storm Chasers' 16-5 rout of Albuquerque last night...of the seven hits he's collected with Omaha, five of them have gone for extra-bases (2 doubles, 2 triples, 1 homer)...the switch-hitting outfielder was claimed off waivers from the Cincinnati Reds' organization a week ago.

WALK FREE ZONE--Kelvin Herrera worked a scoreless eighth inning in a non-save situation here on Thursday, dropping his season ERA to 0.76 (2 ER in 23.2 IP)...his earned run average is tops among AL relievers and ranks second in the Majors, behind former Royals farmhand Jeremy Jeffress' work with Milwaukee (0.59)...Herrera has yet to yield a walk thru his first 25 appearances of 2018, surpassing Dan Quisenberry for the most games without a walk to start a season...Quiz did not allow a free pass in his first 19 outings, though his inning total was 37.2 in 1982.

AN ERROR IN THEIR WAYS--Kansas City committed just its second error of the trip last night when Alcides Escobar misplayed a ground ball with the infield drawn in during the Oakland eighth...overall, the Royals have played exceptional defense this year, with last night marking just the ninth error the team has committed in its last 42 contests...KC is tied for the second-fewest errors in the American League, with 25, as well as the second-best fielding percentage (.989).

DRAFTEES STILL WORKING--The two Florida Gators the Royals chose with their first two picks on Monday night will be in action today as the Gators face Auburn in the first game of their best-of-three NCAA Super Regional...first-round selection Brady Singer (18th overall) is expected to start today's game, while Compensation Round pick, Jackson Kowar (33rd overall) is slated to pitch in the second game of the series, tomorrow at 9 a.m. (PST)...Florida, the defending College World Series champs, will be the host school in this Super Regional.

WHERE'S WHIT???--Kansas City utility man extraordinaire Whit Merrifield got a rare defensive night off, serving as the designated hitter last night...in his third big league season, Merrifield's name is likely to be somewhere near the top of the batting order, but where he'll play on a given day could be virtually anywhere on the diamond...since June 1 alone, he has started at second base (three games), in center field (twice) and first base (twice) and as the DH (once)...on the year, he's played four different defensive positions, including his normal location of second base (43 games), center field (6 games), first base (5 games) and right field (4 games)...he has played left field and third base in previous seasons, while also DH'ing four times this year.

THEY STILL DARE TO RUN--Five-time *Rawlings* Gold Glove winner and Platinum Glove winner, Alex Gordon, continues to get tested by baserunners and he continues to pass the test, as Monday night he picked up his fourth outfield assist of the year, when Justin Upton tried to make it to third base on a hit to left in the eighth inning...for Gordon, it was his 86th career outfield assist, one behind Gerardo Parra's 87 for the most in the Majors since 2010, when Alex made the move from infielder to outfielder...Gordo also has a Major League best 84 outfield dimes since the start of the 2011 campaign, which was his first full year in left.

MERRIFIELD ON THE BASES--Last year's American League stolen base champ Whit Merrifield pilfered a pair of bags last Sunday vs. the A's, upping his season total to 14, good for second best in the league this year to this point...he has made an art out of stealing third base, swiping the corner bag last Sunday for the seventh time in as many attempts this year, which tops both leagues and is now 17-for-18 in his career, trailing only Rajai Davis (22) and Jose Altuve (20) in the American League since the start of 2016.

ALL-STAR BALLOTING UNDERWAY--All-Star Balloting for the 2018 MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard, which will be held on Tuesday, July 17th at Nationals Park, the home of the Washington Nationals is underway...the 89th Midsummer Classic, hosted by the Nationals for the first time since the franchise moved to Washington, D.C., will mark the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital...for the fourth consecutive season, MLB's All-Star Balloting Program will be conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at MLB.com, all 30 Club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark mobile apps...fans around the world can cast their votes for starters a total of 35 times with the 2018 Camping World MLB All-Star Ballot.

ESKY THE IRON MAN--Alcides Escobar started his Major League-leading 397th consecutive game last night...the next closest Major Leaguer in consecutive starts is San Diego shortstop Freddy Galvis with 228.

KC'S TOP SKIPPER--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost recorded his 1,100th career win on May 18 vs. the Yankees and has since upped that career total to 1,107, which is good for sixth on the all-time list among active skippers...he has a 650-675 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, blowing past Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and is also sixth among active managers in games (2,284)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
