**DUFFY DAZZLES TO STOP SKID**--Left-hander Danny Duffy and two Kansas City relievers combined on a four-hit shutout here yesterday, as the Royals ended a six-game skid with a 2-0 win...five days after he failed to record a strikeout, Duffy fanned 10 A's hitters and scattered three hits over his 7.0 scoreless frames...he stranded six baserunners as Oakland put men in scoring position in two innings, but he was equal to the task both times...he capped his start by striking out Chad Pinder and Josh Phegley with the tying run at second base in the seventh, protecting a 1-0 lead...the Royals gave Duff an early advantage with consecutive one-out hits by Ryan Goins (double) and Paulo Orlando (RBI single) and then were held without a base hit until Alex Gordon made it a 2-0 game with a solo shot in the ninth...it marked the fifthstraight contest on this road trip that KC's offense was held to three runs or fewer...Kelvin Herrera worked around a two-out single by Matt Chapman to record his 14th save of the season in 15 tries, clinching Kansas City's fourth shutout of the season and first since April 9 when it blanked the Mariners, 10-0, at 'The K'.

**DAY BALL**--Kansas City has won four of its last six games contested in the afternoon, which includes two of its last three against these A's...the Royals are 10-19 in day games overall, after dropping 10 of their first 12...following today's series finale, KC's first three games of the next homestand will be contested in the evening.

**DUFFY RETURNING TO FORM**--Danny Duffy recorded his seventh career start of 7.0 scoreless innings or more and first since May 18, 2017, when he blanked the New York Yankees for 7.0 frames in a 5-1 victory...over his last four starts, Duff has been sharp, going 2-0 with a 2.10 ERA (6 ER in 25.2 IP), while holding the opposition to a .202 average (18-for-89)...in the four starts prior to his current run, Danny was charged with 20 earned runs in 19.1 innings (9.31 ERA), with opponents batting .356 against him (31-for-87)...yesterday also marked the first time he's recorded 10 strikeouts or more since the May 18 start vs. the Bombers last season.

**HOMESTAND STARTS TUESDAY**--Following today's road trip finale, Kansas City will open an eight-game homestand, beginning Tuesday night with the first of two against the Cincinnati Reds, both 7:15 starts...the stay will also feature three-game visits from the defending World Series Champion Houston Astros Friday thru Sunday and then the other Texas club will visit for three as the Rangers hit town on June 18-20...KC last faced Cincy in 2015, winning all four games and is 13-8 all-time vs. the Reds.

**FEW RISP OPPORTUNITIES**-Kansas City took advantage of one of its scoring chances yesterday as Paulo Orlando delivered the game's first run with a RBI single in the second inning...it marked the Royals' first hit of the series with a runner in scoring position and just their third in their last 18 at-bats...KC opened the trip by going 5-for-14 with RISP Monday evening in LA, when it scored six runs...for the season, the club's .217 average in scoring situations is 29th out of 30 teams, ahead of only the Texas Rangers' .201 mark.

<u>AMONG THE ELITE</u>--Kelvin Herrera earned his 14th save yesterday, working a scoreless ninth inning...he dropped his season ERA to 0.73 (2 ER in 24.2 IP), good for second among Major League relievers, behind only Milwaukee's Jeremy Jeffress (0.59)...his 0.73 WHIP is also tops among American League relievers and ranks fourth in the bigs...Herrera has yet to allow a walk through his first 26 appearances of the year, surpassing Dan Quisenberry for the most games without a walk to start a season...Quiz did not allow a free pass in his first 19 outings, though his inning total was 37.2 in 1982.

leagues, 100 of his 106 outings were as a starter, including all 26 last season at Jackson (AA) in the Diamondbacks' organization...he went 10-9 in the Southern League with a 4.68 ERA (68 ER in 130.2 IP) and 111 strikeouts, tied for 10th most in the league...he was used primarily as a setup man before his first start, and is tied for second on the team with five holds.

<u>YOUTH IS SERVED</u>--On May 30 vs. Minnesota, Keller became the youngest Royals starter (22 years, 307 days) since Yordano Ventura (22 years, 309 days) on April 8, 2014...with a win tonight—at 22 years, 318 days—he'll become the youngest Royals starter to win was Ventura (also 22 years, 316 days) on April 15, 2014 at Houston...prior to Ventura, the last younger Royals right-handed starter to win since Zack Greinke (21 years, 334 days) on Sept. 20, 2005 vs. Detroit (Game 2).

<u>AMONG THE ROOKIE ELITE</u>-Brad ranks among the AL rookie leaders in: holds (5, tied for 4th) and appearances (23, 4th), while among rookies with 25.0 innings pitched, he's second in ERA (2.12), third in opponents' average (.225) and WHIP (1.15)...the only Royals rookie (min. 50.0 IP) to record an ERA lower than Keller's current 2.12 mark was Greg Holland, who posted a 1.80 ERA (12 ER in 60.0 IP) in 46 relief appearances in 2011...he's one of six pitchers to make their Major League debuts with Kansas City this season—most in the American League—joining: Tim Hill, Eric Stout, Trevor Oaks, Scott Barlow and Jason Adam.

League debuts with Kansas City this season—most in the American League—joining: Tim Hill, Eric Stout, Trevor Oaks, Scott Barlow and Jason Adam. <u>ON THE ROAD</u>--Keller has earned both his only win (May 11 at Cleveland) and his two losses (April 20 at Detroit and Tuesday at the Angels) away from Kauffman Stadium, where he owns a 2.16 ERA (4 ER in 16.2 IP) in 12 appearances...he's held opponents scoreless in eight of those 12 outings, including his 3.0-scoreless-inning performance on May 11 at Cleveland, when he earned the win thanks to Salvador Perez's go-ahead HR off Andrew Miller in the seventh inning.

3.0-scoreless-inning performance on May 11 at Cleveland, when he earned the win thanks to Salvador Perez's go-ahead HR off Andrew Miller in the seventh inning. <u>CAREER HIGHLIGHTS</u>--Brad was originally selected by Arizona in the eighth round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...in five seasons in the D-Backs' organization, he wenr 40-32 with a 3.77 ERA (227 ER in 541.1 IP), and increased his win total in each of his last four seasons, going from six in 2014 to eight in 2015 (and a career-best 142.0 IP) to nine in 2016 and a career-high 10 last season...entering 2017, he was ranked by MLB.com as the No. 7 prospect in the D-Backs' organization and the No. 8 prospect by *Baseball America*...he graduated in 2013 from Flowery Branch High School (Ga.), where he was named Region-8 5A All-Region First Team and Second-Team Pitcher of the Year as a senior.

## Tuesday's Starter – Ian Kennedy

Ian will make his 14th start of the season to kick off a two-game set with Cincinnati on Tuesday night...he's 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (42 ER in 65.2 IP).
Kennedy took a no-decision in a 4-3 loss to the Angels on Wednesday ...allowed one run on seven hits with five strikeouts in 5.0 innings...worked out of jams in

- second and third and threw four scoreless before giving up consecutive doubles to start the fifth...limited the damage by escaping his second bases-loaded jam of the night.
  He's winless over his last 11 starts, going 0-6 with a 6.88 ERA (41 ER in 53.2 IP) since his last win on April 7 at Cleveland.
  - Opponents are hitting .484 (15-for-31) with runners in scoring position against him in his last six starts after batting .119 (5-for-42) with RISP in his first seven starts.
  - Kennedy will face Cincinnati for the first time since 2015...he's 5-1 with a 2.33 ERA in seven starts against the Reds, his lowest ERA against any NL opponent.
  - He's winless with a 5.40 ERA in seven starts at Kauffman Stadium...his last home win came Sept. 29, 2017 against Arizona in his final start of last season.

**DUPER STILL SUPER**--Kansas City replay review guru, Bill Duplissea, was credited with another successful challenge yesterday, though it didn't come back with the result the Royals had hoped for...in the fourth inning, Duplissea asked New York to take a look at a play where Paulo Orlando was called out on a tag at first base and Alcides Escobar was called out at the plate...after a 3-minute, 37-second review, it was determined that Orlando was indeed safe at first, however, the call on Escobar stood, resulting in the third out of the inning...with the successful overturn, Dupe's current 2018 mark is 16-for-18 for an 88.9% success rate, the tops in the Majors...it's actually not even close, as Friday's updated numbers indicate that San Francisco is second at 68.8% (11-for-16)...Dupe has made good on 68% of his challenges in his career (115-for-169), which ranks among the best, including a Major League best 73.1% success rate over the last three seasons (68-for-93).

**BREAKS AHEAD IN SCHEDULE**--This extended weekend in Oakland will close out a stretch in which KC will have played 23 games in 24 days...the Royals will take tomorrow off before opening a two-game Interleague set against the Cincinnati Reds, then get another day off on Thursday, which will also be the night of the annual Diamond of Dreams charity event on the Kauffman Stadium field, featuring songstress Rachel Platten...the Royals have four scheduled off days this month, playing 14 times in 18 days...KC actually had five days off on the original schedule, but have to make up the April 15 snowout with the Angels on Monday, June 25, when the Royals are traveling between Houston and Milwaukee making that a four-city, nine-game tour, which includes the makeup game.

**GORDO GOES DEEP**-Alex Gordon homered in the ninth inning yesterday, giving the Royals an important "tack-on run" in the 2-0 victory...it snapped a streak for Gordo as his previous 17 hits had all been singles, dating back to his last roundtripper on May 22 at St. Louis...it was also Alex's 165th career home run, moving him within four of Hal McRae for fourth on Kansas City's all-time list...over his last 16 contests, Gordon has been a solid contributor to the offense, batting .317 (19-for-60) with a pair of homers and six RBI, while reaching base at a .359 clip.

**WHO'S ON FIRST2**--Mike Moustakas played in his 900th contest in a Royals uniform yesterday and celebrated another milestone, making his first start at first base...Moose has appeared in 857 games as the third baseman, served as the designated hitter 31 times and been a pinch-hitter on 11 occasions...Mike's 857 games at third base are third-most in franchise history, behind only George Brett (1,679) and Joe Randa (940), who both saw time at first base in their Kansas City careers... Brett appeared in 621 games at third base (and eight at shortstop), before making his first start on the other corner on May 13, 1979.

**DRAFTEES STILL WORKING**--Kansas City's first-round selection, Brady Singer (18th overall), was an 8-2 winner in yesterday's NCAA Super Regional as his Florida Gators took the first game from Auburn in the best-of-three series...Singer improved to 12-1 on the year, allowing two runs on four hits with two walks and nine strikeouts over 6.2 innings...fellow Royals selection, Jackson Kowar (33rd overall), was slated to start this morning's game as the Gators look to clinch another trip to the College World Series...Florida is the defending College World Series champ and is hosting one of eight Super Regionals this weekend.

**<u>BACK TO ERRORLESS BALL</u>**--The Royals were flawless in the field yesterday, after committing their second error on the trip in Friday's contest...KC is tied for the second-fewest errors in the American League, with 25, as well as the second-best fielding percentage (.989), matching the Los Angeles Angels.

**DIVISIONAL WORK**--Kansas City earned just its fifth win in 19 tries against an American League West club yesterday...today closes out a stretch of 10-straight contests against the West, however, the Royals will resume play against the division during the next homestand as both Houston and Texas are slated to make visits to Kauffman Stadium...KC is 12-14 within the AL Central, including an 8-4 record in its last 12 intradivision contests...the Royals have gone just 3-12 vs. the East... KC's work against the National League is 2-3, with the NL Central the focus this season.

L.C. FILLS IN AGAIN--For the second time this season, Royals' Minor League Pitching Coordinator, Larry Carter, is filling in on the Major League staff as he will serve as the pitching coach again today with Cal Eldred attending to his daughter Emily's high school graduation festivities...Carter is in his 21st season in the Royals' organization and fourth in his current role...the 2014 Dick Howser Award winner – which recognizes outstanding contributions to the organization in player development – previously served as a pitching coach with Omaha (AAA) in 2013 and 2014, helping the Storm Chasers win consecutive National Titles.

**WHERE'S WHIT???**-Kansas City utility man extraordinaire Whit Merrifield returned to center field yesterday, making his second start in center on this road trip... in his third big league season, Merrifield's name is likely to be somewhere near the top of the batting order, but where he'll play on a given day could be virtually anywhere on the diamond...since June 1 alone, he has started at second base (three games), in center field (three times), at first base (twice) and as the DH (once)... on the year, he's played four different defensive positions, including his normal location of second base (43 games), center field (7 games), first base (5 games) and right field (4 games)...he has played left field and third base in previous seasons, while also DH'ing four times this year.

<u>ALL-STAR BALLOTING UNDERWAY</u>-All-Star Balloting for the 2018 MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard, which will be held on Tuesday, July 17th at Nationals Park, the home of the Washington Nationals is underway...the 89th Midsummer Classic, hosted by the Nationals for the first time since the franchise moved to Washington, D.C., will mark the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital...for the fourth consecutive season, MLB's All-Star Balloting Program will be conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at MLB.com, all 30 Club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark mobile apps...fans around the world can cast their votes for starters a total of 35 times with the 2018 Camping World MLB All-Star Ballot.

ESKY THE IRON MAN--Alcides Escobar started his Major League-leading 398th consecutive game last night...the next closest Major Leaguer in consecutive starts is San Diego shortstop Freddy Galvis with 229.

**KC'S TOP SKIPPER**--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost recorded his 1,100th career win on May 18 vs. the Yankees and has since upped that career total to 1,108, which is good for seventh on the all-time list among active skippers...he has a 651-675 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, blowing past Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and is sixth among active managers in games (2,285)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).


