THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - JUNE 12

1978 - Despite committing a team-record seven errors, the Astros rally from a 5-0 deficit to stun the Pirates, 6-5, in the Astrodome... Houston erupts for all six of their runs in the bottom of the 8th to win it.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros will match up with the division-rival Athletics tonight in the first of three games at The Coliseum...**RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (7-3) will start for the Astros opposite **RHP Daniel Mengden** (6-5) and the A's.

ALL-STAR UPDATE: Major League Baseball announced the first American League balloting update today, which included **Jose Altuve** (701,236) as leading all American League second basemen...Altuve is a five-time All-Star (2012, 2014-17), including starts in each of the last three years (2015-17).

#ALLSTROSGAME: The 2018 MLB All-Star Ballot is open to fans and exclusively online at Astros.com/Vote... fans can vote up to five times per day and 35 times throughout the voting period, which ends on July 5...the 89th MLB All-Star Game airs live on July 17 on FOX.

ABOUT THE RECORD: The Astros are off to their second-best start in franchise history with a 42-25 record... their best 67-game start came last season, as the eventual World Series champs started 45-22.

WINNING WAYS: The Astros have won five straight games, their fourth winning streak of at least five games this season...the Astros longest winning streak of the season is six games, set from April 17-22...this five game streak has moved the Astros to 42-25 and 16 games above .500 for the first time this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros own the best road record in the Major Leagues at 23-11 (.676), besting the Red Sox (22-11, .667) and Yankees (20-10, .667)...Houston averages a Major League high 5.76 runs per game on the road, has posted the best team road batting average (.276) and ranks second in road teram ERA (2.79).

VS. OAK: The Astros have gone 5-1 against the A's this season, which includes a three-game series sweep in Oakland from May 7-9...the Astros have gone 13-4 in their last 17 games at The Coliseum, including a 10-game winning streak at the venue from 2016-17.

IN THE SPRING TIME: OF George Springer has been at his best against the A's this season, hitting safely in all six games with a .560 (14x25) batting average, two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI...on May 7 at OAK, Springer became the first player in franchise history to record six hits in a 9.0-inning game.

SUNDAY'S SWEEP: The Astros completed their first four-game sweep of the Rangers in franchise history on Sunday with an 8-7 victory at Globe Life Park in Arlington...the game ended in strange fashion as Houston took the lead on a balk in the top of the 9th inning...1B Yuli Gurriel led the offense with a 4x5 day.

BACK IN HOUSTON: A limited number of tickets are still available for **An Evening with the Eagles** concert tour, featuring special guest **Chris Stapleton**, set for this Friday, June 15 at Minute Maid Park...tickets are available for purchase at Astros.com/Eagles.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS: RHP Dean Deetz, who is on the Major League restricted list, has been assigned to Class A Quad Cities to begin a rehab assignment... on Sunday, **C Tim Federowicz** cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple A Fresno...he was originally DFA'd by the Astros on Friday.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Astros have scored 124 runs in the 7th inning or later this season, which ranks second in the Major Leagues, trailing only the Cubs (127).

HIT MACHINE: 2B Jose Altuve has 30 hits in his last 16 games, dating back to May 25, posting a .455 (30x66) batting average in that timespan...he leads all Major League players in hits (93) this season and is on pace for his fifth straight 200-hit season (2014-17).

ROAD RAGE: 2B Jose Altuve is hitting .413 (59x143) in road games this season, by far the best road batting average in the Majors...he also led the Majors in that category last season (.381) and has posted a .390 (254x651) batting average in his last 162 road games.

CORREA DAY-TO-DAY: SS Carlos Correa exited last Wednesday's game following his 7th-inning at-bat with right side discomfort...he was re-evaluated on Thursday and is considered day-to-day.

NO BLEMISHES: SS Carlos Correa has not made an error in 70 consecutive games, which is a franchise record for a shortstop...this marks the second-longest active streak among MLB shortstops, behind an 87-game streak by Tampa Bay SS Adeiny Hechavarria (currently on the 10-day DL)...per Elias, the streaks by Correa and Hechavarria are the longest produced by all active Major League shortstops.

RISPY BUSINESS: 1B Yuli Gurriel leads the AL with a .444 (20x45) batting average with runners in scoring position, nearly 50 points higher than second-place **Martin Maldonado** (.400, 16x40)...Gurriel is hitting .588 (10x17) in those situations dating back to May 24.

LEADING ROLE: OF George Springer leads the Major Leagues with five leadoff homers this season... Springer has 23 career leadoff home runs, which ranks second in club history behind **Craig Biggio** (53), and ranks tied for 15th in American League history, along with **Alfonso Sorianio**, **Shannon Stewart** and **Lou Whitaker**.

HOUSTON TRAFFIC: 3B Alex Bregman has an active nine-game hitting streak and has reached base safely in 23 consecutive games, posting a .368 OBP and a .906 OPS in those contests...his streak is the second-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only a 26-game streak by the Rangers OF Shin-Soo Choo.

THE HOUSTON OPEN: The **PGA TOUR**, the **Astros Foundation** and Astros Owner & Chairman **Jim Crane**, have announced a five-year partnership for the Houston Open beginning in 2019...the Astros Foundation will operate the event and serve as the host organization.

LAST START - 6/6 VS. SEA: Received no decision in 7-5 win over Seattle... he allowed 4 runs on 7 hits in 6.0 innings...struck out 4 with 2 walks.

- THE DARK KNIGHT: 2017 All-Star is in his 4th Major League campaign...known for his elite strikeout rate, McCullers has not disappointed this season, posting 72 strikeouts thru his first 12 starts and 69.1 innings.
- has already recorded 7 wins this season, which ties his single-year career-high set in 22 starts in 2017 (7-4)...7 wins rank T-7th in the AL.
- GROUND AND POUND: has become one of the game's elite groundball pitchers... leads the AL in groundball rate (55.8%) and ranks second in groundball to flyball ratio (2.36), behind Dallas Keuchel (2.53).
- posted a 4.00 groundball to flyball ratio in 2017, which ranked 2nd in the Majors behind **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (4.41) (min. 100IP).
- has improved his groundball rate in nearly every season of his young career: 47.4% in 2015, 57.3% in 2016, 61.3% in 2017 and 55.6% this
- HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: has been dominant at home in his career, going 16-5...among pitchers with at least 175.0 innings pitched at MMP, McCullers has posted the lowest career ERA (2.38), immediately ahead of Roger Clemens (2.55) and Roy Oswalt (2.92).
- IT'S ELECTRIC: owns a career 9.95 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (443SO/400.2IP), which ranks 6th in the AL since his debut season of 2015...trails only strikeout artists Chris Sale (11.39), Danny Salazar (10.60), Chris Archer (10.56), Corey Kluber (10.21) and Carlos Carrasco (9.96).
- has 10 career double-digit strikeout games and is the 3rd pitcher in club history to record 10 double-digit strikeout games prior to turning 25 years old...also Don Wilson (16) and Larry Dierker (10).
- EL CAMBIO: has relied heavily on his curveball throughout his career, but this season, has been throwing his changeup at a career-high rate (16.8%)... his curveball usage is down to 43.3% this year from 48.5% in 2016 and 47.6% in 2017.
- has posted a 22% whiff rate on his changeup, a career high rate on any pitch for his career in a single season (previously 21.8% on his curve in 2016)...opponents are 4x35 (.114) with 1 extra-base hit and 12 strikeouts off his changeup this year.
- SNAP DRAGON: despite his decreased curveball usage this season, no pitcher in the Majors has thrown his curveball at a higher rate than McCullers since pitch data was first tracked in 2007...43% of all pitches he has thrown in his career have been curves.
- the pitch has averaged 85.8 miles per hour over his career, the hardest curveball thrown by a starter since 2007...is averaging 87.1 mph on his curveball this season, up from 86.0 mph in 2017, with both numbers leading all Major League pitchers.
- recorded 108 strikeouts via the curve in 2017, which led all AL pitchers.
