THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - JUNE 14

1996 - 1B Jeff Bagwell ties a Major League record and sets the franchise high with four doubles in the Astros 9-1 win at San Francisco...Bagwell also ties the franchise record for the most extra-base hits in a game.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros will go for the sweep and for their eighth straight victory today in this three-game series finale in Oakland...RHP Justin Verlander (8-2) will start for the Astros opposite RHP Frankie Montas (3-0) and the A's.

CY YOUNG CAMPAIGN: RHP Justin Verlander (8-2), a six-time All-Star (2007, 2009-13) and the 2012 All-Star Game starter, 2011 Cy Young Award winner and 2011 MVP, might be having the best season of his career as leads the Majors in ERA (1.45), WHIP (0.76), opponent batting average (.157) and opponent OPS (.475).

WINNING WAYS: The Astros have won a season-long seven straight games and have moved to a season-high 19 games above .500 with a 44-25 record...Houston posted two winning streaks of seven-or-more games last season, an 11-game run from May 25-June 5 and a seven-game streak from Aug. 31-Sept. 6.

ABOUT THE RECORD: The Astros are off to their second-best start in franchise history with a 44-25 record... their best 69-game start came last season, as the eventual World Series champs started 46-23.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros own the best road record in the Major Leagues at 25-11 (.694), besting the Red Sox (24-11, .686)...Houston averages a Major League high 5.97 runs per game on the road, has posted the best team road batting average (.280) and ranks second in road team ERA (2.83).

DUBS IN OAKLAND: The Astros have gone 7-1 against the A's this season, which already includes a threegame series sweep in Oakland from May 7-9...the Astros have gone 15-4 in their last 19 games at The Coliseum, including a 10-game winning streak at the venue from 2016-17.

IN THE SPRING TIME: OF George Springer has been at his best against the A's this season, hitting safely in all eight games with a .471 (16x34) batting average, two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI...on May 7 at OAK, Springer became the first player in franchise history to record six hits in a 9.0-inning game.

LAST NIGHT'S WIN: The Astros posted a blowout victory over the A's last night by a score of 13-5 in the middle game of this three-game series...once again, **DH Evan Gattis** (2x5, 2HR, 5RBI) was the story, hitting two home runs and driving in five, his second consecutive five-RBI game...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (8-1) earned the win, tossing 6.0 innings in the victory.

WHAT A NIGHT: DH Evan Gattis is the first player in Astros franchise history to post consecutive five-RBI games, doing so last night and on Tuesday night...the last Major Leaguer to do so was Maikel Franco for the Phillies back in 2015...Gattis also tied the franchise record for RBI in consecutive games with 10, reaching a mark also set by 1B Jeff Bagwell (2001) and C J.R. Towles (2007).

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Astros have scored 127 runs in the 7th inning or later this season, which ranks tied for first in the Majors along with the Cubs (127).

ALL-STAR UPDATE: MLB announced the first American League balloting update on Tuesday, which included **Jose Altuve** (701,236) as leading all AL second basemen...Altuve is a five-time All-Star (2012, 2014-17), including starts in each of the last three years (2015-17).

HIT MACHINE: 2B Jose Altuve has 31 hits in his last 18 games (since May 25), posting a .419 (31x74) batting average in that timespan...he ranks second among all Major League players in hits (94) this season and is on pace for his fifth straight 200-hit season (2014-17).

ROAD RAGE: 2B Jose Altuve is hitting .397 (60x151) in road games this season, the best road batting average in the Majors...he also led the Majors in that category last season (.381) and has posted a .387 (252x651) batting average in his last 162 road games.

RISPY BUSINESS: 1B Yuli Gurriel leads the Majors with a .468 (22x47) batting average with runners in scoring position, while teammate 2B Jose Altuve (.382, 21x55) ranks third...Gurriel is hitting .632 (12x19) in those situations dating back to May 24.

50-50 SH0T: OF George Springer has posted a .481 OBP this month, reaching base in 25 of his 52 plate appearances (15 hits, 9 walks, 1 HBP)...he ranks second the AL in that category in 11 June games.

HOUSTON TRAFFIC: 3B Alex Bregman has an active 10-game hitting streak and has reached base safely in 24 consecutive games, posting a .369 OBP and a .895 OPS in those contests...his streak is the second-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only a 28-game streak by the Rangers OF Shin-Soo Choo.

DRAFT PICK SIGNINGS: Yesterday, the Astros announced the signings of 10 players that were drafted in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft...among that group were six in the top 10 rounds: OF Seth Beer (1st round, 28th overall), SS Jeremy Peña (3rd), RHP Cody Deason (5th), C Cesar Salazar (7th), RHP Austin Hansen (8th) and OF Chandler Taylor (10th).
