<u>SHELVED</u>: With today's transactions, Angels have 15 players simultaneously on D.L. for first time in club history...Last MLB team with 15 on D.L. at same time was **Oakland** in 2016... <u>Today's active player roster features just 12 players from Opening Day.</u> (STATS D.L. data spans to 1987)

<u>TYLER SKAGGS TONIGHT</u>: The lefty is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (13 IP - 1 ER) in his two starts this month...<u>Has fashioned a 2.73 ERA (52.2 IP - 16 ER) over his last nine starts</u>...**Holding lefthanders to a .173 (14/81) average this season.**

FLETCH LIVES! In the fourth inning Wednesday, David Fletcher collected his first Major League hit - a two-run triple...He is the second Angel to record a triple for his first big league hit in MLB debut (also Thad Bosley in 1977 vs. KC)...Fletcher is the fifth LAA player with three hits in his MLB debut, joining C.J. Cron (2014), Kendrys Morales (2006), Lee Stevens (1990) and Gil Flores (1977)...In 58 Triple-A games this season, Fletcher was batting .350 (89/254) with 55 runs, 25 doubles, five triples, six HRs and 35 RBI...Was leading Pacific Coast League in hits, runs, doubles, extrabase hits and ranked third in average.

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout (6.1 WAR in '18) is on pace for a 14.3 WAR season – would be the best single season in MLB history passing Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...Next highest MLB player in WAR in 2018 is Jose Ramirez (CLE) at 3.9...Trout leads MLB w/ 23 HRS...On pace for career-best 54 HRS...Also leads MLB with 168 total bases, 42 extra-base hits, 56 runs, 56 walks and a .444 OBP.

<u>SOMETHING FISHY:</u> Mike Trout is the first player in Angels' history with 20+ HRs in seven straight seasons...<u>Joins Alex Rodriguez</u> and <u>Mickey Mantle</u> as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 season.

OHTANI TO D.L. On June 8th, Shohei Ohtani was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a Grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection last Thursday with Dr. Steve Yoon in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks...His 61 Ks are a club record through first nine career starts & lead A.L. rookies.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 34 of last 41 games...LAA starting pitchers have fashioned a 2.97 ERA (230.1 IP – 76 ER) since May 1, tops in A.L. and second in MLB in span...Angels are only team in MLB to boast five starters with 3.70 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts).

<u>GLOVE STORY:</u> LAA has gone errorless in 47 of 69 contests on season...<u>Club has 28 errors thru 69 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct</u>...Halo outfielders are tied for MLB lead with 15 OF assists.

WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 36 of 69 games and 20 of last 33 contests...LAA has just seven 10+hit efforts in last 31 games...Angels hitting .234 (77/329) with RISP since May 1 (41 G).

HOT HALOS: Mike Trout has four HRs in last four games (back to back multi-HR games June 11-12)...He is batting .356 (32/90) with 22 runs scored, eight doubles, one triple, 11 home runs and 20 RBI over his last 23 games...Justin Upton has opened June 14-for-41 (.341) with four home runs and five RBI (4 HR his last 10 G)...He is the first Angel with 15 HRs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) since Vernon Wells (25 HRs) in 2011...Martín Maldonado has hits in 15 of last 19 games...Has .300 (33/110) average with eight doubles and three HRs since May 1...Over his last 14 contests, lan Kinsler is batting .323 (20/62) with 14 runs, five doubles, six home runs and 11 RBI.

Tossed 6.1 scoreless innings in season debut on March 30 at the Oakland Coliseum

- Making 14th start of the season and eighth on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Oakland...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- OFF THE BOARDS: Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 10 of 12 starts this season...His 10 starts with two-or-fewer runs are tied for second most in the Majors this season among left-handers.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Has not allowed a home run across last two starts, after yielding six HR in previous four starts.
- LEFT OUT: Is holding lefties to a .173 (14/81) batting average this season, which ranks as seventh best in the A.L.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on Saturday at Minnesota after tossing seven innings and allowing one
 earned run on five hits with one walk and eight strikeouts.
- <u>STRIKEOUT STREAK</u>: Has recorded 5+ strikeouts in a career high eight straight games...Last Angels lefty with a longer streak was **Chuck Finley** (16 consecutive games) in 1997.
- THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD: Has pitched to a 4-1 record and 2.66 ERA (40.2 IP 12 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 1-3 record and 3.62 ERA (32.1 IP 13 ER) at home.
- EARLY SUCCESS: In 27 career regular season starts from March-May, is 9-8 with a 3.77 ERA (167 IP 70 ER) and 156 strikeouts...From June-October in 42 starts, is 9-17 with a 4.71 ERA (221.2 IP 116 ER) and 191 strikeouts.
- <u>GETTING FAMILIAR</u>: Since start of 2017, has allowed two home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (261 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 258 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- <u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> In six career starts against the Athletics, is 1-4 with a 5.08 ERA (33.2 IP 19 ER)...Earned the win in first start this year vs. A's on March 30 at the Coliseum (season debut) after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings and allowing three hits and no walks with five strikeouts.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In four career starts at the Coliseum, is 1-3 with a 4.56 ERA (23.2 IP 12 ER)...This season, is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.1 IP 0 ER) after season debut on March 30.
- 300 K's: Recorded 300th career strikeout against Aaron Hicks in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- <u>NEW CAREER HIGH:</u> Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati.
- SEASON DEBUT: Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- <u>COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT</u>: During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- <u>2017 RECAP</u>: Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.
