LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play the eighth contest of a nine-game (3-4) road trip to Minnesota (June 8-10; 2-1), Seattle (June 11-13; 0-3) and Oakland (June 15-17; 1-0)...Last night's win snapped a four-game losing streak...Club remains a season-high 7.5 games back of pace in A.L. West...Angels are 25-29 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 12-8-2 in 22 series (7-3-1 in 11 road series)...Since a 14-4 mark thru first 18 road games, Halos are 7-10 in last 17 away affairs...Halos are 8-5 this month...Following this series, LAA hosts Arizona (June 18-19) & Toronto (June 21-24).

FISH ON FIRE: Mike Trout is 10-for-14 (.714) with six runs, a double, four home runs & seven RBI over his last four games... Has raised season clip from .299 to .323 in span.

<u>SHELVED</u>: With yesterday's transactions, Angels had 15 players simultaneously on D.L. for first time in club history (currently 14 on D.L.)...Last MLB team with 15 on D.L. at same time was **Oakland** in 2016 (*STATS D.L. data spans to 1987*).

<u>MVP x 3?</u> Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout (6.2 WAR in '18) is on pace for a 14.3 WAR season – would be the best single season in MLB history passing Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...<u>Next highest MLB player in WAR in 2018 is Jose Ramirez (CLE) at</u> <u>4.6</u>...**Trout** leads MLB w/ 23 HRs (on pace for 53 HRs)...**Also** leads MLB with 171 total bases, 42 extra-base hits, 58 runs, 57 walks and a .450 OBP.

FLETCH LIVES! David Fletcher collected his first MLB hit Wednesday - a two-run triple...Just second Angel to record a triple for his first big league hit in MLB debut (also Thad Bosley in 1977 vs. KC)...Fletcher is the fifth LAA player with three hits in his MLB debut, joining CJ. Cron (2014), Kendrys Morales (2006), Lee Stevens (1990) and Gil Flores (1977)...In 58 Triple-A games this season, Fletcher was batting .350 (89/254) with 55 runs, 25 doubles, five triples, six HRs and 35 RBL...Was leading Pacific Coast League in hits, runs, doubles, extra-base hits and ranked third in average.

<u>SOMETHING FISHY:</u> Mike Trout is the first player in Angels' history with 20+ HRs in seven straight seasons...<u>Joins Alex</u> <u>Rodriguez</u> and <u>Mickey Mantle</u> as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 season.

OHTANI TO D.L. On June 8th, Shohei Ohtani was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a Grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection last Thursday with Dr. Steve Yoon in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks...His 61 Ks are a club record through first nine career starts & lead A.L. rookies.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three runs-orless in 35 of last 42 games...LAA starters have fashioned a 2.88 ERA (237.1 IP – 76 ER) since May 1, tops in MLB in span.

GLOVE STORY: LAA has gone errorless in 47 of 70 contests on season...<u>Club has 29 errors thru 70 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct</u>...Halo outfielders are tied for MLB lead with 15 OF assists.

WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 36 of 70 games and 20 of last 34 contests...LAA has just seven 10+ hit efforts in last 32 games...<u>Angels hitting .232 (79/341) with</u> <u>RISP since May 1 (42 G).</u>

<u>PITCHING POINTS:</u> LAA pitchers have 33 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through first 70 games (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 634 Ks)...<u>Halos have issued 245 free passes, second-most in A.L.</u>..**Angels' bullpen has tossed 259.1 IP to rank second in A.L.** to **Tampa Bay..13 blown saves are second-most in MLB.**

- <u>ANGELS DEBUT</u>: Today's start marks Angels debut and first Major League appearance since July 16, 2016 for Cincinnati (vs. Milwaukee)...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to today's game.
- WITH THE BEES: In 13 starts this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-0 with a 3.44 ERA (49.2 IP 19 ER)...Recorded 54 strikeouts with 15 walks...Bees are 13-0 in his starts this season.
- <u>RECENT HOT STRETCH</u>: In last four starts for Salt Lake, is pitching to a 1.88 ERA (14.1 IP 3 ER) with 13 strikeouts.
- LEFT ON LEFT: Is holding left-handers to a .234 (15/64) average this season for Salt Lake with one home run allowed (.266 average and six HR allowed vs. righties).
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Made six appearances (two starts) for Angels this Spring, going 1-3 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 IP 9 ER) with 16 strikeouts and six walks...*Made start vs. A's on March 23 in Tempe (L; 4 IP, 5 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO).*
- LAST TIME OUT (with Salt Lake): Did not factor in decision in last start for Bees on June 9 vs. New Orleans, after working 3.2 innings and allowing two runs (both unearned) on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts...Set season-high 82 pitches thrown.
- LOCAL PRODUCT: Native of La Palma, CA and attended Laguna Hills HS...Is the first Angels starting pitcher from an Orange County HS since David Huff (Edison HS Huntington Beach) in 2016.
- **STARTER #10:** Becomes 10th different starting pitcher for Angels this season, which is tied with Detroit for third most in American League (behind Tampa Bay 13 and Oakland 11).
- <u>VS. OAKLAND</u>: Today marks second career start vs. Athletics...Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (4 IP 4 ER)...Only previous start vs. A's came on June 12, 2016 for Cincinnati at Great American Ball Park; all four runs allowed came on a pair of two-run HR in the second inning by **Marcus Semien** and **Jake Smolinski**.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Today marks first career appearance at the Coliseum.
- FAMILY TIES: Is the grandson of longtime Los Angeles public address announcer John Ramsey, who worked for the Angels for three seasons in the 1960s and again from 1979-84...His career included work for the Dodgers, Kings, Lakers, Rams, Raiders and USC football.
- MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE: Pitched parts of two seasons with the Reds (2015-16), going 2-12 with a 6.17 ERA (119.2 IP 82 ER)...Recorded 116 strikeouts while walking 50).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally drafted by Kansas City in fifth round of 2008 First-Year Player Draft out of Laguna Hills HS (20 miles from Angel Stadium)... Was traded by Royals with LHP Brandon Finnegan and LHP Cody Reed to Cincinnati on July 26, 2015 for RHP Johnny Cueto...Signed with Angels as a minor league free agent on Nov. 30, 2016 and resigned with Angels as minor league free agent on Jan. 22, 2018.
