**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers were unable to avoid a three-game sweep in Cleveland as they dropped the series finale to the Indians, 12-2, on Sunday afternoon at Progressive Field. Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits, including a double, in the loss, while Niko Goodrum and James McCann each added a hit and a RBI. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing six runs on eight hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 3.0 innings. The Tigers begin a brief homestand this afternoon as they open a four-game series vs. Oakland. Following the series against the Athletics, Detroit returns to the road for a six game trip, which includes four games at Toronto (June 29-July 2) and two games at Chicago (July 3-4).

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nicholas Castellanos went 2x4 with a double in yesterday's game to record his team-leading 28th multi-hit game of the season. Castellanos ranks sixth in the American League with 28 multi-hit games. His double yesterday was his 23rd of the season, which places him tied for fifth in the AL.

**STREAK SNAPPED:** JaCoby Jones went 0x3 in yesterday's game, snapping his hitting streak at a career-long nine games. Jones hit .333 (11x33) with four runs scored, two doubles, one home run and four RBI during the streak, which was the second longest by a Tigers player this season, trailing only a 10-game streak by James McCann from May 1-12.

**RECAPPING THE ROAD TRIP:** The Tigers went 3-5 on their recently completed 10-day, eight-game road trip, going 3-0 at Chicago (AL), 0-2 at Cincinnati and 0-3 at Cleveland. Detroit hit .222 (59x266) as a team during the trip, while the pitching staff compiled a 6.31 ERA (67.0IP/47ER). Individually, José Iglesias hit .333 (9x27) with a run scored and three RBI over the eight games, while JaCoby Jones also batted .333 (7x21) with three runs scored, a double and a RBI.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers begin a brief four-game homestand this afternoon. Detroit is 23-17 at Comerica Park this season, and their 23 home victories are the fifth most in the American League. The Tigers are hitting .262 (358x1369) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.08 ERA (371.0IP/168ER).

**TIGERS AND A'S:** The Tigers and Athletics begin their seven-game season series this afternoon. Along with the four games in Detroit this week, the two teams will also meet for three games in Oakland from August 3-5. Detroit went 1-5 against the Athletics last season, including a 0-3 record at home. Over the last six years, each team has won the season series three times.

**WESTWORLD:** Detroit is 7-7 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 25 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (44-69, .389).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters today's game with a 36-42 (.462) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,104-1,081 (.505) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from

2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**ABOUT JORDAN:** In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his ninth start of 2018 this afternoon in the series opener vs. Oakland.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Zimmermann did not factor into the decision in his last start on June 16 at Chicago (AL), allowing four runs, three earned, on four hits with four strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Zimmermann has faced the Athletics twice in his career, posting a 1-0 record with a 3.65 ERA (12.1IP/5ER) and five strikeouts. He last started against Oakland on May 6, 2017 and received a no decision, giving up four runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Zimmermann has appeared in 28 games, including 27 starts, at Comerica Park and has an 11-12 record with a 6.45 ERA (149.1IP/107ER) and 99 strikeouts. In three home starts this season, Zimmermann is 1-0 with a 3.93 ERA (18.1IP/8ER) and 20 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL WEST:** Zimmermann has made 11 starts in his career against teams from the American League West and has a 4-4 record with a 3.39 ERA (71.2IP/27ER) and 41 strikeouts. In six starts vs. the AL West last season, Zimmermann went 1-2 with a 5.15 ERA (36.2IP/21ER) and 19 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN JUNE:** Zimmermann has made 44 career starts during the month of June, posting a 16-11 record with a 2.75 ERA (287.2IP/88ER) and 220 strikeouts. In five June starts last season, Zimmermann went 1-1 with a 3.82 ERA (30.2IP/13ER) and 26 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (682x2664) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .267 (723x2708) against him. In eight starts this season, righties are hitting .275 (19x69), while lefthanded batters are hitting .230 (17x74).

**KEEPIN' IT 1,000:** Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 52 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

**STREAK SNAPPED:** Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann ranks second among active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.93 walks per nine innings.

**SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016:** Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

**ALL-STAR SELECTION:** Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

**TOSSING A NO-HITTER:** Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

**ABOUT BLAINE:** Hardy will make his 13th appearance and eighth start of the season tomorrow night at Oakland.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Hardy pitched out of the bullpen on Wednesday at Cincinnati, allowing two hits with one walk in a scoreless third of an inning. Hardy's last start was on June 17 at Chicago (AL), when he earned the win after giving up a run on six hits with three strikeouts in 5.1 innings.

**VS. OAKLAND/AT COMERICA PARK:** Hardy has made 10 career relief appearances against Oakland, posting a 1-0 record with a 1.74 ERA (10.1IP/2ER) and eight strikeouts. He faced the Athletics three times last season and was 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (2.1IP/0ER) and three strikeouts. Hardy has pitched in 91 games, including four as a starter, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling an 8-1 record with a 3.09 ERA (110.2IP/38ER) and 82 strikeouts. In four home starts this season, Hardy is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA (23.1IP/7ER) and 17 strikeouts.

**FOR STARTERS:** Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in six of his seven starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 3-1 record with a 3.40 ERA (39.2IP/15ER) and 26 strikeouts.

**AT TOLEDO:** Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.
