### PREGAME FESTIVITIES

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered their sixth straight loss on Monday as they dropped the series opener to the Athletics, 5-4. Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits, including a three-run home run, his 10th of the season, while John Hicks, José Iglesias, Leonys Martin and Victor Martinez each added two hits. Jordan Zimmermann started for Detroit and threw 5.0 shutout innings, allowing four hits with one walk and three strikeouts. Shane Greene took the loss after giving up a run on one hit with one walk and two strikeouts in 1.1 innings. The Tigers and A's play the second game of their four-game series tonight. Following the series vs. Oakland, Detroit returns to the road for a six game trip, which includes four games at Toronto (June 29-July 2) and two games at Chicago (July 3-4).

TIGERS AGREE TO TERMS WITH FIRST OVERALL PICK CASEY MIZE. THIRD ROUND PICK KODY CLEMENS: The Tigers have agreed to terms with RHP Casey Mize, the first overall pick in the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, and third round selection INF Kody Clemens, In 17 starts for Auburn this year. Mize went 10-6 with a 3.30 ERA (114.2IP/42ER). He led the Southeastern Conference with 156 strikeouts, 12.24 strikeouts per nine innings and a 0.87 WHIP. Mize was named a 2018 first-team All-American by Baseball America and earned first-team All-SEC honors. Clemens played in 65 games with Texas this season, hitting .351 (87x248) with 58 runs scored, 15 doubles, three triples, 24 home runs and 72 RBI. Clemens ranked second in the country with 24 home runs and 180 total bases. while he was fifth with a .726 slugging percentage. Clemens was named Big 12 Player of the Year and earned first-team All-America honors. The Tigers have now agreed to terms with 36 of their 40 draft picks.

**NICK THE STICK:** Nicholas Castellanos went 2x5 with a double, a home run and three RBI in yesterday's game to record his team-leading 29th multi-hit game of the season, which ranks tied for fifth in the American League. Castellanos also ranks third in the AL with 94 hits, tied for third with 24 doubles and 10th with 37 extra-base hits and 154 total bases.

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS:** The Tigers played their 24th one-run game of the season yesterday, falling to 13-11 in those contests with a 5-4 defeat. Detroit's 24 one-run games are tied with Kansas City for third in the American League (Seattle, 34 and Tampa Bay, 32), while their 13 one-run wins are tied for the fourthmost in the league. The Tigers have won 10 of their last 14 games decided by one run. In addition to the 24 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 16 games that have been decided by two runs.

V-MART GETS ALL A'S VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez has posted impressive numbers in his career against the Athletics. Entering tonight's game, Martinez is hitting .362 (109x301) with 27 runs scored, 23 doubles, seven home runs and 37 RBI in 81 career games vs. Oakland. Among active players, Martinez ranks first with a .362 batting average, while he is second with a .415 on-base percentage and seventh with a .508 slugging percentage.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers are 0-1 on their current four-game homestand. Detroit is 23-18 at Comerica Park this season, and their 23 home victories are tied for the fifth most in the American League. The Tigers are hitting .262 (368x1406) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.10 ERA (380.0IP/173ER).

**TIGERS AND A'S:** The Athletics lead the season series against the Tigers 1-0 after winning yesterday. Along with the four games in Detroit this week, the two teams will also meet for three games in Oakland from August 3-5. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost six straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's

longest losing streak since dropping six consecutive games from August 3, 2002-April 22, 2003.

**WILD, WILD WEST:** Detroit is 7-8 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 26 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (44-70, .386).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 36-43 (.456) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,104-1,082 (.505) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**STUMPF INJURY REHAB UPDATE:** LHP Daniel Stumpf made an injury rehab appearance with Triple A Toledo last night vs. Indianapolis, throwing 1.2 hitless innings with one strikeout. In three injury rehab outings with the Mud Hens, Stumpf has a 2.45 ERA (3.2IP/1ER) with four strikeouts. Stumpf has been on the disabled list since May 30 (retroactive to May 29) with ulnar nerve irritation.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Hardy has pitched in 43 games, including one start, in his career against American League West teams and has a 1-1 record with a 2.42 ERA (44.2IP/12ER) and 45 strikeouts. In four appearances, including one start, against AL West opponents this season. Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 2.57 ERA (7.0IP/2ER) and seven strikeouts.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in six of his seven starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 3-1 record with a 3.40 ERA (39.2IP/15ER) and 26 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .226 (70x310) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .293 (137x468) against him. In 12 appearances, including seven starts this season, lefties are hitting .191 (9x47) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .278 (32x115).

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

FIRST WIN AS A STARTER: Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.
