### PREGAME FESTIVITIES

**Western Michigan University Day:** As part of FOX Sports Detroit University Days, the Tigers will host Western Michigan University Day. Each ticket package includes a game ticket, a Detroit Tigers/WMU hat and a donation to the WMU Alumni Association Legacy Scholarships, which recognize the loyalty of multi-generational Bronco families.

**National Anthem:** The national anthem will be performed by Western Michigan's **Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia**, which is the oldest continuously active Greek organization at Western Michigan University.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers dropped their seventh consecutive game on Tuesday as they lost to the Athletics, 9-7, at Comerica Park. Niko Goodrum and Dixon Machado each had a hit and two RBI, while Nicholas Castellanos added a pair of hits and a RBI. Jeimer Candelario, John Hicks and Leonys Martin also contributed two hits in the loss. Blaine Hardy started for Detroit and received a no decision, allowing six runs, three earned, on six hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Shane Greene took the loss, giving up two runs on three hits in a third of an inning. The Tigers and A's play the third game of their four-game series tonight. Following the series vs. Oakland, Detroit returns to the road for a six game trip, which includes four games at Toronto (June 29-July 2) and two games at Chicago (NL) (July 3-4).

### TIGERS AGREE TO TERMS WITH SECOND ROUND PICK

**PARKER MEADOWS:** The Tigers announced today that they have agreed to terms with OF Parker Meadows, the team's second round selection in the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Meadows was named a 2018 Rawlings-Perfect Game first-team All-American. The native of Loganville, GA has played 92 games, posting a .370 (95x257) batting average with 87 runs scored, 18 doubles, eight triples, 10 home runs and 64 RBI. The Tigers have now agreed to terms with 37 of their 40 draft picks.

**NICK THE STICK:** Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits, including a double, and drove in a run in last night's game to record his third consecutive multi-hit contest and his team-leading 30th of the season, which ranks tied for fourth in the American League. Castellanos also ranks third in the AL with 96 hits, tied for third with 25 doubles, tied for eighth with 157 total bases, tied for ninth with 38 extra-base hits and 10th with a .308 (96x312) batting average.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** The Tigers had three doubles in last night's game and now have 164 two-baggers on the season. Detroit's 164 doubles are tied with Minnesota for the second most in the American League, trailing only Boston, which has 169.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers are 0-2 on their current four-game homestand. Detroit is 23-19 at Comerica Park this season, and their 23 home victories are the sixth most in the American League. The Tigers are hitting .263 (380x1444) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.14 ERA (389.0IP/179ER).

**TIGERS AND A'S:** The Athletics have a 2-0 lead in the season series against the Tigers. Along with the four games in Detroit this week, the two teams will also meet for three games in Oakland from August 3-5. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost seven straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's longest losing streak since dropping seven consecutive games from September 6, 1986-May 9, 1987.

**WILD, WILD WEST:** Detroit is 7-9 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 27 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (44-71, .383).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 36-44 (.450) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,104-1,083 (.505) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins

history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**ABOUT MIKE:** Fiers will make his 15th start of the season tonight vs. Oakland.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fiers suffered his fourth loss of the season on Friday at Cleveland, allowing four runs on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Fiers has made nine appearances, including eight starts, in his career vs. the Athletics, compiling a 1-3 record with a 4.50 ERA (46.0IP/23ER) and 41 strikeouts. He faced Oakland three times last season, including twice as a starter, and went 1-1 with a 4.97 ERA (12.2IP/7ER) and 12 strikeouts.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Fiers has made nine career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 3-1 record with a 3.06 ERA (53.0IP/18ER) and 40 strikeouts. In seven home starts this season, Fiers is 3-1 with a 3.51 ERA (41.0IP/16ER) and 31 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL WEST:** Fiers has appeared in 31 games, including 29 starts, in his career against teams from the American League West, posting a 6-10 record with a 5.82 ERA (164.0IP/106ER) and 142 strikeouts. In three starts against AL West opponents this season, Fiers is 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA (16.0IP/7ER) and 11 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN JUNE:** Fiers has pitched in 31 games, including 26 as a starter, during the month of June, compiling a 10-8 record with a 3.23 ERA (158.2IP/57ER) and 142 strikeouts. In four June starts this season, Fiers is 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA (23.0IP/10ER) and 22 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .252 (370x1471) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .260 (422x1626) against him. In 14 starts this season, lefties are hitting .258 (39x151), while righthanded batters are hitting .288 (46x160).

**IMPRESSIVE TIGERS DEBUT:** Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

**TOSSING A NO-NO:** Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fulmer took the loss in his most recent start last Wednesday at Cincinnati, allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and nine strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

**VS. OAKLAND/AT COMERICA PARK:** Fulmer has made two career starts against the Athletics, compiling a 2-0 record with a 0.57 ERA (15.2IP/1ER) and 12 strikeouts. He last faced Oakland on May 5, 2017 and earned the win, giving up two runs, one earned, on eight hits with two walks and nine strikeouts in 8.0 innings. Fulmer has started 31 games in his career at Comerica Park, posting a 10-10 record with a 3.51 ERA (197.1IP/77ER) and 139 strikeouts. In eight home starts this season, Fulmer is 1-4 with a 4.07 ERA (48.2IP/22ER) and 32 strikeouts.

**TURNING IT AROUND:** Michael Fulmer has allowed three runs-or-less in each of his last three starts. After posting a 6.89 ERA (31.1IP/24ER) in six starts from May 7-June 3, Fulmer has a 2.29 ERA (19.2IP/5ER) with 20 strikeouts over his last three starts.
