# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - JULY 9

1976 - In the Astrodome, RHP Larry Dierker hurls the fifth no-hitter in franchise history, a 6-0 gem over Montreal.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros, winners of six straight, are in the midst of their longest homestand of the season, an 11-game, 11-day stand, which will take them thru the All-Star Break...speaking of All-Stars, **RHP Gerrit Cole** (5-8), who was named a 2018 All-Star yesterday, will start for the Astros tonight opposite the Athletics.

WINNING STREAKS: The Astros current six-game win streak is their third streak of six-or-more games this season and half as long as their season-long 12-game winning streak from June 6-18, which tied a franchise record...Houston has won a season-high six straight home games, their longest win streak at Minute Maid Park since winning nine straight last season from Aug. 31-Sept. 20.

**30 GAMES UP THRU 92:** The Astros are a season-high 30 games over .500 as they are off to their second-best, 92-game start in franchise history, trailing only their 62-30 start in 2017...a win today would match their 93-game start from last season (62-31).

#ALLSTROSGAME: MLB announced the rosters for the 2018 All-Star Game last night, naming five Astros to the All-Star Game in 2B Jose Altuve, 3B Alex Bregman, RHP Gerrit Cole, OF George Springer and RHP Justin Verlander...this marks the third time that the Astros have had five or more All-Stars on one squad... they had a club-record six All-Stars in 2017 and five in 1994...Houston's five All-Stars in 2018 are tied for tops among all AL clubs (CLE and BOS).

**VS. THE A'S:** After beginning the season series with a loss to the A's on April 27 in Houston, the Astros have won eight straight games against their divisional opponent...this marks the Astros second-longest win streak against the A's in franchise history, trailing only a 10-game run from July 20, 2016-April 28, 2017.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Astros have homered in a season-long 15 straight games, which ties as their third-longest streak in franchise history, last accomplished from June 13-29, 2017...they had one streak longer in 2017, a franchise-record 19-game streak (May 23-June 11).

YESTERDAY'S WIN: The Astros won their sixth straight game yesterday, this time by a score of 2-1, to complete a four-game sweep of the White Sox...LHP Dallas Keuchel (6-8) pitched the Astros to victory after tossing 7.0 innings, allowing just one run on six hits...2B Jose Altuve clubbed his ninth home run of the season, while SS Marwin Gonzalez drove in the winning run on a sacrifice bunt.

**PERFECT AGAINST THE SOX:** The Astros finished the 2018 season series vs. the White Sox with a 7-0 record... this marks the first time in franchise history that the Astros have swept a single opponent in seven gamesor-more in a season...the previous season-best for the club was 6-0 season records against the 2005 Phillies, 2004 Phillies and 2001 Expos.

HIT MACHINE: 2B Jose Altuve leads the Majors in hits (122) and ranks second in batting average (.338)...his 122 hits rank as the third-highest total posted by an Astro prior to the All-Star Game, trailing only his 2014 total (130) and **Bob Watson** and his 123 hits in the first half of the 1973 season.

**CLUTCH CITY:** 1B Yuli Gurriel and 3B Alex Bregman rank first and tied for second in the AL in batting average with runners in scoring position, with Gurriel checking in with a .427 (32x75) average and Bregman a .373 (28x75) mark...these two have accounted for four of the five walkoff hits by the Astros this season.

**LUMBERJACKIN!: DH Evan Gattis** leads the Astros with 62 RBI on the season after totaling just eight RBI thru his first 32 games...since then (May 12), he has tallied 54 RBI, which leads the AL in that span by 10 RBI over **J.D. Martinez** (44 RBI).

**STREAK SNAPPED: 3B Alex Bregman**, the AL Player of the Month for June, had his 12-game hitting streak snapped yesterday...during the run, Bregman hit .429 (21x49) with seven doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.439 OPS.

**COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole** has posted the second-highest strikeout total prior to the All-Star Break in franchise history with 158 strikeouts in his 18 starts...only **RHP Mike Scott** ranks ahead of Cole, as he fanned 167 hitters in 22 starts prior to the 1986 All-Star Game.

AT THE BACK END: The Astros have converted 10 straight 9th-inning save opportunities dating back to May 31... it's been a combination of RHP Héctor Rondón (7 saves) and RHP Ken Giles (3) in the 9th for the Astros since that date, with the two combining to toss 10.2 scoreless innings in those opportunities.

ALL-STAR WORTHY: RHP Collin McHugh has been one of the best relievers in the Majors this season, as he's posted a 4-0 record and a 0.86 ERA (4ER/42IP) with 55 strikeouts in 42 innings pitched...among AL relievers, he ranks first in WHIP (0.74) and second in ERA and in opponent OPS (.449).

**TUCKER TIME:** On Saturday, the Astros called up top prospect **OF Kyle Tucker**, who has started each of the last two games (1x7, BB, RBI) in left field...according to MLB.com, Tucker currently ranks as the No. 8 prospect in baseball.

ACT OF VALOR NOMINATION: RHP Charlie Morton will be honored on the field prior to tonight's game for his 2018 Bob Feller Act of Valor Award nomination...the award is given annually to a Major League player who actively supports service men and women.

**PACK 'EM IN**: The Astros have sold out Minute Maid Park seven times this season, including each of the last two Sunday games...this marks their most sellouts in a single season since the 2008 season (15 sellouts).

- is making his 19th start of the season...has been dominant in his outings, combining to strike out 158 hitters thru his first 18 starts (116.2IP).
- · is 8 strikeouts shy of 900 for his career.
- **K KING COLE**: his 158 strikeouts mark the 2nd-most in club history prior to the All-Star Break of a single season...needs 9 strikeouts to match the club record set by **Mike Scott** (167) in 1986.
- ranks 2nd in the AL in strikeouts and strikeouts per 9.0 innings (12.19), with both marks trailing Chris Sale (176 SO/12.98 SO/9).
- has 5 double-digit strikeout games this season...struck out at least 11 batters in each of those 5 games...prior to this year, had 2 games with 11+ strikeouts in 127 career starts with the Pirates.
- · set an AL record for K's in the month of April this season with 61.
- **VS. OAK:** is set to face the A's for the 4th time this season...has led the Astros to wins in each of his 3 starts against the A's this year, striking out 27 hitters in 18.2 innings pitched.
- **WELCOME TO HOUSTON:** was acquired from the Pirates on Jan. 13, 2018 in exchange for 4 young players: **RHP Michael Feliz**, **OF Jason Martin**, **IF Colin Moran** and **RHP Joe Musgrove**...former #1 overall selection by Pittsburgh in 2011, was the Pirates 2017 Opening Day starter.
- became the first pitcher to start his career with the Astros with 8 consecutive quality starts.
- **AMONG THE LEADERS:** has shown well with his new club as he currently ranks T-3rd in the American League in opponent batting average (.183), 3rd in winning percentage (.818), 6th in WHIP (0.97), 6th in opponent OPS (.587), 8th in ERA, 9th in innings pitched and T-9th in wins.
- over parts of his first 3 starts this season, posted a scoreless inning streak
  of 19.0 innings, the 6th-longest scoreless streak in the AL this season.
- **TOUGH TO SQUARE UP:** his .183 opponent batting average is the 5th-best mark by an Astros starting pitcher prior to the All-Star Break, behind **Hal Woodeshick** (.165 in 1963), **J.R. Richard** (.168 in 1980), **Nolan Ryan** (.1776 in 1983) and **Justin Verlander** (.182 in 2018).
- has been particularly tough on left-handed hitters, allowing them to hit just .182 (37x203) with a .599 OPS (.269 OBP/.330 SLG).
- has struck out 39.9% of all left-handed hitters he has faced, the top mark in baseball directly ahead of teammate Charlie Morton (39.5%).
- **SPRING STREAK:** posted a 7-game winning streak from May 4-June 24, which was the 2nd-longest streak of his career behind an 8-game runs set with the Pirates across 2 seasons (Sept. 7, 2014-April 29, 2015).
- went 6-0 on the road to start his Astros career, joining Justin Verlander (2017-18) and Donne Wall (1995-96) as the only pitchers to start their Astros careers with a 6-game road winning streak.
- **THE ARSENAL:** has virtually scrapped his sinker this season, as 4.3% of his pitches have been sinkers (career-low)...has thrown his curve at a career-high rate (19.5%) and has increased his 4-seam fastball usage from last year (50.1% this year, up from 41.9% last year).
- his 4-seam fastball has been one of his best weapons, as he has allowed a .167 average (32x192) against the pitch (68 strikeouts).
