# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - JULY 11

1967- At Anaheim Stadium, Jimmy Wynn becomes the first Houston player to get a hit in the All-Star Game, singling in the 9th...Rusty Staub later singles in the 11th...LHP Mike Cuellar, the third Astros All-Star, pitches 2.0 shutout innings...the NL wins the marathon, 2-1, on a Tony Perez solo homer in the top of the 15th inning. **TONIGHT'S GAME:** The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros, who have won seven of their last eight games, are in the midst of their longest homestand of the season, an 11-game, 11-day stand, which will take them thru the All-Star Break...speaking of All-Stars, **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (10-3), a 2017 All-Star, will start for the Astros tonight opposite the Athletics.

**30 GAMES UP THRU 94**: The Astros are 30 games over .500 and are off to their second-best, 94-game start in franchise history, trailing only their 63-31 start in 2017.

**#ALLSTROSGAME:** MLB announced the rosters for the 2018 All-Star Game on Sunday, naming five Astros to the All-Star Game in **2B Jose Altuve**, **3B Alex Bregman**, **RHP Gerrit Cole**, **OF George Springer** and **RHP Justin Verlander**...this marks the third time that the Astros have had five or more All-Stars on one squad...they had a club-record six All-Stars in 2017 and five in 1994...Houston's five All-Stars in 2018 are tied for tops among all AL clubs (CLE and BOS).

**10 STARS:** Including the Astros five All-Stars this season, there are 10 players on the Astros roster with All-Star Game appearances...the 2018 five are joined by **RHP Chris Devenski** (2017), **RHP Will Harris** (2016), **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (2015, 2017), **C Brian McCann** (2006-11, 2013) and **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (2017).

HOME COOKING: RHP Lance McCullers Jr. has posted a 4-1 record and a 2.47 ERA (14ER/51IP) in eight starts at Minute Maid Park this season...his career winning percentage and ERA at Minute Maid Park rank as the best in stadium history (min. 200IP). LOWEST ERA AT MMP BEST WIN % AT MMP

LAST NIGHT'S WALKOFF: The Astros walked off a winner last night in 11 innings on a most-bizarre ending involving a missed tag of SS Alex Bregman and a throwing error by C Jonathan Lucroy to secure the Astros a 6-5 comeback victory...Bregman was front and center in the contest as he hammered two solo homers earlier in the game...RHP Justin Verlander (0ER/6IP) tossed 6.0 scoreless frames in his start, while RHP Collin McHugh (1ER/2IP) picked up the win in relief.

**POWER SURGE: IF Alex Bregman** recorded his first career multi-homer game last night, giving him 19 home runs this year, which ties his single-season career high, set in 2017...he now has 11 home runs in his last 24 games and six homers in his last nine home games.

**UP THE CHARTS: RHP Justin Verlander** has amassed 2,576 strikeouts in his career, which ranks 28th in Major League Baseball history...he entered the season ranking 42nd in strikeouts and has moved up 14 spots over the first three months of the season.

**RING NIGHT III:** Due to the record-breaking demand and spectacular response from fans to the second Replica World Champions Rings giveaway presented in June, all ticketed Astros fans in attendance tonight will receive the popular giveaway at gates upon entry... after this giveaway, the Astros will have distributed over 120,000 replica rings.

**BEST SINCE 1944:** The Astros lead the Majors in run differential at +187, which is the best run differential thru the first 94 games of any season since the 1944 Cardinals owned a +228 differential at the 94-game marker...in MLB's expansion era (since 1961), prior to the 2018 Astros, the 1998 Yankees owned the best run differential thru 94 games at +182.

**HIT MACHINE: 2B Jose Altuve** leads the Majors in hits (124) and ranks second in batting average (.335)... his 124 hits are the second-highest total posted by an Astro prior to the All-Star Game, trailing only his 2014 total (130).

**CLUTCH CITY: 1B Yuli Gurriel** and **3B Alex Bregman** rank first and second in the AL in batting average with runners in scoring position, with Gurriel checking in with a .421 (32x76) average and Bregman a .368 (28x76) mark.

**LUMBERJACKINI: DH Evan Gattis** leads the Astros with 62 RBI on the season after totaling just eight RBI thru his first 32 games...since then (May 12), he has tallied 54 RBI, which leads the Majors in that span and leads the AL by seven RBI over **J.D. Martinez** (47 RBI).

HOUSTON TRAFFIC: 3B Alex Bregman, the AL Player of the Month for June, had his 12-game hitting streak snapped on Sunday, has reached base safely in 17 consecutive games...dating back to May 15, Bregman has reached base safely in 48 of his last 49 games.

**TUCKER TIME:** On Saturday, the Astros called up top prospect **OF Kyle Tucker**, who has started each of the last four games (3x14, 2B, BB, RBI) in left field... according to MLB.com, Tucker currently ranks as the No. 8 prospect in baseball.

**ALL-STAR WORTHY: RHP Collin McHugh** has been one of the best relievers in the Majors this season, as he's posted a 5-0 record and a 1.02 ERA (5ER/44IP) with 57 strikeouts...among AL relievers, he ranks first in WHIP (0.73) and second in ERA.

THIS IS HOME: On Monday, at its public Board meeting, the Harris County - Houston Sports Authority Board of Directors voted to approve an extension of the Astros lease at Minute Maid Park through 2050...the home for the Astros since 2000, the original lease agreement was set to expire in March of 2030...the details of the lease extension include a rent increase in the amount of \$1 million beginning this year for the remainder of the original lease (through 2030) and an additional \$1 million increase for the 20-year extension (through 2050)...the majority of these funds will be directed towards maintenance and capital repairs at MMP.

- LAST START 7/6 VS. CWS: had one of the most dominant performances of his career, striking out a career-high 12 batters in an 11-4 Astros win... gave up 1 run on 3 hits over 7.0 innings, walking none.
- took a no-hitter into the 6th inning.
- became the 2nd-youngest pitcher in club history to have a game with 12 strikeouts and no walks (24 years, 277 days)...Larry Dierker is the only one to do it at a younger age, as he had 2 games like this as a 22-year-old in 1969.
- THE DARK KNIGHT: 2017 All-Star is in his 4th Major League campaign...known for his elite strikeout rate, McCullers has not disappointed this season, posting 118 strikeouts thru 18 starts and 108.1 innings.
- is inching closer towards a career high in innings pitched, needing just 17.1 innings to reach 125.2 innings, a career-high set in 2015...has worked 6.0+ innings in 7 consecutive starts for the 1st time in his career.
- WINNING WAYS: has already recorded 10 wins this season, a new single-season career-high...ranks T-7th in the AL in wins.
- is on a season-high tying 4-game winning streak...is 1 win shy of his career-long streak set last season...has made 7 starts during this run, which began on May 31 vs. BOS, posting a 2.60 ERA (13ER/45IP) and 50 strikeouts.
- the 24-year-old is the youngest Astros pitcher to record 10 wins prior to the All-Star Break of a single season since a 24-year-old Wade Miller went 11-3 prior to the break in 2001.
- VS. OAK: has won each of his 3 starts vs. the A's this season...could become the first Astros pitcher to win 4 games against a single opponent in one year since 2016, when Collin McHugh went 4-0 vs. Seattle.
- **GROUND AND POUND:** has become one of the game's elite groundball pitchers... ranks 2nd in the AL in groundball rate (56.6%) and 2nd in groundball to flyball ratio (2.58), trailing **Dallas Keuchel** in both categories (56.7%/2.79).
- posted a 4.00 groundball to flyball ratio in 2017, which ranked 2nd in the Majors behind LHP Dallas Keuchel (4.41) (min. 100IP).
- IT'S ELECTRIC: owns a career 10.07 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (485SO/433.2IP), which ranks 5th in the AL since his debut season of 2015...trails only strikeout artists Chris Sale (11.56), Danny Salazar (10.60), Chris Archer (10.54) and Corey Kluber (10.09).
- has 11 career double-digit strikeout games and is the 2nd pitcher in club history to record 11 double-digit strikeout games prior to turning 25 years old...also **Don Wilson** (16).
- EL CAMBIO: has relied heavily on his curveball throughout his career, but this season, has been throwing his changeup at a career-high rate (17.5%).
- has posted a 21.9% whiff rate on his changeup, the highest rate on any pitch for his career in a single season (ahead of a 21.76% mark on his curveball in 2016)...opponents are 7x58 (.121) with 2 extra-base hits and 20 strikeouts off his changeup this year.
- **SNAP DRAGON:** no pitcher in the Majors has thrown his curveball at a higher rate than McCullers since pitch data was first tracked in 2007...44.2% of all pitches he has thrown in his career have been curves.
- the pitch has averaged 85.8 miles per hour over his career, the hardest curveball thrown by a starter since 2007...is averaging 86.4 mph on his curveball this season, up from 86.0 mph in 2017, with both numbers leading all Major League pitchers.
- HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: has been dominant at home in his career, going 17-5 with a 2.41 ERA...among pitchers with at least 200 innings pitched at MMP, McCullers ranks 1st in both winning percentage (.773) and in ERA.
