WINS AND LOSSES: Texas shut out the Indians, 5-0, on Sunday, and club is 1-2 to begin this 2nd 'half' opening 7-day, 7-game homestand against CLE (1-2) and OAK (4 G)...team snapped a 4-G losing streak on Sunday, but has still dropped 4 of 5, 7 of 9, and 10 of 12...at 4-12 (.250), Texas has the 2nd-lowest win pct. in MLB this month (SD-.235, 4-13)...TEX has more losses this month (4-12) than in entire month of June (14-11)...the 4 wins this month have come against DET (2), BAL (1), and CLE (1), and 2 of the 4 wins have been SHO...team still has a 15-14 record beginning 6/16.

- At 42-58 (.420), Rangers rank 12th in A.L. in winning pct...the 42 wins are the fewest for Texas after 100 games since 2014 (40-60) and 2nd fewest in last 16 seasons (beg. 2004).
- Texas has been under the .500 mark since a season best 1-1 on 3/30...following loss on Saturday, Rangers matched low mark of season at 17 games under .500 (2nd time, also 27-44 thru 6/15)...this was just 4th season in TEX history to be 17+ under as early as 6/15 (last 2007, club-record 6/3)...club lost a season high 7 straight games from 6/7-15 and directly followed that with a 2018 best 7 consecutive wins from 6/16-23.

SERIES STUFF: Rangers are 0-4-1 in last 5 series after having won a season-best 5 consecutive series from 6/15-7/1...team is still 6-3-1 in last 10 series in Arlington, only losses in that span to the Astros (0-4 from 6/7-10; 0-2 from 7/3-4)...the Rangers have gone 11-21 in series openers, but have won the 1st game in 6 of their last 9 series.

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas is 23.0 GB of division-leading HOU, gaining ground yesterday for the 1st time since an off day on 7/12...club was season high 24.0 GB following loss on Saturday, the 2nd-earliest date ever for Rangers to have a 24-game deficit (6/4 in 2001) and just the 10th season overall in club history to have a deficit so large...only other season with a 24+ game deficit in last 16 seasons (beg. 2004) was 2014...club has lost 6.5 games in the standings over the last 19 days...current deficit is 3rd-largest in the majors...club has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 104 days and in either 4th or 5th place for 114 of 115 days (T2nd following win on 3/30).

AT HOME: Texas is 20-30 (.400) in Arlington this season, 4th-lowest home win pct. in A.L. and 6th-lowest in MLB...team snapped 5-G home losing streak yesterday...the 5-G losing streak was preceded by a 6-1 stretch in Arlington from 6/16-6/30...team is 7-6 in last 13 at home, this after a 5-G losing skid from 6/7-15, and are 13-13 in last 26 G after opening year at 5-15...overall 20-30 record is 2nd-slowest 50-G start at home in TEX history (19-31 in 2014).

THE SWINGIN' A'S: The Rangers are 5-4 vs. OAK in '18, only A.L. West opponent with a winning record against...TEX has won 3 straight and 4 of last 6 vs. A's, and have a 3-2 mark in Arlington...Rangers have gone 23-20 vs. OAK beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, and Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Rangers went 7-3 vs. the A's at home last season, and have won 14 of last 21 meetings in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 366-356, and holds leads of 194-168 in Arlington and 106-101 at Globe Life Park...this is the 3rd straight series between the clubs to be played at Globe Life Park, as each of final 2 meetings will be at the Coliseum (8/20-22 and 9/7-9).

- This week's series with the A's will start a run of 7 consecutive games against division opponents, this after just 2 games vs. the A.L. West since 6/11.

HOT IN HERE: Despite a forecasted cold front this week, the Rangers are still projected to have a first pitch temperature of greater than 100 degrees tonight for the 4th consecutive game...the last longer streak of 100 degree first pitches for Texas was 6 straight games, 7/28-8/2/12.

ODOR NAMED A.L. PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Rougned Odor has been selected as the A.L. Player of the Week for the period ending 7/22...Odor is the 1st Ranger to be selected for the award since Adrián Beltré for 7/24-30/17...it marks the 3rd time Odor has won the league's weekly award, also taking the honors for 8/27-9/4/16 and 7/20-26/15...Odor went 8-for-13 (.615) with a HR, 3 RBI, and 2 R in the weekend series against Cleveland, and he ranks among A.L. leaders in hits (1st, 8) and total bases (2nd, 11) since the All-Star break...his 3 SB in the second 'half' are the most in MLB.

ODOR OF LATE: Rougned Odor matched season highs in both hits (3) and RBI (3) on Sunday afternoon...Odor is now batting .364/.438/.582/1.019 (20-55) with 3 HR and 8 RBI in July to raise his season average from .229 to .259, highest since Opening Day...in his last 47 G since 5/24, Odor is batting .299/.374/.467/.841 (50-167), posting the 4th-highest OPS among ML second baseman (min. 165 PA) in that span behind only Jose Altuve (.930), Javier Baez (.894), and Scooter Gennett (.845).

SHUTOUT: The Rangers have posted 3 shutouts in 2018, including a pair of shutouts in the month of July...Texas is tied for the 2nd-most SHO in the majors this month...this is the 1st time Texas has posted multiple shutouts in a single month since July 2017 (2).

TURN THE PAGE: Yesterday's shutout came after Texas pitching allowed 25 runs in the 1st 2 G of the series with the Indians...the 25 runs scored by the Tribe in the 1st 2 games of the weekend series matched the most ever against Texas in 2 contests preceding a shutout (also 6/9-11/14, 25 R by CLE/MIA before Rangers' 6-0 SHO on 6/11 vs. MIA)...Texas also allowed 16 runs in Saturday's loss, just 3rd instance in club history to allow 16+ R in game prior to a SHO...the others: 9/4-5/05 at KC/MIN - lost 17-8 at The K, then won 7-0 at Metrodome and 4/20-21/07 vs. OAK - lost 16-4 then won next game 7-0.

RUA IN RESERVE: Ryan Rua has 2 home runs off the bench this season (2-R HR yesterday and pinch-hit 3-R HR on 7/13 at BAL)...Rua joins Mitch Moreland (2012), David Murphy (2013), and Leonys Martin (2015) as the only Rangers with multiple HR off the bench in a single season since 2006 (all hit 2 HR)...Rua is the only A.L. player this season with multiple home runs as a sub.

RUNNING RANGERS: Texas swiped a season-high 4 stolen bases yesterday, most since another 4 steal game on 9/1/17 vs. LAA...the Rangers have 15 stolen bases in their 1st 16 this month, 2nd-most in the A.L. and T3rd in MLB (CLE-19; MIL-17; PIT-15)...the 15 stolen bases this month already matches the clubs total for the entire month of June.

HIP HIP JOSÉ: José Leclerc has held opponents 2-for-32 with 17 strikeouts over his last 10 outings after a scoreless inning of relief yesterday...Leclerc has 31 SO in 17.0 IP since 5/30, and his 16.41 SO/9 in that span is highest in MLB...Leclerc ranks among the overall A.L. relief leaders in opponent average (2nd, .138), opponent OPS (3rd, .454), and SO/9 (7th, 13.11).

SHORTS: Elvis Andrus enters tonight's game with 1,499 career hits...Adrián Beltré is batting .368 (7-19) with 6 BB, 2 HR, and 6 RBI in his career vs. Brett Anderson, highest average of any active player vs. Anderson (min. 20 PA)...Cole Hamels has a 2.93 ERA (26 ER/80.0 IP) in 13 night starts, 9th-lowest in the A.L....yesterday was Delino DeShields' 6th career game of 2+ R, 2+ BB, and 2+ SB, 4 more than any other player in Texas history...Joey Gallo has 3 OF assists in his 1st 2 career starts in RF, T10th-most among A.L. right fielders...the Rangers have used 4 pitchers in each of their 3 shutouts this season.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#35 Cole Hamels, LHP
(5-8, 4.36)

TONIGHT: The 34-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season in tonight's series opener against Oakland...leads Texas starters in starts (19), innings (109.1), ERA (4.36), and opp. average (.251)...despite win in last outing, has gone 1-2 with a 9.53 ERA (18 ER/17.0 IP) in last 4 starts to raise season ERA from 3.41 to 4.36, highest since 4/24 (4.41)...last started and earned the win in the Rangers' 5-4 victory on 7/13 at BAL (6.1 IP, 4 R-ER)...has gone 5-2, 2.93 (26 ER/80.0 IP) in night games this season, 9th-lowest ERA in A.L.... Rangers are 7-12 in his starts, w/ 17 of 19 games decided by 3 runs or less.... in his 10 starts from 4/24-6/19, Hamels went 3-3 with a 2.81 ERA (20 ER/64.0 IP), 9th-lowest ERA in A.L. during that span...has allowed 2 ER or less in 8 of last 14 starts, including streak of 5 straight from 4/24-5/22, longest by a Ranger in 2018...opponents have swung and missed on 27.0% of pitches, an increase of nearly 6 pct. points from 2017 (21.6%)...despite being slowed by a lengthy disabled list stint in 2017, still posted his 9th career double-digit win total...earned the wins in each of the Rangers' division-clinching games in 2015 and 2016... made 4th career Opening Day start this season, becoming the 10th different pitcher to start multiple openers for Texas...joined the Rangers in a 7/31/15 trade after 9 1/2 seasons with the Phillies, ranking in the team's top 6 all-time in wins, starts, innings, and strikeouts...signed a 6-year contract extension on 7/25/12, taking him through 2018, with a club/vesting option for 2019.

LUCKY 20: Hamels is slated to reach the the 20-start mark tonight for the 13th straight season (2006-2018), as he has done so each year since debuting in '06... will join Sabathia (16), Colon (15), Verlander (13), Shields (13), and Greinke (13) as active pitchers with 13-or-more seasons of 20+ starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Hamels is averaging 8.97 SO/9 this season, highest rate among Texas starters and 18th-highest in the A.L...strikeout of LAA's Michael Hermsillo in 5th inning on 6/2 was 2300th of career...with 2336 career K's, joins Sabathia (2923), Verlander (2599), Colon (2518), Hernández (2436), Greinke (2373), and Scherzer (2338) as active pitchers to surpass the 2300 milestone.

• Has recorded a strikeout in 320 straight games, the 9th-longest streak in ML history...next on the list is Pedro Martínez (329)...streak dates to 5/31/08, as he last failed to record a strikeout on 5/25/18 at HOU (4.0 IP, 6 R-ER, 0 SO) w/ PHI.

LAST START: Earned the win in the Rangers' 5-4 victory on 7/13 at BAL (6.1 IP, 5 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 81 pitches/53 strikes)...exited leading 5-1 with bases loaded and one out...Caleb Joseph followed with a 3-run double off José Leclerc, and all 3 runs were charged to Hamels...retired side in order in each of 1st 3 innings...was supported by a pinch-hit, 3-run homer by Ryan Rua in the 7th... recorded a strikeout in his 320th consecutive game, passing David Cone for the 9th-longest such streak in ML history.

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 3-4 with a 3.96 ERA (23 ER/52.1 IP) in 9 G/GS career vs. OAK, QS in 5 of 9...has faced the A's twice this season, once in Oakland and once in Arlington, going 1-1, 2.38 (3 ER/11.1 IP) with 5 BB/16 SO...earned 1st win of 2018 in Rangers' 4-1 victory on 4/3 vs. OAK (5.0 IP, 1 R-ER, 11 SO)...recorded 1st 8 outs via strikeout, 1st Rangers pitcher ever to do so...the 11 SO are most in outing of 5.0-innings-or-less in WAS/TEX franchise history (since 1961)...took the loss in a 3-2 Texas defeat on 4/24 vs. OAK (6.1 IP, 2 R-ER, 5 SO)...Hamels left with game tied 1-1 before Matt Bush allowed inherited runner to score.

IN ARLINGTON: Hamels is 1-6 with a 5.83 ERA (35 ER/54.0 IP) in 9 G/GS in Arlington this season, 2nd-highest home ERA in A.L. (7.53-CWS' Giolito)...home ERA is nearly 3 runs higher than road figure (2.93)...is winless in last 4 home starts at 0-3, 7.99 (21 ER/23.2 IP), with last win coming on 5/22 vs. NYY (7.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...has allowed 14 of 21 home runs at home...has lost 5 straight home starts to A.L. West opponents dating to last season, last win on 9/11/17 vs. SEA (6.0 IP, 3 R-ER)...opponents have batted .279/.345/.535/.879 at home compared to .222/.315/.382/.697 on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one-or-zero runs of support in 11 of 19 starts overall in 2018...has not received more than 2 runs in support in 14 of 19 starts... received 5 runs in last start, most since 5/22 vs. NYY (6), to raise season RSA from 2.88 to 3.13, still 3rd-lowest in A.L. (2.81-DET's Fulmer, 2.88-BAL's Cashner)...last season, Hamels' 7.18 RSA would have ranked highest in MLB if he qualified...Hamels is 4-0 in 5 GS in '18 when receiving 3+ runs of support.

2018: Has lost 8 of his last 13 decisions and 12 of last 19 for Texas dating back to 2017, this after opening his Rangers career with a 31-7 record in 1st 38 decisions...8 losses in 2018 are tied w/ Colon for most on staff and T9th in A.L... is T1st in MLB with 11 hit batsmen (also CWS' Giolito) and T4th in MLB with 21 home runs allowed through 19 starts, this after 11 HBP and 18 HR allowed in 24 starts last season...Chirinos has caught 17 starts (5-6, 3.93), Pérez caught start on 6/7 vs. HOU (0-1, 6.14), and Kiner-Falefa caught 7/1 vs. CWS (0-1, 12.60)... opposition batting .251/.330/.460/.790 overall...opponents batting .233 (21-90) with RISP, including 7-for-19 in last 3 starts after going 8-for-46 (.174) w/ RISP in prior 10 starts...batters leading off game are 5-for-15 w/ 3 HR, 4 BB, 3 SO...opponent avg. by PA in game: 1st PA: .212 (32-151), 2nd time: .224 (32-143), 3rd time: .311 (38-122), 4th time: 4-for-6...had 11 strikeouts on 4/3 at OAK, most by any pitcher in an outing of 5.0 innings-or-less in Washington/Texas franchise history (since 1961)...recorded his 1st 8 outs via strikeout, 1st Rangers pitcher to ever do that and 2nd in franchise history to Senators' Jim Duckworth did it for Washington (1st 8) on 9/4/65 at DET in Tiger Stadium (credit Elias Sports Bureau)...carried
