ASHBY

- The Colorado Rockies continue a five-game Interleague homestand tonight with the second of a three-game series against the Oakland Athletics, the final home Interleague series of the 2018 season.
- Won 3-1 last night behind Kyle Freeland's six shutout innings ... Nolan Arenado hit his 26th home run of the season, his 100th career home run at Coors Field ... is the seventh player in franchise history to hit 100 or more homers at Coors Field.

12TH STREET

- Split a two-game series against the Houston Astros to begin the homestand ... have now gone seven consecutive series without a series loss (last series loss: June 26-28 at San Francisco, 1-2) ... that is their second-longest streak in franchise history without losing a series (longest: nine, April 30-May 28, 2017) ... prior to the split with Houston, had won six consecutive series against teams at .500 or above, their longest series winning streak since 2014 and the first time in franchise history that they won six consecutive series against teams at or above .500.

ROCKRIDGE

- On Thursday, the Rockies announced that they acquired right-handed reliever Seunghwan Oh from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for Minor League infielder Chad Spanberger, Minor League outfielder Forrest Wall and a player to be named later.
- Oh, 36, went 4-3 with two saves, a 2.68 ERA (47.0 IP, 14 ER) 10 walks and 55 strikeouts in 48 relief appearances with Toronto this season.

19TH STREET

- The Rockies are 21-9 since June 19, a .700 winning percentage that is the best in the NL and the third-best in MLB (Oakland's .758 winning percentage is best) ... have won 17 of their last 22 games since June 28.
- Of the 20 series remaining in the Rockies season, 16 are against teams currently at or above .500, including each of the next eight series.

LAKE MERRITT

- Since June 19, the Rockies have posted a 3.62 team ERA (266.1 IP, 107 ER), the third-lowest ERA in the National League over that span.

- Rockies starters have a 3.49 ERA (178.0 IP, 69 ER) over that span, second-lowest in the NL ... have surrendered only 14 home runs since June 19, the fewest in the NL.

FRUITVALE

- Since June 19, the Rockies rank second in the NL with a .279 team batting average and third with 47 home runs ... rank second in the NL and fifth in MLB with 5.53 runs per game over that span.

SAN LEANDRO

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended on June 18 the Rockies have gone 14-4 at Coors Field.
- Over that 18-game span, have outscored opponents 111-70 ... have posted a 3.48 team ERA over that span, a 3.13 ERA by the starters and a 4.19 ERA by the bullpen.
- Have averaged 6.2 runs per game while batting .305.

LAFAYETTE

- Colorado is 9-5 in Interleague play this season, including 6-2 at Coors Field ... a win tonight or tomorrow would tie their franchise record for home Interleague wins in a single season (also: 2004, 2006).
- Colorado is 158-194 all-time in Interleague play ... the Rockies are 99-81 at home, 59-113 on the road ... Colorado is 13-11 the past 24 road games vs. the AL, including 3-3 this year.

COLISEUM

- The Rockies are playing the Athletics for the first time since 2015 (2-1 series loss in Oakland), their first time at Coors Field since June 12-14, 2012 (3-0 Oakland sweep).
- Carlos González made his Major League debut with Oakland on May 30, 2008 and played 85 games with them prior to his November 10 trade to Colorado (along with Greg Smith and Huston Street) in exchange for Matt Holliday.
- Brett Anderson was acquired by Colorado from Oakland on Dec. 10, 2013 in exchange for Chris Jensen and Drew Pomeranz ... made eight starts for the Rockies in 2013, going 1-3 with a 2.91 ERA (43.1 IP, 14 ER) prior to becoming a free agent on Nov. 1.
- Jonathan Lucroy was acquired by the Rockies from the Texas Rangers on July 30 of last season for a player to be named later (Pedro Gonzalez) ... he batted .310 (44-for-142) in 46 games for Colorado prior to signing with Oakland as a free agent on March 12 of this year.
- Matt Chapman (class of 2011) was teammates with Nolan Arenado (class of 2009) at El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

NORTH BERKELEY

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (82) and also leads MLB in runs allowed in the first (88).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 30 home runs in the first inning, while their 25 home runs allowed are the second-most in MLB ... Nolan Arenado's 11 first-inning home runs and 28 RBI lead MLB.

WALNUT CREEK

- Trevor Story is batting .355 (55-for-155) in 39 games since June 8, the highest batting average in the Major Leagues over that span ... has hit .403 (27-for-67) on the road over that span, which also leads MLB.
- Had his career-best 13-game hitting streak snapped Tuesday, the longest streak by a Rockies player this season.

ORINDA

- Nolan Arenado leads the NL with 26 home runs and ranks third with 74 RBI ... also ranks second in slugging percentage (.591), fifth in on-base percentage (.390) and ninth in batting average (.308).

EL CERRITO PLAZA

- Ian Desmond has recorded a hit in 12-straight games, the second-longest active streak in MLB and his longest hitting streak since 2015 (13 games).
- In 45 games since June 1, is batting .296 (48-for-162) with a .380 on-base percentage and a .556 slugging percentage.

HAYWARD

- Kyle Freeland (5.0) and Tyler Anderson (4.1) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, among NL pitchers in Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball Reference*).

BACK WHERE YOU BELONG

- The 23 year-old right-hander was recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque on July 3 ... reinstated prior to his last start on July 22 after he was placed on the 10-day disabled list on July 13 with a blister on his right middle finger.
- Was a member of his second career Opening Day roster, breaking with the club as a reliever ... made 10 relief appearances for the Rockies before being optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque on May 2 ... went 2-1 with a 6.23 ERA (17.1 IP, 12 ER), six walks and 14 strikeouts.
- Was scored upon in five of 10 relief appearances, allowing multiple runs four times ... worked two or more innings five times.

LAST TIME OUT

- Made his third start of the season at Arizona on July 22 ... recorded his second loss as a starter after allowing four runs on five hits with two walks and six strikeouts across 5.1 innings ... allowed one in the first, two in the fourth and one in the sixth ... pulled after one out walk in the sixth inning, which came around to score.

HELLO TO THE OTHER SIDE

- Will make his first career start against Oakland, his second Interleague start of the season ... took the loss on July 8 at Seattle after allowing six runs on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in six innings of work.
- In seven career Interleague appearances, six starts is 1-3 with a 6.19 ERA (32.0 IP, 22 ER) ... in two Interleague starts at home has gone 1-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 IP, 7 ER).

ONE TO REMEMBER

- In his last relief appearance prior to his option, April 27 at Miami, pitched 3.2 scoreless innings of relief in the 1-0 Rockies win ... entered the game after Tyler Anderson left in the second inning due to lightheadedness ... the 3.2 innings were a career-high in relief.
- Recorded an RBI double in the fifth inning, the only run in the 1-0 win ... according to STATS he became the first relief pitcher in Rockies history and the first in the Major League since Joe Niekro on Aug. 23, 1980 to earn the win and drive in the game's only run in a 1-0 victory ... it was also the first game in Rockies history in which all runs were driven in by a relief pitcher.

HOME GROWN

- Will be making his second start at home this season ... his last start was an 8-1 win, going seven scoreless innings and allowing three hits with no walks and four strikeouts against the Giants.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 IP, 6 ER) in five appearances, one start, at Coors Field this season ... went 1-0 with a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP, 6 ER) in his four relief appearances at home.
- In 24 career appearances at Coors Field, including 12 starts, has gone 10-3 with a 4.88 ERA (94.0 IP, 51 ER), 29 walks and 60 strikeouts.
- His .769 winning percentage at Coors Field is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 12 starts).
- In his 12 starts at Coors Field, is 9-3 with a 4.63 ERA (72.0 IP, 37 ER), 21 walks and 42 strikeouts ... has allowed 13 home runs.

ONE FOR THE ROAD

- Is 1-3 with a 7.08 ERA (20.1 IP, 16 ER) in eight relief appearances, two starts, on the road this season ... 0-2 with a 7.94 ERA (11.1 IP, 10 ER) as a starter.
- In 25 career road appearances, including 11 starts, has gone 3-5 with a 4.83 ERA (76.1 IP, 41 ER), 29 walks and 68 strikeouts ... has only allowed seven career home runs on the road.
- As a starter on the road, is 2-4 with a 5.49 ERA (57.1 IP, 35 ER).

SOMETIMES ALBUQUERQUE

- Made eight starts with Triple-A Albuquerque, going 3-1 with a 2.15 ERA (37.2 IP, 9 ER), 12 walks and 42 strikeouts ... allowed three runs one time, two runs or less seven times ... logged three quality starts.
- Last started on June 28 vs. Sacramento ... pitched 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

GOOD YEAR, ROOK

- Made the Rockies Opening Day roster in 2017 and made 20 starts and 16 relief appearances ... went 10-5 with a 5.03 ERA (111.0 IP, 62 ER) across his 20 starts.
- Was named the National League Rookie of the Month for April after going 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (32.0 IP, 10 ER) ... finished the month first among Major League rookie pitchers in ERA and innings pitched, tied for first in wins and tied for fourth in strikeouts ... pitched seven innings in three consecutive starts April 11-22, becoming the first Rockies pitcher since Jhoulys Chacin in 2013 to accomplish the feat.
- Pitched eight shutout innings May 26 vs. St. Louis, his longest career outing, allowing five hits with no walks and three strikeouts.
- Moved to the bullpen in September and went 0-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 IP, 8 ER).

The 24-year-old right-hander will make his 21st start of the season, 11th at home ... was reinstated from the paternity list Friday ... did not factor into the Rockies' 11-10 win at Arizona on July 20 ... allowed six runs (five earned) on eight hits with three walks and six strikeouts in five innings pitched ... is 3-0 (Rockies 4-0) with a 3.24 ERA (25.0 IP, 9 ER) over his last four starts ... is 3-5 with a 7.31 ERA (48.0 IP, 39 ER) in 10 starts at Coors Field this year ... logged his second home quality start his last outing at home, July 11 vs. Arizona ... will make his first career start vs. Oakland ... has made one Interleague start this season, winning at Seattle on July 6 (6.0, 5, 1, 1, 0, 5) ... 3-0 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP, 10 ER) in six career Interleague starts.

- Leads the National League with 26 homers after hitting his 100th at Coors Field Friday vs. Oakland ... third in the league with 74 RBI ... among league leaders in total bases (217-1st), slugging percentage (.591-2nd), multi-hit games (39-2nd), runs (68-T3), on-base percentage (.390-5th), batting average (.308-9th) and hits (113-T8) ... ranks first in MLB with a .413 (52-for-126) batting average vs. left-handed pitchers.
- His .335 career batting average with RISP is second among active MLB players and fourth in the Majors since 1974 behind Tony Gwynn, Rod Carew and Joey Votto (STATS).
- Second behind Trevor Story in the NL with 15 home runs at home ... leads NL with .362 home batting average.
