THE LATEST:

- Last night, the Blue Jays lost for the second straight night in Oakland, falling, 6-2, to the A's...Have now dropped two of their last three sets and are 2-5-5 in their last 12 series...Need a win today to avoid being swept for the 5th time this year in a 3+ game series (last: July 23-25 vs. MIN).
- The Jays finished July at 9-15...Are 18-20 in their last 37 games, as well as 22-23 over their last 45...Are now 5.5 games back of the Rays and remain at a season mark of 25.5 games behind the division-leading Red Sox...Have not been further back of 1st place since the end of the 2009 campaign, finishing 28.0 games back of the Yankees...Are now 10 games below .500, last hitting that point at the end of the 2017 campaign (76-86)...Have not been further than 10 games below the even mark since Sept. 30, 2017 (75-86).

SMOAKING SOMETHING:

Justin Smoak notched his 17th home run of the season last night, tying Yangervis Solarte for the team lead with a solo shot...Was his 10th road homer, which includes each of his last five blasts...Is now tied for 5th among switch-hitters with his 17 HR...Among AL first basemen, ranks 1st in OBP (.359), 3rd in SLG (.468) and 4th in HR (15 as a first baseman).

MORALES ON MORE LAST MONTH:

- *Kendrys Morales went 2-for-2 last night on a pair of singles, drew two walks and drove in a run...Reached base four times in a game for the 3rd time this season (last: July 13 at BOS)...Now has 24 multi-hit games, 2nd most on the team (Solarte-26)...Over his last 20 contests, has gone 23-for-64 (.359) with 4-2B, 4-HR and 10-RBI, along with 14BB/13K for a .475 OBP and a 1.084 OPS.
- Morales finished the month of July with an on-base percentage of .459, 2nd best among AL batters...Also ranked 10th in AVG (.338).

LEFT COAST LIFESTYLE:

- This afternoon marks the 6th game of Toronto's longest road trip of the season, playing 10 games in a 10-day span...After this three-game series in Oakland, will complete the trip with four dates in Seattle (63-44).
- ◆The Jays are now 2-3 on the current road trip...Have gone 4-9 in their last 13 road games and are 8-19 since May 29...Have an overall road record of 21-30...The .412 win% ranks 10th among AL clubs and is their lowest since 2012 (.395)...Have been out-scored, 274-228, and out-hit, 480-412, during away contests...Have averaged 4.47 runs/game on the road (8th highest in the AL) while allowing 5.37 R/G (13th in the AL)... Have averaged 1.35 HR/road game, tied for 4th best in the AL.

BLUE JAYS vs. THE ATHLETICS:

All-Time: 195-223...All-Time, On The Road: 99-111...2018: 0-6

- The Blue Jays were swept by the A's in a four-game series the last time they met, back at Rogers Centre in May...Have gone 4-11 in Oakland since the start of 2014 while going 12-5 at home...Have been out-scored, 43-15, while losing all six games vs. the Athletics this year, their longest streak against them since Aug. 18, 1998-Aug. 15, 1999 (7G)...Have never been swept by Oakland across an entire season...Their only other one-win year vs. OAK was 1994 (1-5).
- Kendrys Morales leads all current Blue Jays with 22 career home runs and 62 RBI vs. Oakland...Has gone 25-for-88 (.284) with 3-2B, 4-HR and 12-RBI in 24 games against them since 2015 (.825 OPS).
- ◆Yangervis Solarte went 7-for-18 (.389) in the 4G series against the A's earlier this year, including a pair of doubles, a home run and four RBI... Has hits in six of his last seven games against them, dating back to 2015 (9-for-30, .300 AVG).
- Justin Smoak has gone 21-for-78 (.269) vs. OAK over the last four seasons, with 2-2B, 7-HR, 15-RBI and 14BB/22K across 23 games (.564 SLG, .945 OPS).

RANDAL RIPPING:

*Randal Grichuk doubled in the 1st inning last night and came around to score Toronto's 1st run of the game...Has nine extra-base hits in his last 12 games (6-2B, 3-HR)...Over that span, has gone 13-for-46 for a line of .283/.365/.609 (.974 OPS).

GETTING BUFF:

Voladimir Guerrero Jr. made his Triple-A debut last night in Buffalo... Walked in each of his first three plate appearances and drove in a run in his next PA with a sacrifice fly...With last night's effort, his 61 games at Double-A New Hampshire and some rehab work in the GCL (3G) and FSL (1G), the 19 year old is now hitting .399 (99-for-248) this season with 22-2B, 1-3B, 14-HR, 63-RBI and 25BB/28K (.451 OBP, 1.116 OPS).

BACK IN THE SHOW:

Brandon Cumpton was added to the Blue Jays' roster last night and made his team debut as he took the mound to start the 5th inning... Lasted 1.2 innings and allowed a lone run on three hits (2BB, 2K)...Was his first MLB action since Sept. 13, 2014 vs. CHC.

THIS AND THAT:

Blue Jay batters recorded another two-base hit last night and have now doubled in 15 consecutive games (31-2B), matching their longest such stretch this year (also April 22- May 6)...Last had a longer streak last season, a 25-game stretch from Aug. 25-Sept. 20, which was the 11th longest in team history.

NOT SO WILD ABOUT THE WEST:

◆The Jays are now 8-17 against AL West clubs this season...The .320 win% ranks 13th among AL teams and is their 2nd lowest in a season all-time (23-49, .319 in 1977).

PITCHING IN:

*Toronto pitchers finished the month of July with an ERA of 5.31 (12th in the AL) and a .279 OBA (13th)...Struck out 212 batters (7th) while issuiing 80 walks (9th).

Marcus Stroman, RHP # 6

Born: Medford, NY AGE: 27

TODAY'S START:

- Making his 15th start of the season...Coming off winning back-to-back starts for the first time this season on 7/27 at CWS, where he allowed 2 ER on 7 hits over 6.2 innings (1BB, 3K)...Is 2-4 with a 4.53 ERA (23 ER/45.2 IP) over his last 8 road starts.
- Now has a 2.98 ERA in 7 starts since his DL stint (14 ER/42.1 IP)... Had a 7.71 ERA (32 ER/37.1 IP) in his 7 starts prior.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Ranks 1st among MLB pitchers with a groundball rate of 63.0% since the start of last season.
- Before being placed on the disabled list on 5/9, posted a 0-5 record and a 7.71 ERA across 7 starts...Since being reinstated on 6/23, holds a 4-2 record and 2.98 ERA over 7 starts.
- Made his 100th career start on 7/10 at ATL...Earned his 1st road win of the season after throwing 7.0 IP and allowing 1ER on 6 hits (2BB, 5K)... Stroman also singled in his first at-bat of the season... Was his 3rd career hit, to go with a pinch-hit double and a home run last season...Has gone 3-for-10 (.300) as a batter since the start of last year...The three hits in that time are the most by an AL pitcher other than Shohei Ohtani, and are tied for 2nd most in Blue Jays history (Happ-4, Halladay-3, Williams-3).
- Earned his 1st win of the season on 6/29 vs DET...Also recorded his 500th career strikeout with a K of James McCann in the 5th inning...Became the 21st player to record 500 SO as a Blue Jay... Snapped his career-long streak of 6 consecutive lost decisions... Allowed 2 runs on 5 hits across 7.0 innings, matching his longest outing of the year (5/2 at MIN)...Recorded 4 strikeouts without issuing a free pass for his first walk-free start since 9/2/17 at BAL
- Was reinstated from the disabled list on 6/23 and threw his 1st scoreless start of the year that night at LAA, allowing 6 hits through 5.0 IP (1BB, 5K).
- Was placed on the 10-Day disabled list from 5/9-6/22 with right shoulder fatigue.
- Allowed 5 runs on 9 hits over 5.0 innings on 5/8 vs. SEA (2BB, 2K)...The 9 hits matched a season high (also 4/13 at CLE).
- Tied a season-high 7.0 IP on 5/2 at MIN and allowed 2 runs on 6 hits for his 1st quality start of the year.
- Played in his 100th career game (94th start) vs. TEX (4/27)...
 Allowed 6 ER in back-to-back starts for the 2nd time in his career (also May 28 (7) and June 4, 2016 (6)).
- Allowed 5 runs on 6 hits over 4.2 innings on 4/7 vs. TEX...Walked 5 batters, 1 shy of career high (7/17/17 vs. OAK)...Was his 1st career game recording more balls than strikes (51-44).
