RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers were shut out by the Athletics, 1-0, in 13 innings on Friday night at the Oakland Coliseum. Blaine Hardy started for Detroit and threw 7.0 shutout innings, giving up just one hit with two walks and six strikeouts. Buck Farmer took the loss after allowing one run on two hits in 1.2 innings. Offensively, Nicholas Castellanos and José Iglesias each had two hits, while Jeimer Candelario and James McCann each added one hit. The Tigers and Athletics play the second game of their three-game series tonight. Following the three games in Oakland, the road trip continues with a three-game set at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8).

THE HARDY BOY: Blaine Hardy turned in his best outing of the season last night, throwing 7.0 shutout innings with one hit allowed, two walks and six strikeouts. Hardy carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning until Jed Lowrie's infield single broke up the no-hit bid, which was the longest of Hardy's career. Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in eight-of-11 starts this season, posting a 3.53 ERA (58.2IP/23ER) and 40 strikeouts.

START ME UP: With Blaine Hardy's 7.0 scoreless innings in last night's game, Detroit starting pitchers have now thrown 17.0 consecutive shutout frames, which is the longest streak since posting 18.0 straight scoreless innings from June 14-16. Since the All-Star break, Tigers starters have compiled a 3.10 ERA (61.0IP/21ER), which is the third-lowest ERA in the Majors in that stretch, trailing only Boston (1.82 ERA) and Houston (2.96 ERA).

TIGERS TIDBITS: José Iglesias had a pair of hits in last night's game and has now hit safely in six of his last seven contests. Over the seven-game stretch, Iglesias is hitting .348 (8x23) with five runs scored, four doubles, one home run and six RBI...Victor Alcántara threw 2.0 shutout innings with one strikeout last night. Alcántara has not allowed a run in seven of his eight appearances this season, posting a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP/1ER) and limiting opponents to a .222 (8x36) batting average.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 34th onerun game of the season last night, falling to 17-17 in those contests with a 1-0 loss in 13 innings. Detroit's 34 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 44 and Seattle, 41). In addition to the 34 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 22 games that have been decided by two runs.

ZIP, ZERO, ZILCH, NADA: The Tigers suffered their Major League leading 14th shutout of the season last night at Oakland. Detroit's 14 shutouts are the most the team has had in a season since 2003, when the Tigers were shut out 17 times.

V-MART GETS ALL A'S VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez has posted impressive numbers in his career against the Athletics. Entering tonight's game, Martinez is hitting .347 (110x317) with 27 runs scored, 23 doubles, seven home runs and 37 RBI in 85 career games vs. Oakland. Martinez leads all active players with a .347 batting average, while he is third with a .402 on-base percentage and ninth with a .486 slugging percentage. In 40 career games at the Oakland Coliseum, Martinez has a .344 (53x154) batting average with eight runs scored, 10 doubles, two home runs and 16 RBI.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-1 on their current sixgame road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (0-1) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8). Detroit is 18-36 on the road this season and has lost 16 of its last 21 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .230 (429x1864) on the road in 2018,

while the pitching staff has compiled a $4.68\ ERA\ (461.1IP/240ER).$

TIGERS AND A'S: Detroit is 0-5 against the Athletics this season after dropping the series opener last night. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost 10 straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's longest losing streak against the franchise since dropping 10 consecutive games to the Philadelphia Athletics from May 19-June 28, 1931.

WESTWORLD: Detroit is 10-16 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 31 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-78, .376).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 47-63 (.427) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,115-1,102 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks tied for 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his 15th start of 2018 tonight at

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann lost his third consecutive start on Sunday vs. Cleveland, allowing five runs on six hits with one walk and two strikeouts

VS. OAKLAND: Zimmermann has made three career starts against the Athletics, posting a 1-0 record with a 2.60 (17.1IP/5ER) and eight strikeouts. He started against Oakland earlier this season on June 25 at Comerica Park and received a no decision after throwing 5.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Zimmermann has started 115 career games on the road and has posted a 40-38 record with a 3.81 ERA (685.0IP/290ER) and 579 strikeouts. In eight road starts this season, Zimmermann has a 2-2 record with a 5.15 ERA (36.2IP/21ER) and 31 strikeouts.

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Zimmermann is making his second career start at Oakland Coliseum tonight. His only other start at the venue was on May 6, 2017, when he did not factor in the decision after allowing four runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Zimmermann has made 13 starts in his career against teams from the American League West and has a 5-4 record with a 2.98 ERA (84.2IP/28ER) and 55 strikeouts. In two starts vs. AL West teams this season, Zimmermann is 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA (13.0IP/1ER) and 14 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST: Zimmermann has made 37 career starts during the month of August, posting a 15-12 record with a 4.33 ERA (216.0IP/104ER) and 183 strikeouts. In six August starts last season, Zimmermann went 2-3 with a 7.44 ERA (32.2IP/27ER) and 17 strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT ZIMM'S JULY: Zimmermann started five games during July and went 2-3 with a 4.55 ERA (29.2IP/15ER) and 28 strikeouts

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (700x2733) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .267 (742x2776) against him. In 14 starts this season,

righties are hitting .268 (37x138), while lefthanded batters are hitting .254 (36x142).

KEEPIN' IT 1,000: Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his

start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 43 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann ranks second among all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.91 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft
